Benefit For Hope raises \$30,000

Leadership Bedford teens raise awareness and funds for better mental health.

NSPIRED BY their own experiences and unique challenges, students from Youth Leadership Bedford recently made a lasting impact by hosting the first annual Benefit For Hope on April 15 at Shelbyville Central High School (SCHS). Students from The Webb School, Community High, Cascade High, and SCHS united in coordinating this event for their class project. The teens' efforts paid off, raising an astounding \$30,000! These much-needed funds will provide grants

for anyone younger than 21 who seeks professional counseling but cannot afford mental health services.

"I'm so proud of this year's class for taking on a project that is so important. This mental health awareness campaign has the potential to help many people. It's an incredible legacy these young people will leave behind," said Carol Garrette, who volunteers as a youth advisor with the program. This class project was highly ambitious and featured dinner catered by M·A·C Daddies, live music, a silent and live auction, a mental health resource fair, and an insightful presentation by Mary Anne Christian from the Tennessee Suicide Prevention Network.

"This event has been the most eye-opening experience I've had in my high school career," said Kara Swain from SCHS. "I've connected with many people in our community and have gained knowledge and respect for the roles of all mental health providers and individuals who

respond to crisis emergencies. The support for this event was greater than we imagined it would be. I want to thank all the sponsors and people who came to support us. Raising nearly \$30,000 is a great start on our journey to fund counseling services. I feel like we are getting closer to breaking the stigma around mental health issues in Bedford County."

Friends for a Better Bedford donated \$1,500, and platinum donors who gave at least \$1,000 include Farm Credit, Elaborate Images, Cooper Steel, Dr. Tammy Garrett, Wild Wilderbeast Lodge, First Community Bank, Leadership Bedford Board, and Rural First. Almost two dozen other businesses graciously donated at the gold and silver levels. Items donated for the auctions included a prestigious hunting trip to South Africa, tickets to the NASCAR race at the Nashville Superspeedway, signed sports memorabilia, cast iron cookware, unique artwork, and Yeti coolers.

"Benefit for Hope is essential to our community. We need to rally behind those who are struggling with mental health issues," said Daniel Craig from Cascade High. "One thing that motivates me is that this event is going to help others. The money from the event could not only help people but could also save a life. I have gone through losing classmates, and it is not something I want anyone else to go through. Mental health is not something we need to take lightly; it is a tough topic to talk about, but it is necessary. That motivated me to work on the project every day. I hope future Youth Leadership Bedford members continue this amazing event. I hope they raise \$60,000!" GN

Brooks Healing Center celebrates its first anniversary

Founded with love. Rooted in nature.

R ECOVERING FROM drug and alcohol addiction is not only possible, but life can be even more meaningful and beautiful afterward. Just ask Tyler Bowman, founder and CEO of Brooks Healing Center (BHC).

"Life is beautiful. It's based on perception and how we look at it. It's the people we surround ourselves with and our mentality. Drug and alcohol addiction is rooted in a thinking problem, and we must know how to combat that to overcome it. At BHC, we love our patients until they can love themselves. Someone did that for me, and now I want to do that for others.

When I finally went into a treatment program the last time, I'd had enough. I was willing to make the necessary changes."

After Bowman successfully completed a similar treatment program, the love and acceptance he discovered compelled him to open a facility in Normandy alongside the soothing waters of the Duck River. "This is my mission. I feel like if I'm still alive after multiple overdoses and all the chaos I caused my family, then this is my way to give back. The name refers to a brook," said Bowman. "It's a moving water analogy. I believe life is always changing, and one of the hardest things for me was accepting



The facility offers three programs, starting with a clean slate through detox guided by a medically trained professional. Patients enrolled in the residential housing program are submerged in full-time treatment, while others have the flexibility of a 30 to 60-day partial hospitalization plan if they have a devoted support system in place back home. While following their individualized plan, patients work with licensed therapists to dig into the root causes of their addictions and learn ways to navigate through their past trauma without returning to the numbing effects of drugs or alcohol. Bowman said he enjoys the nature aspect of the program be-



cause it allows those in recovery to have fun and reminds them how to enjoy life without centering activities around drinking and using drugs.



