# THE ELKHART EXPERIENCE

As the year comes to a close I'm grateful for another strong year for our Elkhart Lake businesses.

At the end of 2022 we were proud of achieving a record-breaking year. However, with travel being in such high demand, our resort village was tipping the scales of being over-tourismed. This was a concern among many popular vacation destinations.

The start of 2023 gave way to indepth conversations with our businesses and residents about the impact of the visitor economy and the importance of preserving Elkhart Lake's small town charm. Many topics rose to the surface; litter, respect for private property, appreciation for the destination, noise, outdoor music and the lake. It can be a trick to balance these issues

while driving the economic engine of an incredibly popular vacation destination. However, the Tourism Commission took this feedback to heart and developed a three-year strategic plan with greater focus on the stewardship of our resort village.

As we moved into summer, Elkhart Lake's outdoor music scene continued to be a hot topic. The Tourism Commission studied the issue, took regular readings, and charted the summer music experience. This revealed important data and created great opportunities for new conversations and collaboration. We appreicated the frank opinions both pro and con of Elkhart Lake's outdoor live music scene and it's contribution to the Village's community culture. An Ad-Hoc Committee was created to dive deeper into the details and find solutions to balancing Elkhart Lake's popular music

scene and its impacts on residents.

Concesus building is important work and takes time. As I write this article, these conversations of balancing resident life while supporting the visitor economy are still on-going. Our hope is it will generate more thoughtful solutions and build stronger working relatoinships. We will continue to strive towards greater balance between preserving Elkhart Lake's small-town charm and offering an engaging Elkhart Experience.

I met so many great people and made great friends that I am friends with to this day.

I am a member of the Plymouth American Legion Auxiliary and enjoy working at events. My hobbies are sewing, cooking and crocheting. I crochet each of my grandchildren a lap quilt as part of their high school graduation gift. I am happy to crochet gifts for friends too. I am also my high school class historian. I organize monthly lunches and special events for the PHS Class of '65. There were about 200 of us and we have really stayed close, especially since our 50th Class Reunion. I was one of the organizers of our 50th Class Reunion. We had such a great group who worked on the reunion and the highlight of our reunion dinner and social was having "The Impacts" play throughout the evening. "The Impacts" were PHS students from several classes that formed a band in the mid 60's and played at many of our high school dances. They worked hard to reunite for our class reunion, and they were amazing.

My husband Ron and I have been married 53-1/2 years. We have three fantastic, successful children and in-law children and six wonderful grandchildren. They have all brought so much joy to our lives. We love getting together.

One and a half years after retiring from the bank, I decided I really missed people, so I got a job at Piggly Wiggly in Plymouth at the Customer Service desk. 



- 2 gallons of the chili, warmed, not hot. Chili will get brought up to appropriate temperature before serving. Please bring in a disposable container. (i.e. 2 - 1 gallon plastic ice cream pails or foil disposable pans)
- The chili should have a label to identify what type of chili it is, whether it is homemaker or commercial and the name/contact info. (i.e. Homemaker, Joe Schmo 920-123-4444, Spicy Bean Chili)

























# Wade House to Host Taproom Talks Speaker Series

#### Saturday, February 24, 2024 | 1–2pm Shipwrecks of the Great Lakes: Tragedies & Legacies from the Inland Seas

It is estimated that there have been at least 6,000 shipwrecks on the Great Lakes. Over 30,000 lives have been lost in those wrecks. Each of the losses is a story waiting to be told.

Join us to listen to harrowing tales featuring some of the worst maritime disasters to ever occur on the Great Lakes. From the heartbreak of the Lady Elgin tragedy to the legendary sinking of the Edmund Fitzgerald, and many others, you'll hear tales of tragedy and mystery during this storytelling event.



Lardinois is an awardwinning tour guide and author of 12 books of regional history and lore, including Shipwrecks of the Great

Lakes, as well as Storied and Scandalous Wisconsin, and Milwaukee Ghosts and Legends.

Enslaved, Indentured, Free, 1800 to 1850

The Northwest Ordinance of 1787 made slavery illegal in the territory that would later become Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, and part of Minnesota. However, many Black individuals' rights were denied by white enslavers who continued to hold them captive in the territory well into the nineteenth century. Enslaved, Indentured, Free shines a light on five extraordinary Black women-Marianne, Mariah, Patsey, Rachel, and Courtney—whose lives intersected in Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, during these seminal years.

