Land is Back with Lions

FLORENCE— University of North Alabama softball head coach, **Ashley Cozart**, announced the addition of a familiar face to her coaching staff last week. Former catcher, **Georgia Land**, will assist the coaching staff this upcoming season.

Land was one of three seniors on the team this past season. She finished the 2023 campaign with an impressive .341 batting average and a team-high 9 home runs .587 slugging percentage, and 1.034 on base percentage plus slugging percentage (OPS).

"Adding Georgia to our staff immediately makes us better," said Cozart, who enters her 11th season in 2024. "Her knowledge and passion for the game is so exciting to observe. Georgia was one the best catchers I've ever had. We are so happy to have her join us."

Land transferred to North Alabama as a sophomore and finished her fourth year in 2023. She was a second team All-ASUN selection in 2022 and 2023.

"I am so thankful for Coach Cozart giving me this opportunity to come back and help coach this year," said Land. "I have loved all four years here as a player and am so excited to be here for my fifth. I cannot wait to pour into this team and see what they can do this year."

Land started 158 games for the Lions over her four seasons.

The feathering process will actually reach more homes overall since a few areas that were not receiving the paper being this year are The only reinstated. difference is that the feathered areas will be receiving the Courier Journal regularly, but on alternating weeks.

In addition, we have numerous open racks around the Shoals area where a free copy of the *Courier Journal* is always available during a store's business

hours.

Outlet stores in Florence and Central, Hometown Market in Florence, Big Star in St. Florian, HT General Merchandise on Chisholm Hwy, and the Rogersville and Town Creek post offices.

A list of rack locations will also appear in the *Courier Journal* routinely and it will be updated often.

Regardless, the mailed papers alone will still exceed 51,000 every week.



Medicare Minute Medicare "Donut Hole"

September and October are two months we get calls on the coverage gap or "donut hole". This happens because there is a temporary limit on what your drug plan will pay while you are in the gap. The good news is not everyone will enter the coverage gap. The coverage gap begins after you and your plan have spent a certain amount on covered drugs. In 2023 once you and your plan combined have spent \$4,700 you will enter the coverage gap.

Here's the way the coverage gap works. Imagine you have a prescription that retails for \$400 per month. Your copay, hypothetically, is \$30. This means your plan would pay the rest of the cost or \$370. Medicare will track what you paid (\$30) and what your plan paid (\$370) and count the cost of the drug as \$400 for that month. Let's also say that the other prescriptions you are taking equals \$100 per month. You are now at \$500 per month. In this example you would reach the coverage gap sometime in September.

Under most plans in 2023 once you have reached the coverage gap your plan will temporarily stop paying anything on your drugs. This means you will be responsible for the entire cost of your prescriptions. The silver lining around this very dark cloud is Medicare has negotiated a discount on the drugs you use. For name brand drugs and/or generic drugs you will pay 25% of the retail price.

If you are eligible for Medicare but still on employer coverage you may wonder why you have never reach the coverage gap. This is because employer coverage does not have the "donut hole". The coverage gap only applies to Medicare prescription drug plans. Also remember that Medicare drug plans can vary which means your coverage in the gap can vary.

their tourism dollars are not arriving.

who People planned on Hawaiian trips by-all-means should follow through.

Unfortunately, the political opportunists are taking advantage of the situation to declare how the root cause of the disaster is everything from white settlers and industrialists in 1800's to climate change and America's passive attitude in addressing it.

Nothing new there. Lately, EVERY notable tragedy seems to have its genesis in white people or climate change.

Sure, it was warmer than average on the island for much of the summer and high winds that buffered coast off the coast were an obvious cause and accelerant, but there was some stupidity involved as well.

There were repeated calls for electricity to be restricted in some of the areas that were more susceptible to having downed power lines during the high winds.

Cheap foreign labor and some of America's highest land costs eliminated the last of the sugar and pineapple plantations in the middle of the previous decade.

Sprawling fields of green sugar cane and pineapple shrubs were once the state's lifeblood. What hasn't been developed to capitalize on tourism has been overtaken by dry, nonnative grasses.

