

Why I Volunteer for Glacial Lakes Conservancy

It might be interesting to some why a twenty something would be spending so much time volunteering for a land trust, but it's pretty simple. You know a few people and you fall in love with being outdoors, even if you're falling into the water...



My initial involvement with Glacial Lakes Conservancy began this past spring when I was asked to participate in biodiversity monitoring at Willow Creek Preserve. One of my friends previously worked as the Land Intern on this property, and currently my friend Isabel manages it. So naturally, I had no out. What I didn't expect to have was a pretty decent time trenching about the property. Through monitoring, I got to see parts of the preserve that you normally wouldn't. Along with that I got to meet many of GLCs other volunteers, a bunch of new aquatic species, and got to spend my evenings in nature which is always good for mental health. While you might not categorize me as someone who likes to be hiking around in a pond, I think this gave me the perfect opportunity to pull on some waders and get myself outdoors! This was my first opportunity to volunteer for a Land Trust as typically my volunteer work is subject to indoor type non-profits. But I would highly recommend to anyone wishing to get outdoors and spend some time with community members to volunteer some time with GLC, especially in the spring. Just maybe, a word of advice, don't fall into the water while checking the traps!

Erik (Jake) Jacobsen said the photo is of course, the Camp Brosius (formerly Fleck's Resort) "Round House" probably constructed in about 1903. As an Architect, I have done some renovation work at the camp.

Bob Bromm shared that he is a part-time resident of beloved Elkhart Lake. This month's photo of Camp Brosius Round House was my residence for 5 summers when I worked there during college in the late 60s & early 70s. (Yes, that dates me). My great grandfather Bromm was a German immigrant and started coming to Elkhart Lake from Southern Indiana when Camp Brosius was still Fleck's Resort. The area of Elkhart Lake reminded him of his homeland. My granddaughter is now the 6th generation to fall in love with the area.

The picture featured in this month's Depot Dispatch is very recent, probably in the last 5 years. When I lived upstairs in the round house with no indoor plumbing, there was a different set of steps to the top, blue & white striped shutters, and no picnic tables outside as all dining was in the formal dining room. Thank you for this month's photo as it evokes many fond memories.

The unidentified picture in the September issue of the Depot Dispatch is the main lodge at Pine Point Resort, now known as the Point Elkhart condos. The resort was founded in 1879 by C. V. Pettibone, a Fond du Lac businessman. Although intended to be a family summer home, the property became dotted with enough cottages to accommodate 250 guests.

After twenty years, ownership was transferred to George Diefenthaler and

then Walter and Helen Stark.

High school graduations, dances, and parties gave life to Pine Point's pavilion. In the 1940's it was used by the Ernest Graves and Kathryn Darrell Acting Companies. The resort also provided a ten-piece band for dancing.

Jay and Leatha Stein bought the property in 1943 and operated it until 1971. During that era, a number of comedians spent their summers at Pine Point as they improved their routines while on the road to stardom.

The property became known as Point Elkhart when the Steins sold it to Leisure Facilities which then sold it to Milwaukee businessman, John Burke. Old buildings were razed and the present condos began to pop up - one after the

Community Members Come Together in Sheridan Park

Community members came together last week to complete revitalization projects in the Sheridan Park neighborhood. As part of Habitat for Humanity's Rock the Block event, corporate and individual volunteers rolled up their sleeves to tackle various projects including a porch repair for a homeowner with young children, window and door repairs and replacement, brush removal and yard maintenance.

While Rock the Block is primarily focused on exterior rehabilitation, the Habitat Lakeside team did accept the task of revitalizing the teachers lounge at Sheridan Elementary School. "On our first visit to the school, my initial thought was that this room was where furniture and supplies came to die", shared Niki Zohrab, Executive Director. "It was bland with far too much furniture, and clearly a room where supplies that weren't being used were dropped and left. Thanks to the hard work by our wonderful volunteers, the space is now an inviting and relaxing spot for teachers to enjoy a little downtime."

Multiple area organizations sponsored the event, helping cover out-of-pocket expenses, volunteer lunches and necessary supplies. 





Pauly began with a homebrew kit, as many brewers do. This hobby quickly became a passion and then in 2012, Pauly decided to turn his passion into a career and opened a small packaging brewery in a corner of a local bar that once housed the old Wigwam sock factory in Sheboygan. 3 Sheeps' products quickly found their way into hands of dedicated fans throughout Wisconsin, resulting in long hours to keep up with the demand, a rapidly expanding team of employees, and a desire to make the best beer possible.

In 2017, Founder and Brewmaster Grant Pauly decided to expand his quickly growing brewery and moved 3 Sheeps from its original home to the former Coca-Cola facility located at 1837 North Ave in Sheboygan. > Along with their passion for beer, 3 Sheeps has always valued taking care of their community and being a good neighbor. Every month they partner with a different local charity and help to raise money through events and beer sales. Lakeshore Technical College Saves Students Over \$2M



With the average college textbook costing around \$105, according to Education Data Initiative, students can spend hundreds of dollars every semester. However, students at Lakeshore Technical College have been saving money —\$2.1 million since 2018—thanks to the college making open educational resources available.

Open educational resources include free online textbooks, videos, and other learning tools that reside in the public domain. Rather than renting or purchasing textbooks, students download materials to their electronic devices. The college library also offers hard copies of the materials for checkout.

"Access to open educational resources is valuable to our students not only for the cost savings but also because these resources tend to be timelier and more relevant to industry than textbooks from the traditional ivory tower," said Lakeshore President Dr. Paul Carlsen.

