

## **Energy Saving Tips For Winter**

Look at these tips to save money on winter energy expenses and help winterize your home wherever you live.

You've probably gotten out your winter coat and gloves now it's time to winterize your home too. Chilly mornings and potential precipitation also may equal rising gas and electric bills. #### Winterize your furnace

Your HVAC system doesn't need a weekly cleaning like the rest of your home, but it does need a HVAC tune-up at least

Set up a service call so a technician can make sure all parts and pieces are in good working order.

Change filters monthly.

Winterize your water lines

If you have any plumbing lines that are in uninsulated spaces or against an outside wall, cover them in pipe insulation foam (readily available at hardware stores).

#### Other saving tips

Swap out holiday lights. Widely available LED lights are also wallet-friendly, and have the added bonus of a longer life, too. According to energy gov they only use 20% to 25% of the energy and last 15 to 25 times longer.

Take advantage of solar rays. Open curtains on southfacing windows during the day to soak up the sun's heat.

## **Turbines Up** at Colbert

TUSCUMBIA- The Tennessee Valley Authority celebrated the expansion of the Colbert Combustion Turbine Plant recently with over 100 dignitaries attended the dedication event and touring the state-of-the-art facility in Tuscumbia.

The expansion demonstrates TVA's commitment to providing affordable, reliable, and clean energy to meet increasing demand in north Alabama.

Construction
began on the Colbert
Combustion Turbine
Plant in the summer of
2021, with more than
one million hours of
work safely dedicated
to the project. These
hours were worked
with no significant
environmental events,
no OSHA serious events,
and no lost-time injuries.

TVA started commercial operation of three new units on July 25 of this year, ahead of schedule, and under budget. The additional 750 megawatts at Colbert provides enough dispatchable electricity

to power more than 400,000 homes.

"These units provide needed flexibility, responsiveness, and reliability for the power grid," said Roger Waldrep, Vice President of Major Projects. "They allow us to meet demand during peak periods, like the extremely hot days we experienced in August and September and the upcoming cold nights that are ahead this winter."

TVA plans to invest \$15 billion over the next three years to build additional generation and upgrade the existing system to ensure the region continues to benefit from affordable, reliable power.



to weave. They would teach each other, share different methods of the craft, and create woven works while visiting with one another. Today, the artwork of finger weaving is worn as a part of regalia for both men and women during times of cultural celebration and to carry on tradition. It is practiced by individuals and passed down from generation to generation to keep the cultural practices alive.

## **Medicare Minute**

## "Year-end Reminders"

We have spent the past two months discussing the Medicare Annual Enrollment Period. We have talked about Medicare health plans. We have covered the different types of health plans and how to choose the one that may be best for you. We also discussed Medicare prescription drug plans and how they can change and need to be reviewed each year. But, just because the Annual Enrollment Period is over doesn't mean you can go to sleep at the wheel. There are some things you need to stay on top of.

To begin with you should make sure you have received your enrollment card from each insurance company you signed up with. If you enrolled into a Medicare Supplement and prescription drug plan you should have received two cards. One card from the company handling your supplement and another card from the company handling your drug plan. If you enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan you should have received one card and that's from the company your Advantage plan is with.

The second thing to verify is your premium is coming from the appropriate place such as your bank account or Social Security check. You may not know this until January. If the premium is taken out of your bank account, for example, and you don't see it deducted in January you will want to contact the company. You don't want to go two or three months without paying the premium and then have to pay those months at one time. It's better to address it up front.

between Toledo and Wyoming on December 30 can be had for \$12 each. Tickets can be found for as little as \$19 for Auburn and Maryland in Nashville's Music City Bowl. It appears like they are begging for some butts in the seats.

Tickets for some other random games are more like what would be expected.

Cotton Bowl tickets for Missouri and Ohio State for as little as \$124 each.

Peach Bowl tickets for Ole Miss vs Penn St are as low as \$94.

Orange Bowl tickets for Georgia vs. Florida State selling for as little as \$121

Then the minimum ticket prices jump for the playoff semifinals, Rose Bowl (\$440), Sugar Bowl (\$403).

The college football national playoff championship tickets on January 8 are as little as \$1,250-\$1,400 each. (And you'll need your oxygen tank and binoculars for most of those seats anyway.) Some lowerlevel end zone – 10 yard line seats range from about \$2,000 each for 1-3

seats to \$7,600 each in larger blocks. Most of the better seats are no longer available.

None of that includes airfare, accommodations, transportation, meals, gratuities, or souvenirs.

Those playoff events might be a nice once-ina-lifetime trip, but there is a lot of expense, a lot of walking, and a lot of traffic.

At those prices, the concept of a widescreen television, a choice selection of food, snacks, and drink 15 feet away with no lines, friends, record/rewind functions, AND nearby restrooms, appears VERY attractive. That can be at home or at your favorite sports gathering place, like 306 Barbecue or Birdy's Sports Grill in Muscle Shoals — Both are sponsors of the Game

Day Scorecard Contest this year.