HE CALSONIC Arena, located at the
Celebration grounds, has a new identity—
the Cooper Steel Arena. The exterior and the interior
received much-needed updates, including fresh exterior
paint, an updated facade, and new doors and windows. A new
Cooper Steel Arena sign reflects a corporate partnership between
Cooper Steel Fabrications and the Tennessee Walking Horse
National Celebration (TWHNC), which includes multimilliondollar renovations.

"We've been looking for someone to purchase the naming rights of the arena for several years now," said Warren Wells, TWHNC CEO. "I can't think of a better company to partner with us than Cooper Steel. They started locally here in Shelbyville and have been tremendously successful around the country. They are a family-owned business and a great corporation for our community."

Boasting 52-foot ceilings, a 150-foot by 300-foot show floor with an additional 125-foot by 250-foot indoor warm-up area, permanent seating for up to 4,500 spectators, and additional seating for up to 7,000, the massive indoor arena has served as the hub for national and community events since its completion in 1989. According to Wells, plans aren't finalized for the

entire renovation but will include a facelift for the whole arena. Renovations will take a break during this year's TWHNC and resume in October.

"This will be great for the Tennessee walking horse industry; we have a lot of walking horse shows that call this arena home. This is also good for our community. We are recruiting new events for Shelbyville, and these upgrades will only help us bring in more. In 2021, we brought in just under \$50 million to the local economy. We've had a good bit of growth since then, and this will only compound that growth."

This year, the TWHNC will celebrate its Diamond Anniversary of 85 years. This year's Celebration, beginning August 3 and continuing through September 2, must be added to your calendar of events.

"The board and I have a vision that I think will be tremendously successful for the Celebration and our community," said Wells. "Our World Grand Championship Show has seen steady growth over the last few years, which should continue. We have struggled to be profitable for the last 15 years but have seen success over the last two fiscal years. The renaming of the arena is very exciting. We are working on a master long-term plan, and that gets me really excited for the



called the Cooper Steel Arena. That was the first time I saw my friends and family since returning home. As you can imagine, I [have] great memories in that arena, not to mention all the events I attended there as a kid."

Wells, a native of Bedford County, believed success was found elsewhere, so he left to pursue a career in the professional sector away from home but ultimately chose to return to his first love.

"Bedford County is special, as well as the people. We have so many great stories and history. I am obviously biased since we are the home of a breed of horse that bears our state's name around the world. I like best that Shelbyville is my home. It is who I am to the core. I love that my son now wears the same school sports uniforms that I did as a kid. I believe that the best days for Bedford County are before us, and I am excited to be here and play a role in our future success. I hope the next generation doesn't have the same outlook on Bedford County that I did, and I will work diligently to make them realize they can have a successful career right here at home." GN

future of our 105-acre facility. I'm excited about the future of the Celebration."

Last year, the Celebration added Wednesday night to its schedule. Previously, this night was the Tennessee Walking Horse Breeders and Exhibitors Association Futurity Night, and the Celebration absorbed those classes into its schedule, making the Celebration 11 nights rather than 10. Last year, Wednesday night events were held in the Calsonic Arena (now the Cooper Steel Arena). This year, the first Wednesday night will be held outdoors in the Celebration Arena. Food booths and the Blue Ribbon Circle will be open like all other nights of the Celebration.

The Celebration will also host several exciting family-friendly events such as a motocross competition, various 4-H events, dog shows, rodeos, circuses, monster truck wars, a demolition car derby, and, of course, its crown jewel, the world grand championship for the Tennessee walking horse.

"My oldest son really loves when the monster trucks and the Lone Star Rodeo come to town," said Wells. "He is crazy about dirt bikes, so we are working with a producer to get Arena Cross back to Shelbyville. That arena is so personally special to me. I was in the Shelbyville Tennessee Army National Guard that deployed to Iraq in 2005–2006. When we returned, the community threw us a welcome home event in what will now be













EFORE THE Webb School closed its 153rd year, which saw the largest enrollment in school history and the most diverse student body with students from five continents, 22 countries, and 12 states, plans were already underway to exceed expectations in the next school year.

During 2022-2023, Webb continued an intentional focus on the school's firm foundations of honor and character, along with the pursuit of the three A's — academics, arts, and athletics. - 2. For what ends are we preparing our students?
- 3. What processes, assessments, and student showcases should we use to equip students to be their very best, competing most favorably in a changing world while being agents of goodness?

