








# Schools in West Kern Consortium See Significant Growth



Lost Hills Union Elementary, Maple Elementary, and Semitropic Elementary Schools Districts have been working in partnership as the West Kern Consortium (WKC) for Full Service Community Schools, and have seen more growth than any other local district or

charter school in Kern. Per 2023 California Smarter Balanced Summative Assessment data release, most school districts in California have struggled to catch up to their pre-pandemic numbers while WKC excels.

A full-service community school model centers the school as the community hub: a one-stop shop for support and services. Community schools are an evidence-based strategy for school improvement that leverage the resources and voices of the community to support the whole child. The WKC districts focus their educational plan on five priority areas: early childhood education, math and literacy education, expanded learning programs, family and community engagement, and social and mental health services.

"It really does take a village to get to this level. But, we want the world to know that it is possible," says Assistant Superintendent and project director for the consortium Fidelina Saso says. "Children, no matter their life circumstances, are capable of learning at higher levels. We must lead with this in mind if we are going to get our goal as the highest performing district in Kern County." Since WKC's inception, the consortium has grown to include Elk Hills Elementary, Wasco Union High School, and Taft Union High School Districts. WKC predicts these schools will make similar gains in due time, with some already showing seeds of success.

# Bakersfield College Hosts Inaugural College Rodeo Competition

Bakersfield College's Rodeo Team recently hosted its first National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA) Collegiate Rodeo at the Kern County Fairgrounds. Student athletes from several colleges including Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, Fresno State, University of Nevada Las Vegas, and others came to

Tips to Prepare for Flu Season



Influenza is more common than people may realize. Data from the World Health Organization indicates there are around one billion cases of seasonal influenza each year. Though only a small fraction of those cases result in severe illness, even a mild case of the flu can be unpleasant and disruptive.

The phrase "flu prevention" may be somewhat misleading, as the best people can do is reduce their risk for seasonal influenza. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the best way to do that is to get vaccinated against the flu each year. Each year's flu shot is different, as researchers design the vaccination based on which strand of influenza they anticipate will be most prevalent in a given year. In addition to getting vaccinated, individuals can consider these tips, courtesy of the CDC, to protect themselves and others from the flu and stop the spread of germs.

• Steer clear of close contact. Individuals who are sick can steer clear of close contact with other people in order to safeguard them from the flu. On the flip side, people who live or work with individuals who have the flu can avoid close contact as well.

- **Don't be a hero.** The CDC urges anyone who is sick with the flu to stay home until their illness subsides. Avoid going to school, work and running errands so you can help to prevent the virus from spreading.
- Cover up. The CDC notes that the flu virus spreads primarily through droplets produced when people with influenza cough, sneeze or talk. When around others, cover your mouth and nose, particularly when sneezing or coughing. When you have to sneeze or cough, do so into the cradle of your elbow. Coughing into your hands could help to spread the virus, as germs can transfer from your hand onto surfaces others may touch, like doorknobs and handles.
- Routinely wash your hands. Make it a habit to wash your hands regularly. When returning home, wash your hands before you do anything else. This is especially important when returning home from places where lots of people tend to congregate, such as grocery stores and restaurants. Lathering hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds can help get rid of germs. If soap and water is not available, the CDC recommends using an alcohol-based hand rub.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. The CDC notes that germs spread when people touch contaminated surfaces or objects and then touch their eyes, nose or mouth. It's easy to touch your eyes, nose or mouth without even thinking about it, but make a concerted effort to avoid touching these areas to safeguard yourself and others from the flu.



- 1 Cup Soft Shortening Butter Flavored
- 1 1/2 Cups Granulated White Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 2 3/4 Cups Sifted All Purpose Flour
- 2 Tsp. Cream of Tartar 1 Tsp Baking Soda
- ½ Tsp Salt
- 2 Tbsp Cinnamon
- 2 Tbsp Sugar



#### **Directions:**

Stir together Sifted flour, Cream of tartar, Baking soda, Salt

Mix the wet ingredients with the dry ingredients slowly. Mix well.

Refrigerate the combined dough for 1 hour.

Roll into 1-1.5" balls.

Roll the balls in the cinnamon and sugar and coat well.

Place balls 2" apart on ungreased cookie sheet (or use silicone baking mat).

Bake until lightly browned, but still soft.

375 Degrees for about 7 minutes

Pull cookies out of oven – let sit 3-5 minutes before transferring them to a cookie sheet.