Local leaders knew of the island's susceptibility widespread fires. Despite fires scorching over 100,000 acres on Maui from 2016-2020, less than \$250,000 has been spent on wildfire mitigation on the entire island, according to regulatory filings over the past four years.

Hawaii's emphasis on unrealistic near-term renewable environmental goals clouded thinking on the need for current fire prevention measures.

Hawaii Electric admitted the need to power lines prevent from sparking in wind but delayed its funding requests to the state until last year. No funding has yet been received.

Doug McLeod, a former

Maui County energy commissioner, conceded, "We weren't as focused on these fire risks as we should have been."

During the confusion, officials also closed the only road in and out of Lahaina dooming scores of possible survivors to incineration.

Perhaps the most exasperating failure was the delay by Hawaii's Department of Land and Natural Resources in diverting water from Upcountry Maui to help Lahaina firefighters, which would have prevented much, if not all, of the catastrophe.

Kaleo Manuel, first deputy of Hawaii's Commission on Water Resource Management, and a celebrated Obama Foundation graduate and DEI proponent, wasted valuable hours. Instead of realizing the enormity and the urgency of the situation, Manuel chose to seek input from local farmers. This critical period, while initial flames had been tempered, would have firefighters given upper hand. However.

five hours after the initial request, approval was moot because access to water diversion areas were already overcome by flames and the town's fate was all but sealed.

As it turns releasing water to combat fires stravs from agency's commitment to promoting 'water equity.'

Indeed, Manuel's comments during a 2022 University of Hawaii livestream said it all, "My motto is always, like, let water connect us and not divide us... We can share it, but it requires true conversations about equity."

Instead of facing immediate dismissal for an unacceptably unrealistic perspective, has Manuel reassigned to another position in the agency.

We'll have to where liabilities fall for Lahaina's 120 deaths and the destruction of over 2,700 structures valued at over \$5 billion.

However, we MUST realize our increasingly frivolous mindsets often ignore reality.


DAVE Says

HELPING TAKE CARE OF MOM

Dear Dave,

My mother-in-law is 85, and she's had some health setbacks recently. The family got together with her, and as a group, we decided it was time to sell her property and move her into an apartment at a nice senior living facility. She should see a little over \$300,000 from the sale of her house. Aside from that, she has



about \$10,000 in a savings account. The problem is, she'll only receive \$2,100 a month in Social Security, and rent at the facility is \$2,600 per month. Plus she loves making donations to charities. With interest rates where they are, is a CD ladder a good place to put the money to help her cash flow expenses in the future?

Dear Ed.

If this were my motherin-law, I'd want her to do better than a CD (certificate deposit) ladder. Even with the deficit between her Social Security income and the cost of rent, she'll only need to see \$6,000 a year from the investment to make up the difference. And plus, she's 85. Even if she got nothing in terms of interest, the chances of her burning all the way through her nest egg before she dies are almost zero. I know the thought of her passing away isn't pleasant, but it's something you have to take into consideration.

As far as the charities go? Right now, she's the charity. Maybe not in the traditional sense of the word, but it's time for mom to come first. Only the strong can help the weak. I didn't let my toddlers carry our newborn. And when it comes to money, you've got to have the financial strength—the free and clear assets—to carry others. Take care of your own household first. That's her responsibility at this point.

Ed, you're not going to mess this up unless you put the money in crypto, or something stupid like that. If you want to do some high-yield savings as a part of it, that's fine. If it were me, I'd probably end up investing some of it too. Here's the thing: Overall, if you could make 8% on it, that's \$2,000 a month, and it lasts indefinitely. That's not even touching the principal. But like I said before, even you make nothing on it, just divide \$6,000 into \$300,000. See what I mean? It's probably going to last as long as she does.

Of course, there may be some other medical bills, and you'd probably want her to have a life other than just paying bills. That's why I'd like to see that extra \$2,000 a month happening. It would provide a little cushion. And there may be a few other little things from time to time the family would have to pick up, but that's not unusual in a situation like this.

You all can make this work for her. Don't be super aggressive, but don't be super conservative either.




