Ivey Signs No Burn Order

MONTGOMERY – Last week Governor **Kay Ivey** signed a statewide Drought Emergency Declaration – often referred to as a 'No Burn Order' – prohibiting all outdoor burning in Alabama. This order was effective November 9.

"Alabama is currently experiencing extremely dry conditions, which greatly increases the potential for dangerous wildfire activity," Ivey stated. "This declaration is meant to prevent unnecessary burning, reducing the chance of avoidable fires. I urge Alabamians to heed this warning."

Since the statewide
Fire Alert was issued
on October 24, Alabama
Forestry Commission
(AFC) firefighters have
responded to 352 wildfires
that have burned 3,199
acres across the state.

The Drought
Emergency Declaration
order will remain in
effect until rescinded by
the State Forester. At that
time conditions will have
changed sufficiently to
reduce the occurrence
and frequency of
wildfires. Some scattered
brief rain events
occurred November 9-10,

but they were not nearly enough to offer relief.

TVHS Turns 100...

Colbert County. That goal soon came to include Lauderdale and surrounding counties. Attendance at meeting was reported to be significant and Peter A. Brannon, curator of the Alabama Department of Archives and History gave an address on the history of Alabama with an emphasis on Colbert County. Membership in the society cost \$1 per year.

Mr. King was elected present of the Society at this first organizational meeting, a post he would hold for the rest of his life. Mrs. Susan Kirkman Vaughn and Dr. WH Blake of the State Normal School were elected vicepresidents. Mrs. Minnie L. Nathan was elected secretary-treasurer. The first board of directors were residents of Colbert and Lauderdale Counties: Mr. JG Sanderson; Dr. Dudley Sanders; Mr. John R. Price; Mrs. John Milner; Mrs. EP Rand; Mr. John D. Rather; and Mr. John M. Clark.

Within five years a very valuable collection of local historical artifacts had been collected by the society and was on display at the Tuscumbia Chamber of Commerce. These artifacts included a six-pound cannonball from a Civil War skirmish Confederate between General Nathan Bedford and Forrest Union General Grenville Dodge. It had been found in a cotton-field on the Harry Fennel place near Town Creek and was donated to the Society by Mrs. Lula Bell King. Many of these artifacts still exist at the Leighton Public Library. By 1928 the Historical Society had also erected a number of lasting metal markers upon historic sites in valley. Members the were encouraged to contribute books, manuscripts, documents. relics, and any and all suitable material for preservation. Unwritten stories of historic incidents relating to the valley throughout its history are solicited.

The first volume of The Journal of Muscle Shoals History was published in 1973 to help record that history. The Journal is still being published by the Society to this day. Back copies of some issues can still





According to the 2023 Kids Count Data book, Alabama ranked 45th among states in child well-being. The rating improved despite the state falling in 8 of the 16 indicators. That is because other states also declined in math, reading and other

Dear Dave.

My husband and I want to do a live-in and flip real estate purchase. The idea is to buy a fixer-upper and rent out the basement to help with the mortgage payments. How do you feel about ideas like this? Erin

Dear Erin,

In a situation like this you need to do a basic business analysis. You've got to have a plan in place, and you've got to figure out the worst-case scenario. Part of this is determining whether you can survive if things fall



apart. In this case, the worst case is that you can't get a renter, *and* the house doesn't sell. It puts your family in jeopardy, so to me it's not an option.

Want my honest opinion? I think you've both got a case of house fever right now. The possibility I just mentioned isn't a rare occurrence. Lots of people have had the same idea, with the best of intentions, and still wound up in a big mess. I love real estate. I mean I really love real estate. And I've flipped more than a few houses in my day. But the particulars of this deal make me a little nervous. If you and your husband are willing to accept possibility of things

not working out like you planned—and the fact you might have to take additional jobs for an unknown length of time just to make ends meet—then it might be a play. But for me? Nope. I don't like putting myself into these kinds of situations.

When I was much younger, I was willing to do all kinds of dangerous stuff and ignore the risk. But going broke decades ago knocked that kind of thinking out of me in a hurry. Any deal that runs the risk of leaving you bankrupt, or the victim of a foreclosure, just isn't worth it. Erin.

Our son, Garrett, 34, had open heart surgery on October 24th for a congenital hole in his heart. "I keep dealing with it within trying to push through." "But you don't have to do it alone. If you fall out, we won't know what you were dealing with most recently, and how to help. Talk to us. Let us know."

"You don't know what burden you are carrying until it's lifted."

"Rest is when healing happens."

"I would give my whole heart for my family. I have time of tribulation, Give always been the one to do certain things." "You have always given your whole heart, and you are giving it now by being still enough to heal."

"When you are in another room, in five minutes we will check on

"Call your doctor's nurse or PA and just ask them."

"We will go with your body temperature needs."

"Ok, take my hand and grab me by the elbow, now 1-2-3 Pull." (Great way to make bed adjustments.)