Now, if we can be sure one of our local cable providers won't be "in negotiations' with certain networks and temporarily off the air, we will be in great shape.

The college football playoff expands to 12 teams next year. So, the possibility exists that one or two teams could play four games in the postseason. I am not sure how many dedicated fans can afford travel to four consecutive playoff games in a month.



## How to Ease the Winter Blues

Dear Savvy Senior,

What can you tell me about seasonal affective disorder? I've always disliked winter, but since I retired and am home a lot more, the gray, cold winter months make me feel really blue.

If you get depressed in the winter but feel better in spring and summer, you may indeed have seasonal affective disorder, or SAD, a wintertime depression that affects roughly 5 percent of

In most cases, SAD is related to the loss of sunlight in the winter months. Reduced sunlight can upset natural sleep-wake cycles and other circadian rhythms that can affect the body. It can also cause a drop in the brain chemical serotonin, which affects mood, and can increase the levels of the hormone melatonin, which can make you feel more tired and lethargic.

If you think you may have SAD, a trip to your doctor's office is the best way to diagnose it or you can take a SAD "selfassessment" test at the Center for Environmental Therapeutics website at CET.org/assessments. If you find that you have SAD, here are several treatment options and remedies that can help.

**Light therapy:** The most effective treatment for SAD is sitting in front of a specialized light therapy box for 20 to 30 minutes a day, within the first hour of waking up in the morning. Light therapy mimics outdoor light to cause a change in brain chemicals linked to mood.

While you can buy a light box without a prescription, it's best to use it under the guidance of a health care provider and follow the manufacturer's guidelines. Most health insurance plans do not cover the cost.

The best light therapy lamps provide 10,000 lux of illumination, many times stronger than typical indoor light, and have a diffuser screen that filters out ultraviolet rays and projects downward toward the eyes.

Some top-rated light therapy products include the Carex Day-Light Classic Plus Bright Lamp (\$145); Northern Light Technology Boxelite-OS (\$205); and the budget friendly Verilux HappyLight Luxe (\$70), all of which are available at Amazon.

Cognitive behavioral therapy: Even though SAD is considered to be a biological problem, identifying and changing thought and behavior patterns can help alleviate symptoms too. To help you with this, choose a therapist who specializes in cognitive behavioral therapy and who has experience in treating SAD. To locate someone in your area, Psychology Today offers a search tool at PsychologyToday.com/us/therapists/cognitivebehavioral-cbt.

Antidepressants: Some people with SAD benefit from antidepressant treatments too. Some proven medications to ask your doctor about are selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRIs) and the extended-release antidepressant bupropion.

But keep in mind that it may take several weeks to notice full benefits from an antidepressant. In addition, you may have to try different medications before you find one that works well for you and has the fewest side effects.

Lifestyle remedies: Some other things you can do to help alleviate your SAD symptoms include making your environment sunnier and brighter. So, open up your blinds, sit closer to bright windows and get outside as much as you can. Even on cold or cloudy days, outdoor light can help, especially if you spend some time outside within two hours of getting up in the morning.

Moderate exercise such as walking, swimming, yoga and even tai chi can also help alleviate SAD symptoms, as can social

## Black Americans Need Better Immigration Policy

Growing up on the rural farms of Halifax, Virginia, I pulled tobacco just like my great-grandfather Roosevelt, a sharecropper who provided for his family until he died in his late 80s. Just a generation before him, his father was a slave.

In the late 1990s, as I edged closer to high school graduation, I noticed a shift in the farm workforce. My fellow laborers were increasingly immigrants, rather than Black Americans like me.

It wasn't until later that I realized that the labor market changes I'd witnessed in my hometown were lowerwage immigrant workers displacing Black Americans, a nationwide phenomenon that had occurred several times throughout American history.

Reducing immigration is not a cure-all for the plights of Black Americans. But it's an immediate, tangible action that Congress could take -- one that, over the last 200 years, has been repeatedly proven to tighten labor markets

and improve workers' bargaining power.

Since the end of the Civil War, African Americans have repeatedly made progress in closing racial wealth and income gaps—only to see that progress reversed by waves of immigration crashing onto U.S. shores to supply businesses with cheap labor

This is not the fault of the immigrants themselves. Rather, the fault lies squarely with those elected officials who've allied themselves with Big Business, allowing the dilution of Black workers' bargaining power by importing cheap, desperate laborers by the tens of millions. The problem won't be fixed until Black voters hold those policymakers accountable at the ballot box.

In the decades after emancipation, Black Americans became essential workers in the factories of a rapidly industrializing nation. Their standard of living improved, despite pervasive racism.

But towards the end of the 19th century, the flow of legal immigrants -- increasingly from southern and eastern Europe -- turned into a torrent. These desperate arrivals, who were willing to accept virtually any job at any wage, pushed Black workers out of many jobs.

Many of the Black leaders of the time, from Booker T. Washington to W. E. B. Du Bois to A. Philip Randolph, pleaded with policymakers to restrict immigration — a historical fact that's little known today, but amply demonstrated in Back of the Hiring Line, a book by Roy Beck, the founder of my organization.

