



Dear readers of The Lakes News Shopper, The question for this week is "When Should You Take Your Social Security?"

The "right" answer to this common query remains as elusive as ever. It depends on a wide array of personal variables. It depends on how Congress acts. It depends on how the unknowable future plays out. No wonder many families find themselves in a quandary when it comes to taking their Social Security benefits. Let's take a closer look at how to find the right balance for you.

Social Security Planning: A Balancing Act

For Social Security planning purposes, you reach full retirement age (FRA) between ages 66–67, depending on the year you were born. However, you can generally begin drawing Social Security benefits as early as age 62 (with the lowest available monthly starting payments) or as late as age 70 (for the highest available monthly starting payments).

Retirees are often advised to wait until age 70 to begin taking Social Security. In raw dollars, waiting to take your Social Security often works out to be the best deal for many families. Plus, these days, many of us choose to work well into our 70s and beyond. Some analyses have even factored in the cost of spending down other assets while you wait, rather than using them for continued investment growth. The conclusion is the same.

Following are some of the most common factors that may influence whether to start taking Social Security sooner or later.

• Alternate Income Sources: First, and perhaps most obviously, if you have few or no alternate income sources once your paychecks stop, you may not have the luxury of waiting until you're 70. You may need to start taking Social Security as soon as possible.

• Life Expectancy: To at least break even, if not come out ahead by waiting until age 70 also assumes you'll meet or exceed the age the Social Security Administration estimates someone your age and gender is likely to reach, based on the averages. Even if you can afford to wait, you'll want to factor in whether your health, lifestyle, and family history justify doing so.

• Estate Planning: Have you placed a high or low priority on leaving as much as possible to your heirs and/or favorite charities after you pass? Your preferences here may influence how, and from where you'll spend down your inheritable estate, which in turn may influence the timing of your Social Security enrollment.

• Employment: How likely is it you'll keep working until your FRA? Once you reach it, you can collect full Social Security benefits, even if you're still working. But until then, your earnings may reduce your Social Security benefits.

• Marital Status: If you're married, one of you has probably paid in more, one is likely to live longer, you may retire at different times, and your ages probably differ. All these factors can complicate the equation. You'll want to consider the timing, rules, and outcomes under various scenarios - such as when and whether to take Social Security as an earner, the spouse of an earner, the widow or widower of an earner, or an ex-spouse of an earner — while also factoring in whether you and/or your spouse are still working prior to your FRAs, as described above. Ideal start dates for one scenario may not be ideal for another.

• Other Circumstances: Beyond your marital status, there are other factors that may influence your timing decisions if they apply to you-such as if you're a business owner, you live abroad, you qualify for Social Security Disability, or your children qualify for Social Security benefits under your account.

• Income Taxes: We find many pre-retirees don't realize that up to 85% of their Social Security income may be taxable. Your annual Social Security income also figures into your modified adjusted gross income (MAGI), which can push you past thresholds for incurring Medicare surcharges (beginning at age 65, based on your MAGI from two years prior). Bottom line, broad tax planning may influence your timing as well.

Degrees of Control


Clearly, there's a lot to think about when deciding when to start taking Social Security. There are many known factors you can include in your Social Security planning. You know your marital status. You can access your Social Security account and/or use a calculator to estimate your benefits. You can make educated guesses about your life expectancy, how long you'll work, and so on. Also, if you've delayed taking Social Security past your FRA, you may be able to change your mind ... to a point. You can file to collect up to six months of retroactive benefits if you end up needing the income sooner than planned.

You can use all of this planning information and more to make reasonable assumptions and timely decisions about when to take your Social Security. 




Paper Boy Retires



• Coloring: Hair coloring techniques continue to evolve. The most basic technique is a single-process color, which is a wholehead dye or one used for root touch-ups. Full or partial foils may be used to add highlights or lowlights to hair by placing them in strategic locations. Balayage is a relatively new treatment that involves hand-brushed highlights. Ombre is a service in which hair gradually becomes lighter or darker from root to tips, or vice versa.


• Color correction: In addition to general color services, many stylists specialize in color correction. The hair specialists at Redken say that color correction cancels out and neutralizes uneven pigments in the hair through the use of toners and other products. Hair color can fade or turn brassy over time, which color correction can fix. Also, color correcting may adjust improperly colored hair.

• Nail treatments: Salons also specialize in nail services. Manicures and pedicures typically involve the soaking of hands and feet, sloughing off dead skin, moisturizing and pushing back cuticles, trimming nails, and applying nail color. Acrylic nail services also are available, which involve the application of a liquid acrylic product mixed with a powdered acrylic product (monomer and polymer) to form a malleable product that can be shaped to the nail and will harden with air drying, according to Nails magazine. Gel nails are another product, and these offer long-lasting nail color.

• Other services: In addition to hair and nails, salons frequently offer waxing or other hair removal, massages, eyebrow shaping/threading, makeup application, facials, and skin care consultations.