Continuing to think about these questions, Cheeseman noted the significant advantages students gain from a Webb personalized education with small class sizes, small advisories, and small grade levels, where every student is known and valued.

"Our size allows for the formation and growth of deep, healthy relationships between outstanding faculty and staff and our students in which they are both nurtured and challenged to know their passions and gifts and develop them with character above all else."

Cheeseman also pointed to other aspects of the "Webb Difference," emphasizing honor, character, and personalized education. Included are the Emerging Voices Program, which stresses writing across the curriculum and public speaking; a global education to prepare students to live and work in a globally connected world; and the Wilderness Instruction and Leadership Development (WILD) program to provide extensive training in outdoor skills, leadership, and confidence.

"Being one of the most diverse schools in Tennessee, with a powerful honor code and college-preparatory standards, we are a microcosm of the world our graduates will inherit. I am confident that Webb graduates will be equipped to thrive and lead in every corner of the globe." **GN**

But I was blessed from the heavens because Daddy taught me to work hard for what I wanted. Momma taught me

NO LONGER PLAYING IN THE SHADOW

Sheffield proves he shines just as brightly as his brothers

T WAS a Friday evening in early June, and varsity baseball player Jaxon Sheffield had recently graduated from Cascade High School (CHS). Most young men his age might be out on the town celebrating with friends, but not Sheffield. Instead, he reminisced about why his athletic career has been a home run. "Everyone in my family has had a big part in my career so far with everything I've ever done. When I think back, I can't think of any sporting event that I've played in that there wasn't at least one of my family members there to support me. If my mom, Misty, had to work and my dad had obligations of his own, they would always get together and come up with a way that at least one of them, or my grandparents, could be there to support me at

my game. They just always found a way in their schedules to be there."

From the time he smacked the first ball off the tee at 5 until he pitched for the varsity team in high school, Sheffield had played football and baseball for the Tullahoma Wildcats. But in late 2022, when his dad, Travis Sheffield, accepted the position as the head baseball coach for the Champions, Jaxon transferred to Cascade High in Bell Buckle to play his last season with his dad. Sheffield was the MVP in March as the Champions beat Cornersville and impressed again in April when he helped them conquer Grundy County. "When I transferred to Cascade to complete my senior year, it was a whole new group of people. But everyone brought me

in with open arms, and we all got along just fine. They accepted me, and we had a ball together."

The Sheffield family instantly rose to stardom throughout Tullahoma when Jaxon's big brothers, Jordan and Justus Sheffield, signed with the major leagues. Jordan Sheffield currently pitches for the Colorado Rockies and Justus Sheffield pitches for the Atlanta Braves. With Jaxon ranked as one of the top 26 players in Tennessee, the Sheffield family has proven to be kings of the pitcher's mound. "My brothers have always encouraged me, and I've seen all the good things they've done in their baseball careers. I want to follow in their footsteps and play in the major leagues one day. To do that, I will need to take some of the hardest steps I've ever taken. I'm going to need to work harder than I have been and just stay at it."

When I asked Jaxon what it's like pitching for his dad and playing the position of a middle infielder, he said, "Dad holds me to a higher standard than everyone else, and that's how it's supposed to be. I like the extra pressure that he puts on me. I want to give my best, and he helps me achieve that. Playing sports has always been something I've enjoyed doing. Most players don't enjoy practicing, but I love practicing. I think it's fun. Sports are fun, whatever the game, whether it's football, baseball, or basically anything that is competitive."

Jaxon said his favorite major accomplishment includes beating prior athletic

records. "During the 2021–2022 football season, I was the running back and linebacker for the Wildcats, and we won the state championship for the first time in the school's history. I can't just thank one person who has helped me along the way because people have been helping me all my life. The entire coaching staff at Tullahoma has helped me every step of the way, especially coach Maurice Shaw and coach Sisk. The environment in that locker room in Tullahoma was my home away from home."

