Your 2016 Measure B Tax Dollars at Work

2016 Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee Annual Report on Fiscal Year 2022

In November 2016, Santa Clara County voters approved Measure B, a 30-year, half-cent countywide sales tax devoted to enhancing transit, highways, expressways, and active transportation (bicycles, pedestrian, and complete streets) within Santa



Clara County. In 2019, VTA's 2016 Measure B Program began the process to deliver the projects and programs contained in the ballot, having been delayed by an unsuccessful court challenge to the measure.

The ballot entrusted the 2016 Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee (MBCOC), comprised of fellow community members, with oversight to ensure that 2016 Measure B funds are being spent consistent with the ballot and for informing voters on Program compliance.

The MBCOC has conducted it annual hearing to gather input from the public, evaluated the results of the independent audit for the subject period, and completed review of the revenues and expenditures for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 (7/1/21 - 6/30/22). After thorough and careful consideration:

FINDINGS It is the conclusion of the 2016 Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee, that for the period of FY 2022, 2016 Measure B tax dollars were spent in accordance with the intent of the measure.

Today, they continue to expand their reach and strive to have a greater impact on students throughout the nation. In the future, STEM-Bridge also plans to offer other programs to help students find their passion in STEM.

Start young

"I believe that with areas related to STEM, it is fundamental to start young. As someone who has loved math and computer science my entire life, I find it even more intrinsic for those who wish to be successful in those areas to start early. I hope that with STEMBridge, we can inspire children, starting from around us, to dive into the world of STEM and explore their passions", said Kaipa, a senior at Evergreen Valley High School.

"One of my favorite things in the world is competition math", said Sun, a senior at Evergreen Valley High School. "Unfortunately, I didn't discover it until my junior year of high school, as there were no organizations around me that promoted competitions such as the AMCs. My goal is to spread the love for competition math to as many people as I can, especially youth who are talented and interested in mathematics and wish to further their learning and put their skills to test while enjoying the process of solving problems."

Free lessons

STEMBridge offers free lessons at local libraries across the Bay Area. The organization offers both in person classes at Village Square Branch Library as well as online sessions. The classes are taught weekly by qualified candidates who are well versed in their area of expertise.

"Unlike most other places that offer competition math preparation, our organization offers classes completely free of cost. We strive to provide opportunities to the underprivileged kids in the community who are nevertheless interested in broadening their mathematical knowledge, one bright mind at a time", said Vincent Lo, a junior at Evergreen Valley High School.

U.S. News and World Report ranks San Jose as second-best for family life

S. News and World Report recently ranked San Jose the second-best area of the country in which to raise a family.

The news publication researched such factors as living, average salary, quality of high school education and crime rates to determine the most desirable metro areas for families looking to relocate.

The San Jose metro, which includes Santa Clara and San Benito counties, owed its high ranking in large part to having the best college readiness among high school students, according to U.S. News.

Also discussed in the rankings was high housing costs, with a typical single-family home now going for nearly \$1.5 million.

Exorbitant home prices are one reason San Jose has since the start of the pandemic shed some 50,000 residents, a roughly 5% decline in the city's population. That helped Austin, Texas, knock San Jose off as the country's 10th largest city earlier this year. With a population of *See SAN JOSE, page 5*

- Links posted on blogs.
- Social media feeds
- Online news sites

So how does one start curate content for their own business?

1. Decide how much content you'll curate

Determine what percentage of content to create and curate. You may even want to decide the percentage of content to use from each network. For example, you may plan to curate 70% of your content and out of that 70%, 60% will come from Twitter and 40% from Instagram. There is no single answer as to what percentage is best for curating. 2. Identify topics

Identify different topics for the content you plan to curate. This will make it easier to search for content and gain a wide variety of consumable content for your audience. You can select topics that are strictly related to your industry or you can take a broader approach and find topics that are relevant to your brand.

3. Find your sources

Find a wide variety of sources, both to increase your audience base but also to keep them entertained. Here are a few of the most popular strategies for sourcing content:

Re-share social media content: You can re-share content from popular social sites like Instagram or Twitter. Compile a list of industry-relevant hashtags and look for applicable content that has been posted with those tags. Depending on your industry, LinkedIn may also provide valuable content to curate.

Manual research: Read industry-relevant online publications to learn about the most recent trends or strategies in your niche.

Content curation tools: Use content aggregators that allow you to easily see posts from websites that you select.

4. Share with your audience

Publish the content you've found to share with your audience. To maximize time, it's

best to use a scheduling tool and schedule content in bulk for days or even a week at a time. You may want to look for a tool that has a browser extension that allows you to easily schedule content from your web browser while you research.

5. Analyze your results

Monitor how engaged your audience is with your curated content to determine what to post next. For example, you may notice that your audience engages the most with the content you share on a particular topic. In that case, you want to adjust your content plan to include a greater percentage of content on that topic.

How much are the top San Jose employees paid?

By Jana Kadah San José Spotlight s San Jose braces for budget deficits in the coming year, the city broke its record in employee compensation last year with 63 employees earning an annual salary of more than \$400,000.

Of the top 100 highest-paid city employees, 93 work in public safety—69 in the police department and 24 in the fire department. The only city employees making more than \$500,000 work in public safety. City Manager Jennifer Maguire is the highest paid non-public safety employee, and fourth overall in top earners.

Just eight city employees earned more than \$400,000 in annual pay and benefits in 2018, city data shows. That number increased to 34 in 2020 and jumped to 63 in 2022, according to a San José Spotlight analysis on employee salaries every two years between 2018-2022. City data shows a fire captain topped the list last year with roughly \$566,733 in compensation and benefits.

Overtime wages also increased to \$97 million—\$19 million more than in 2020, data shows. Around half of those wages went to police officers, according to the analysis.

Members of the San Jose City Council do not rank near the top of the list, and on average net \$130,000 to \$150,000 annually, including benefits, according to city data. The mayor tends to earn considerably more than other staff. In 2022, then-Mayor Sam Liccardo earned more than \$250,000 in pay and benefits.

The city employed about 8,400 people, including part-time employees, in 22 departments last year. The total cost of employment is \$130 million.

The data was collected from the city's employee compensation portal. The "other" category includes sick and vacation payouts, among other cash payments. "Benefits" includes health care and retirement contributions.
