4,000 ride new electrified **Caltrain**

ore than 4,000 people toured the new electrified Caltrain trains recently, and San Jose Mayor Matt Mahan was one of the riders.

"This is truly the future of transportation and a gift for generations to come," said Mahan. "There is an incredibly long list of people to thank for it, but I'll stick with the $biggest — the \,people\,of\,Santa\,Clara$ County who made the strategic decision to invest even during some tough economic times."

The new vehicles offer enhanced amenities, including new digital onboard displays, power outlets at each forward-facing seat, a new seat color palette selected by the public, energy-efficient lighting, coat hooks, security cameras, and expanded storage under the cantilevered seats.

The new trains generate less noise than their diesel equivalent, making the trip more enjoyable both for riders and residents that live near Caltrain tracks.

Starting in fall of 2024, this new fleet will come online, eventually taking 1 million vehicle miles off Bay Area roads.

Editor's note: Caltrain is the oldest continually operating rail system west of the Mississippi.

vergreen resident Felita Zhang has been awarded a West Point Pre-med Scholar-ship.

Zhang grew up in Evergreen Valley and attended Tom Matsumoto elementary school, lived in Shenzhen, China for two years (6th and 7th grade), then moved back to Evergreen and attended Chaboya Middle School for 8th grade. She graduated from Evergreen Valley High School in 2018.

"I really loved growing up in Evergreen, as it provided me with so many opportunities to learn subjects in science and math," Zhang said. "I've always had a fascination with the human body, especially after second grade when I visited the Tech Museum's Body World's exhibit, where real preserved human bodies were on display to show the anatomy within

where you can see the entire human organ systems.'

Tech Museum volunteer

Many years later, Zhang returned as a volunteer at the Tech Museum in high school, where she worked at the Body World exhibit to explain the human anatomy and basic pathology to museum visitors.

"I loved the complex nature of the body, and

was especially interested in fixing the problems within, and this is what started my journey to pursue pre-med," Zhang said. "To me, being pre-med, meant having a compassionate and service-oriented mindset, since physicians do not only heal, but also empower patients through providing encouragement and treating their trauma and injuries to live See ZHANG, page 5

San Jose strikes deal to avoid worker walk-off

an Jose leaders and union offi-Scials have reached a tentative deal on wages less than a day before the city's core workforce prepared to strike.

After months of impasse and a week spent in daily mediations, the city and its two largest unions-IFPTE Local 21 and AFSCME Local 101—agreed to suspend the strike until the San Jose City Council ratifies the new contract tomorrow.

"We are confident that the city council will approve these terms," the union coalition known as Staff Up San Jose wrote in a statement. "We are only pausing our strike until the council gives its formal approval (tomor-




San Jose has reached a tentative deal with two unions to avoid a strike by approximately 4,500 employees, about half the city's workforce. Photo by Jana Kadah.

The council is holding a closed session meeting Tuesday morning to vote on the new contract. Details of the agreement have not yet been made public. Councilmembers will have to reopen the bal-

anced budget to find dollars to move a new deal forward, but it's not clear how much will need to be cut to accommodate union demands. However, budget conversations will happen over the coming months.

"We aren't going to cut with a butter knife, rather a scalpel," Councilmember Sergio Jimenez told San See STRIKE, page 7

2016 Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee Annual Report on Fiscal Year 2022

In November 2016, Santa Clara County voters approved Measure B, a 30-year, half-cent countywide sales tax devoted to enhancing transit, highways, expressways, and active transportation (bicycles, pedestrian, and complete streets) within Santa



Clara County. In 2019, VTA's 2016 Measure B Program began the process to deliver the projects and programs contained in the ballot, having been delayed by an unsuccessful court challenge to the measure.

The ballot entrusted the 2016 Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee (MBCOC), comprised of fellow community members, with oversight to ensure that 2016 Measure B funds are being spent consistent with the ballot and for informing voters on Program compliance.

The MBCOC has conducted it annual hearing to gather input from the public, evaluated the results of the independent audit for the subject period, and completed review of the revenues and expenditures for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 (7/1/21 – 6/30/22). After thorough and careful consideration:

FINDINGS It is the conclusion of the 2016 Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee, that for the period of FY 2022, 2016 Measure B tax dollars were spent in accordance with the intent of the measure.

The Santa Clara Valley Open Space Authority (Authority) will open the 1,859-acre Máyyan 'Ooyákma – Coyote Ridge Open Space Preserve to the public on Thursday, August 31.

