This spring I participated in wildlife monitoring at Willow Creek Preserve. I have always loved the outdoors, having grown up in Elkhart Lake swimming, fishing and exploring. I took the WI Master Naturalist Class and as a result, have monitored bluebird boxes for 8 years. I have volunteered at EH May Environmental Park (Maywood) for over 20 years. I became aware of GLC when Maywood was approached about being a land stewards for the Bur Oak preserve. In the past 3 years, I started reading the GLC newsletter, signed up for emails, and have attended some events. I decided to get my feet wet, literally, helping Isabel check amphibian traps in the ponds and wetlands. I then signed up to check the snake boards this past month. I was unsure if I could do these things, but found out I could and I think I only fell once or twice tramping along the wetlands! I was thrilled to see the blue-spotted salamander and learn the names of other water creatures in the traps. Isabel is a pleasure and easy to work with and I appreciate her dedication and long hours to GLC, along with Jennifer and Miriam. It was nice to meet and visit with other volunteers, too.

As a newer participant with GLC, I plan to continue supporting their mission by volunteering and attending events. I encourage others who have thought about helping to dive in and learn something new!



Updates: Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District

Message from the District Administrator: 2019 referendum coming to an end, the Dr. Adam Englebretson

This summer has been a busy one in the district. The maintenance staff has been working hard cleaning and updating the facilities. Summer is a great time to complete projects around the buildings.

The following items were completed this summer:

- Removal and upgrade of high school boiler
- Abatement of asbestos in the high school boiler room
- Replacement of water softener and booster pumps at the high school
- Completed LED lighting in the high school hallways and classrooms
- Added a stand-up cooler/ freezer for school lunch program
- Installed new tennis court nets

We want to thank our summer maintenance crew, which includes our maintenance staff, some educational assistants, and past graduates, for their hard work the past few months. The buildings and grounds ready for students to return on September 5th.

The projects above were completed with funding provided by the operations and maintenance referendum passed in 2019. The District will be entering the final year of the five-year referendum which provided revenue limit flexibility for operational expenditures and to update maintenance areas of focus. With the District is looking at a number of plans to ensure students receive the same great educational opportunities as offered in the past. We are very thankful for the strong support our community has provided over the years. Because of this support, our District is a special place, earning a well-deserved reputation for academic excellence. Within the next few months. more information will be shared on the District facility study that was completed last year to determine how to best address maintenance needs, and create plans for updates and improvements in future years.

Another exciting project that took place this summer was donated by Lakeshore Technical College (LTC). LTC will be refurbished one of the high school classrooms as a space for students to participate in online LTC courses. They refurbished the classroom with new paint, flooring, furniture, technology and any of the electrical preparation necessary to make it functional. The room will also be able to be used as a classroom for other classes.

The teaching staff have been meeting throughout the summer to work on curriculum and to prepare their rooms to provide students with the best possible learning environments. Staff will be returning on Monday, August 28th for four (4) professional development days to prepare for the school year. All students and parents are invited to the Back-to-School Night on Wednesday, August 30th from 4:00-6:00pm. This is a great



SCCA's Lakeshore Trout Unlimited Receive Awards

Behind the scenes, many individuals, organizations, businesses, tribes, and government leaders are initiating outstanding programs and policies to protect and enhance the lands and waters of the Lake Michigan Basin.

Annually since 2014, the Lake Michigan Champions of Conservation awards have honored outstanding environmental achievements of those who have gone beyond the normal scope of work on the restoration, improvement, or enhancement of Lake Michigan and its watersheds. This year, the following nominees were selected as the Lake Michigan Champions of Conservation.

Oneida Bird Monitoring Program

The Oneida Bird Monitoring Program began in 2021 when Northeastern Wisconsin (NEW) Audubon Society, Audubon Great Lakes chapter, and UW-Green Bay's Cofrin Center for Biodiversity formed a deep, collaborative partnership with the Oneida Nation. The program has successfully implemented a volunteer bird monitoring program at multiple restoration sites on the Oneida Nation Reservation located near Green Bay, Wisconsin.

This multi-year cross-organization collaboration has provided a wealth of scientific data to support management decisions of the land while it has also created an outreach opportunity with Oneida Nation elders, Oneida Nation youth, and the inclusion of the greater community at large. The Lakeshore Chapter of Trout Unlimited has been a leader in active environmental restoration and education projects aimed to care for the cold water fisheries of Kewaunee, Calumet, Manitowoc, and Sheboygan Counties.