Join us as Mary Elise Antoine, focusing on the five women listed above, explores the history of slavery in the Upper Mississippi River Valley, relying on legal documents, military records, court transcripts, and personal correspondence. Whether through perseverance, self-purchase, or


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
























# Wall-Raising Ceremony

Join Habitat for Humanity Lakeside for a Wall-Raising Ceremony on Thursday, December 14, 2023.

Habitat for Humanity Lakeside, a nonprofit affordable housing provider serving Sheboygan County, Wisconsin will hold a wall-raising ceremony for its 51st Sheboygan area home on Thursday, December 14, 2023 at 3:00 p.m. at 822 Oakland Avenue in Sheboygan. The ceremony, which is open to the general public, will feature Habitat representatives, representatives from Drexel Building Supply, and future home buyer Adriana Hernandez Perez. Anyone interested in this project is welcome to attend. As the weather is expected to be cold, warm beverages will be provided.

The Hernandez Perez house will be the second ADA compliant household built by Habitat Lakeside, designed to accommodate future accessibility needs of the daughter, who lives with a degenerative muscular disease. It will be single story home set back far enough to add a ramp in front if eventually needed. The house will feature a roll-in shower, grab bars, wider doorways, suitable turning areas for a wheelchair, and an attached garage with alley entrance.

This marks a first for Habitat Lakeside: inclusion of a garage. "Habitat homes are designed to be simple, decent, and affordable – and therefore typically do not include a garage," said executive director Niki Zohrab. "However, we always customize each home to meet the specific needs of the family who will reside there, and in this instance a garage will provide accessibility for everyday activities, ensuring the house is a perfect fit."

Groundbreaking for the home began in November, following removal of a large tree on the lot. The completion of the house and dedication are anticipated to take place in late spring of 2024. Plenty of volunteer opportunities still exist on this and many other projects.

This project is being funded by the generosity of donors. The lead sponsors are Drexel Building Supply and Sargento Foods. Other major sponsors include Unity Spiritual Center, Sartori Company, U.S. Bank Foundation, Wisconsin Public Service Foundation, Masters Gallery Foods, Whirlpool, and Wells Fargo Foundation. Additional funding is still being sought for the project. #### **LEONARD'S WAY/GENERAL CAPITAL/ VAN HORN DEVELOPMENT**


General Capital and Van Horn are under way at 604 S. Lincoln Street. All of the old buildings have now been removed and the underground parking area in the General Capital building is taking shape. The Village bid out for the sewer/water/gutter/pathway in late November. The bids were well under our engineer's estimate. Work will begin on the utilities by the end of December and will continue through next Spring.





#### **MAILBOX PLACEMENT** & SNOW PLOWING

The US Postal Service has guidelines to follow when placing your mailbox at your residence. The mailbox needs to be 41" to 45" from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or the point of mail entry. The mailbox also needs to be 6" to 8" back from the curb or curb line. Below is a drawing with these specifications. If your mailbox is damaged due to snow plowing and it does not meet the US Postal Service guidelines, you will be responsible for any repairs or replacement that is needed.



#### **WINTER RULES BEGAN NOVEMBER 15TH**

Winter parking regulations go into effect on November 15th. As a reminder, here is the ordinance.

Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am, at that time your vehicle must be moved.

#### **PARKING REGULATIONS**

All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 8 am. and 10 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 8 am until 10 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

#### **SNOW REMOVAL WARNING**

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient, and you will be in violation.

#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period. Also, if you live at a corner intersection, remember you need to clear the sidewalk approaches to

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

#### Missy Koehler, Elkhart Lake Chamber Executive Director

Missy welcomed everyone to the meeting and started by sharing some facts about the Chamber. The Chamber currently has 178 members to date, residing in Elkhart Lake and neighboring communities. The chamber has experienced a lot of growth over its 73 years. The Chamber has many events throughout the year – West of 57 Restaurant Month, Golf Outing, Downtown Night, Christmas in the Square and Schnee Days. The Chamber financials remain solid. Resources for income include membership fees, The Depot Dispatch, Farmers Market and sponsorships.

