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

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

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Advertising Premiums

Toys have been used as advertising premiums for more than 100 years, from the cloth dolls that first appeared in the 19th century and baseball cards initially issued by tobacco companies to Cracker Jack prizes and more recent toys in cereal boxes or kids' fast-food meals.

This "Log Cabin Express" toy, which sold for \$150 at an online auction on AntiqueAdvertising.com, is an unusual case: the tin can of Log Cabin syrup didn't come with a toy, it became the toy! The rolling platform was the premium. It attaches to the empty tin to turn it into a pull toy. The tin was already eye-catching with its cabin shape and colorful lithographs. One side is marked as "Table Size," suggesting consumers "Serve From The Can." Long before today's environmental concerns and zero-waste movements, this company encouraged reusing its packaging. After all, why make a brightly colored figural tin if it's only going to be thrown away?

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





Books as Brain Food

Now here's a "novel" way to increase our brain function. It doesn't involve getting more exercise or eating certain foods. It doesn't include doing puzzles. We only need to grab a book and start flipping pages.

Emory University did a study that showed how there are "quantifiable changes" in brain activity when participants read a book. Granted, it was a bit more regimented than just grabbing your favorite author's latest bestseller.

In the study, participants were given a baseline brain scan each day for a few days. Then they were given the thriller "Pompeii" by Robert Harris with instructions to read 30 pages a night. Each morning they were given another brain scan. After the book was finished (about nine days), they were given more scans to see how the brain reacted. Researchers were able to track which portions of the book the participants were reading and correlate them to the brain scan images.

Here's what they learned: During reading, and for days afterward, there were significant activity increases in the parts of the brain associated with story comprehension, as well as processing language.

According to the study, the reading has to be fiction to get these brain connectivity changes, something with a narrative that describes events unfolding, and a story we can identify with.

Here's my thinking: While researchers don't know yet how long these brain changes last after reading a novel, it's at least five days. Perhaps we should spend some time in 2024 re-reading the novels that had an impact on us, as well as new narrative fiction and a few of the old classics. The reference librarian is sure to be a good source for book suggestions.



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

- ½ teaspoon peppermint extract
- ¼ teaspoon vanilla extract
- teaspoon salt
- 4 cups powdered sugar plus additional as
- needed for rolling and fork imprints
- food coloring optional

Instructions

Line two large baking sheets with parchment paper, wax paper, or silicone baking mats. Set aside.

In a large bowl with a handheld mixer or the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, beat the cream cheese, melted butter, peppermint extract, vanilla extract, and salt on medium speed until completely combined.

Reduce the mixer to low then slowly add the powdered sugar, stopping to scrape down the sides and bottom of the bowl as needed. The mixture will become stiff, but keep mixing. After all of the powdered sugar has been added, the consistency should be like PlayDoh and not sticky. If it is still lumpy, stir it with a large spatula to bring the mixture together. Cover the bowl then allow the cream cheese mint dough to rest for 10 minutes. If coloring your mints: if you are using just one color for your cream cheese mints, you can use your mixer to beat the color into the dough. If you want to do more than one color, divide the dough into as many bowls as you need, cover the bowl when it's not in use, and stir desired color into each portion until fully blended. Using a ½ teaspoon measure or mini cookie scoop with a trigger, drop small balls2 of cream cheese mints onto prepared baking sheets. Use your hands to form each mound into a ball, rolling between your palms/fingers gently until smooth and uniform. Place back onto baking sheet. Use a bit of powdered sugar on your hands if the warmth of them is melting the balls or making them too sticky.

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Dip the tines of a fork in powdered sugar and gently but firmly press down on each mint with a rocking motion to imprint lines across each mint.

Allow mints to dry at room temperature for about 3 hours (or until dry to the touch) then chill in the refrigerator at least 2 hours before serving. Store mints in airtight containers in single layers with a sheet of wax or parchment paper between them to keep from sticking together for up to 2 weeks. Mints freeze well, up to 3 months. Thaw in the refrigerator.