While Sheffield spent the summer choosing which college to attend,

he helped his dad coach the Cyclones summer baseball program at CHS. "We have kids from several of the surrounding counties," said Sheffield. "If it doesn't work out for me to play professionally after I graduate from college, I will definitely stay in athletics and maybe coach like my dad. No matter what happens, keep playing the game," advises Sheffield. "You may have a losing streak and play several bad games in a row, but don't quit. If you keep working and stay in the cage, you can have a really good game that puts you on a hot streak. So stay at it. Always continue bettering yourself." **GN**







SWINGING FOR SUCCESS


Andrew Reeves to represent The Webb School at the Junior National Championship.

HE SUN shone brightly over Jekyll Island as Andrew Reeves, a sophomore at The Webb School (TWS), swung his golf club, striking the white ball with a hard thud. A surge of joy filtered through him as he watched it soar through the air and land on the velvety putting green. He could smell the freshly mowed grass and hear the birds chirping from the surrounding palm trees. Reeves ran toward his ball, eager to finish the hole below par. He felt the soft breeze on his face and the sweat forming across his forehead. Lining up his putt, he drew in a steady breath. Feeling the weight of his trusty club and the grip of his gloves around

the handle, he adjusted his stance and focused on nothing but the ball. Gently tapping it, he watched it roll toward the hole, disappearing below the surface. Reeves grinned and pumped his fist in the air. He had just earned sixth place in the annual Hurricane Junior Golf Tour and the opportunity to compete in December at the Hurricane Junior Golf Tour National Championship in Orlando, Florida.

TWS quickly recognized Reeves's skill when he joined the golf team in 2019 and earned the title of Most Valuable Player of the middle school. That spring, he competed in the U.S. Kids Golf Nashville Local Tour, where he placed

first for the season and qualified to play in the world championship in Pinehurst, North Carolina. When COVID-19 shut down most sports competitions, instead of taking time off, Reeves continued to compete in several local events and focused on improving his golf score. While in the eighth grade at TWS, he played for the high school team, where he secured several more victories, including placing second at the WillowBrook Golf Course and getting one of the top 20 spots for the state.

"My parents, Jason and Gina Reeves, motivate me to do my very best to succeed, along with my coach, Jeff Mitchell, from TWS, and my swing coach, Jude Lenahan, from The Grove Golf Club in College Grove. My parents put clubs in my hands at an early age, and I started going with my father to play golf. I learned it takes hard work and dedication to be successful."

As a varsity player for TWS during the 2022–2023 school year, Reeves scored second place at the WillowBrook Sundrop Invitational. Later, he was the low medalist at Indian Hills in Murfreesboro and the low medalist at Riverbend Country Club (RBCC) against Grace Christian with an even par. He led Team USA to victory at the RBCC Junior Ryder Cup, where he

served as captain. Tying for second place at the Stones River Country Club, Reeves later tied for first in the district tournament, propelling the TWS golf team to third place. The following week, they finished second in the region, qualifying for the TSSAA state tournament at the Sevierville Golf Club, where Reeves tied for fourth place.

In December, at the national championship, Reeves will play against some of the finest golfers in the country and is looking forward to proudly representing TWS. When asked about representing TWS in the upcoming tournament, Reeves said, "Webb has given me a lot over the years, and this was my opportunity to give back to them."

Coach Jeff Mitchell frequently tells his golf team to "stop whining and start trying." Reeves has undoubtedly proven to be a model example of this motivational charge. "Andrew has been a loyal member of the Webb golf program since his sixth grade year," said Mitchell. "He has made steady improvements each and every year. His most significant area of improvement has been his mental approach and mental toughness. He now thinks a lot about tournament preparation and the proper way to practice. I would expect that we will see continued growth and improvement from Andrew. I look forward to seeing all he will achieve at Webb and beyond."

With limitless potential in golf and academics, the future shines brightly for Reeves. He hasn't chosen a college major yet, but he is interested in possibly pursuing a career in engineering, technology, or architecture. "I am passionate about golf. I feel that sports, in general, provide important lessons to prepare us for adulthood. I will keep practicing, playing tournaments, and working with my coaches to develop a stronger mental game from now until December." GN



Ham and Cheese Sliders

2 pkgs. sweet Hawaiian rolls, 12 oz. each 11/2 lbs. Virginia ham, NOT honey ham 12 slices Swiss cheese 1 stick real butter 2 t. Worcestershire sauce

1 t. garlic powder

1t. onion powder1t. poppy seeds

Preheat oven to 375°. You will need two 9"x13" baking pans. Slice rolls lengthwise and place bottoms of 12 in each pan. Place ham on the rolls; then top with cheese slices. Put top of roll on and set aside. In a sauce pan, mix butter, Worcestershire, garlic powder, onion powder, and poppy seeds. Wait until butter is completely melted then brush mixture over the ham sandwiches. Cover with foil and let sit in refrigerator for 1 hour or overnight. You can bake them immediately if desired. Bake for 15 minutes or until cheese is melted.

