New Bridge to Open 11/3

FLORENCE- The public is invited to attend the ceremonial grand reopening and ribbon-cutting of the new bridge over Cypress Creek on Lauderdale County Rd 16 (Rasch Rd.) at noon on Monday, November 6.

The original concrete bridge was built around 1935, according to Lauderdale County Engineer, Eric Hill. However, county workers closed the bridge in 2017 because of structural concerns. According to Hill, inspectors started noticing some structural concerns and his department had been receiving reports of traffic heavier than the 3-ton limit allowed on the bridge.

A report from the Alabama Department of Transportation's emergency bridge inspection team confirmed the county's

Fire Alert Re-Issued for AL

SHOALS-The Alabama Forestry Commission (AFC) has re-issued a Fire Alert for all 67 counties in the state. This order was effective as of last week prior to press time. In the 32 northern counties north of Interstate 20, NO burn permits will be issued. In the 35 southern counties south of Interstate 20, **Furman**

certified prescribed burn managers will have the option to obtain a one-day burn permit. Until lifted, there will be no exceptions to this rule. Anyone who burns a field, grassland, or woodland without a burn permit may be subject to prosecution for committing a Class B misdemeanor

During a recent seven day period, AFC wildland firefighters responded to 111 wildfires that scorched more than 1,881 acres of forestland in Alabama. Drought conditions are expected to worsen as no rain is forecast for the next week, and October is historically the state's driest month. This extremely dry weather creates a greater-thanaverage potential for outdoor fires to escape easily and spread rapidly, taking longer - and more firefighting resources - to contain and ultimately control.

"It was just a very unexpected turn of events and a whirlwind couple of days," said UNA head coach Missy Tiber. "When Allie Craig wanted to know if we wanted her on the team, I didn't hesitate — 'Of course!' She knows high level basketball and is the exact type of player we seek out. I know she's excited to make her last vear special in front of her friends and family here at home.

After graduating high school in 2018, the Killen native joined the Crimson Tide roster as the No. 14 ranked wing by HoopGurlz ESPNW. The 6 foot 1 forward played in all 31 games as a freshman and went on to play in over 100 career games over four seasons with five starts.





One Cannot Simply Sue, **But Must Sue** For Something

A plaintiff must request a specific remedy, such as a payment it wishes the defendant to make or an action it wants the defendant to take or stop taking. A plaintiff cannot ask the court to issue an advisory opinion, make a public statement on an issue, or edit a statute, although the courts interpret statutes and have the authority to find them unconstitutional.

If waiting for a final decision from the court might prove

ineffectual to a plaintiff, he or she may request an **injunction**. These are situations where immediate and irreparable harm will be done without a court order. Think of the demolition of a building, once done it can't be undone. In those situations a court can order that the opposing party do or stop doing an act – at any time. The court may grant the request before a trial is completed if: (1) It deems the plaintiff likely to succeed in the case; (2) The plaintiff will likely to suffer irreparable harm if it is not granted; (3) The plaintiff will likely endure greater harm from the absence of injunction than the other party will endure from it; and (4) the injunction is in the public interest.

Some civil remedies: (1) Damages: Payment for plaintiff's losses; (2) Specific performance or injunction: Litigant must perform or cease performing a specific act such as the sale of a specific of property. Property, in the eyes of the law, is deemed unique. Each parcel had its own qualities and therefore the breach of a contract concerning the sale of a house for instance would require the sale of that specific house; (3) Declaratory Judgment: Rights and obligations of litigants clarified or determined. We see declaratory judgments in cases of insurance coverage. Sometimes people will buy particular types of coverage that either do or don't have the type of coverage they need. Insurance companies will file to determine that they do not have coverage under a particular type of policy. For instance, a policy of property damage on a 4-wheeler would cover the 4-wheeler but may not cover injuries caused by the 4-wheeler.



s the morning light peeked over the Gaza horizon on October 18, fresh evidence of exactly what happened at the Al-Aȟli Baptist Hospital the night before emerged exposing one of

the most blatant war-time disinformation events in our lifetimes.

The hospital was first reported to have been struck at 7:20pm local time October 17. Almost immediately, claims by the Gaza Health Ministry of carnage, a leveled hospital building, and at least 500 dead from an "Israeli bombing" began to inundate the world press. This included major American outlets like *The New* York Times, ABC News, CNN, and the Associated Press.

ABC NEWS: At least 500 people have been killed in an explosion at Al Ahli Arab Hospital in the middle of Gaza, according to the Gaza Health Ministry. The hospital served as a shelter for thousands of residents who fled their homes in northern Gaza, seeking safety from Israeli airstrikes.

Medicare Minute

"Medicare Advantage Plans Part 3"

A Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) is a type of Medicare health plan offered by a private insurance company that contracts with Medicare to provide you with all your Part A and Part B benefits. There are six things to consider when choosing a MA plan. We discussed three of those things last week; the premium, copays and coinsurance of the plan. This week we will talk about deductibles, provider networks and drug formularies.

A deductible is the amount you are required to pay for your health care services before your health insurance begins to pay. Most MA plans do not have a deductible on services as long as you receive the services from an in network provider. If you receive the services from an out of network provider you may have to meet a deductible before the plan pays or you may not have coverage at all depending on the type of plan you have.

The provider network of the plan is a list of doctors or health care facilities that have agreed to accept the plan. If you are considering a MA plan for the first time you will want to verify with your agent that any doctor or facility you may want to visit is in your plan's network. If you are already in a MA plan you will want to verify with your doctor that they will accept the plan in 2023.

A MA plan's drug formulary is a list of drugs that are covered by the plan. This will include the tiers and copays of the drugs and any deductible you may have to meet on the prescriptions you are taking. Don't overlook the formulary of the plan because MA plans do not cover every prescription drug that is manufactured.



a train coming. Well, the train came and whacked off his head. The moral of the story is: Don't lose your head over a piece of tail.







Yes, the Gaza Health Ministry, clearly partisan entity run by Hamas reported it and no questions were asked.

More proof emerged when an intercepted conversation between iihadists the next day indicated that a misfired rocket caused extensive damage near the hospital.

It is also impossible that any health agency could determine death tolls into the hundreds within an hour or two as described. Rescue teams couldn't get in for hours, much less recover and determine such a significant body count.

National Public Radio held out hope even days later on its six Things Considered Allprogram insisting that truth about the hospital bombing "was a very complex situation."

Once again. American progressive press has been left standing in the street, its collective pants down, runny stool flowing down its legs.

One story hits in the U.S. and the rest blindly repeat the unverified data. It sounds plausible, the carnage is high, and it will draw viewers and clicks.

No worries, though. Their sheep will forgive and continue to follow, because their trusted news people found a sensational angle, they were reporting in 'good faith,' AND their deeply rooted objective of painting Israel and the West in a bad light was well-contrived.

This is yet another lesson that we should never blindly believe the American mainstream press about anything, especially when there is a stench in the air and supporting facts are in short supply.