In the 1920s, a multiracial coalition of Americans succeeded in pressuring Congress to scale back immigration.

The slowdown in foreign migration enabled Black workers to reclaim the gains they'd lost. Between 1940 and 1980, Black wages quadrupled. The percentage of Black men considered middle class skyrocketed from 22% to 71%.

Unfortunately, Black workers lost ground after Congress reopened the cheap labor spigot with the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1965 and turned it full throttle with subsequent legislation throughout the 1980s and 1990s. Between 1979 and 2019, the median

wage of Black workers rose only 5.2%, while white workers' earnings swelled by 20%.

Economists have pointed to the increased immigration between 1980 and 2000 as the cause of 60% of the relative wage decline, while 25% of the decline was in employment, and 10% of the rise was in incarceration rates among less-educated Blacks

I m m i g r a t i o n 's crowding-out effect continues. The Economist recently covered the replacement of African American agricultural workers in Mississippi -- in a county that's 70% Black -- by white South Africans brought here on H-2A guestworker visas.

Scaling back immigration would help the African American descendants of slaves, who have all too often been consigned to the back of the hiring line by businesses seeking the cheapest and most pliable labor allowed by elected officials who make and enforce immigration policy.

## The 340B Drug Discount Program is for THE POOR, Not Megaprofits

Corporate greed is a powerful motivator. When our lawmakers draft legislation, they really ought to have special committee evaluate how corporations might exploit it.

No such committee exists, though. And that's one reason a program enacted in 1992 to give poor and underserved populations better access to costly prescription drugs has turned into multibillion-dollar boondoggle for hospital mega-chains.

It's high time for Congress to restore the 340B drug discount program to its intended

purpose.
The 340B program hospitals, allows specified clinics, and other "safety net" providers to purchase outpatient prescription drugs at significant discounts. Theoretically,

providers could pass along these savings to their underserved patients by charging them less for medications or reinvesting in services and facilities for those in need.

But nothing requires them to do that. So, very often, they don't. Instead, they use the discounts to pad their profits.

Though 340B participants get drugs at a discount, they can still seek reimbursement from commercial insurers, Medicare, and uninsured patients at the much higher market rates. On average, for example, hospitals price top oncology drugs 4.9 times higher than their discounted acquisition

The number of entities e to receive discounts has eligible skyrocketed since the program's inception. Originally. only hospitals that served a "disproportionate share" of low-income Medicare or Medicaid patients, as

well as certain specified clinics, were eligible to participate. amounted to only a few thousand providers.

The program expanded over the years but really took off in the mid-2000s. Large hospital groups discovered they could claim 340B discount pricing even for clinics serving wealthier patients. By expanding the number of 340B entities, they could maximize profits without spending a dime on populations in need.

Today, more than 50,000 hospitals, affiliated clinics, and other providers claim 340B discounts.

the number As of participating organizations has risen, so too has the grift. Discounted purchases accounted for about \$4 billion per year in 2009 but increased more than tenfold by 2022, to \$54 billion.

All of this wouldn't necessarily be cause for

providers passed along their savings to patients. But study after study has shown that large hospital systems and big pharmacies are the primary beneficiaries of 340B discounts. And these entities are pocketing the profits at the expense of low-income patients.

It's time for Congress to act. The need for the 340B program -- to help underserved populations receive quality care remains just as pressing today as it was in 1992.

Reforming the 340B discount drug program should be a bipartisan priority. Let's close the loopholes, increase the oversight, re-examine which hospitals should qualify, and ensure that hospitals re-invest their savings into helping those who need it most.


Dear Dave.

## Single? No Kids? Who Will Handle **Your Estate** Planning?

We write a lot of wills for veterans and other first responders such as police officers, fire fighters, and paramedics. We do this as a community service and most lawyers do some work for the community pro bono (free).

I've always enjoyed talking to people about how to resolve estate issues. There are a lot of solutions that lawyers learn in law school and

as they practice law. Usually, a lawyer can come up with a solution to problems that people have. There are a certain number of solutions that the law provides for in estate planning.

Single people without children often don't know who will handle their estate. They want someone trustworthy, and they worry about honesty and reliability.

You can also go to the American Bar Association website (americanbar.org) and search for "estate planning info and FAQs.

Years ago, I represented an estate where a teacher who taught in the Florence City School System for over 40 years tried to save money by typing her own will. She named a financial institution as her executor, but that financial institution went out of business. The successor corporation (the one that took its place) charged the estate eight (8) percent. It was extremely expensive, and two of her three children were teachers and the other an engineer. All well qualified. It cost a lot of money because she tried to save a little money.

A financial planner can handle your affairs. An attorney can handle your affairs. As a hard and fast rule this law firm would not act as an executor of an estate other than in some exceptional circumstances.

Think about trustworthy friends or extended family. Maybe the person who handles your estate is your best friend. And if you're both getting older, maybe it could be your best friend's child. Sometimes people have such strained relationships with their children that it just makes more sense to name someone else to handle their affairs after they are gone.




