### Walsworth Purchases St. Joseph Real Estate, Points to Growth

There was good news recently about a 'quiet' company that's growing in St. Joseph and around the country. The printing company known simply as 'Walsworth' says it's now the third largest printer of both books and magazines in the nation! That success is leading to long-term investment locally.

Walsworth has purchased the real estate that houses its St. Joseph operation, located on Maiden Lane in St. joseph Township. Walsworth acquired IPC Print Services (a/k/a Imperial Printing) in 2010, taking over the building's lease in the process, and has been utilizing the plant's printing capabilities since then. Now, it has taken full ownership of the real estate.

"Purchasing this building tells our employees, and the St. Joseph community, that we're here to stay," said Phil Archer, General Manager of Walsworth – St. Joseph. "It's another step in showing our commitment to this location."

Lucas Vandermolen, the Manufacturing Support Manager at Walsworth – St. Joseph, feels that the purchase is a big step for the future of the plant. "The investment to own our facility is a huge commitment by the Walsworth family to our employees, customers, and community," said Vandermolen. "This purchase shows how much Walsworth values our plant and our people. This will help with our mission to create opportunities for our team, customers, and communities through print."

The company said the purchase was driven by the success of the St. Joseph plant and its workers. "This is a culmination of our relationships with our customers, our growth as a plant, and how we've been able to make the most out of our past capital investments," Archer added. "Bottom line, it's a reflection on all the hard work our employees have put in to satisfy our customers' needs."

### On the Loose in Aarhus

I usually write columns this time of year that drop names – the names of guys playing in college football bowl games. But this year I face a choice: Write a couple of those, or sail on sail on sailor with further tales of my Baltic Sea cruise.

Guess I'll keep it on cruise control. But I'm still collecting bowl names, and will put forth a couple of those columns in January, if Farrell and Head are okay with that. Or if they're not.

Today's port of call is Aarhus, Denmark. (Pronunciation guide: Our cruise director said it like so: "ORE-oose." I include this tidbit not just to edify you but to direct you momentarily back to this column's headline, which you might now read differently than you first did!)

Aarhus is really into Bluetooth. As in Harald Bluetooth, the Viking king of Denmark in the late 900s. Bluetooth was his nickname; his real last name was Gormsson. (My guess is there probably wasn't very much debate among the leaders of Bluetooth Special Interest Group, the people who give us Bluetooth wireless technology, over naming the company Bluetooth or Gormsson.)

Herewith, glimpses of Aarhus:

The Well of Pigs: This is a sculpture-slash-fountain near the Aarhus city hall. It depicts a massive sow with seven piglets scrambling around her to suckle. The fountain has built-in mechanical workings which enable quite a – let's say slightly abnormal – sight: At different intervals, the sow "drools," and the piglets, ummm, "pee." I don't know what artistic vision spurred the creation of this piece, but one Danish blog I stumbled across says it's an homage to Denmark's pork producers, because "bacon is a mandatory dish on the table of every Dane." Mandatory bacon?! -- my kids heard this and now all want to visit Denmark!

We visited a large open-air museum called Den Gamle By (translation: "The Old City"). One tours through "neighbourhoods" populated by genuine relocated historic buildings from around 1864, 1927, 1974 and 2014. In the 1864 neighbourhood, we toured a cobbler's shop. Upstairs of the shop is a section devoted to the life of the shoemaker's 14-year-old apprentice. The display is aimed at elementary-age kids. And somewhat to my surprise, right at a grade-schooler's eye level, is a comic-book style depiction of the apprentice visiting a female friend and engaging in, ahem, consensual, clothing-free, not-safe-for-work activity.

Feeling a mite peckish, we checked out the menu at a cozy place called Café Harepus. (Their logo features a little bunny that's reaching for a gigantic mug of hot beverage and a huge croissant, but its arms are waaaaay too small to grab either! Poor thing! That must be one sourpuss Harepus!)

As we decided what to order, I realized that I recognized the song playing on the café's sound system! – and it warmed this Hoosier boy's heart! It was a jazzy version of "Back Home Again in Indiana"! I mentioned it to the barista but she just gave me a kind of sourpuss Harepus look.

We noshed on chocolatey delights called Flodebollers. They were sooooo goooood. Google later claimed the name in English means "River Balls." But I dug a little deeper and found a much more satisfying translation: "Creamy Buns."

(Note to Farrell and Head: I PROMISE those last two sentences are certified safe-for-work.)





Last but certainly not least, we launched an aggressive education campaign in support of Lake Michigan College's Millage Renewal. As their most outspoken ally, we helped secure a victory at the ballot that will raise over \$200 million for the college over the next twenty years, allowing them to continue the important training and technical education services they provide our region.

These are the types of endeavors we are working on in between the ribbon cutting ceremonies we are commonly known for. They are the underlying reason we exist and our contributions in this space are foundational to creating an economic environment where businesses can flourish and people can prosper. Your investment and engagement in our organization directly supports these activities, and we could not do it without you. Stay tuned - there's much more to come in 2024.
