



For approximately 60 years, the golf course and clubhouse amenities have offered recreation, fine dining, and socializing to the members and their guests.

The Almaden Golf and Country Club has evolved over time into a family-friendly environment centered around one of the best golf courses in Northern California. It continues to be the home course for the Leland High


School and San Jose State University golf teams.







Leigh basketball coach resigns

Resident Carol Martin, who attends classes four to five times a week, says that yoga helped her find her inner strength. "I'm calmer than I used to be," she says, "and I learned to take time to breathe." Martin appreciates the range of classes offered and says that she likes the community. "Anuja and Ron are super nice," she says. "They're caring people."

For resident Mackenzie Lorenzago, yoga is a very spiritual practice. "The lessons focus on different aspects of life that are both challenging and rewarding," she says. "There are a lot of studios focused on the body, core and pushing yourself. Coming here, there's a sense of 'You're perfect just the way you are and you're going to be better.' It's a special balance for me."

For teacher Sheetal Kalidindi, Almaden Yoga is her happy place. "It's a beautiful community and such a great haven for us," she says. "I feel blessed to teach here." She also appreciates the whole body aspect of yoga. "No other workout makes you feel so calm, so centered," she says. "Anuja focuses on bringing your mind and body and breath together. She makes you do longer holds and makes you feel how you feel in a pose. Ron will gently push you a little bit out of your comfort zone, building your strength. You come away saying, 'Whoa, I was able to do that.'"

"Unless we're tested, we don't know how strong we are," says Chaudhri. "Every pose is an expression of how you're feeling from your fingers to your toes. Sometimes we forget we are strong. We get into a place of 'I can't. I can't hold any longer. I can't do this.' But we can. We may not like it, but we can. That's what life is about. It's about thinking, 'I am strong. I am capable. I can."

When the couple opened their studio at Via Valiente Plaza six years ago, Chaudhri says they were greeted so warmly, it motivated them to give back even more to the community. With every class, she tries to create a new experience with different themes and concepts. "My responsibility is to send people off with something they can apply to their lives," she says.

Each class has its own feel and members often connect, forming friendships. For instance, the 6am class is made up of 'Type A' men and the 9:30am weekend class is more serious than the 11am class. Seniors and those recovering from injuries usually attend the Chair Yoga class and share breakfast together afterwards.

Resident Suzanne Quane, who started taking classes at Almaden Yoga in 2011, goes for her mind and body and socializing. "I've made so many friends there," she says. "We've gone through births and marriages and grandkids together, and the teachers are so nice." Quane says that for her, yoga helps with living life. "It makes you more grateful for what you have," she says. "You're able to cope better with what comes your way and it puts you in a nice frame of mind. In fact, if I get in a bad mood, my husband says, 'Have you gone to yoga today?' It's a gift they've given us. I don't know what I'd do without them. I just can't recommend it highly enough.'

For Victor, yoga is a flexibility and strength of the mind, as much as of the body. "Calmness in uncomfortable situations; that's what this practice will teach you," he says. "When someone cuts you off, or you

receive a bothersome email, you can let it sit. The more you do it, the more it shows you. It opens your mind and allows you to be more connected, calm and grounded. You will control your mind; your mind won't control you."

Husband and wife Kaushal and Anita Agrawal take classes together. He started coming to Almaden Yoga about four or five years ago and suggested Anita give it a try. "It became a life-transforming experience for us both," says Kaushal. "I've taken yoga many places, but Almaden Yoga is a hidden treasure. The teachers are top-notch. Ron's style is upfront and he gets you to work to the next level. Anuja is calm and collected and works to improve your strength."

"I love the peace and how the mind and heart connect," says Anita. "The breathing brings you back from tension to the present moment." Anita has been practicing for the last two years and enjoys it so much, she recently took training to become a teacher. "It's a wonderful experience," she says. "The days I don't practice I feel like something's missing in my life."