Instructors for more than 180 Lakeshore courses have eliminated textbook costs by adopting open educational resources. In addition to saving students money, the resources provide more equitable access to course materials. All students can access materials on the first day of class since they do not need to wait for bookstore shipments or financial aid awards.

He was a four-time All-Illini-Badger Football Conference honoree, graduated No. 2 in career interceptions (18), and his nine interceptions in 1985 is tied for the most in a single season and among the nation's best as he led several defensive-minded

Chambers re-wrote the rushing record book as the Muskies rolled up the points and yards during his career. He graduated as the program's career rushing leader with 2,733 yards (he's now third), and he was second in career scoring (266 points) and touchdowns (44). He was a key component on two IBFC championship teams, including the 10-0 finish in 1997.

Plucinski was a dominating pitcher that helped lead the Muskies to three conference championships, the 2002 NCAA Division III World Series and a fifth-place finish nationally. Vandlen is among the football program's most decorated offensive linemen that helped lead the Muskies to the program's first NCAA Division III postseason playoff berth. He was a two-time IBFC Offensive Lineman of the Year, two-time first team All-IBFC and two-time Football Gazette North All-Region.

Hall was a dominating pitcher for the softball program and has career records in five of the program's six pitching

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

SNOW REMOVAL

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

SNOW REMOVAL WARNING

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient and you will be in violation.

VILLAGE ORDINANCE -8.32 ANIMAL FECES

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!! If you see this happening, you can report it to the police. If you know the owner of the dog, you are able to make a statement to the police and the owner will be cited. Also, if you catch someone on video (doorbell cameras) not picking up animal waste you can turn the video to the police, who can than cite the owner of the animal. Please keep Elkhart Lake clean.

A Sheboygan courier driver will bring packaged meals, which are plugged into



Pre-COVID, a similar arrangement had been made with a local church. But COVID changed FMOW's delivery model for more than three years. The route will take less than an hour to deliver while providing about a dozen area residents with a friendly face, a quick safety check and a tasty meal. FMOW has been delivering meals throughout all of Sheboygan County for 53 years. 

Van Horn Terminates Franchise Agreement with Mazda

North-side Sheboygan location remains as a pre-owned auto dealership.

Van Horn Automotive Group has terminated the franchise agreement with Mazda Motor Corporation, effective September 30, 2023. The dealership will remain operational as a retailer and service center for pre-owned vehicles.

Termination of the Mazda franchise is scheduled for Saturday, September 30, 2023. It will reopen for business on Monday, October 2, 2023 under the name Van Horn Motors of Sheboygan.

This location has been in the Van Horn Family since 1989, when Joe Van Horn and Dan Wieland went into business together. Dan and Joann Wieland operated the dealership as Van Horn Wieland Oldsmobile. Hyundai was added shortly after, and then Mazda more recently. In January of 2020, Van Horn Hyundai of Sheboygan moved to a new facility on Racetrack Road, leaving Mazda as the sole franchise. "The move to sell the franchise back to Mazda was strictly a business decision," said Jeff Niesen, President of Van Horn Automotive Group. Warm Poinsettias With Ample Sunlight

This may seem strange due to their holiday connotations, but poinsettias are tropical plants. Provide lots of sunlight — a sunny window with east, west, or southern exposure is best. Also try to keep the temperature between 65 and 70 degrees during the day, keeping in mind that the area around a drafty window can be quite a bit cooler than the rest of the room. If your plant's leaves are touching a cold window, they may drop off. At night, poinsettias like a slightly lower temperature (55 – 60 degrees), but avoid drastic drops in temperatures.

How to Water Poinsettias

Make sure to water the poinsettia whenever the surface of the soil feels dry. Give the plant a good watering, but don't flood or soak it — gravel in the bottom of the pot will help keep the roots dry. If your home is dry during the winter months, a humidifier or plant mister can help your plant stay hydrated.

How to Prevent Leaf Loss

If your plant starts to lose leaves, there are a few likely culprits. Ask yourself these questions: Is the plant resting against a cold window or near a draft? Is it too warm or dry in the room? Is the plant thirsty?

If the leaves wilt, and the soil gets dry to the touch, water your poinsettia right away. But remember: Wilting or dropping leaves can also be a sign of over watering. If the soil is soggy when the leaves fall, you've probably watered too much

Encouraging Poinsettias to Rebloom

Poinsettias can stay attractive for months. But it's tricky to get them to re-bloom — that is,

unless you live in a subtropical area. Then you can transplant them to your garden in January, and let the natural changes in daylight trigger their color later in the year.

To coax your plant back into bloom, let it dry out gradually starting in April. Water just enough to keep the stem from shriveling, and put the plant in a spot that stays about 60 degrees.

In mid-May, prune the stems to 4 inches high and repot the poinsettia in a slightly larger pot. Move it to a warm location with good light and resume watering. When new growth emerges, fertilize every two weeks with a complete fertilizer.

In July, pinch back the stems. Pinch again in mid-August. Poinsettias need 10 weeks of 12 hours or less of sunlight each day to show color. For Christmas flowers, keep the plant in complete darkness from 5 p.m. to 8 a.m. daily, starting around Oct. 1.

This is too much work for most of us, so don't feel bad if you compost your poinsettia after you've enjoyed it indoors.

Quick facts

- Poinsettias bloom when the days get shorter.
- The colorful "flowers" of poinsettias are actually modified leaves called "bracts."
- Poinsettias grow well in moist soil and temperatures between 65 and 70 degrees F.
- They can be grown outdoors during summer.







