By ANN SCHWARTZ Lake Mille Lacs, the area's mighty inland ocean, took one of its own on January 12 when the pickup truck of Richard "Dickie" Francis Gadbois, 80, of Isle, went through the ice. He wore a life vest but efforts to save him were futile.

According to the Mille Lacs County Sheriff's Office, the ice was approximately 6 inches thick where Dickie's truck went in. The recommended thickness for a truck is 13-17 inches of clear ice.

Social media and his Go Fund Me site were abuzz with friends' tributes to Dickie.

You had nothing but patience with me. I set your whole resort on fire, you didn't kill me, you made me show up the next day. You were nothing but a kind man. The world needs more people like you."

\$982 million State infrastructure plan



On Tuesday, Governor Tim Walz announced through a news release the State's 2024 Infrastructure Plan – their capital investment recommendation for the upcoming legislative session. The \$982 million plan invests in infrastructure improvements across the state, including funding for water and transportation infrastructure, housing, and public safety.

"The investments in our 2024 Infrastructure Plan are investments in the wellbeing and future of Minnesota," said Governor Walz. "We have an obligation to ensure every Minnesotan has access to clean water, well-maintained infrastructure, safe communities, and state buildings that are safe and accessible. These projects will support local governments in their work to improve our infrastructure and create good-paying jobs in every corner of the state."

"Infrastructure investments like those laid out in our plan are one critical way we ensure we're making life easier for all Minnesotans," said Lieutenant Governor Flanagan. "In addition to the important infrastructure investments, this plan will help more Minnesotans find a safe, affordable place to call home and create additional early childhood programs and facilities to continue to put Minnesota on a path to becoming the best state for kids and families."

Water Systems and Transportation

Our state's water and trans-

portation systems protect the Information systems protect the Minnesotans' health and safety. The Governor and Lieutenant Governor's 2024 Infrastructure Plan invests in more than \$215 million in water and transportation infrastructure, including more than \$119 million to support grants and low-interest loans to keep our water clean and

frastructure, including more than \$119 million to support grants and low-interest loans to keep our water clean and replace lead pipes. The plan includes \$28 million to establish new grant programs to help remove contaminants like PFAS from drinking water. Additionally, \$2 million in invested in developing a continuous nitrate monitoring network.

Public Safety

The 2024 Infrastructure Plan includes more than \$142 million for public safety projects, including expanding laboratory and investigatory capacity for the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension and planning for a Minnesota State Patrol headquarters. The Infrastructure Plan also includes \$47 million to build the infrastructure needed to provide rehabilitative programming and educational space for

incarcerated individuals. **Housing**

According to the news release, every Minnesota deserves access to a safe and affordable place to call home and a healthy environment and the plan includes more than \$97 million for housing and environment, with more than half of that in Housing Infrastructure Bonds to back the development of multifamily housing supporting people facing homelessness, seniors, and families find safe housing. The infrastructure plan also includes more than \$16 million to update the Minneapolis Veterans Home to better meet residents' needs. **Maintain State Infrastructure**

More than \$440 million is planned to maintain and renew the buildings that taxpayers own and rely on every day, including nearly \$206 million for Minnesota State and the University of Minnesota to repair and renovate buildings.

Other Infrastructure

The 2024 Infrastructure Plan includes more than \$85 million for other infrastructure needs across the state, including \$40 million for local government projects and \$5 million in grants to construct and renovate early childhood facilities and help ensure families have access to early childhood programs housed in safe facilities.

Select Minnesota laws that took effect January 1, 2024 part 3



The following is final part of the select new laws passed during the 2023 legislative session that took effect Jan. 1, 2024. Part one was published in the NewsHopper January 6 issue. Part two was published in the NewsHopper January 13 issue. Juvenile strip searches restricted; isolation largely prohibited

Also in the public safety law is language targeting juvenile detention facilities.

A facility staffer cannot conduct a strip search unless "(1) a specific articulable, and immediate contraband concern is present; (2) other search techniques and technology cannot be used or have failed to identify the contraband; and (3) the facility's chief administrator or designee has reviewed the situation and approved the strip search."

The search must be conducted by a health care professional or staffer who has received training on trauma-informed search techniques and other applicable training.

Using physical or social isolation for punishment of a juvenile will be prohibited unless used for the safety of a juvenile, staff, or other residents.

TRANSPORTATION-Supporting professional teams, other organizations on your license plate

The Minnesota Department of Public Safety Driver and Vehicle Services (DVS) will have nine new special license plates available this year, which is the most it has ever released in one year.



The new special plates include designs from professional sports teams, two nonprofits, and a blackout plate.

The six professional teams are Vikings, Wild, Twins, Timberwolves, Lynx and United.

In addition to typical vehicle plate fees, an annual contribution of at least \$30 must be deposited in the Minnesota professional sports team foundations account. Minus the cost of administering the account funds, remaining


funds will be distributed to the foundations in proportion to the total number of Minnesota professional sports team foundation plates issued for that year. Foundations can only use the proceeds for philanthropic or charitable purposes.

Other plates available that became are for Lions Club International and Minnesota Missing and Murdered Indigenous Relatives, with proceeds going to their respective purposes. Blackout plates (black background with white text) are also available this year.

Also effective Jan. 1, 2024,

the Public Safety Department must provide real-time information about the location and availability of driver's exam appointments. "The website must also provide an option for a person to enter an address to see the date and time of the next available exam at each exam station sorted by distance from the address provided."

Effective for applications submitted after Jan. 1, 2024, the Office of Traffic Safety can voluntarily collect race and ethnicity data of an applicant on a driver's license or identification card application