Not Student Friendly

Editor:

Prior to the start of the 2023 fall semester at UNA, it was reported by the *TimesDaily* that the University of North Alabama would consider a resolution to keep tuition for the coming year at the same rate and create a system that streamlines fee costs. It was also reported that UNA has a variety of "676

fees, including special course, general semester, and distance learning fees.

The Times Daily printed an article in 2019 entitled, "4.1% tuition hike includes fees." This article contained the following comment:

"President Ken Kitts called the increase a transparent, true cost of attendance model that includes fee inclusion in the overall tuition cost." The 'and fees' did not include General Studies Fee (GSF) of \$30 per semester credit hour for construction of the baseball/football complex, and the \$150 Dining Dollar Fee (DDF). For a student taking 15 credit hours, the GSF would be \$450; the DDF would be \$150 for a total of \$600. Kitts did not mention these amounts.

The following comments are from The FLOR-ALA student newspaper at UNA: Over the summer, UNA increased the required fees for students 100% or more. For the 2022-23 school years fees were a flat rate of \$30 per credit (GSF). Now depending on one's college major, charges can range from \$60-\$100 per credit hour. Additionally, the DDF has been raised by \$25, from \$150 to \$175."

On a student credit card–good only at UNA–the \$175 is credited.

As students make

purchases on campus, debits are shown on the card. UNA is getting their money first.

Per the noted article, under the new schedule for example, a student in UNA's College of Education and Human Sciences will pay \$60 per credit hour in fees. If taking 15 semester hours a student will pay \$900 in fees. Prior to the new schedule a student taking 15 hours was paying \$450 in fees. This is a \$450 increase.

If enrolled in the UNA's Sanders College of Business and Technology, the student will pay a new fee of \$1,350, an increase of \$900!

If enrolled in UNA's Anderson College of Nursing and Health Professions, the student will pay a new fee of \$1,500, an increase of \$1,050.

Please note that these increases do not include the fees already included in tuition and will raise millions of dollars.

The press release sent to the *TimesDaily* is a joke. It appears the Trustees do not care. All they want is money for the new complex!

This isn't creating a system that streamlines fee costs, and it certainly isn't student friendly.

Medicare Minute

"Prescription Drug Plans"

October 15th through December 7th is a period of time that Medicare has set aside to make changes to your Prescription Drug Plan (PDP) or Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) if you want. Whether you have a Medicare supplement and a stand-alone drug plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan with prescription drug coverage now is the time to review your drug plan for 2023. Like MA plans, drug plans have certain things you want to look at when considering which PDP is best for you. Those things are premium, deductibles, copays, coinsurance and the plan's provider network.

Although the things listed above are most important

Although the things listed above are most important so are the tiers that drugs are place into. So before we discuss the cost of the plans let's look at drug plan tiers. Normally there are five tiers to a drug plan. Tier 1 and Tier 2 drugs are usually your most common generic drugs. Tier 3 drugs are preferred brand, Tier 4 drugs are non-preferred brand and Tier 5 drugs are specialty drugs. One of the most misunderstood parts of a drug plan is the tier a person's drug is in.

Many people we meet with think that if their drug is listed in a certain tier under their current PDP it's the same on all plans. This is not always true. Sometimes, for example, a drug may be listed a Tier 2 under one plan but may be a Tier 3 under another plan. Why is this important? Because in most drug plans the copays are higher for Tier 3 than Tier 2.

You can check the tiers of your drugs by looking at the plan's formulary. The formulary is a list of the drugs that are covered by the plan. You can get the formulary of the plan you are considering by going to the plan's website, going online to Medicare gov or you can visit our office and we can help.



born child.

Some go as far as using the term 'birthing parent,' not embracing the unequivocal scientific fact that only women are able to give birth.

Those are some areas where the lines between candidates and parties are clearly defined.

There may not nickel's worth of difference between candidates on dozens of other issues.

Voting may just be a national exercise in futility anyway from which minimal change will result. Maybe we should better appreciate entertainment the factor of the campaigns themselves.

Most of the candidates like to appear center-left or center-right, anyway.

These days it is all about marketing through agencies that take huge cuts of the tens of billions in campaign cash that will be spent on House. Senate and Presidential races alone in the 2024 cycle.



They are the same advertising giants that market caffeine-laden energy drinks to the sleepdeprived, fast food to the seemingly ravenous, pharmaceuticals to druginsanely dependent society, and convey the importance of environmental sustainability for agricultural conglomerates few concerns about the cancer-laden elements they are filling our bodies

How much faith can we have in corporate behemoths who buy their way into politics or megamedia companies that channel thought anyway?

One news story last week explains it all.

Reuters is the world's largest multimedia news provider, reaching hillions of people worldwide daily. Thev use the tag, "Information you can trust.

However, a November 8 online headline reads,

The fact that we only have legitimate global temperature records for 150 years (and that those are sometimes massaged as needed) doesn't seem to matter.
