# Care Needed for Cooking

FLORENCE - The holiday season is almost here, and it is a time when home cooking activities are at their peak. Unfortunately, all this cooking leads to a related peak in cooking fires. Cooking fires are responsible for nearly half (49%) of all home fires, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). That's why it is critical to know and use safe cooking practices, according to Mike Wesson of SERVPRO of the Quad Cities.

According to the NFPA, Thanksgiving is the leading day of the year for home cooking fires, with more than three times the daily average for such incidents. The fire and water remediation specialists from SERVPRO in the Shoals area urge home cooks to take some basic safety steps recommended by the NFPA to help prevent cooking fires.

- Keep your cooking area clean and keep anything that can burn (dish towels, oven mitts, packaging) at least three feet away from cooking equipment.

- Keep in mind that the leading contributing factor to cooking fires and to fire deaths overall is unattended cooking.

Therefore, plan to be at home and in or near the kitchen at all times when cooking.

More than two-thirds of home cooking fires begin with the ignition of cooking materials, including food, fat, and grease. So the NFPA strongly discourages the use of things like Turkey fryers that use large amounts of oil at high temperatures. "If you do use one, follow all placement, use, and safety instructions carefully," added Wesson.

# **Getting Old** Is Bothersome

an equal number of customers keep what you have. who did not want to buy a new computer because "This one has been working just fine for 10 years!" Our technicians often plead with a customer to not spend money upgrading their old computer.

I get it; you paid a lot of money for that computer years ago and, by golly, it should last a lifetime. Unfortunately, reality doesn't care. So, with the Christmas shopping season fast approaching, here are some tips for when to buy a new computer and when to

The average lifetime of a business computer is 3 - 5 years. Business users have high demands such as being in front of the computer 8 hours-a-day, running word processors, spreadsheets, and multiple tabs open in their browser.

Home users may only use their computer for surfing the web, occasional word processing, and perhaps a game of solitaire. These users may be able to use their computer for up to 8 years.

If your slow computer is less than 5 years old, then it may be worth spending some money on an upgrade. For example, if your computer only has 8GB RAM, spending \$50 to upgrade to 16GB might add some life to your old junker. If your computer takes more than a minute to come alive in the morning, then you probably have a mechanical hard drive. Spending a couple of hundred dollars (parts and labor) in upgrading to a solidstate hard drive will make a tremendous difference and can add years to the life of your computer.

If you're ready to junk it all and upgrade to a new computer, then plan to spend at least \$500 on a new computer. The minimum specifications for a home

user are a 256GB solid-state hard drive and 16GB of RAM. Business users should consult with a computer nerd before spending a dime but generally should budget for at least \$600 -\$800. Technicians can transfer all your data from your old one to a new one making the transition nearly painless. Regardless of business or home use, you get what you pay for with computers so let price be your guide.





# Negotiation, Mediation, Arbitration or Trial

No insurance company will pay money without proof that money is owed. This is especially true in personal injury cases where documentation of medical expenses, injuries, lost wages and other claims is required. Unless the claim is documented, the claim will not be paid.

Your attorney should know the value of the case after becoming thoroughly familiar with the injuries

and medical documents that prove these injuries. A demand letter containing the information needed for an insurance company to evaluate a claim adds to the value of a claim. This letter should address why the other party is at fault and the damages.

At this point negotiation can take place to settle the case. The majority of cases are settled after documentation is obtained and received by the insurance company. This includes documentation of how the bills were paid, whether it was Blue Cross Blue Shield, Medicare, Medicaid or if they were not paid. If the case is filed for trial, most cases are still negotiated for settlement.

Those cases that can't settle are often ordered to mediation by the court. Mediation is an opportunity for all the parties to be present with a mediator who can help the parties reach an enforceable resolution. We mediate a lot of cases. The mediator does not have the authority to decide the case absent an agreement between the parties.

