





View From The Bench by John Adams, Jr.

Playoff Baseball for the Twins!

I wrote in our August 1st paper that I was done writing about what was then a very mediocre Minnesota Twins baseball team unless they made a run for the Major League Baseball Playoffs. Well, that run has been completed with the Twins running away from the rest of the below-average American League Central to win the division by a whopping nine games over Detroit as Cleveland totally cashed it in during September and ended up in third place, 11 games behind the Twins. Minnesota will now host Toronto in a best of three Wild Card Series starting Tuesday at 3:38PM. The Twins will hope to end an unfortunate record they hold for all of professional sports with 18 consecutive post season losses that dates all the way back to 2004.

When I last wrote about Minnesota, they were muddling in mediocrity with a 54-53 record. Since August 1st the Twins have played much better baseball, ending the last two months of the season with a 33-22 record. There are several reasons for this uptick in play, one is that the Twins started hitting the ball better while maintaining quality starting pitching. Max Kepler, who I wrote several times how he was underachieving, has been a big part of that, hitting .300 during this stretch and also leading the team in homeruns overall with 24. Another reason that Minnesota made a late-season push is the depth of the roster. The Twins have often battled injuries, and in the past these injuries would derail their season; this year however, the injuries let some young guys get a chance to prove they belong at the MLB level and they responded as players like Royce Lewis and Matt Walner made key contributions to the Twins postseason push. As the Twins get healthier heading into the postseason, they now find themselves with plenty of depth at several key positions. The last reason the Twins were able to pull away with the AL Central is that it truly is a really bad division, and fortunately for Minnesota, many of their September and October games were against teams in the AL Central or against other below average teams.

Minnesota's starting pitching has been a strength all season, and that alone gives me hope that they will be able to end their 18-game playoff losing streak. Sonny Gray, Pablo Lopez and Joe Ryan will be the starters for the Wild Card Series with other starters Keta Maeda and Bailey Ober moving into middle relief roles. The Twins also get injured pitchers Chris Paddack, Jorge Alcala and Brock Stewart back to bolster the depth of their once depleted bullpen. If the Twins are to advance past the Blue Jays in the Wild Card Series, they will need continued strong pitching, clutch hitting from an improved lineup and the bullpen to perform at a higher level than they have throughout the season. While I'm not predicting that the Twins advance, I do feel that this will be the year that "The Streak" ends and Minnesota wins at least one playoff game!







Clay County Fair Celebrates Another Successful Year

With nine near perfect fall days the 2023 Clay County Fair powered by SMU was the perfect get-away location for thousands of fairgoers, September 9-17.

"If you create a memorable experience, they will come. Even a little rain shower didn't deter people from attending the Fair," said Fair CEO/Manager Jerome Hertel. "For the second year in a row we had over 300,000 in atten-



dance. Overall attendance was slightly down by 2% at 318,678."

"More noteworthy is the fact that participation and spending remain at all-time highs," continued Hertel. "Youth involvement numbers are up and fairgoers like the large variety of products and services offered at the Fair. Many fairgoers take the opportunity to do their Christmas shopping at the Fair. The Fair was a great success and we are thankful that so many people enjoyed the Fair this year"

- Hertel continued that the success of the 2023 Clay County Fair can be measured by several metrics, including:
 - **Youth Involvement**
 - A record 930 4-H and FFA exhibitors from 48 counties in Iowa, Minnesota, and Nebraska participated in livestock and human sciences events at the Fair. Last year, 750 exhibitors from 46 counties participated.
 - Approximately 1,300 third and fourth grade students from 15 regional schools visited the Fair as part of the AgCiting and SciCiting field trip programs coordinated by ISU Extension Clay County.

