## Creamy Tortellini Soup

## Serves 6

## INGREDIENTS

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 pound Italian sausage, casing removed
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 medium sweet onion, diced
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning

- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 4 cups chicken stock
- 1 (8-ounce) can tomato sauce
- 1 (9-ounce) package refrigerated three cheese tortellini
- $1 / 2$ bunch kale, stems removed and leaves chopped
- $1 / 3$ cup heavy cream
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh basil


## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Heat olive oil in a large stockpot or Dutch oven over medium heat. Add Italian sausage and cook until browned, about 3-5 minutes, making sure to crumble the sausage as it cooks; drain excess fat.
2. Stir in garlic, onion and Italian seasoning. Cook, stirring frequently, until onions have become translucent, about 2-3 minutes; season with salt and pepper, to taste.
3. Whisk in flour until lightly browned, about 1 minute.
4. Gradually whisk in chicken stock and tomato sauce. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer, stirring

 occasionally, until reduced and slightly thickened, about 10 minutes.5. Stir in tortellini; cover and cook until tender, about 5-7 minutes.
6. Stir in kale until wilted, about 1-2 minutes. Stir in heavy cream and basil until heated through, about 1 minute; season with salt and pepper, to taste.
7. Serve immediately.

## Roasted Carrot Soup

## Serves 6

## INGREDIENTS

- Extra virgin olive oil
- 3 pounds carrots, peeled
- Kosher salt
- Black pepper
- 4 garlic cloves, chopped
- 1 teaspoon grated fresh ginger

- 5 cups low-sodium vegetable broth, divided
- 1 teaspoon ground coriander
- 1 teaspoon allspice
- 1 cup whole milk
- Fresh mint leaves, for garnish (optional)


## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat your oven to $425^{\circ}$. Brush a sheet pan with olive oil.
2. Roast the carrots. Arrange the carrots on the prepared sheet pan. Season lightly with salt and pepper and drizzle generously with olive oil. Roast for 25 minutes, then flip and roast until the carrots are fork tender and nicely caramelized, about 20 minutes more. Remove from the oven and set aside to cool.
3. When the carrots are cool enough to handle, cut into chunks and place in a large food processor or blender. Add the garlic, ginger and 3 cups of the broth. Puree until the mixture is smooth.
4. Transfer the carrot puree to a heavy cooking pot. Add the remaining 2 cups of broth, coriander and allspice. Place the pot on medium heat and watch carefully as the soup bubbles. Stir occasionally until reduced slightly, 10 to 15 minutes.
5. Turn the heat to medium-low and stir in the milk. Once heated through, remove from the stove.
6. Transfer to serving bowls and garnish with fresh mint leaves, if using. Enjoy!

## INGREDIENTS

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon coarse ground black pepper
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter

- 1 yellow onion , chopped
- 1 head cabbage chopped roughly
- 14 ounces diced tomatoes
- 14 ounces crushed tomatoes
- 3 cups beef broth
- 3 cups rice , cooked


## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Add the ground beef to a large dutch oven with the salt and pepper and brown it really well then remove it from the pot and add in 4 tablespoons of butter, onions and cabbage and cook for 5-6 minutes until they start to caramelize.
2. Add in the diced tomatoes, crushed tomatoes, beef broth and the cooked beef and let simmer on low heat for 15 minutes then stir in the cooked rice and cook until its warmed through and serve.

