APPLIANCE WARRANTIES

We have all heard the horror stories of building new houses or remodeling existing homes. With that being said, I have been remodeling my home. It hasn't been all smooth sailing, but it hasn't been terrible. I've had some snags with my appliances which leads me to this week's article.

Most appliances come with a manufacturer's warranty that typically lasts for a specific time frame, such as one year or longer. These warranties typically cover the cost of parts and labor necessary to repair defects that occur under normal use and conditions.

The coverage provided by appliance warranties varies depending on the manufacturer and the specific terms of the warranty. Generally, warranties cover defects in materials or workmanship that affect the performance of the appliance. Warranties do not cover the natural wear and tear that occurs with the regular use of an appliance, such as a light bulb.

Trying to fix it yourself can void the warranty. You should rely on authorized service centers or technicians approved by the manufacturer to ensure the warranty remains valid. Most repair services will advertise if they can service appliances under warranty. I like to do business where the seller can do the service.

Reach out to the manufacturer's customer service or the authorized service center to report the problem, confirm in writing and keep the letter or email. Provide them with detailed information about the issue, such as the symptoms and any error codes.

Depending on the warranty terms, the manufacturer may send a technician to inspect and repair the appliance or direct you to an unauthorized service center.

Always document each communication, including date, name of customer service representative, and any service reports or invoices. Written records can be valuable in case of a dispute or further issues and can prove notice of an issue during the warranty period. This can also extend the warranty period.

speaker, Congressman known Mike Johnson, a hardline conservative from Louisiana." Seconds later, Holt called him a "hardconservative." Garrett Haake Then underlined he was a 'staunch conservative on issues like abortion and government spending."

CBS anchor, Norah O'Donnell, declared, "The staunch conservative wants a federal ban on abortion rights and opposes samesex marriage." Reporter Nikole Killion added, "He managed to unite both the hard-right and establishment flanks of the party."

ABC's Rachel Scott aid, "Johnson is said. staunchly anti-abortion right and "not in favor of protections for same-sex marriage." He even voted against reauthorizing the Violence Against Women Act in 2021. Why? There were gun rights issues and religious liberty issues with it. But it's too much fun to imply he favors violence against women.

Journalists wanted



to press Republicans on why they would support Johnson. PBS anchor, Geoff Bennett, pressed Rep. Mariannette Miller-Meeks of Iowa, "Mike Johnson is more genial than Jim Jordan, but he's no less a hard-liner. He is on the far right of the spectrum when it comes to issues like reproductive rights, same-sex marriage."

It should be obvious that Democrats hold staunchly opposite from positions the 'ultraconservative hardliners," but there are "ultraliberal hardliners."

When far-left Rep. Nancy Pelosi, D-Calif., stepped down from the speaker's job last November, ABC and NBC hailed her as a hero and an icon whose reign was legendary. CBS hailed her as an outsized political force for a generation.

When Democrats Rep. Hakeem elected Jeffries, D-N.Y., replace Pelosi as their party leader, PBS and the others hailed him as the first black lawmaker to head a major political party in Congress. That was a two-sentence story with no drama.



homes, and robot vacuum cleaners. These AIs are very constrained in their abilities, but can generally do one thing very well. The computer code necessary for these little AIs

Artificial General Intelligence

by "The Computer Skeptic"

is self-contained and can be stored on microscopic pieces of computer hardware.

Recently, there has been an explosion of what we call "Narrow AI" based on large language models. For example, Microsoft's "OpenAI" model was fed the entire knowledge contained on Wikipedia, medical journals, and online encyclopedias. All this was fed into a large neural net, processed and the end result is an AI that rapidly predicts what word ought to follow another word. For example, if I say, "The quick brown fox" it will know to follow that with "jumps over

the lazy dog." It's not smart in the way that humans are smart, it's just really good at predicting what word should come after another.

Google's "Bard" is another leap in AI technology. Instead of feeding their computer a curated feast of Wikipedia and encyclopedias, they fed it the entire internet. These large language models are now able to assist little humans in ways that were unimaginable just a few months ago.

Then we have imageprocessing technologies that mimic the human visual world. Large bodies of works of art were fed into a machine then computer scientists taught it how to produce whatever image or video our human minds can conceive of. We are on the verge of being able to speak the idea of a movie into our computers, and our computers will spit out a full-length movie. This is one of the things screen actors and writers were mad about. And rightly so because their jobs really are at stake.

Computer scientists are feverishly working on the next big thing, Artificial General Intelligence (AGI), which will combine all the little aforementioned AIs into one large super-intelligent network of computers. Currently, these AIs have to be fed the knowledge that humans mostly already know. AGI will be as smart as a human with the ability to reason, think, and maybe even

be self-aware--the gold standard of "humanness." The timeline for AGI development remains a subject of ongoing debate among experts. Some argue that it may be possible in years or decades; others maintain it might take a century or longer; and a minority believe it may never be achieved. I think we're 10 years from AGI but, regardless of how long it takes, I suspect it will come as a surprise. Buckle up, little humans, it's gonna be a wild ride!

Medicare Minute

"Types of Medicare Advantage Plans"

There are basically two types of Medicare Advantage Plans. One type is a HMO. HMO stands for Health Maintenance Organization. The other type is a PPO or Preferred Provider Organization. Although both are Medicare Advantage Plans there are some distinct differences in the two.

In most HMO plans you generally can only go to doctors, health care facilities or hospitals that are on the provider list of the plan except in emergency. HMO plans require you to name a primary care provider (PCP). Your PCP becomes the quarterback of your health care. This means you may have to have a referral from your PCP if you want to see a specialist or another health care provider. All HMO plans do not require a referral, so this is a question you will want to ask of considering an HMO.

In a PPO plan, you also have a defined network of providers. You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network but, unlike a HMO, you may have some coverage if you go to an out-of-network provider. You will pay more for using an out-of-network provider versus an in-network provider. Also a PPO plan may give you the option of getting your health care from a provider outside your immediate geographical area whereas a HMO can be more limited.

HMO and PPO plans are similar in many ways. They both have a defined network of providers, both have a copay on most services you receive and except for a few exceptions will both include prescription drug coverage. Finding a Medicare health plan is about finding the plan that is right for you. It's a good idea to research both HMO and PPO plans if you are considering a Medicare Advantage Plan.




Dear J.T.,





Dear Editor:

My heart goes out to the innocent Israeli and Palestinian victims of the war in Gaza. The overriding characteristic of war seems to be coldblooded cruelty. That's the conclusion I reached a 20-year-old Vietnam.

I'd been recuperating from a shoulder wound and a base camp near the Cambodian border. Over several nights, the base had come under intense rocket attacks

from nearby forests. One morning I stepped out of a bunker to find the company compound strewn with shrapnel from the night before.

Rocket attacks were so common in those days that I had not paid much attention to their shattered remains until that morning. What I immediately noticed was a long, thin sliver of twisted, multi-edged metal. It was stuck into the ground like a hunting knife. What's more, I found that it couldn't be safely picked up without first, wrapping it in a towel. That's how heavy and surgically sharp it was. Carelessly holding it could have inflicted a serious cut.

Anyone hit by that ugly piece of metal probably would've died instantly or bled to death within minutes.

I don't expect humans to lose their capacity for war no matter how cruel or impersonal it becomes. We are falling creatures, unable to save ourselves. It comes from the lusts that war in our members. (James 4:1)