Fairgoer Spending

- Preliminary fairgoer spending on food, beverage, specialty concessions, and carnival rides is at an all-time record of \$3,117,143.18, breaking the previous record set in 2022.
- GoldStar Amusements set single-day records for carnival ride revenue on the last weekend of the Fair, including an all-time single-day record on Saturday, September 16. **Exhibitor Participation**
- 461 unique commercial exhibitors, concessionaires, and vendors showcased at the Fair. With at least 150 ag-specific exhibitors, the Fair again hosted the largest farm machinery and ag equipment show at any fair in the United States.
- 1,263 exhibitors participated in various open class livestock and non-livestock competitions at the Fair with a combined 10,278 total entries.
- Attendance
- Grandstand shows attracted 16,097 fairgoers to multiple stage performances and dirt events. The top two attended events were Jo Dee Messina and Diamond Rio on Thursday, And 14 and the Outlaw Truck & Tractor Pull season championships on Sunday, September 17.

Are Wind Turbines Going Out Of Fashion?

KTIV, a Sioux City TV station on September 25th for their 6 and 10 PM TV News had a story about the Wind Turbine issue in Dickinson County. Their reporting favored the wind turbine company. That evening I sent them an email that included facts I don't believe they covered in their reporting. KTIV has not responded to my email. Here is an edited version of my email to KTIV:

In your reporting I thought you provided more face time for the wind turbine company than you did the Concerned Citizens. The local citizens (mostly local farmers and homeowners with small acreages) are fighting a billion-dollar Chicago organization with millions of dollars in resources.

A big point of the KTIV story was that Dickinson County would receive a lot of tax revenue. That is not true. I am sure Red Rock did not tell you about the favorable property tax policy for wind turbines granted by the State of Iowa and Dickinson County. Wind Turbines in Dickinson County (and many other Iowa counties) do not pay any property tax until they are operational (2024, 2025, and maybe 2026 gone)

They do not pay ANY property tax in the first year of operation (2027 gone). Then they only pay 5 percent for the second year of operation. After the first year of operation, it is 5 percent additional for each succeeding year to a maximum of 30 percent of assessed valuation. (Residential homes pay 56 percent of assessed value from the first year. Commercial and Industrial property pay 90 percent of assessed value.) Strangely enough the value is determined by the wind turbine company.

The existing wind turbines in Dickinson County are only paying \$1.4 million of the \$71M of the County revenue. According to my calculations that is only 2 percent of County revenue. In Dickinson County lakeshore residential property brings in far more each year.

Dickinson County is blessed with many natural resources. I feel turning the natural resources of Dickinson County into an industrial wind farm will jeopardize the extensive property tax base we already have. Who wants to own a home with whirring blades outside their windows and multiple flashing red lights at night?

The only reason wind turbines are being pushed now is the federal subsidy for wind turbines. It is not for clean energy. When the federal subsidiary goes away the support for wind turbines will die with it. Who is going to fund the cost of restoring the land to its original condition? Probably not a bankrupt wind turbine company based in Chicago.

The electricity generated here will not be used by any Dickinson County homes. Probably not any will be used in northwest Iowa either. My sources say the electric power is probably going to Chicago.

Most of the landowners receiving wind turbines lease payments do not live here. It is their neighbors who do live here that will suffer the health impacts.

The two wind turbines installed at the Spirit Lake School some years ago no longer produce any electricity due to parts no longer being available. The blades just hang there idle. Who is going to pay to take them down and restore the land?

After the 10 PM wind turbine news story KTIV had a segment with a title: "Opposition to Wind Turbines Grows" I was unable to find a KTIV video or script for this segment, but I did find this item on the Internet:

Local opposition to wind and solar development growing across the country, survey finds. The number of local regulations on renewable energy projects, which could hamper, delay or block development, is on the rise in the U.S., according to a report by the Columbia University Sabin Center for Climate Change Law.

Open Letter to the Dickinson County Board of Adjustment

Today, I am just an 80 year old guy fighting a couple of health problems, but in an earlier life, back in the 20th century, I spent many years arguing over a variety of energy policy issues in Washington, D.C., Massachusetts, and California. Speaking as a long term advocate for solar and wind power who is much more cautious on that issue today, I write to offer three arguments against the gigantic wind generation project proposed for Dickinson County. Please note that, while I currently live in Spencer, I grew up on a farm six miles east of Milford. Hence I know well the area where this project wants to locate. My three arguments follow.