Hot and Tangy Wings

3 1/2 lbs. chicken wings 1 c. barbecue sauce 1/2 c. hot sauce 1/2 c. honey 1 t. brown sugar 1 t. dry mustard

Clean and dry chicken wings. Cut and discard wing tips. Cut the wings at their joints to make two separate pieces. Place chicken pieces in broiler for 8-10 minutes until chicken is browned, flipping pieces once. Place chicken in a slow cooker. In a small mixing bowl, combine barbecue sauce, hot sauce, honey, brown sugar, and mustard. Pour over wings. Cover and cook on low for 4 1/2 to 5 hours or on high for 2 to 2 1/2 hours.

Buffalo Chicken Dip

1 pkg. cream cheese, softened, 8 oz. 1 can chunk white chicken, drained, 10 oz. 1/2 c. buffalo wing sauce 1/2 c. ranch salad dressing 2 c. Colby/Jack cheese, shredded

Preheat oven to 350°. Spread cream cheese into an ungreased shallow light baking dish. Layer with chicken, wing sauce and salad dressing. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake uncovered, 20-25 minutes or until cheese is melted.

Bringing the world to Wartrace

Four decades of The Strolling Jim

Strolling Jim Ultra 40 Marathon in Wartrace, Tennessee. According to Lake, some of the best runners in the world have been to Bedford County for the Strolling Jim, the second oldest continually held ultramarathon in the United States. This legendary race begins at the Well House in downtown Wartrace and covers 41.2 miles of scenic roads before ending at the Strolling Jim historical marker in front of the Walking Horse Hotel. Runners can enjoy the meandering rolling hills, native wildflowers, picturesque farms, and wildlife along the route. The race has routinely attracted runners from all 50 states and at least seven other countries who enjoy the friendly atmosphere and Southern hospitality of Bell Buckle and Wartrace.

Held the first Saturday of each May, the Ultra Marathon has a 95% completion rate, which is astounding considering the length of this "ultra" challenging course. According to Lake, almost 4,000 people have competed in the marathon over the years. Of the 156 who completed the 2023 race, 26-year-old Dan Green from Huntington, West Virginia, was the first to cross the finish line in just 4 hours, 18 minutes, and 59 seconds. Green missed beating the course record set by Zach Beavin in 2022 of 3 hours, 55 minutes, and 44 seconds, which earned Beavin \$6,000. Finishing second, in 4 hours, 57 minutes, and 11 seconds, was 40-year-old Allison Mercer from Atlanta, Georgia. Mercer's finish time allowed reigning champion Camille Herron, who finished in 4 hours, 44 minutes, and 1 second in 2022, to keep her title another year. Potential winnings increase by \$1,000 every year that the course record remains unbeaten, according to Lake.

Besides the 40-miler, participants could also race in the marathon, the half marathon, or the 10K. Eric Waterman received first place in the marathon after completing it in 3 hours, 8 minutes, and 49 seconds. Owen Bradley finished the

half marathon in 1 hour, 34 minutes, and 46 seconds. Sean Giffin was the first to complete the 10K in 41 minutes and 45 seconds. Three noteworthy participants in the 40-miler were all 76, and the oldest runner, 80-year-old Janet Lowe from Cookeville, took part in the 10K, proving that age really is just a number.

Lake said they raised \$9,000 in this latest race and, through the years, have been able to donate roughly \$100,000 to the East Bedford Civic Club, which benefits Cascade High School. "After almost 50 years, most people in Bedford County can't remember a time when we didn't have a Strolling Jim," said Lake. "Now, we have all kinds of different distances, and we welcome locals to come out and enjoy a little foot tour of the pretty countryside where they live. It's also a terrific way to support our schools."

Slip on your running shoes because the 2024 Strolling Jim Ultra Marathon starts on May 4. **GN**






