Hudrlik Flooring makes room for Cana Wine Bar in Crosby

The Cuyuna Lakes Chamber of Commerce welcomed a new business, the Cana Wine Bar, to Crosby on Tuesday with a ribbon cutting ceremony.

Owners Mark and Kolly Hudrlik have been busy with the last minute details of their new venture, which is located in the front building at 64-1st Ave. SW.

The Cana Wine Bar features wine by the glass or bottle from many different regions of the world, Minnesota domestic and craft beers by the can, and charcuterie boards with meat, breads and cheeses from various areas around the world.

In the last few weeks before they could open, the Hudrliks needed to wait for the software integration to connect the automated wine dispenser from Italy.



In addition, the Hudrliks were challenged to select wines that would suite a variety of customers from a \$9 bottle of wine to the more sophisticated \$300 bottle.

"Everyone has a unique and special taste from sweet whites to dry reds," Mark Hudrlik said in a press release.

To help them with their selection, the Hudrliks invited a few oenophiles (people who appreciate wine) to taste the variety of wines to feature on the menu and in the wine dispensing machine for the wine tastings.

The idea of a wine bar

was not as much about the wine as it was about the experience.

"Over the past few years, we have been fortunate to visit wineries from around this country, the world and local state wineries," said Mark. "Meeting the owners, wine makers and seeing their passion for the art of wine and seeing the talent we have even in our own state of Minnesota has been an incredible experience. Our hope is to bring that experience and excitement to our own community to enjoy. We are anxious and excited to start this new journey with all of you."

The Cana Wine Bar name came about when the Hudrlik's family and friends would gather on Wednesdays (Wine Wednesdays) to explore different wines from around the world.

The DNR sets winter regulations for these lakes after completion of annual fall population assessments. Results from Upper Red showed an optimal level of walleye spawning stock and a high overall net catch rate, especially of nearly mature walleye.

Mille Lacs' results found slightly lower walleye numbers than in 2022. But the continued strong presence of walleye born in 2013 and 2017 and acceptable numbers of walleye born in 2021 and 2022 suggest there are adequate numbers of younger fish to keep the population

sustainable as they mature and reproduce to replace fish caught by anglers.

Complete winter fishing regulations are available on the Upper Red Lake regulations webpage and the Mille Lacs Lake regulations webpage.

Especially in regards to Upper Red, we get questions how to handle fish

cooked in a fish house and the requirement to retain carcasses, and how this applies to possession limits. For this information, please read the details on pages 32-33 in the Minnesota Fishing regulations.

Take precautions on the ice

The ice season got off to a quick start in parts of Minnesota, with ice forming on some water bodies and numerous reports of ice anglers already testing their luck. But the weather over the last week has not been great for those who want to get out ice fishing. Many lakes that people have been out on likely have seen some degree of ice melting as a result of sun and warm weather.

-If you choose to go on the ice, make sure to check ice thickness throughout the day. Don't assume the path you walked onto the lake will be safe for your walk home. Ice melts faster near shore so don't wait too long to return home if you think the ice is becoming unsafe. Now more than ever, it is crucial to wear a life jacket, ice picks,

and ice cleats. And a cell phone, whistle or other communications device makes it more likely a person can call for help.

The Minnesota DNR reminds everyone to stay on shore until there's at least 4 inches of new, clear ice. While 4 inches of new, clear ice is the minimum recommended thickness for walking, it takes at least 5 to 7 inches to

hold a snowmobile or small all-terrain vehicle, 7 to 8 inches for a larger, side-byside ATV, and 9 to 10 inches for a small car or SUV.

Each year, unexpected falls through thin ice lead to serious injury or death. Checking the ice thickness with a spud bar, auger or other device is the best way to prevent falling through. Wearing a life jacket is the best way to avert tragedy, since the initial shock of falling into cold water can incapacitate even strong swimmers.



CONSERVATION TIP OF THE WEEK **DECEMBER 18-24 2023** WRAP WISELY THIS HOLIDAY SEASON Approximately 2.5 million pounds of wrapping paper will end up in the landfills this holiday season. If that seems high, it's because wrapping paper with foil, glitter, sparkles, lamination, or sequins is not recyclable. Instead, wrap using reusable gift bags - typically made of cloth or fabric - or old magazines or newspaper. If you use traditional wrapping paper, save what you can for next year.

• It's ice fishing season. Get out and enjoy, but be sure to leave no trace behind. And don't be greedy. Only take what you're going to eat.

 Enjoy the most Minnesota of birds - the Black-capped Chickadee. These little birds are often overlooked, but - like a Minnesota Winter - they are beautiful and tough. They'll be at your feeder all year, and, with some patience, can be conditioned to eat seeds out of your hands.

• Dec .19: First quarter moon.

• Dec. 21: Winter Solstice, the shortest day of the year (only 8 hrs 33 min of daylight) with the sun at its lowest altitude. Don't give up hope-- the days will begin lengthening, slowly in the next couple of weeks, but more rapidly in the coming months.

• Dec. 21 - 22: Moon near Jupiter.

CWC Board approves budget levy

The Crow Wing County 2024 budget and property tax levy increase of 3.99% was set at the Tuesday, Dec.12 County Board Meeting. Commissioners unanimously passed the \$107,261,400 budget and \$45,909,662 property tax levy.

While property taxes are expected to account for 46.4% of total county revenues next year, intergovernmental revenue such as state and federal allocations, grants, and cost sharing agreements, will account for 35%. Other taxes (9.5%) including the local option sales tax supporting county highway projects and charges for services (5.5%) make up the bulk of the remaining revenue.

By department, the largest expenditures for the county come in Community Services at 32.8%, Highway Services at 23.5% and Public Safety services at 18.1%. Community Services also generates the most revenue followed by the Highway Fund and Public Safety Services.

The Board also set the tax levies for the First Assessment District and the Second Assessment District in Unorganized Territory. The County Board is the local government for the districts as they don't have an organized township structure. The Board voted to set the First Assessment District tax levy at \$1,258,993 for an increase of 5.88%. The Second Assessment District tax levy was set at \$83,811 for a 4.9% increase.

Dry conditions throughout Minnesota increase potential for wildfires

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources encourages Minnesotans to use caution and stay aware of wildfire risk. Lack of snow and unusually warm, dry conditions over the next week are likely to increase fire danger in much of Minnesota. Dry, brown grasses and vegetation mean wildfires can start easily and spread quickly; this elevated risk is likely to persist until we have continuous snow cover.

"Don't be fooled because it's December. Even with some scattered snow showers, burning vegetative debris is risky right now, especially with temperature increases and windy conditions predicted over the next week," said Karen Harrison, DNR wildfire prevention specialist. "We are asking people

to consider delaying any planned burning until conditions improve."

Due to drought conditions over the past few years, any fires now have the potential to burn deep into the unusually dry organic soil layer. Deep-burning fires hold heat for days, sometimes months, and could lead to wildfires in the days or weeks ahead.

It is best to wait to burn brush or vegetative debris until there is at least 3 inches of snow cover on the ground. Alternatively, Minnesotans are asked to consider composting, chipping, or transporting materials to a brush collection site as alternatives to burning.

When conditions improve, remember burning permits (mndnr.gov/burnpermit) are required for burning vegetative debris (leaves, branches, woody material, etc.) in piles larger than 3 feet high by 3 feet in diameter until there is at least 3 inches of continuous snow cover. Check current conditions on the DNR fire danger and burning restrictions webpage (mndnr.gov/burnrestrictions). Also, be sure to follow safe debris burning tips (mndnr. gov/wildfire/prevention/debrisburning) to help reduce wildfire risk.