## Roasted Cream of Cauliflower Parmesan Soup

## INGREDIENTS

- 1 medium head cauliflower, cut into small florets (about 4 cups)
- 1 small onion, finely diced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- Salt and pepper to taste

- 1/4 cup butter
- $1 / 4$ cup white whole wheat flour
- 1 cup milk
- $1 / 3$ cup heavy whipping cream
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 3/4 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- 3 tablespoons minced fresh parsley


## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Arrange cauliflower, onion, and garlic in a single layer on a greased baking sheet. Drizzle olive oil evenly over vegetables and season with salt and pepper to taste. Roast vegetables at 400F 20-25 minutes or until very tender.
2. In a medium pot, melt butter over medium-high heat. Whisk flour into butter until completely smooth and
cook 1 minute until golden-brown. Gradually whisk milk, cream, and chicken broth into flour mixture until completely smooth. Cook over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally until simmering and slightly thickened,
3. Place roasted cauliflower mixture in a high-speed blender and top with milk mixture. Blend on high speed until completely creamy.
4. Return soup to pot and bring to a low simmer over medium-high heat, then reduce heat and simmer at low 10 minutes. Remove soup from heat and whisk in Parmesan until melted, then stir in parsley and salt and pepper to taste. Serve soup hot and enjoy!

## Stuffed Pepper Soup

## INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb lean ground beef
- 2 Tbsp olive oil, divided
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 small yellow onion chopped
- 1 cup chopped red bell pepper
- 1 cup chopped green bell pepper
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 (14.5 oz) cans petite diced tomatoes
- 1 (15 oz) can tomato sauce
- 1 (14.5 oz) can low-sodium beef broth
- $21 / 2$ Tbsp chopped fresh parsley, + more for garnish
- $1 / 2$ tsp dried basil
- $1 / 2$ tsp dried oregano
- 1/2 cup uncooked long grain white or brown rice
- Cheddar or mozzarella cheese, for serving (optional)


## INSTRUCTIONS

1. In a large pot heat 1 Tbsp olive oil over medium heat, once hot add beef to pot and season with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally while breaking up beef, until browned. Drain beef and pour onto a plate lined with paper towels, set aside.
2. Heat remaining 1 Tbsp olive oil in pot then add onions, red bell pepper, green bell pepper and saute 3 minutes, then add garlic and saute 30 seconds longer.
3. Pour in diced tomatoes, tomato sauce, beef broth and add parsley, basil, oregano and cooked beef, then season with salt and pepper to taste. Bring just to a light boil, then reduce heat to low, cover and simmer, stirring occasionally, 30 minutes.
4. While soup simmers, prepare rice according to directions listed on package, then once soup is done simmering stir in desired amount of cooked rice into soup.**
5. Serve warm topped with optional cheese and garnish with fresh parsley.

## CLAYBANK MASTER GARDENERS

## Happy $\mathcal{N e w}$ Year Gardeners,

Get rid of the winter blues, bring joy to your life, and start a garden!
December and January are the best months for our Wiregrass Area planting zone (zones 8a and 8b) to sow seeds for hardy spring blooming plants, and to plant new fruit trees and
 bare-root roses and shrubs, giving the roots time to get well established before spring leafing out and flowering. You can grow in the ground, make raised beds or grow in pots using good quality soil with a scoopful or two of compost mixed in. Growing your own veggies organically is easier at this time of year because the bugs are at a minimum.
Lettuce varieties in a pot are easy to grow, as well as broccoli, cabbage, collard and mustard greens, chives, Swiss chard, kale, green onions, and potatoes, radishes. Don't forget to check the planting recommendations on your seed packet for this growing zone and for the optimal planting times. (Summer veggies like beans, corn, peas, tomatoes, summer squash, are best to start indoors in early spring.) When frost and freezes are forecast, newspaper and or some type of cloth or old sheets will protect your plants. Always remove the covers as soon as temps go above freezing so they can air out and get sunlight.
Now is the time to plant winter and spring blooming bulbs for amaryllis, daffodils, daylilies, irises, paperwhites, snowbells, tulips, among others. Did you know there is a free Alabama Gardening Calendar online at www.aces.edu? You can also get a wonderful chart showing the optimal temperatures for seed germination for most vegetables from the www.aces.edu website. Ask for bulletin ANR-1061, either online or at the Extension office for your county. The Extension offices are a wonderful free resource for all things growing and they are there to help and advise.