If a case is not settled it is then referred over for a trial. A trial will resolve the issues one way or the other. Outcomes at trial can be good, bad or indifferent. It is that uncertainty that truly promotes settlement through negotiation or mediation. A trial means that a judge decides what law applies and the jury decides what the facts of the case are and then applies the law to the facts to render a decision known as a verdict, stated in dollars, or for the defendant.

Certain types of contracts contain agreements not to go to court but to instead arbitrate. Automobile purchase contracts almost always contain an agreement to arbitrate. These agreements are enforced by the court. During arbitration both parties present evidence that is generally admissible but under a more relaxed evidentiary standard and the arbitrator makes the final decision. Arbitration decisions are generally not reviewable by the courts.

# 6 Steps to Make Thanksgiving Dementia-Friendly

families with and friends nationwide preparing for Thanksgiving. the Alzheimer's Foundation of America (AFA) is offering 6 steps to create dementia-friendly Thanksgiving for the 6 million more than Americans living with Alzheimer's disease or another dementia-related illness.

"We want individuals living with dementia to experience the joy and togetherness that comes

Thanksgiving, why which is important for family caregivers to be proactive and sensitive to their loved ones' needs," said Jennifer Reeder, LCSW, SIFI, AFA's Director of Educational and Social Services. "A few small adaptations can make a big difference in enabling someone with dementia to participate in, and Thanksgiving enjoy, celebrations."

AFA offers the following 6 steps to help make a Thanksgiving

celebration dementiafriendly:

- Factor the person's routine into scheduling the celebration. Changes in daily routine can be challenging for someone living with dementia, to the greatest extent possible, plan the celebration around their routine. Consider holding celebrations earlier in the day to minimize the potential impact of "sundowning" a common syndrome that can cause agitation and confusion in the late afternoon-early evening as the sun sets.
- Plan for help. Relatives and friends are often eager to assist but may not know how. Give them specific tasks that they can help with, such as asking them to bring a dish, help with cooking, shopping, or decorating, or spending time with your loved one while you are preparing for the celebration.
- Prepare your loved one. Try to familiarize them with the guests beforehand by showing photos, sharing stories,

or arranging a phone or Facetime chat prior to the celebration. You could also make an invitation to the event to share with your loved one so they know the details and that it will be happening.

- Prepare your guests. Consider sharing beneficial information with guests about your loved one—such as ways to communicate with the person, what they respond well to, and what may cause distress—especially if they have not seen the person recently. This will help facilitate positive interactions and engagement.
- Keep your loved one involved. Make adaptations that enable your loved one participate in the celebration by focusing on what they can do, rather than what they cannot. Invite them to help by preparing ingredients for a simple dish, setting the table, decorating, and other Playing activities. familiar music or going through old photos are forms of reminiscence

that can bring joy and foster positivity during the celebration. Singing familiar songs, arts and crafts, and having a snack together are great intergenerational activities that kids can participate in as well.

 Have a quiet space available. Prepare a quiet place away from the crowd where the person with dementia can go if the celebration becomes too much for Have familiar them. comfort items available (i.e., favorite blanket, sweater, stuffed animal) that will help them feel safe and comfortable. Try to control the flow

of visitors when possible; those in the early stages are better able to interact than those in later stages.



# **Medicare Minute**

# "Prescription Drug Plans 2"

When looking at a prescription drug plan the first thing that most people look at is how much the plan cost. There are drug plans that cost less than \$20. There are also plans that cost more than \$100. Conventional wisdom tells us that something that cost \$100 has to be better than something that cost \$20, but when talking about Medicare prescription drug plans this isn't necessarily true. You have to look deeper than the premium of the plan to see if it's the right fit for you.

One important part of a drug plan is the deductible phase of the plan. A deductible is the amount of money you must pay out of your pocket before your plan will begin to pay. For example, if your plan has a \$505 deductible you may have to pay the first \$505 before the plan will pay. The good news is plans treat deductibles differently. Some plans have deductibles an ell tions of differently. Some plans have deductibles on all tiers of drugs. On some plans the deductible only pertains to tier 3, 4 or 5 drugs but not tier 1 or 2 drugs. Other plans have no deductible at all. The way to know if your plan has a deductible on the prescriptions you are taking is to look at the plan's Formulary to find your drug's tier and the Summary of Benefits to see if you have a deductible.

