A WAW evening of high spirits and remembrance

WISCASSET, ME (August 18, 2023) – Nearing the end of the summer's peak season, the Wiscasset Art Walk on Thursday, August 31, 5 to 8pm, offers visitors an assortment of activities to enjoy, ponder, and share. From the magnificence of award-winning artists to the reflections on loved ones lost to drug use, the evening promises a stimulating experience.

Sylvan Gallery on Water St. hosts award-winning artists, Crista Pisano and Neal Hughes, fresh from travels as plein air painters. The gallery features an exhibit of their new work, and the artists will be on hand to talk about the plein air competition circuit and the qualities that make their fresh art so successful.

August's Wiscasset Art Walk coincidentally falls on the date of International Overdose Awareness Day and so WAW has invited the 716 Candles Project, in partnership with Healthy Lincoln County, to share insight and the human side of substance use with the Wiscasset community. 716 Candles is a multi-site, multi-day program which, in Wiscasset, will feature hands-on making of paper cranes, an international symbol of hope and peace; and "Show of Hands," the forming of plaster hands to reflect care for those affected by substances, under the guidance of Merrymeeting Adult Education's Maggie Morgan, also illustrating art making as a means to healing. An exhibit of photos, "Lights of Lincoln County," by Charles Richards, poignantly displays the faces of our neighbors and friends who have been impacted by drug use.

Also on the sidewalk during this beautiful evening is the dynamic musical twosome of Rick

The enthusiastically anticipated opening of Jodie's Restaurant, in the former Sarah's Café at the corner of Main and Water Streets, is here at last and open during WAW. Signs declaring that the new restaurant is 'Coming Soon' have teased passersby for weeks. Right now, the Red Cross especially needs type O negative, type O positive, type B negative and type A negative blood donors as well as platelet donors. For those who don't know their blood type, making a donation is an easy way to find out this important personal health information. The Red Cross will notify new donors of their blood type soon after they give.

Joseph C. Houston named director of Lewiston Public Library

LEWISTON, (August 11, 2023) - The City of Lewiston and the Lewiston Public Library Board of Trustees announced today that Joseph "Joey" C. Houston has been named as the Lewiston Public Library's new Director. Following an extensive search to find an experienced, versed library leader, Houston comes to the post with nearly two decades of experience in academic, private, public libraries.

Houston learned of the Lewiston Library position from his former colleague who recently became Portland Public Library's Executive Director. "Lewiston is a place where I could settle down and make a difference in the community while also exploring a state rich in beautiful natural resources from the forest to the coast."

A career as a librarian first piqued his interest as an 18-year-old college freshman at Ohio State University where he was employed at the Knowlton School of Architecture Library. "I enjoyed it enough that I continued to explore that path after college and eventually decided to ma-



triculate to graduate school for library and information science at Kent State. I had been a voracious reader and writer growing up, so it is not too surprising that I ended up in an industry that is based on a love of reading, access to knowledge, and learning," said Houston.

Houston comes to Lewiston after most recently serving as Interim Executive Director of the Hussey-Mayfield Memorial Public Library in Zionsville, Ind. While there, he served in the roles of Director of Public Services and as a department head for Teen and Adult Services. Houston also previously served at Harrison College in Indianapolis as Director of Library Operations and Learning Management System Administrator, Instructional Technology Administrator, and Campus Librarian. He also served as Adult Services Library Associate at Old Worthington Library in Worthington, Ohio.

"Director Houston's broad experience and skill set will be an asset to our library and community. The Board looks forward to his advocacy, ideas, and leadership," said Mariah Pfeiffer, Chair of the Lewiston Library Board of Trustees.

"I'm confident that Director Houston will effectively champion the goals of the Lewiston Public Library both now and into the future," said Library Board Trustee Ed Barrett. "His extensive experience will no doubt be a plus to both staff and visitors alike, and his love of reading, writing, and learning complements the Library's exemplary resources."

Houston has a Master of Library and Information Science from Kent State University and a Bachelor of Arts, Spanish Linguistics from Ohio State University. Located at the cor-

ner of Pine and Lisbon Streets, the Lewiston Public Library is home to over 155,000 materials within its physical and digital collections. The 30,140 square-foot edifice is also home to the Marsden Hartley Cultural Center, a tribute to Lewiston born Marsden Hartley (1877-1943), one of the top American 20th century painters with works on display worldwide and in the Library itself. The Lewiston Public Library offers free public computers and Wi-Fi, lowcost printing, faxing, and scanning services as well as meeting rooms and quiet study spaces, free Maine State Park Passes, author events, programs for new skills learning such as canning, line dancing, and crafting, movie nights, book swaps, and a safe space to gather to connect with neighbors and friends. The Library also recently relaunched its Outreach homebound delivery service that brings books and other materials directly to the homes of Lewiston residents. Anyone who lives, pays taxes, goes to school, or teaches here in Lewiston is eligible for a free library card to access resources.






