Vidalia Onion Pie

Serves 8 INGREDIENTS

Pie Crust

- 2 1/2 cups crumbled Ritz crackers
- 1/3 cup melted butter

Pie Filling

- 2 tbsp butter
- 2 1/2 cups thinly sliced vidalia onions
- 3/4 cup milk
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp black pepper
- dash hot sauce
- 3/4 cup grated cheddar cheese
- 1/2 tsp dry parsley , optional

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven for 350F.
- 2. Mix the melted butter into the crumbled crackers until the butter is absorbed all the crackers are wet with the butter. Evenly spread into a 9 inch pie pan and press on the bottom and along the sides to make a pie shell.
- 3. Heat the 2 tbsp butter in a skillet over medium low heat. Add the sliced onions and saute until they are tender. This should take about 10 minutes.
- 4. While the onions are sauteeing, whisk together the milk, eggs, salt, pepper and hot sauce in a bowl until well mixed.

ONIONS

- 5. Once the onions are tender, evenly spread on the cracker pie crust. Pour egg mixture over the onions in the pie crust. Top with grated cheese and parsley.
- 6. Bake in 350F oven for 40 minutes.
- 7. Let cool for 5 minutes. Slice and serve.

Southern Onion Rings

INGREDIENTS

- 1 quart oil for frying, or as needed
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- · 2 teaspoons salt, divided
- 2 teaspoons ground black pepper, divided
- 3 egg whites
- 1 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon white vinegar
- 3 large sweet onions, peeled and sliced into thick rings

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Heat oil in a large heavy skillet over medium-high heat, or deep-fryer to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C).
- 2. Place flour in a shallow baking pan and stir in 1 teaspoon of salt and 1 teaspoon of pepper. In a medium bowl, whisk together egg whites, milk, vinegar, and remaining salt and pepper until frothy.
- 3. Dip onion rings in wet ingredients then into flour mixture until coated. Then dip in egg white mixture again, and then into flour again.
- 4. Fry onion rings in hot oil a few at a time so they are not crowded, until golden brown. Drain on paper towels, and serve immediately.

Onion Jam

INGREDIENTS

- ¼ cup vegetable oil
- ½ cup white sugar
- 4 cups onion, coarsely chopped
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ground black pepper to taste
- ½ cup red wine vinegar

DIRECTIONS

- **1.** Heat vegetable oil in a heavy skillet over medium heat. Stir sugar into oil with a wooden spoon, stirring constantly, until mixture is a light caramel color, about 10 minutes. Mixture will be very hot.
- 2. Stir onion, salt, and black pepper into sugar mixture. Onions will immediately start to caramelize. Stir frequently over medium heat until sugar has dissolved

and onions are browned, about 15 minutes.

3. Pour red wine vinegar into onion mixture; simmer until mixture reaches a jam consistency, about 30 minutes. Let cool to serve.

NOTE: Serve a cup of jam over a bar of creme cheese with crackers or as a spread for meat sandwiches. Store covered in refrigerator for up to two weeks.

French Onion Soup

INGREDIENTS

- 1 ounce (2 tablespoons) butter
- 4 large onions, thinly sliced
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 32 ounces beef broth
- 3 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- salt to taste
- 4 slices thick crusty bread, toasted
- 4 slices provolone or gruyere cheese

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Heat a dutch oven or stock pot over medium heat. Add butter; melt. Add sliced onions, pepper and garlic powder; sauté for 7-8 minutes until tender.
- 2. Add beef broth, Worcestershire sauce and salt to taste. Bring to a simmer, cover and simmer for at least 10 minutes. Keep warm until ready to serve.
- 3. Just before serving, preheat broiler. Arrange oven-proof individual crocks, bowls or soup mugs with a wide mouth on a baking sheet.
- 4. Ladle soup into bowls. Top each with a slice of toasted bread and a slice of cheese. Place under broiler until cheese melts and is slightly golden. Serve warm.

Notes

For make-ahead prep, prepare the soup through the simmering stage, then cover and refrigerate up to two days. When ready to serve, rewarm soup stove top, then proceed with the recipe.

Stuffed Onions

INGREDIENTS

- 6 medium yellow onions (about 2 pounds)
- 2 bacon strips, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1/4 cup dry bread crumbs
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley or 2 teaspoons dried parsley flakes
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1-1/2 cups sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Dash each pepper and ground nutmeg
- 1/2 cup beef broth



DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 375°. In a Dutch oven, bring a small amount of water to a boil. Peel onions; using a slotted spoon, place onions in boiling water. Cook for 4-6 minutes more until softened; remove and let stand until cool enough to handle. Cut a 1/4-in. slice off the top of each onion. Remove center, leaving a 1/2-in shell. Chop centers and tops of onions; set aside. In a skillet, cook bacon until crisp; remove to paper towel to drain. In the drippings, saute chopped onion until tender. Stir in bread crumbs and parsley. Add the butter and mushrooms; cook until mushrooms are tender. Add bacon, salt, pepper and nutmeg. Stuff onion shells; place in an ungreased shallow 1-qt. baking dish. Pour broth around onions. Bake, uncovered, until tender, 45 minutes, basting frequently during the first 15 minutes.

Vidalia Sweet Onion dip

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 2 cups shredded Swiss cheese
- ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 cups thinly sliced Vidalia sweet onion
- hot sauce, or to taste

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 2. Stir the mayonnaise, Swiss cheese, Parmesan cheese, Vidalia onion, and hot sauce together in a casserole dish.
- 3. Bake in the preheated oven until the edges are golden brown, 30 to 35 minutes. Allow to cool 10 minutes before serving.







CLAYBANK MASTER GARDENERS

Many people ask us "When is the best time to trim the bushes and shrubs in our yard?" Good question. **Now is the time**. Traditionally the rose gardeners trim on or by **February 14**th. If you have azaleas, trim after their blooms are done.



This is also a good time to start seeds indoors

too. Beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, kale, Black-seeded Simpson lettuce (it is more heat tolerant), onions, sugar snap peas, & spinach can be started indoors and planted outside in late March or early April in SE Alabama zone 8.

Use a moist seed mix or peat pellets, but not garden soil. Water seeds from below the pots or pellets, but don't let them stand in water too long. A hardware store clamp-light kept about 2" above the seedlings will provide warmth and light and keep them from getting too leggy.