Chaudhri and Victor believe that yoga has naturally improved the health of many of their clients. "Once they start doing yoga, stretching and strengthening, and relaxing their minds, they feel much better," she says.

"Going to Almaden Yoga, I've gotten so much stronger," says Quane. "I've gotten rid of aches and pains. I can even do a hand-stand. I never could have done that before."

"You can cure your back problems through yoga," says Victor, "but you have to keep doing it. The medical community at Stanford now recommends that their patients try yoga before considering surgery. It's also good for sleeping."

Victor also appreciates yoga as an emotional outlet for both joy and sadness. "Yoga can take you so deep, people cry or laugh aloud in class," he says. "It helps people through the pain of divorce or a death in the family; they sob through class and let it go. It's amazing."

"Every single human being should be doing yoga to compliment anything else they do," he says, "including bikers, runners and tennis players. We have runners whose times improved an hour to an hour and a half through breathing exercises. My swimming time improved by 4 to 7 minutes." He also credits yoga with aiding him and Chaudhri

in completing a hundred-mile bike ride.

Through a client's recommendation, Chaudhri taught yoga to the Leland High School baseball team. During the relaxation part of the class, the boys were so comfortable they would fall asleep. They also won the championship. The following year, she sent the coach an email suggesting they do some stretches, meditate and visualize winning the game. They did it and they won. The coach told her when they were asked what made the difference, they all said yoga. "I wish I could get into all the schools here, even just once a week," she says.

Looking Back

Chaudhri didn't set out to become a yoga teacher. Quiet and shy as a child, it was her father, Dr. Manmohan Chaudhri, who pushed her towards an alternative way of life and a natural way of healing. He insisted she take yoga class as a little girl-but she hated it. Nonetheless, she was flexible and the star of her yoga class. Today she is grateful for that push, which helped her to realize her passion: yoga and teaching.

She grew up in ITT/Kanpur and New Delhi in Northern India, and received her Bachelor's in Psychology at Jesus and Mary College in New Delhi. Following her father's suggestion that she work in the computer industry, she took a two-year course in Systems Management and found work as a technical writer with the East India Company in India. After marrying and coming to the U.S. in 1995, she worked at Business Objects, NASA and Sentilla. She says she felt fortunate to work with amazing people, but she was always seeking something.

After her divorce, she met Victor and fell in love. While they were living in Los Gatos, she rediscovered yoga at Yoga Source, taking classes and a teacher training program. She became certified in 2006 under Linda Schlamadinger-McGrath and taught at the Indian Community Center, as well as Yoga Source

One day, driving around Silver Creek, she stopped in at America's Best Karate, met owner Kevin Waldschmidt and ended up teaching yoga at his studio. He mentioned that he also had an Almaden location in the Via Valiente Shopping Center and that it might be a good place for her. While teaching there, she sat outside with a sign-up sheet during an open house. Before she knew it, she had 90 people say if she offered class at any other time, they'd come, which led to Almaden Yoga. Victor helped her make up a business plan and they were off. On Feb. 5, 2010, they opened their doors. Now they have about 20 teachers and are open seven days a week. On May 1, 2013, they opened a second studio in San Jose.

Victor grew up in Mumbai, India. There he

attended Shivaji University, majoring in engineering. He received his Master's in computer engineering at Syracuse University in New York. He worked at Intel for six years in various capacities from engineering to business development, marketing and corporate development. He also received a Master's in Business Administration from Arizona State University. In 1996, he started his first start up, Vyyo. In 2000, the company went public. That same year he met his wife.

An avid runner, swimmer and cyclist, Victor was introduced to yoga in 2001 through Bryan Kest's Power Yoga instruction series and never looked back. He also underwent his teacher training under Schlamadinger-McGrath. In 2011, he became certified and started teaching in 2012. Meanwhile, he continued in the high tech field, creating several startups including IoTium. In addition to teaching and co-ownership of Almaden Yoga, Victor also runs a nonprofit, Vibha, which empowers underprivileged children in India and North America, ensuring every child their right to education health and opportunity.

