### **Town of Gorham announces** election & voting information

-- A State Referendum and the Town's Annual Municipal Election will take place on Tuesday, November 7, 2023 in which voters will have an opportunity to vote on People's Veto Referenda, Direct Initiatives of Legislation (i.e. Citizen Initiatives) Bond Issues, other referenda proposed by the Legislature, and Constitutional Amendments, as well as appointments to the Gorham Town Council and Gorham School Committee.

The State will have eight referendum questions on the ballot, which can be viewed on the Town's website.

The Town has two seats open on the Town Council, and three seats open for the three-year School Committee seat, and one seat open for a one-year School Committee seat.

You can request an absentee ballot by visiting the Town's website. Your ballot will be mailed to you once we receive them in early October

GORHAM, ME (August 18, 2023) since the State of Maine offers Election Day voter registration.

Absentee Voting

Absentee ballot requests are now available. You can request an absentee ballot by calling the Clerks office or by going to the Town's website. Ballots will be mailed out the first week of October once the Town Clerk's Office receives them

Absentee voting will be available in the Council Chambers at the Gorham Municipal Center (75 South Street, Suite 1) between Monday, October 23 and Thursday, October 26, as well as Monday, October 30 and Thursday, November 2. The last day to obtain an absentee ballot will be Thursday, November 2 at 5pm.

To be counted, absentee ballots must be returned to the Town Clerk's Office by 8pm on Election Day - November 7, 2023 by you or an immediate family member.

### **Gunpowder mills of Gorham &** Windham documentary to air

GORHAM, ME (August 18, 2023) -- A documentary, produced by Saco River Community Media's Executive Director Patrick Bonsant (former Gorham Community Access Media Specialist) and Gorham Community Access Media (GoCAM) Manager Georgia Humphrey, will reveal the little known, but consequential story of the Towns of Gorham and Windham's history. Gunpowder mills once served as a major employer and an integral contributor to the Union troops during the U.S. Civil War.

In The Gunpowder Mills of Gorham & Windham, Maine, Patrick and Georgia take viewers on a journey back in time. Not long after Maine was incorporated as a state in 1820, the mills were established along the banks of the Presumpscot River. Based on late author and University of Southern Maine chemistry professor Dr. Maurice Whitten's book

The Gunpowder Mills of Maine, the story emphasizes the process of making gunpowder and the people who worked in the mills under dangerous conditions for 81 years.

Of the collaboration, Patrick shared that Georgia "conducted the most essential documentary interview featured in the film in the GoCAM studio. Georgia was also instrumental in gathering valuable footage and archival materials, including a critical scene of the late Dr. Maurice Whitten, the respected author of the book, adapted into a documentary. Georgia also "lent her smooth narrative voice to the documentary."

The Gunpowder Mills of Gorham and Windham, Maine will air on Maine Public Television on Thursday, August 31 at 9pm and Saturday, September 2 at 2pm. Congratulations to Patrick and Georgia on this achievement!

WISCASSET, ME (August 18, 2023) – Nearing the end of the summer's peak season, the Wiscasset Art Walk on Thursday, August 31, 5 to 8pm, offers visitors an assortment of activities to enjoy, ponder, and share. From the magnificence of award-winning artists to the reflections on loved ones lost to drug use, the evening promises a stimulating experience.

Sylvan Gallery on Water St. hosts award-winning artists, Crista Pisano and Neal Hughes, fresh from travels as plein air painters. The gallery features an exhibit of their new work, and the artists will be on hand to talk about the plein air competition circuit and the qualities that make their fresh art so successful.

August's Wiscasset Art Walk coincidentally falls on the date of International Overdose Awareness Day and so WAW has invited the 716 Candles Project, in partnership with Healthy Lincoln County, to share insight and the human side of substance use with the Wiscasset community. 716 Candles is a multi-site, multi-day program which, in Wiscasset, will feature hands-on making of paper cranes, an international symbol of hope and peace; and "Show of Hands," the forming of plaster hands to reflect care for those affected by substances, under the guidance of Merrymeeting Adult Education's Maggie Morgan, also illustrating art making as a means to healing. An exhibit of photos, "Lights of Lincoln County," by Charles Richards, poignantly displays the faces of our neighbors and friends who have been

impacted by drug use. Also on the sidewalk during this beautiful evening is the dynamic musical twosome of Rick

Turcotte and Chris Lannon. When these guys play blues and country together, the energy rises and feet get tapping. They are high energy and an upbeat accompaniment to the sidewalk activities.

The enthusiastically anticipated opening of Jodie's Restaurant, in the former Sarah's Café at the corner of Main and Water Streets, is here at last and open during WAW. Signs declaring that the new restaurant is 'Coming Soon' have teased passersby for weeks. And new owner Jodie Roquemore's posts on Facebook, asking fans for their menu suggestions and dining hopes, have been tantalizing. The whole town is looking forward to checking out the new menu.

