

# Aitkin High School gym named after former wrestling coach

Noel Bailey, 82, of Aitkin, started in humble beginnings on a Palisade-area dairy farm. He also attended a one-room schoolhouse before graduating from Aitkin High School

in 1959.

Life has its ups and downs. He's now facing cancer and lost two beloved wives along the way -- Patricia and Alma. But wrestling gave his life its purpose for many years.

In 1972, Noel and wife Pat moved to Aitkin to take over Hill's Drive-In, a local legend establishment. But Noel continued in education and taught at Aitkin High School till 1998, where he also coached.

Under the late John Fremling, Noel began coaching wrestling in Aitkin in 1972 and was promoted to head coach for 23 years. He built Aitkin's strong reputation as a wrestling program standout in Minnesota — with 263 wins, 145 losses and five ties.

Along the way, Noel garnered numerous awards and

accolades, including introductions into wrestling halls

of fame.
Son Lance was also a wrestler, growing up under his father's tutelage.

His daughter Dawn helps him out a lot now as he goes through the regime of cancer treatment.

It is a sad day in America when the right to freedom of speech is used to accuse people of a crime with the only evidence being what someone claims they heard someone say to someone else.

At the City Council meeting for Crosby held Monday, January 22, 2024, Council Member Paul Heglund did just that.

As I stated at the council meeting following Heglund's words of support of a letter written claiming there had been a theft of city property - only facts - not opinions, should be used to accuse anyone of something this serious. I have seen the same facts Council Member Heglund has and they are as follows:

In May of 2023, a computer generated work order was issued to provide a taxpayer with a second water meter and identified the meter by serial number. Shortly thereafter the billing clerk created, on computer, the appropriate invoice for the meter and began billing accordingly.

At no time was the meter ever missing, unaccounted for or given for free. These are the facts.

The City has the option of having the City Attorney present at a council meeting at a cost of \$750 per meeting he attends. It was requested that he attend the January 22, 20244 meeting to provide legal advice regarding this situation. That was the only reason he was there.

This precaution proved necessary when Heglund made his statement of support of the accusation. Council Member Heglund's action and words indicate he believes numerous City Employees and a Council Member are guilty of a crime. What a shame it is to have a council Member support such an accusation during a recorded official meeting with his only evidence being words someone claims were spoken to someone else by someone else and a total disregard of the physical evidence.



# Part of Govenor Walz budget slates \$149.9 million to Get Out MORE

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources has announced the programmatic framework that will guide how and where the historic, onetime Get Out MORE (Modernize Outdoor Recreation Experiences) investments will be focused.

The \$149.9 million Get Out MORE investments, part of Gov. Tim Walz and Lt. Gov. Peggy Flanagan's One Minnesota Budget, will help Minnesotans of all abilities and interests enjoy a worldclass recreation system, whatever outdoor experience they

"The Get Out MORE investments are planned to ensure we are using this funding to do the most good in the most places," DNR Commissioner Sarah Strommen said. "I'm thrilled about the transformative projects included in this plan and can't wait for people to start experiencing these improvements as they enjoy our public lands and waters. We are making great progress to ensure our outdoor recreation system can engage people of all abilities and interests, and help people Get Out MORE."

The Get Out MORE funding are focused in these key areas:

• Enhancing access and welcoming new users to public lands and outdoor recreation facilities (\$35.4 million)

The investment in enhancing access and welcoming result in refreshed recreational facilities, revitalized and sustainably re-engineered roads and trails that access recreational opportunities, and improved accessibility for all Minnesotans.

The breakdown of the \$35.4 million funding will be \$15 million for accessibility improvements, \$9.4 million for roads, \$8 million for hiking and paved trail surface improvements, \$2 million for improved wayfinding and signs and \$1 million for track chairs and other adaptive equipment

 Modernizing camping and related infrastructure (\$9.5 million)

These investments will focus on updating the camping infrastructure and experiences at two popular state parks in Minnesota with \$5 million for ences at Minneopa State Park including a campground designed with larger, accessible sites and modernized facilities, and improved wayfinding and trails and \$4.5 million for renewing wastewater infrastructure at Myre-Big Island State Park.

 Enhancing fisheries and fishing infrastructure (\$60 million)

These projects move Minnesota toward a state-of-the-art fish hatchery system with safe and biosecure water supplies, increased fish production, and improved staff safety. The investments will also enhance shore fishing sites and opportunities.

The budget includes \$24 million for the Waterville Hatchery, \$19 million for the Crystal Springs Hatchery,

new users to public lands will a pilot to modernize experi- \$12 million for other hatcheries and \$5million for shore fishing.

 Modernizing boating access (\$35 million)

This investment will enable the DNR to update more than 100 public water accesses to be more accessible to all users, meet the needs of modern watercraft, improve protection of public waters from stormwater runoff and invasive species, and enhance climate resilience.

The budget breaks the \$35 million into \$30 million for 40 to 60 large-scale projects, which will include accessible features, stormwater improvements, aquatic invasive species prevention, healthy shorelines and accessible ramps for nonmotorized boats and \$5 million for 75-125 small-scale projects, including longer launch ramps, wider drive lanes, wider and longer parking stalls and improved stormwater treatment.

· Restoring streams and modernizing water-related infrastructure to support outdoor recreation (\$10 million)

Phase one of this investment will reconnect an estimated 63 miles of streams and restore an estimated 43,000 feet of habitat with \$5.6 million for channel restoration, dam removal and modification, and culvert replacements for streams. The balance of the funding will be used in the future.