1. Zoning laws and zoning officials exist to keep incompatible land uses apart in separated residential, commercial, industrial. and agricultural zones. If this wind power project is allowed to add dozens of 500 foot tall generators to a region of family farms and small towns, the basic zoning precept of separating incompatible land uses would be violated. The proposed project is a forest of industrial scale structures operating 24 hours a day, every day of the year. In fact, each of these massive 500 foot tall generators is an industrial factory which manufactures electricity. I call them "electricity factories." I urge the Board of Adjustment to see that any permission to site, throughout eastern Dickinson County, one hundred or so electricity factories operating 24/7 would equate to imposing an incompatible industrial use on the neighboring farms, homes, and small towns.

2. Critics are justified in warning of visual blight or scenic pollution. Imagine one hundred 500 foot tall industrial structures east of Highway 71. The scenic damage would injure year round residents and could trickle down to a reduced number of summer vacationers. When I lived in big cities, I never knew anyone who planned vacations near industrial sites.

3. The wind generator/electricity factory industrialization of Dickinson County could drive away future investments. Ask yourself, who would invest in a business or a housing project where looking east at a rising sun or moon means peering through a picket fence of 500 foot tall industrial structures? Why endanger the county's continued growth by inviting the construction of one hundred 500 foot tall electricity factories east of Highway 71?

To sum up, the gigantic size of the proposed wind generator project would impose equally gigantic injuries to the Dickinson County environment and economy.

The enormous side effects of the wind power project mean that the Board of Adjustment's decision whether to approve the project builder's zoning request is the most impactful decision the Board will ever make.

Consequently, the Board should provide for more than a merely perfunctory public hearing on this zoning request. The Board should maximize the opportunity for public attendance and citizen comments pro and con. Perhaps this would mean two or three weekday evening hearings, or daytime hearings on two consecutive Saturdays. Ideally, both sides would supply expert



Flu And Covid Shots Available

Influenza is a serious illness. For some, the flu leads to hospitalization and even death. It can be especially serious among young children, older adults, and people with chronic health conditions such as asthma, heart disease or diabetes. A flu shot decreases your chances of getting the flu. For this reason, Dickinson County Public Health (DCPH) is again offering flu vaccination for people ages six months and older.

The CDC and DCPH are also encouraging the COVID vaccine. The CDC recommends one dose of the updated COVID vaccine for those ages five and above. People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised may get additional doses. Children ages six months to four years need multiple doses to be up to date, to include at least one dose of the updated COVID vaccine. COVID vaccination recently transitioned to the commercial market. For uninsured and underinsured adults, DCPH participates in the COVID Bridge Access Program, which provides free COVID immunization to adults 19 years of age and older that do not have health insurance that covers vaccination.

Flu and COVID shots can be received at immunization clinics held at DCPH every Tuesday from 9:00 am until 11:30 am and 1:00 pm until 5:30 pm and on Wednesday from 2:00 pm until 5:30 pm. An appointment is necessary to get the vaccines and can be scheduled by calling DCPH at 712-339-6050. The cost for a flu shot or the flu mist is \$30 if it is not covered by insurance and the high-dose flu shot is \$70. Many insurance providers fully cover the cost of the vaccine. Medicare B eligible clients and those with health insurance must bring their Medicare or insurance cards with them. The flu mist is an option for those between the ages of two and 49. The high-dose flu shot contains four times the antigen, which stimulates a longer, stronger response to the influenza virus. The high-dose flu shot is available and mmended for those over age 65.



LOVE INC Chapter Looking to Start in Dickinson County

Inc as it is most often called, serves as a clearinghouse or a way to connect those in need with churches or agencies that can best provide those needs. This clearinghouse is the foundation of the LOVE Inc ministry. The LOVE Inc clearinghouse receives requests for help, screens the requests, verifies the need, and then refers the request to a local church ministry, church volunteer, or community agency. After people are helped, the Clearinghouse follows up to ensure the need was met and to offer continued spiritual support.