# Spreading Holiday Check for 50 Years! North of the River Christmas Parade Marches Toward a Milestone



It's been a hometown holiday tradition since 1973. This year the North of the River Christmas Parade is celebrating 50 years of filling the streets of Oildale with Christmas cheer.

"Our Christmas Parade embodies our unwavering dedication to the North of the River community," said Jasmin LoBasso, superintendent of recreation and community services for the North of the River Recreation and Park District, which organizes the parade. "It's incredibly important to us to celebrate and preserve the legacy of the parade."

The parade will celebrate its golden jubilee, with the theme NOR Parades of Past, Present, and Future (A Christmas Carol). But don't expect Ebenezer Scrooge and his Bah, Humbug attitude to rain on this parade. Organizers are pulling out all the stops to create a festive holiday atmosphere worthy of a 50th anniversary celebration.

Over the past few months, NOR invited members of the community to submit memories of the parade in the form of written stories, photos, audio clips, or videos. Select memories will be part of a digital storytelling exhibition celebrating the Oildale and North of the River communities.

"Oildale holds a very special place in our heart; it's where NOR was born," said LoBasso. "Some of our earliest parks and facilities, including the Riverview Community Center and Standard Park, continue to provide recreation space to the community."

There is no shortage of nostalgia, when it comes to this decades old tradition. The first parade took place on December 15, 1973, making it the oldest Christmas parade in Bakersfield. Originally called "Children's Christmas Parade" it featured participants dressed up as storybook characters.

Although the themes, music and participants have changed throughout the years one thing remains the same. The NOR Christmas Parade is powered by people. During the energy crisis of the 1970s, NOR decided the parade would be non-motorized in an effort to save fuel. Since then organizers have maintained the tradition and the practice has become a point of pride.

"What makes the parade so unique is that it retains that festive quality that made parades of the past so enjoyable. As a traditional marching parade, it emphasizes engagement, community celebration, and brings you back to an era of nostalgic holiday celebrations," said LoBasso.

Ruben Musquez began attending the parade back in 1984, when he starting working for the North of the River Recreation and Park District as a custodian. He was quickly tasked with coordinating set up, crowd control and directing traffic on the day of the event. For Ruben, the holiday tradition is all about bringing the community together.

"It's great for the kids, and it's great for the community. I think there's a lot of community pride with this event especially for people living in the Oildale area. It's something the whole family can enjoy and that's why people keep coming back year after year," said Musquez.

The 2023 North of the River Christmas Parade will be held on December 9 at 10 a.m. It takes place on North Chester Avenue, kicking off at NOR Park and passing multiple notable historical sites, including North High School, the Rathbun Library, Standard School District and Standard Park. 

#### PREPARING FOR CHRISTMAS

"Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the Lord, and he will reward them for what they have done."

#### **Proverbs 19:17 NIV**

As we prepare to celebrate Christmas, many of us will be preparing to travel, or preparing our homes to welcome loved ones. This parallels what Christmas celebrates, for Jesus' family, Mary and Joseph, were also undertaking a journey, one with unexpected complications. Recall that when Mary and Joseph found no room in the Inn on the eve of Jesus' birth, Mary was forced to give birth in a field, after which she wrapped Jesus in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, which is a feeding trough for domesticated animals. The hay that Jesus was laid upon was fodder for sheep or cattle, and although we usually picture the manger as made of wood, in Biblical times mangers were more often made from clay mixed with straw or from stones held together with mud. It is hard to imagine the modern equivalent of this, but it was probably more like giving birth in the open and then placing the newborn in a wheelbarrow rather than being born in a barn or even a shed. As we consider this, we really ought to consider opening our hearts and homes (and our wallets) to the homeless, as this is precisely what Jesus' family was at this time. "Homeless" or "unhoused" or however we choose to describe them, they had nothing but the clothes on their backs, and even the swaddling cloths which Mary wrapped him in were probably borrowed from the shepherds, who used strips of cloths to wrap the lambs. It is interesting to consider how this family would be treated today in similar circumstances. Would they be helped, or would they be arrested for trespassing, or perhaps referred to a social services agency? As we prepare for Christmas, consider reaching out to the least fortunate among us. This can be as simple as buying a sandwich for someone or giving a nice tip to a service worker, or perhaps helping someone with their luggage on public transportation.