Looking Ahead

On Oct. 13, 2016, Chaudhri is leading a 13-day trip to India, including the Golden Triangle of Dehli, Agra and Jaipur, a visit to the Taj Mahal and of course, yoga. "Because I grew up in India and lived in this country for more than 20 years, I bring an understanding of both cultures," she says. "Every sense of your body will awaken in India," says Victor.

"It's a challenging business," says Chaudhri, "but every time I teach a class, I say to myself, 'How could I not do this? There's a joy in giving to others."

"We are so fortunate to have yoga become a part of our lives," says Victor. "Those who haven't experienced yoga should get their butts to class and do it! It will change your life."

we have accomplished in District 10 since my election and my goals for the next 4 years."

Campaign spending

Sodergren is not accepting campaign donations, or spending his own money on the campaign. He declined to pay the \$2,200.00 fee for District 10 candidates required to have a 200 word qualifications statement listed in the Voter Information Guide, and shuns mass produced mailings, yard signs, and robo calling.

"I'm running without taking or spending any money to hopefully demonstrate that money can be taken out of our political process by candidates who love their City, and have a passion to serve in this capacity," explained Sodergren. "When this happens, the most valuable currency in campaigns will be ideas and the ability to inspire others to work together to solve problems, not money."

Sodergren said he is in a listening mode with everyone on topics ranging from housing to transportation and public safety, in particular "their ideas as to how we can move forward from our current circumstances. "I am doing my best to log the experience of running for office in the hope that all our citizens will become inspired and equipped to do this themselves."

"We have a number of problems including a compromised relationship with those who provide core services including our first responders and public safety," said Sodergren. "The Mayor and many others are working with many different constituencies to remedy the underlying causes for loss of personnel, and the resulting increase in our vulnerability. But, we as a people have a responsibility in this too, as we need to re-establish trust. And, this starts with every interface we have with those who serve us. Every time we see or engage with any City Employee, we can start the conversation by thanking them for their service."

Since there are only two candidates are running for the District 10 seat, a general election, which could have been held on November 8, 2016, will not be necessary. The primary election is June 7, 2016.

A candidates forum is expected to be scheduled sometime this month. The Almaden Times will publish the time and location as soon as the information becomes available.




Councilmember Nancy Pyle, who represented Almaden Valley, received the "woman of the year" award presented by State Senator Jim Beall.





Trump takes big lead in California primary poll

Donald Trump has a commanding lead in the upcoming California Republican primary, bolstering his hopes of winning the GOP nomination and avoiding a nasty convention fight, according to the latest poll.

The poll queried 1,039 likely voters from March 6 to 15. Florida Sen. Marco Rubio removed his name from the California primary ballot on March 15.

In an independent survey, Public Policy Institute of Calif., Trump has the support of 38 percent of likely voters, while Texas Sen. Ted Cruz is favored by 27 percent. Ohio Gov. John Kasich placed a distant third with 14 percent.

On the Democratic side, Hillary Clinton, who appears well on her way to getting her party's nomination, assuming she does not run into trouble with her home email server. She now leads Bernie Sanders by 48 percent to 41 percent. Sanders appeals to independent, and anti-establishment minded voters, according to the poll.

California awards most of its 172 delegates equally to the winners in each of the state's 53 congressional districts.

Former GOP staffer Jack Pitney believes that Trump is in the lead due his stance on immigration. "California Republicans are deeply concerned about immigration, which is Trump's signature issue," said Pitney.

Rule 2: Every letter must contain three components: (1) a greeting (e.g. Dear Soldier or Dear John Smith); (2) an original message of support/ appreciation; (3) a closing (e.g. Love, Thanks, Sincerely) with a signature.

Rule 3: Each letter should be in an UNSEALED envelope. The envelope should bear a 49-cent first class U.S. postage stamp.