Salons are vital businesses in many communities, helping residents look and feel wonderful.

Bad Habits That May Be Affecting Appearance

Change nail colors and give nails time to recover between applications.

• Using dirty makeup brushes. Cosmetics can completely transform appearance, often with minimal effort. By failing to clean brushes after frequent use, women are potentially exposing themselves to bacteria and other microorganisms that congregate on brushes and applicators. This bacteria eventually can spread into the beauty products themselves.

• Popping pimples. The temptation to pop pimples is significant. The wellness resource Verywell Health says popping pimples forces pore debris deeper into follicles, can make blemishes worse and increases the chances of developing acne scars and post-inflammatory hyperpigmentation. Use a warm compress on pimples to speed up the natural healing process instead of popping them.

• Taking hot showers. While this may be more of a concern in winter, when a steamy shower is the perfect way to chase away the chill, water that is too hot can remove a layer of the protective oils on skin and hair. Moderate the temperature instead.

To The Editor: The Importance of Investing in the Future of H-LP Schools Did you know? The original Lake Park school building, known now as the H-LP elementary building was completed

in 1904. The same boiler and some of the piping are currently

being used today by H-LP employees and students. The current gym, located in the H-LP elementary, was added to the original Lake Park school in 1953. The same gym is currently being used today by elementary students.

In 1975, the voters of the H-LP district approved a bond issue to build the then-new middle/high school and to renovate the elementary school in Harris. The new building in Lake Park opened in 1977 for grades 7-12. Those classrooms are still currently being used today by elementary students.

In 2004, after the completion of the new 6-12 middle/high school building on the south side of Lake Park, the previous middle/high school became the elementary school.

These projects met the needs at the time and have served the community well. But just like our own homes, there comes a point when you stop renovating/repairing and simply replace it because it's the wisest financial decision for the future. Repairing the elementary building would only delay the inevitable replacement—and at what cost then?

Venetian Pears

10 firm Bartlett pears, peeled, halved, and cored, keeping the stem intact on one half

6 cups full-bodied red wine

1 tablespoon whole black peppercorn

2 2/3 cups sugar, divided

6 cups full-bodied white wine

1 vanilla bean

1/2 cup heavy cream, stiffly whipped

Cut a 42" slice off the base of each pear so it will stand up. Add the red wine, the peppercorns, half the sugar, and 11/2 cups water to one pan big enough to hold 10 pear halves. Then add the white wine, vanilla bean, the remaining sugar, and 142 cups water to the other large pan. Bring each pan to a slow boil and reduce the liquid for 5 minutes. Add the pears, half

to each pan. Cover and simmer 30 to 40 minutes, depending on the ripeness of the pears. When a toothpick enters without too much resistance, remove from the heat and set aside to cool. Refrigerate overnight. To serve, take 1 red pear half and 1 white half (with 1 stem between them); sandwich together with a tablespoon of the whipped cream.


Cyclones Honor Trice

Wow, what a crazy and eventful sports week we just had! I wasn't sure what to write about this week with all that happened; the Twins finally won a playoff series with a 2-0 sweep of the Blue Jays (I was lucky and got to go to the clinching game on Wednesday) and now are tied 1-1 in the American League Division Series with the Astros; the Hawkeyes won another "Iowa" game, being outgained and losing the first down and time of possession battle but leaned on their defense to pull out a 20-13 win over Purdue; the Vikings fell to 1-4 with their fourth one-possession loss (last year they were 11-0 in those games) and once again turned it over in the first quarter of their 27-20 defeat vs the Chiefs. The highlight of my sports week, however was the culmination of a year-long celebration of the 100-year anniversary of Jack Trice at Iowa State and watching the Cyclones play their best game of the year in a 27-14 victory over TCU.

Jack Trice was the first African-American athlete at Iowa State who tragically passed away on October 6, 2023, in his second football game for ISU vs Minnesota, due to injuries sustained from the game. There was heavy speculation that the play that ended up causing most of the injuries that killed Trice was racially motivated, as three Gopher players trampled Trice while he was on the ground. Iowa State did not renew their contract to play Minnesota and the two teams would not play again until 1989. In 1984, Iowa State named their playing field after Jack Trice, and then, in 1997, named their stadium in honor of Trice, becoming the first US Football Stadium to be named after an African-American athlete. Iowa State has also renamed the street in front of the football stadium as Jack Trice Way and also has a statue on campus and in front of their football facility to honor Trice. The year-long celebration culminated with a ceremony on Sunday on ISU's campus where the presentation of a posthumous degree in animal husbandry was accepted by George Trice, a relative of Jack Trice and an ISU Graduate.