You will also want to know if the plan requires you to pay a coinsurance on any of your prescriptions. A coinsurance is a percentage you will pay on your prescription. A lot of plans have a coinsurance on tier 4 and tier 5 prescriptions. This means if you have a coinsurance of 20% on your prescription, and the prescription retails for \$500, you would pay 20% or \$100. Next week we will look at copays, formularies and provider networks.







# The Hidden Danger of **Untreated Heartburn**

Is regular heartburn or acid reflux anything to worry about? I eat a lot of Rolaids throughout the day to help manage it, but it's gotten worse with age and it keeps me up at night too. What can you tell me?

Dear Bob.

Almost everyone experiences heartburn or acid reflux from time to time, but frequent episodes can signal a much more serious problem. It's estimated that more than 60 million Americans experience heartburn at least once a month, with around 15 million people who suffer from it daily.

Heartburn symptoms show up in a variety of ways - as a burning pain behind the breastbone, indigestion, or a sour or burning taste in the back of the throat. Other symptoms may include chest pain, excessing belching, a long-term cough, sore throat or hoarseness.

If you're plagued by heartburn two or more times a week, and it's not responding well to over-the-counter antacids you need to see your doctor, who may refer you to a gastroenterologist. Frequent bouts may mean you have gastroesophageal reflux disease, or GERDs, which can severely irritate and damage the lining of your esophagus, putting you at risk of Barrett's esophagus and esophageal cancer if it's not treated.

### Lifestyle Adjustments

Depending on the frequency and severity of your heartburn, there are a number of lifestyle adjustments you can make that can help provide relief and avoid a more serious problem down the road, such as:

- Avoid trigger foods: Some foods can trigger heartburn symptoms like citrus fruits, tomatoes, fatty foods, chocolate, garlic, onions, spicy foods, mints, alcohol, coffee and sodas. You should keep a food diary to track which foods cause you the most problems and avoid them.
- Eat smaller, slower and earlier: Smaller portions at mealtime and eating slower can help reduce heartburn symptoms. You should also wait at least three hours after eating before lying down or going to bed.
- Lose weight: Having excess weight around the midsection puts pressure on the abdomen, pushing up the stomach and causing acid to back up into the esophagus.
- Quit smoking: Smoking can increase stomach acid and weaken the valve that prevents acid from entering the esophagus.
- Sleep elevated: To help keep the acid down while sleeping, get a wedge-shaped pillow to prop yourself up a few inches. If that's not enough, try elevating the head of your bed six to eight inches by placing blocks under the bedposts or insert a wedge between your mattress and box spring. Wedges are available at drugstores and medical supply stores. Sleeping on the left side may also help keep the acid down.

### **Treatment Options**

If the lifestyle adjustments don't solve the problem, or if antacids (Tums, Rolaids, Maalox, Mylanta or Alka-Seltzer) aren't doing the trick, there are a variety of over the counter (OTC) and

prescription medications that can help, including: **H-2 Blockers:** Available as both OTC and prescription strength, these drugs (Pepcid, Tagamet, Axid and Zantac) reduce how much acid your stomach makes but may not be strong enough for serious symptoms.

Proton-Pump Inhibitors (PPI): If you have frequent and severe heartburn symptoms PPIs are long-acting prescription medications that block acid production and allow time for damaged esophageal tissue to heal. They include Nexium, Prevacid, Prilosec, Zegerid, Protonix, Aciphex and Dexilant. Prevacid, Nexium, Prilosec and Zegerid are also available OTC. But be aware that long-term use of PPIs can increase your risk for osteoporosis and chronic kidney disease.

If the medications aren't enough, there are also surgical procedures that can tighten or strengthen the lower esophageal sphincter so gastric fluids can't wash back up into the esophagus.