Five miles of new trails – including a new 3-mile segment of the Bay Area Ridge Trail and a wide range of accessible experiences – will be open for free to hikers on a schedule that balances recreation and nature experiences with the sensitive habitat for the many species that make their home in the preserve's rare serpentine grasslands.

Free Community Day

On October 14, 2023, the Authority will host a free Community Day celebration at the preserve. The event will feature special speakers and fun family-friendly activities. Details to come at openspaceauthority.org.

About Máyyan 'Ooyákma – Coyote Ridge Open Space Preserve

Máyyan 'Ooyákma - Coyote Ridge is a biodiversity hot spot in Santa Clara County, and its opening as a preserve presents an unparalleled opportunity to educate the public about the importance of protecting habitats for endangered plants and animals and helping them adapt to a changing climate.

The preserve is located less than 15 miles south of downtown San José and nestled between the Santa Cruz and the Diablo mountain ranges in Northern Coyote Valley. The preserve connects more than one million acres of core habitat and open space.

Editor's note: A free annual Butterfly Pass is required year-round to access the trails inside the Habitat Protection Area. Passes are available at https://news.openspaceauthority.org/butterfly-

pass-2023 To ensure that the Preserve's sensitive habitat remain protected, all trails within the Habitat Protection Area will be closed Mondays and Tuesdays, with seasonal hours that will vary based on the needs of the local wildlife.

Other important details about the visitor experience at Máyyan 'Ooyákma - Coyote Ridge:

- Parking at the preserve is limited to 42 vehicles.
- Amenities include an ADA all-gender restroom and paved pathways inside the central gathering area, seating and shaded picnic areas, shaded overlooks and multilingual educational interpretation signage in English, Spanish and Vietnamese.
- Due to the sensitivity of the preserve's habitats, dogs and drones are not permitted anywhere on the property.
- No water is available at the preserve.

History of Máyyan 'Ooyákma - Coyote Ridge Open Space Preserve

The preserve is located within the ethnohistoric territory of the Muwekma Ohlone Tribe of the San Francisco Bay Area, which worked with the Open Space Authority to integrate a Chochenyo translation of "Coyote Ridge" into the preserve's name. Máyyan 'Ooyákma is pronounced "My-yahn Oiyyahk-mah." The Tribe also helped develop bilingual interpretive materials at the preserve to give further visibility to the Chochenyo language.

Funding for this public access project totaled \$4 million, provided by the Open Space Authority's Measure Q, a \$400,000 grant from the Gordon & Betty Moore Foundation, \$400,000 in funding from the Metropolitan Transportation Commission's Priority Conservation Area Grant Program and over \$2.5 million from California State Parks.

"Due to my love for anatomy, my mom once even gifted me a human anatomy coloring book which I still use today in medical school," said Zhang. "I'm also so very grateful for my Evergreen Valley High School teachers, especially Mr. Eliot Gavino, Mr. Hernan Diaz, and Mr. Antonio Pacheco for being great role models in careers that serve others. Their strong service and leadership, as well as their love for learning and care for others were definitely influencing factors in my attending of the United States Military Academy for undergrad to pursue a career as an Army doctor."

Chance meeting of fellow Evergreener

At the United States Military Academy at West Point, Zhang met Evergreen Valley resident Malina Hatton, who graduated from Chaboya Middle School.

"Malina and I worked in the Multifunctional Materials Laboratory together, where we conducted research on aerogels for applications in biosensors and electrodes,' said Zhang. "It was great having a friend who was also in the pre-medical program at West Point, since the premedical community there is very small."

Research activities at West Point

When Zhang was a cadet at West Point, she was on the Sandhurst military skills competition team, part of the Margaret Corbin Women's Leadership Forum, and American Chemical Society. At Harvard, she was a part of the Austen Surgical Society and Medical Students Offering Maternal Support Club. She also conducted research on cardiac tissue engineering for the Harvard Disease Biophysics Group, where she worked with her research advisor and professor Kit Parker.

Amazing mentors at West Point

"At West Point, I was also incredibly lucky to have amazing mentors such as my research advisor, Colonel John Burpo, who helped me navigate life as a premedical cadet at the Academy and provided lots of guidance on the process on entering Army medicine, Zhang said. "With his help, I was able to receive scholarships that have guided my education path, such as the Goldwater Scholarship, Harry S. Truman Scholarship, and the National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship. The support I have received enabled me to not only want to pursue medicine, but also conduct research as a physician-scientist where I can bring research from the lab bench to the clinic and provide the best medical technology to patients. My love for both research and caring for patients through medicine led to me choosing the Harvard-MIT Health Science and Technology Program for medical school, which I entered in August 2022."