Two local women from First Lutheran Church in Milford are leading the charge to establish this chapter. "I was heavily involved as a volunteer with the LOVE Inc chapter in Nobles County, Minnesota, basically the Worthington area, before my husband and I moved permanently to the Lakes area. I saw how it worked to help people holistically. What LOVE Inc offered was much more than products and services, it was a relational approach that ensured that each person was seen as an individual and therefore we had the opportunity to offer prayer, encouragement and ongoing connections, " said Jan Larson.

"Love INC helps churches build ministries to fill the gaps in services by identifying unmet needs in the community too," Larson continued. "From baby cribs to financial management classes, we helped churches organize services and products to meet real needs without duplicating existing resources."

"All of our churches and community agencies are doing great things...we know this. LOVE Inc, is not there to take away from what everyone is already doing. Rather, we understand that cooperating and developing a clearinghouse approach in Dickinson County, means that we are all understanding what everyone else is doing so we don't duplicate our human or financial resources. Everyone has finite resources....we can't afford to duplicate. ministry that are there in our county. When care is not coordinated, needs can be overlooked or duplicated, and people are not served in a holistic manner," added Jane Kruse

Larson continued, "Within the same community, churches are called by God to care for their neighbors, share resources, invest relationally, and show the love of Christ. Yet, no one church can meet all of these multifaceted needs, nor should they be expected to. It takes collaboration across denominational lines and among the community."

For over 45 years, Love INC has helped connect the calling of local churches to the struggles of the community in a way that is collaborative and holistic. It's already happening in over 110 communities across 29 states, including a very mature chapter in O'Brien County which currently has over 25 churches that have come together in their LOVE Inc chapter. "We have visited there as well as the chapter in Worthington, and would love to have other churches and community agencies in Dickinson County join with us to visit and see the possibility for how this can work in our area. When a person has a need, they call LOVE Inc. They hear the voice of a caring, well equipped volunteer from one of the partner churches. ... A volunteer who will take the time to listen and care for the person calling with compassion and discernment; who will inquire about the presenting need, but also explore the broader context of the person's situation. LOVE Inc, through their partnering churches and agencies would then be equipped to provide such things as: furniture, food pantries, diapers, rides to medical appointments, clothing, financial and life skills classes. Love INC helps churches work across denominational lines to meet the tangible and intangible needs of our community."

As of today, 5 area churches have indicated interest in further exploring the LOVE Inc concept with Jane and Jan.

Love In The Name of Christ, or LOVE, We then can also identify the "gaps" in "In October of 2022 our pastor at Spirit Lake United Methodist Church (SLUMC) attended a meeting to learn more about LOVE Inc. She then presented the idea to our church board and explained to us that LOVE Inc works with area churches to find and address unmet needs, like parenting classes, beds for children or financial mentoring, just to name a few. They work to reduce dependence on aid and grow people in both faith, community and wise choices. Our board members agreed it could be a wonderful addition to our current outreach ministries and it was appealing to us to have the ability to collaborate with other churches and community agencies to meet the needs of people in Dickinson County," said Jill Longest, a member of SLUMC. "We clearly understood that LOVE Inc does not seek to replace or duplicate what human service agencies and ministries are doing well, but would exist to compliment and coordinate those efforts and to fill in the gaps when possible. In fact, referring people to existing agencies is one thing LOVE Inc does. I think Dickinson county could truly benefit from our local churches and service agencies working together to address the unmet needs in our communities. It's a win-win for everyone because we can do more when we work together!"

"We would love to have more churches join with us," said Kruse, "and have been reaching out to area churches, but in case we missed you, please reach out to us at either 712-260-2065 or 507-360-7112. We will be scheduling a trip to visit the O'Brien county chapter office in Sheldon in late October and that is the best way to really see and understand how this can work for Dickinson County. We invite the pastors or a leadership representative from the churches to contact us to learn more. Or we are very happy to present the concept of LOVE Inc to any of the Christian churches or their councils in Dickinson County. Let's start working together and sharing our resources for the benefit of others.'