The Lakeshore Chapter of Trout Unlimited is a volunteer-based organization that is celebrating its fortieth year of service. In recent years, that chapter has invested millions of dollars, including the value of volunteer time, to bring the Onion River in Sheboygan County back to being a Class One self-sustaining wild trout fishery. It is

without a doubt the finest trout stream in Southeastern Wisconsin and it is a great example of the conservation legacy that the Lakeshore Chapter of Trout Unlimited works tirelessly to preserve.

Ron Schaper

Ron Schaper is recognized for his leadership in the community-based effort to save and preserve the coastal ecosystem now known as the Point Creek Natural Area, located along Lake Michigan's shore in southeastern Manitowoc County. As the land owner of an important coastal property contiguous with Point Creek, and with his fundraising help, Mr. Schaper filled a vital role in the complex effort to secure this property in perpetuity as well as link it to the larger coastal, biological island that includes his property as well as Kingfisher Farm, currently managed as a UW-Green Bay Field Station.

Thanks to Ron's efforts, the land has become a Manitowoc County Park with a conservation easement held by Glacial Lakes Conservancy. Ron has personally contributed hundreds of hours of hands-on restoration fieldwork at the site and has been instrumental in the community-based work that resulted in the preservation of the Point Creek Natural Area. The combined effect of these projects illustrates the importance of foresight, and the need for long-term, generational dedication to the care of Lake Michigan and to the land.

Abigail Nelson

Abigail Nelson of Gibraltar High School in Fish Creek is this year's Youth awardee. Abigail is being recognized for her leadership in starting a cafeteria composting program at the Gibraltar Area School District in Northern Door County through her involvement in the Gibraltar Ecology Club.

Abbey worked with the cafeteria staff and custodians to get the process going and also partnered with the Climate Change Coalition of Door County. The initiative is a fantastic achievement and a true testament to her dedication and passion for environmental protection. Abbey plans to pursue a degree and career in environmental studies following graduation. "Her senior year portends to have more activities that move forward her missions of enjoying and protecting nature." -Mary Kate McCormack, Gibraltar High School Teacher & Ecology Club Advisor

State Senator Robert Cowles was selected as this year's Policymaker honoree. This award category recognizes a policymaker who has led efforts to protect and enhance the resources of Lake Michigan and the Great Lakes.



the weekend. While the dressage phase, with all the formal coats, white breeches and



competition, to arrive at a final score for Riders had to plan for tight corners and twisting routes in order to not incur time penalties.



Buying a Golf Gourse...at Age 23

Crystal Lake Golf Course sees boost in play under Luedtke

If there was a spectrum titled "people most likely to own a golf course," Tyler Luedtke's name would be near the "least likely" end.



He was not into golf at all in his youth, did not have much interest in the game and still would not describe himself

a s being anywhere close to a golf fanatic.

And speaking of youth, he still has not hit his mid-20s yet—hardly the age when most young people are willing to make a \$1.6 million purchase.

Yet here he is at age 24, the owner of Crystal Lake Golf Course in Crystal Lake, just a few miles southwest of Elkhart Lake. And by all accounts and observations, Luedtke, his friend/manager Jared Kraftzenk and their staff are doing a bang-up job operating the historic course which is a beloved spot to play by many area golfers.

A 2017 graduate of Plymouth High School, Luedtke went to the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he earned his degree in Finance, Sales and



International Business. It was while he was a student at Whitewater that the story develops on how he came to own a golf course. That unique story, by the way, has been well told already in several places including Golf Digest and Wisconsin Public Radio.

be a different kind of sign. "Growing up, I always had the entrepreneurial spirit," Luedtke said. He said he was not sure on a career path anyway after getting his degree, so why not buy the golf course?

and opened it to the public. A nearby home is the original clubhouse. In the 1980s the back nine was added.

Luedtke, Kraftzenk and their staff have been busy since taking over the course. Luedtke said one of the most important changes they made was changing the name back to Crystal Lake Golf Course. They also have worked to clean up the property and have added a new fleet of golf carts this year which are equipped with GPS screens to give golfers their distances to the hole. The course also has a watering system and Luedtke said they have received positive feedback that the course held up well even during a dry June this year.

Luedkte said they do not have a lot of plans for big changes in the future but instead are looking at "taking what we have and elevating it."

Their efforts are being very well received

"The history of the course is very unique," Luedtke said about one of the things which attracted him to it. He said he also likes the natural terrain and features of the course. "Even in winter I thought this place was really unique."

The course dates back to the 1930s when a man constructed six holes for his family to play. He later added three more holes

among area golfers as play has increased significantly this year. The current team resumed taking reservations when they purchased the course and now they say reservations are suggested if people want to secure a tee time.

