extraction and finishing operation and sends out about In the Rossburg area of Aitkin County, APT, American 500 truckloads of peat each year. It is used for soil and turf Peat Technology, operates an enhancement, row crops, and now, for flavoring whiskey.

> The Minnesota whiskey product, which is infused with peat prior to aging, has taken the luxury whiskey market by storm, winning awards and making inroads in the Chicago market.

Phil Steiger, a graduate of St. John's University, has a whiskey enterprise in Northeast Minneapolis called Brother Justice Whiskey. His vision was to have everything sourced locally in Minnesota, so the oak barrels his product is aged in, the peat, the barley and the water are all homegrown. Rather than smoking and burning in the flavor, the finished whiskey is infused with the granular peat made in Aitkin County, giving it an earthy flavor. "It's a new way for people to enjoy whiskey," said Brad Pieper, the CEO at APT since December 2022.

Brother Justice was a blacksmith at St. John's Abbey who taught farmers how to make whiskey during Prohibition. It was a way for residents of Stearns, Benton and Sherburne counties to make a living when legal alcohol markets were dried up.

Right now, with the twoyear aging process, Brother Justice works hard to keep up with demand that sometimes outpaces supply. But APT keeps up its end of the deal, supplying its patented Torv Rok reed sedge peat prod-

uct to the distillery. Brother Justice is also in the process of patenting the Aitkin County Process of producing Cold-Peated American Single Malt Whiskey.

"We look at continuing to grow with Brother Justice and other distillers," explained Pieper. "Soon, you will probably hear about cold-peated Jack Daniels and cold-peated Jim Beam."

APT harvests peat from about eight acres each year and, through its manufacturing processes, produces a granular product, like coffee grounds, and another powdery product with the consistency of cinnamon. They supply their product to the soil-enhancement industry for row crops, golf courses, stadiums and more. The three Canadian customers for local peat are Novozymes, Verdesian and Lallemand.



"We have an open-door policy - we encourage people to come out and tour the plant and taste the whiskey," said Pieper.

Agreement with Amazon causes harsh conditions for postal workers

> For years, Minnesotans have experienced mail de

lays and inconsistency, and postal employees have faced difficult working conditions, made worse by a volume of Amazon deliveries that push the system to the brink.

Millions of Minnesotans depend on the Postal Service to pay bills, receive prescriptions, and conduct other essential business. When service is unreliable, Minnesotans can face serious consequences – from late payment fees and social security checks to days without critical prescription medications.

"As Postmaster General, you are responsible for ensuring that the Postal Service meets its service standards, and it is clear right now that things are not working as they should," wrote Senator Smith. "Entering into contracts that your system cannot support is a breach of your responsibilities."

Reporting by the Bemidji Pioneer uncovered how harsh working conditions and the implementation of a USPS service agreement with Amazon have pushed mail carriers to the breaking point. Workers are being forced to work 12-hour days for six days per week, time off requests are being cancelled, and sick leave is not being honored. Bemidji isn't the first Min-

nesota community to be affected by this new agreement with Amazon – Brainerd saw similar delays after it was implemented and continues to struggle maintaining enough staff. In her letter, Senator

Smith presses for answers from DeJoy on how he plans to remedy both the impact of Amazon's service agreement and the working conditions at the Postal Service so Minnesotans receive on-time deliveries. This letter comes after the Senator pressed Postmaster DeJoy:

To take every precaution to prepare for the influx of holiday packages;

For answers about a payroll error that led to 53,000 rural letter carriers missing or receiving only a partial paycheck; and,

For answers to widespread missing and delayed mail deliveries across Minnesota. The text of the letter:

As Postmaster General, you are responsible for ensuring that the Postal Service meets its service standards, and it is clear right now that things are not working as they should. Entering into contracts that your system cannot support is a breach of your responsibilities.





Seasonal reminder to all about dangers of thin ice and cold water



Unseasonably warm weather during the first half of November means many lakes and ponds remain free of ice, but the water is dangerously cold. The Minnesota Department of Natural

Resources urges parents and guardians to talk with kids about the risks of cold water.

Falls into open water this time of year can turn tragic quickly, and the effects of cold water mean even strong swimmers likely will find it in how their bodies react difficult to save themselves from an unexpected fall. Parents and guardians need to be especially vigilant about watching kids and ensuring their innate curiosity about the water doesn't put them

Capt. Adam Block, boating law administrator with the DNR Enforcement Division. says kids - or people new to Minnesota - might not understand the difference to cold water vs. warm water. He urges parents and guardians to talk with their children and neighbors about staying away from lakes, ponds and rivers this time of year unless there's an adult supervising.

The best way to stay safe around cold water is to wear a life jacket (foam is better than an inflatable in cold water). Block also recommends people carry a phone or other communications device to call for help, to let others know where they're going

and when they plan to return, and to be prepared to deal with an unforeseen incident.

Winter walleye fishing regulations for Upper Red, Mille Lacs lakes

Anglers are reminded that the walleye limit for Upper Red Lake decreased from the five allowed during open water season to four this winter while the Mille Lacs Lake walleye limit will remain at

The Upper Red Lake regulation became effective Nov. 1. Anglers fishing on the state waters of Upper Red Lake can keep up to four walleye with one longer than 17 inches. Beginning Friday, Dec. 1, Mille Lacs Lake anglers can keep one walleye 21-23 inches long or one longer than 28

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources sets winter regulations for these lakes after completion of annual fall population assessments. Results from Upper Red Lake showed a very strong level of walleye spawning stock and a high overall net catch rate, especially of nearly mature walleye. Mille Lacs' results found slightly lower walleye numbers than in 2022. But the continued strong presence of walleye born in 2013 and 2017 and acceptable numbers

of walleye born in 2021 and 2022 suggest there are adequate numbers of younger fish to keep the population sustainable as they mature and reproduce to replace fish caught by anglers. Complete winter fishing


