## Purdy Close, but No Cigar

Everyone in the State of Iowa knows of the underdog story of former Cyclone Brock Purdy and how he has climbed the ranks of being the last player selected in the 2022 NFL Draft to an MVP Candidate and leader of the NFC Champions San Francisco 49ers. Purdy has done so through his relentless hard work, his strong faith and his talent that he doesn't get enough credit for. Myself, along with thousands of other Cyclone fans were hoping Purdy could add a Super Bowl Championship to his already meteoric rise, but the 49ers would come up just short, losing Super Bowl LVIII 25-22 in overtime to Patrick Mahomes and the Kansas City Chiefs.

The game itself was quite boring until the fourth quarter, as both defenses came out and played at an elite level, while both offenses had key fumbles deep in the opponent's territory and neither team could get in much of an offensive rhythm. The Chiefs would take advantage of a muffed punt that hit off a San Fransico player's leg and take their first lead of the game at 13-10 on a Mahomes pass to Marquez Valdes-Scantling late in the third quarter. Purdy and the 49ers, however would answer with a 75-yard drive that ended with a Purdy TD pass to Jauan Jennings to give San Fran a 16-13 lead after the PAT was blocked. The teams would trade field goals, as the 49ers clung to a 19-16 lead before Harrison Butker would send the game to overtime with just :06 left with a 29-yard field goal. The 49ers would score first in overtime with another Jake Moody field goal, but we all knew that it would take a turnover or something odd to happen to stop Patrick Mahomes on the final drive. Unfortunately for 49er fans, Mahomes Magic would strike again as he drove the Chiefs down the field with his arm and legs, and would end the game with a short TD pass to Mecole Hardman to give Kansas City their second straight Super Bowl title.

Purdy played a very good game, throwing for 255 yards and one touchdown with no interceptions. Mahomes, who won the MVP, was just too good for the 49er defense; throwing for 333 yards with two touchdowns and one interception while also running for 66 yards. I felt like Any Reid also outcoached Kyle Shannahan with some of the adjustments made after halftime as well as two questionable decisions by Shannahan. The first one came at the end of the first half with the Chiefs driving for a field goal that made the score 10-3 at halftime. The 49ers could have used one of their two remaining timeouts to give themselves a chance to score right before halftime and take back the momentum. Instead, they let the clock run down and got the ball back with just :20 left in the half. The second questionable decision came when the 49ers won the overtime coin toss and elected to receive the ball. This would be the correct decision with the old NFL overtime rules where if you scored a touchdown first you won the game right there, but the new rules give each team the ball at least once. Most teams would take defense first so they know what they need to score, which also gives you four downs to get first downs instead of three if you know you have to score to keep the game going or to win the game. Kansas City did complete on fourth down early in their game-winning drive that maybe ends up being a punt if that is the first drive of overtime.

While the game didn't go as this Brock Purdy and George Kittle fan had hoped, it is still an awesome story to see such a humble guy, who is grounded in his faith like Purdy, succeeding at the highest level. While he's not a Super Bowl Champion just yet, one can't help but think it will happen Purdy soon for the 49ers and Brock!

I have a 2008 Jeep compass and I purchased a simple Bluetooth system that I want to install in it. It's a standalone system that has an FM transmitter so I can play it over the radio. Well, I was trying to install it and my original idea was to wire it to the fuse box with one of those add a circuit connector until I found out that the fuse box is under the hood and not located under the dash. I want to splice it into the vehicle wiring with proper fuses of course but I need one wire that's always hot and one that's hot only when the ignition is on. Any advice will be greatly appreciated.

#### Dear Steve.

Many people find themselves wanting to add an accessory to their vehicle and nowhere to draw power from. The add a fuse kit you mentioned is one way to do it if the current draw is very low. The second would be to take power from the radio circuit. They have harnesses available to tap into the wires at many car stereo shops. The first thing you will need to do is find out how much current the device will use. Too much of a draw can damage the vehicle. Consulting with the folks at the stereo shop will help you to determine draw as it is something they often must do.

#### **Dear Motor Medics**,

I'm a new listener and column reader and I have a 1993 Ford Ranger with a 4.0 engine. When I first start the engine the hydraulic valve lifters make a lot of noise. The lower the outdoor ambient temperature the worse the noise seems to be. When the engine reaches full operating temperature, the noise goes away. Could this be an issue with the engine oil passages being gummed up? If this was the issue, do you recommend a product that could clean it up?


#### Dear John,

Many of the Rangers with the 4.0 engine develop this noise. Some are caused by lifters that are gummed up while others have excessive valve train wear caused by either high miles or lack of proper lubrication due to long oil change intervals or the use of lesser quality oils at some point. Without taking the engine apart for inspect you could eliminate the possibility of the engine sludge issue by cleaning the oil system and using an additive. We use engine oil cleaner than the engine tune up from Justice Brothers. They seem to work very well for us. You need to add the cleaner then run the engine for ten minutes, change the oil, and then add the engine tune up. If it's not an excessive wear issue this should help. You may need to repeat the process down the road if it occurs again.







It doesn't always end with a Happily-ever-after. These stories are real and are about people who have battled with addiction and/or mental health for a long time. This week, I am going to share with you one of the harder stories. This is Tina's story:

By the time Tina came to us, her situation was already dire. She and her children's father had battled addiction off and on for 16 years and the children they shared had been born with a free ticket to the train-wreck that they called their family. Tina came to the doors of Discovery House looking for help but had her own home. She tried for a few weeks to live at home and came to the meetings and groups that were offered at Discovery House. It didn't take long for her to start to see that trying to be "half-in" just was not going to work. Tina was involved with the Department of Human Services, her children were in foster care, the children's father was in prison for the third time, and she was running out of time to show the courts that she could live a life clean and sober. Tina moved into Discovery House but struggled with being "all-in". Tina, like many addicts, looked for all the loopholes. When she couldn't find a loophole, she created one. This worked for a while. Tina moved back home, and her children began to spend more and more time with her. Before long, Tina and her children were home full-time, and she faded out from Discovery House and all the services that were available to her.

Two months later, I received a call asking if I had heard from Tina. It was then that I learned that Tina had not been seen or heard from for 10 days and the kids had not been at school since before spring break. I attempted to contact Tina, but she did not answer or return any of my calls. Three days later, Tina and her children were found 3 states away in a hotel. Tina had been using methamphetamine and was relying on her oldest daughter to care for the younger siblings in the hotel room or pool area. The children were removed from the hotel and placed back into foster care and Tina continued to move around, avoiding DHS, her children, and sobriety.

Tina would randomly show up asking to see the kids but would not comply with any of the recommendations set forth by the courts to allow her to have visits. Eventually, it was evident to the courts and the providers that reunification between Tina and the kids was not in the best interest of the children. The children's father remained in prison and the parental rights were terminated for him and Tina. The children were adopted by their foster families and continue to live in the community where they once lived with their parents.

While this is the worst-case outcome for Tina and the children's father, the adoption is an attempt to allow there to be a happy ending for the children. As hard as it might be for you, as the reader, to understand Tina's story, it is important to know this: Tina loves her children very much. This was never about not loving her children or about choosing a life of drugs, alcohol, and crime over them. In all the years that I have worked in this field, I have never heard a parent say, "I think today I will get high instead of being the parent my kiddos deserve". Addiction is a cunning, baffling, and powerful disease. No one is immune and addiction isn't prejudice. If you or someone you know is struggling with addiction or mental health, there is hope and help. 