Crystal Lake has an attractive clubhouse with a log cabin look and an outdoor deck area. It has a full bar inside and they also added an on-course beverage cart this year. They do not have food service in the clubhouse but Luedtke said the Lakehouse Bar and Grill is a neighbor of the course and the two businesses collaborate. Groups can use the clubhouse and have food catered in for their guests.

Crystal Lake Golf Course offers leagues, some of which have been active for 40 years, Luedtke said. The course offers a twilight program in which people can play as many holes as they want/can after 5 p.m. for \$30. Glow ball events are held during the year. Find out more about these and other events on the course's website, www.crystallakegolfwi. com. There also is a link there to make reservations for tee times.

Luedtke said they plan to keep the course open as long as they can this fall depending on the weather, then reopen as soon as possible in the spring.

Do not expect any moss to grow under the feet of Luedtke even during the winter months. Even while owning the golf course he continues to run a screenprinting operation at Marshall Sign in Glenbeulah and also does some hay farming—even though he did not grow up on a farm.

"It definitely keeps the day interesting," the young entrepreneur and new member of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce said about his multiple business ventures.

The family first introduced Roman pizza to Wisconsin when Al and Laurie transformed their Sheboygan diner Harry's Diner at Interstate into Harry's Pizza Market in July 2020. Following one year of operation the couple closed the restaurant to focus on finding a more appropriate location. After months of searching, the Latifis found an ideal location to reopen under a new name and in a new town.

"We are thrilled to bring Roman pizza back to Wisconsin and to Sheboygan County in a location with so much history and moreover that is hungry for pizza!" said Al. "Excited to service the area with a unique locale for destination dining and sharing our pizza for carryout and delivery - from downtown Elkhart Lake to Road America and all points around and in between!"

Roman-style pizza making is a trained skill and there are only 50+ Roman pizza restaurants in the United States. Al received his certification in making Roman-style pizza in a week-long full

immersion course at The Roman Pizza Academy, Miami, Fla. in 2019 alongside with his nephew Adrian Latifi, owner of Harry's Prohibition Bistro in Sheboygan. Adrian and Al were of the first 100 chefs in the United States to earn the Roman al Taglio Pizza accreditation. They are the only two certificate holders in the State of Wisconsin. The certificates were presented by Massimiliano Saieva, Lead Instructor of Roman Pizza Academy, LLC.

The introductory menu at Harry's Pizza e Vino will feature 12-inch personal size pizzas with specialty toppings. Signature pizzas will include:

WALNUT – oven-roasted walnuts, walnut-puree, sliced mushrooms, fontina cheese, and cream cheese, finished with an extra virgin olive oil







Village of Elkhart Lake Updates

SEPTEMBER 2023

GENERAL CAPITAL/ VAN HORN DEVELOPMENT

The Planning Commission and Village Board continues meeting about the General Capital and Van Horn Development on the apartment and townhouse development at 604 S. Lincoln Street (the old County property along Highway 67). The development agreements are nearing the final stages. The Certified Survey Map has been approved and recorded and Sohn Manufacturing's driveway will move slightly towards the north. Earthwork could begin on these projects within the next month or two. If all continues to move on schedule, I would expect to see construction on building foundations starting sometime in October or November. BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED

If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be obtained prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1.000.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG DROP OFF BOX

Please make sure you safely dispose of your old prescription drugs. There is a collection box located outside the police department where you can dispose of old/unused medications. Please take your medications out of their containers and just drop the pills in the box. We do not accept liquids or needles.

ROAD PROJECT UPDATE

The Village completed the Lakeshore Road repaving project in July. Work is being completed on engineering for the drainage on Elkhart Lake Drive. Depending on when this is completed, this road project might not be completed until 2024. The Village is looking at potentially doing a couple other roads (Chicago and Osthoff Avenue), if we cannot do Elkhart

Lake Drive this year.

YARD WASTE DUMPSTER

The yard waste dumpster is unattended. Please follow the signs about using the dumpster, you are on camera. If you require assistance, we ask that you set up an appointment with the public works department (920-876-2231), so someone can help you. The dumpster is provided at the Village garage from the end of May through October. This dumpster is for yard waste only, not lake waste. A truck for large brush or trees can be obtained by calling the Village garage at 920-876-2231.

VILLAGE ORDINANCE - 8.32 ANIMAL FECES

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!!

2022 WATER CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT AVAILABLE

The Village is always testing its water for contaminants. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the EPA prescribes regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems.