### **Red Cross: Donation shortfall may impact blood supply**

PORTLAND, ME (August 8, 2023) — The American Red Cross has seen a shortfall of about 25,000 blood donations in the first two months of the summer, which makes it hard to keep hospital shelves stocked with lifesaving blood products. By making an appointment to give blood or platelets in August, donors can keep the national blood supply from falling to shortage levels.

Right now, the Red Cross especially needs type O negative, type O positive, type B negative and type A negative blood donors as well as platelet donors. For those who don't know their blood type, making a donation is an easy way to find out this important personal health information. The Red Cross will notify new donors of their blood type soon after they give.

How to donate blood To make an appointment, simply download the American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org, call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or enable the Blood Donor Skill on any Alexa Echo device to make an appointment or for more information. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain

height and weight requirements.

### **Remembering Rosalie Elizabeth Preble Barde of Gorham**



It is with profound sadness but uplifting memories that the family of Rosalie Preble Barden of Gorham announces her passing on 29 July, 2023, at age 96. Rosalie lived an active life, cherished her family, loved people and animals, and she always felt blessed.

Rosalie was born in Bath, Maine, on September 22, 1926 to Clarence Appleton Preble and Grace Gertrude Shea Preble. She attended Day's Ferry school then Morse High School in Bath. She left high school during World War II to attend the Quoddy trade school to learn drafting. Returning to the Bath Iron Works she worked in the Hull Drawing Room as an Apprentice Draftsman at age 16. During this time, she took flying lessons. After the War, she finished high school and then attended

Stephen's College in Colombia, Missouri. Later she transferred to Gorham State Teachers College in Gorham and received her BA in Biology.

She married Richard Thomas Barden on September 4, 1949, at the First Parish Congregational church in Gorham. They were married 70 years. Richard passed in 2019, shortly after this remarkable anniversary. When first married they opened and operated the Standish Pharmacy and Restaurant. Rosalie became a member of the Dawn of Hope Chapter of Eastern Star and Secretary of Maine Vacation Dog Club training obedience and showing American Cocker Spaniels while they lived there.

When Richard's father needed to retire, Dick returned to Gorham to operate Barden Drug Company. Gray Road was the first home for their three children Michael, Terrilynn and Gregory. In 1959 they moved to Deep Cover Shores on Sebago Lake in Raymond, Maine. When the Bardens moved back to Gorham a few years later they kept the cottage on the lake. Dick eventually purchased the pharmacy from his father and opened Gorham Pharmacy with his former competitor, then partner, Bill Rickards. Dick's mother deeded her childhood home in Kingfield to him, which was used as a skiing vacation camp. While their children grew, their activities kept the whole family busy. They also hosted a high school exchange student, Patricia Palma from Ecuador, who became a member of the family to this day.

Rosalie, being multi-talented, created the architectural design for the home they built on Flaggy Meadow Road. She also initiated an art program and taught art in the Gorham Public Schools. One summer she presented art workshops on the cruise ship the S.S. Rotterdam. She was Vice President of Maine Women in the Arts, a member of the Art Guild of the Kennebunks, the Maine Art Gallery in Wiscasset, and Associate Member of the American Society of Marine Artists. She created art in several media, from oil to sculpture in wood and bronze, but eventually she focused on watercolor as her preferred medium. She won numerous awards and sold over 600 watercolor paintings. After receiving her self-designed Master's De-

gree in Education, she became an Associate Professor at USM and Associate Professor at St. Joseph's College.

Rosalie was an active member of the First Congregational Parish UCC Church in Gorham since 1949. She served on several committees, most importantly the Building Committee for the large extension that was added to the church. She was a deacon for seven years and she enjoyed attending Bible classes there. Rosalie and Dick both sang in the church choir and often sang duets during the morning service. While they were members, the First Parish Choir released a Christmas CD "What Sweeter Music" and traveled together to North Carolina and throughout Europe in Choir Festivals. Rosalie sang in the choir for 60 years.

Dick and Rosalie loved to travel and visited 21 countries, 8 large islands and a good part of the United States. Rosalie's favorite personal trip was to Jerusalem and Israel. She was a member of several clubs but felt the most worthy activity was being a volunteer for 10 years in Hospice which at that time worked out of two



churches before there was a central facility. Interesting fact is that Rosalie was a distant niece of Commodore Edward Preble whose flagship at Tripoli during the First Barbary War of 1803 was "Old Ironsides", the U.S.S. Constitution.

Rosalie enjoyed people, art, music, dancing, water and snow skiing, cooking, reading, cartoons, sports, and was an avid Celtics fan. She was beloved and respected by all who knew her.

Rosalie was predeceased by her parents, her older sister Grace Louise, a nephew Daniel Sawyer, and her loving husband of 70 years, Richard T. Barden. She is survived by her three children, Michael Barden, Terrilynn Barden Dubreuil, Gregory Barden, her half-sister Grace Ellen Preble Sawyer and her husband Gerald Sawyer, her half-brother Clarence A. Preble ("Chip") and wife Judy Hill, along with ten grandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren, 2 great-great-grandchildren, five nephews and four nieces.