Zhang, who loves calligraphy, reading novels and going on long hikes, said that her mom, dad, and twin sister were extremely supportive of her career goals and encouraged me every step along the way. "I'm forever grateful of their support!"

Zhang is currently working to develop a conductive cardiac patch to restore conduction in the heart following a myocar-

SJCC, EVC faculty among most diverse in nation

hen students return to classes later this month for the start of fall term at San José City College (SJCC) and Evergreen Valley College (EVC), they will be attending courses being taught by some of the most diverse faculty in the nation, according to new data from the Chronicle of Higher Education.

According to the Chronicle's "Diversity Index," which was published recently and ranks "colleges with the greatest racial and ethnic diversity among faculty members, SJCC ranks No. 3 and EVC No. 5 nationally among all two-year public institutions.

"While we certainly benefit from being located in one of the most diverse regions in the country, we have also been very intentional with our faculty recruitment process in order to ensure that we are identifying the most highly qualified and talented faculty members to fill our available positions," said Dr. Beatriz Chaidez, San José – Evergreen Community College District's interim chancellor. "By taking steps to ensure we recruit diverse applicant pools, we are able to hire the best and brightest faculty from throughout the nation and world."

According to research, having a faculty comprised of instructors who reflect the racial and



ethnic diversity of the students they teach is beneficial for multiple reasons. One study published in 2018 in the journal Intercultural Education concluded that graduation rates for students of color are positively affected by increased diversity of their faculty. A more recent study published in the Community College Journal of Research and Practice found "a significant strong positive relationship between graduation, transfer, and drop-out rates" for community college students of color as faculty diversity increases.

"Representation matters," Interim Chancellor Chaidez said. "It's important that our students have educational role models with whom they can identify and an opportunity to learn from faculty from a variety of backgrounds."

The Chronicle of Higher Education's Diversity Index measures "the probability that any two full-time instructional faculty members at an institution are from different racial or ethnic groups."



José Spotlight. "We are going to be thoughtful about it and hopefully not let it impact residents in any way."

A three-day strike authorization was approved after 99% of union workers voted last week because of stalled salary negotiations with the city. The following day on Aug. 8, councilmembers asked union leaders to come back to the table for continued mediation.

Leaders met, but city workers continued preparing for a strike—assembling picket signs and organizing membership to picket in case they couldn't reach a compromise.

Mayor Matt Mahan found himself at the helm of a yearslong problem—and tried to find a compromise that would be fair to both residents and employees, he said on multiple occasions.

For nearly a decade, city workers have shared concerns that their raises have not matched the increasing costs of inflation and housing. It's led to high vacancy rates and frustration among workers that is now boiling over. City workers say they have been asked to do more work with less pay—and some have found themselves homeless or driving from Tracy or Stockton because they cannot afford to live in the city they serve.

David Nerhood, a union rep and city employee for 22 years, said San Jose wages fall behind other local government jobs by as much as 8-15%, so employees leave to work in other cities. This new agreement helps make San Jose more competitive, though it's just the first step, he said.

"We need an agreement that ensures that when we bring people on, we offer the competitive pay and benefits that will keep them around for a long tenured career so that they can service San Jose residents the way they deserve to be serviced," Nerhood told San José Spotlight. "The results today are very promising that that's hopefully going to be the direction we head in."

City officials, like Mahan, have said San Jose doesn't have enough money to pay what the union originally asked for. Before calling the strike, the unions asked for an 18% raise over the next three years, with the city offering 12%. The new agreement falls somewhere in between.

"While I support substantial raises for our workers, I will be paying close attention to the budget office's projected fiscal impact before voting on the proposal," Mahan told San José Spotlight. "Signing up for tens of millions of dollars in projected deficits and, therefore, likely future service cuts and layoffs wouldn't be fair to city workers or residents. I won't vote for something today that's going to hurt us tomorrow."

If a deal was not reached, this would've been the largest city worker strike in recent San Jose history. The last strike was in 1981, where thousands of workers picketed for 10 days to protest unequal pay between men and women. That strike was also led by AFSCME Local 101 and San Jose was the first city to hold such a strike.