#### Kathleen Eickhoff - Tourism State of Tourism 2023

With the mission of Delivering authentic experiences which inspire people to fall in love with Elkhart Lake, Director of Tourism, Kathleen Eickhoff, reports 2023 was another strong year for Elkhart Lake's tourism economy.

Promoting and championing the visitor experience is the Tourism Commission's primary function. They manage the Elkhart Brand Experience using beautiful imagery and eloquent storytelling, welcoming new and returning visitors to this beloved inland lake resort village.

As the visitor economy continues to grow Elkhart Lake Tourism also sees the importance of balancing the need for a strong visitor economy with the impact it has on resident life. Éickhoff explained that preserving Elkhart Lake's small-town charm and naturally beautiful setting is at the heart of the newly launched Elkhart Way campaign. This initiative encourages responsible stewardship of our public trails, cedar tree-lined shores, and the crystal-clear lake waters. It's also about encouraging visitors to slow their pace and be intentional with their time and connect with their friends and family while enjoying our beautiful spaces.

Through greater collaboration with the Village, Chamber of Commerce, businesses and residents, Elkhart Lake Tourism will continue to share the value of a strong visitor economy while working to balance its impact.

#### Adam Englebretson – Elkhart Lake Glenbeulah School District

At the State of the Village meeting, Elkhart Lake-Glenbuelah District Administrator, Dr. Adam Englebretson, shared a number of informational items which are currently taking place in the district. He began by sharing some accomplishments that the students, staff and community can celebrate with pride. These celebrations include: this year's DPI school report cards scoring in the significantly exceeds expectations (elementary/middle school) and exceeds expectations (high school) ranges, Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Middle School being ranked as the tenth best middle school in Wisconsin by U.S. News & World Report, the class of 2024 scoring second in the area with ACT composite average, recognizing one senior for scoring a perfect 36 on her ACT, the high school graduation 100% of its students for at least the past ten years, and the strong participation rates in the fine arts (68.7%)

and extra-curricular (93.3%) activities. These positives are recognized by families and choosing the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District as their education destination. Families choosing to open-enroll their children have increased. Families who chose a different area district for education have decreased. Total student counts have risen each year for the past five years.

Dr. Englebretson explained that the current operational referendum, passed in 2018, expires at the end of the year. There were a number of projects which were completed with this referendum including: High School Auditorium renovation, High School Science Lab renovation, High School Culinary Classroom and Lab renovation, High School boiler room and water softener updates, High School LED lighting and flooring updates, new middle school dishwasher and kitchen flooring, Middle School flooring updates, adding an outdoor rubberized track surface and ADA compliant athletic seating, and concession stand and athletic field lighting upgrades. The District will be asking community voters to vote on a new operational referendum to continue providing children in the District the same great education and opportunities they have been provided for years. This item will appear on the April 2, 2024 ballot.

#### Jessica Reilly - Elkhart Lake Summary

2023 was an eventful year for the Village of Elkhart Lake. The Village continues to see residential growth. There are now over 32 houses finished or in the process of being built in the Victory Park Subdivision. This subdivision is over 50% built out. The apartments being developed at 604 S. Lincoln Street by General Capital and Van Horn are underway. Construction will continue throughout the winter with

the hope of people moving in next fall. The Village's contractor will begin their infrastructure work in the coming weeks. In 2023, the Village annexed property on Badger Road, while also amending TIDs #2 and #4 for future development. The Village continues to work on its facility study, with the hope of a final document early in 2024, so the Village Board can begin planning and executing the next steps. The Village has realized through this process that a new 501(c)3 is needed to help identify, promote and sponsor enhancements to the Village of Elkhart Lake. The new 501(c)3 would also strengthen the ability of the public and private sector to work together to manage public and private resources more effectively to accomplish its goals. The Village is looking at upgrading the equipment at Lions Park and Village Square Park and the newly created 501(c)3 may play a role in fundraising for these parks. In 2023 the Village began looking at its nuisance noise ordinances. Some changes were made, but more changes will occur in 2024. 2023 will bring about the retirement of Officer Scott Niemi, while Officer Brenda Garcia was hired fill-time to become the third full-time officer. The Village will also see a variety of fees and charges increasing in 2024, as the costs for most services continue to increase. Cheers to a busy and prosperous