The football piece of this celebration occurred on Saturday with the Jack Trice Legacy game, as Iowa State wore throwback uniforms that were similar to what they wore 100 years ago and they repainted the field with what is now known as the "Trice logo", which also is visibly displayed on their new football complex next to Jack Trice Stadium. As I wrote earlier, this was Iowa State's best performance of the season, as they lead 10-7 at halftime and then dominated the second half to pull away from last year's Playoff Runner-Up. Iowa State used strong special teams play (no this isn't a typo), another great performance by freshman QB Rocco Becht, a reinvigorated running attack and four interceptions to pull away from the Horned Frogs and improve to 2-1 in the Big 12.

Coach Matt Campbell, his staff, and the Iowa State administration have done an outstanding job of telling Trice's story and making sure he is forever a part of Iowa State history and culture. This celebration was much more than a football game, it's a way to forever cement Trice's legacy and the impact he made not only at Iowa State, but across the nation. Trice blazed a path for African-American athletes that was not available at the time, and showed great bravery in doing so. Campbell has made sure that Trice's story is told and that all of his players fully understand Trice's impact on Iowa State. The letter Trice wrote the night before his final game was found after his death and has been a huge part of his legacy at Iowa State. A portion of the letter reads, "The honor of my race, family & self is at stake. Everyone is expecting me to do big things. I will!" Even though Trice died in this game, and was unable to see the honor brought to not only his race, family and self but the entire ISU community, he can rest in heaven knowing that HE DID!





Since last week's article, I have received a few very generous donations for the Spencer House. Sheet sets, towels, and pillows are on their way to us, and we received enough dishes to stock all

three kitchens. We are still in need of some important things before we can say that we are ready to have full-time residents moving in, but things are moving in the right direction. Spencer is still actively seeking 10-12 twin size beds (we are unable to accept used beds), comforters or quilts, cooking



utensils, silverware, pots and pans, kitchen towels/dish rags, window coverings (blinds or curtains), dressers, nightstands, and gas or food cards for HyVee or Fareway since they are within walking distance.

We also have some bigger ticket needs that include some repairs to a section of the roof and replacing the drywall, flooring, and underlayment in the room where the roof leaked the most. It is important to me that I mention Spirit Lake as well. With the excitement about the new house in Spencer and all the needs that we have there, I don't want the Spirit Lake houses to be forgotten. As always, we need paper products like toilet paper, paper towels, Kleenex, and garbage bags. Recently, we have come to realize that we could use some silverware for both houses, bath towels, wash clothes, kitchen towels and rags, and any twin sized bedding.

Last, but certainly not least, we are also still collecting names of people who may be interested in volunteering in one of the three houses. We will have opportunities for volunteers to be involved directly with residents and for volunteers who prefer to stay behind the scenes.



AgLink Connects New Farmers with Transitioning Farmers, Farmland Owners

For many farmers both established and beginning, farming is about building a legacy to last generations. This makes finding a successor a key part of any transition plan, which can be a challenge. Alternatively, starting that legacy can be equally challenging. Beginning farmers face barriers to entry including access to farmland, equipment and other key parts of farm infrastructure.

To help address these challenges, Iowa State University Extension and Outreach's Beginning Farmer Center created AgLink (https://aglinkservices.com/), a platform that helps to facilitate the transition of farming operations from established farmers to beginning farmers. According to Kitt Tovar Jensen, staff

attorney with the Center for Agricultural Law and Taxation at Iowa State University and manager of the Beginning Farmer Center, the program is completely user-led and allows beginning or established farmers and landowners to build connections on a person-to-person basis.

"On one hand, finding a farm successor can be difficult if there isn't a family member to take over, and, on the other hand, finding the right opportunity to get into farming can be just as difficult for beginning farmers. Recognizing these challenges, we created this platform as a resource for these two groups of people to connect with the right opportunities for

them," said Tovar Jensen.

In addition to connecting beginning farmers with established farmers looking to find a successor, AgLink can help connect beginning farmers with other opportunities, according to Tovar Jensen.

"It's not just for those looking to purchase or sell land," she explained, "it's also for those looking for or advertising all sorts of farm opportunities, such as on-farm employment, machinery leases and sales and other traditional or non-traditional farming opportunities. There's a wide range of opportunities for those from diverse agricultural backgrounds."

To get started, potential AgLink users will submit an application which includes questions about the general location and type of farming opportunity being sought or advertised. Staff will then review the application. Upon approval, users can use AgLink to post opportunities, search opportunities and start a conversation.

"For increased privacy, AgLink will only share basic information submitted; for example, the county of a farm opportunity rather than a specific address," added Tovar Jensen. "After that initial application is approved, it's up to the individual to reach out to other users through AgLink and decide when they are comfortable sharing their personal contact information."

While AgLink offers a great venue to



make connections, Tovar Jensen reminds users to be patient while waiting for the right opportunity to come along.

"AgLink is a wonderful opportunity to see what opportunities are out there, build connections and start that conversation," she explained. "Put your best foot forward with an application and be open and flexible to diverse opportunities."


