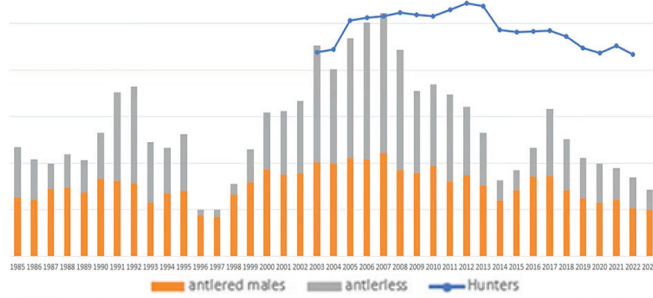

Wolves and deer input



The Minnesota DNR gathers public input annually on the previous deer season to help shape regulations for the next season. Share your opinions on the deer population through a survey questionnaire open to anyone with an interest in deer, especially deer hunters. Take the survey on the DNR deer management page <https://engage.dnr.state.mn.us/embeds/projects/7944/survey-tools/20072>.

There has been a lot of interest regarding the dynamics between wolves and deer as hunters have continued to have reduced harvest oppor-

tunities.

The relationship between wolves and deer populations varies on the interplay of several factors, including the abundance of deer, winter severity, other predators, prey on the landscape (e.g., moose, beaver) and habitat conditions. Wolf Predation meeting in Crosby

On Friday, Feb. 9 at the C-I High School, Hunters for Hunters meeting was introduced by Steve Porter from upper Minnesota to discuss the gray wolf declassification information. Hunters for Hunters is a non-profit organization which was started only three months ago and has already organized 16 meetings in Minnesota towns getting the word out on our state's wolf management problems. Some of these meetings lured 400 and even 600 local residents interested in this wolf problems. At the C-I meeting, there were between 150 to 200 people in attendance. New legislation is in the works as we speak. Some good and some bad but this group is working with law makers to make sure the final draft is done right as it has role model states in the west that have already put new laws in place with the correct

wording.

A few facts that came out of the meeting: Gray Wolves devour over 54,000 fawns per year in Minnesota.

- 32% of does are killed each year by wolves. 90% of which were pregnant. Last year 45.5% were killed by wolves because of the bad winter for Minnesota deer.
- Wolf numbers were up 11% in the last year. DNR estimates wolf numbers at 2,700 now. Hunters for Hunters estimate that number is more like 6,000 to 10,000.
- 80% of wolves food is deer.
- One wolf will kill and eat 17 deer to survive per year. This means that a pair of wolves will kill and eat 34 deer each year. Does your area contain numbers like that?

This new and growing group is putting up highway bill boards saying "PROTECT CHILDREN,

PETS, WILDLIFE-NOT WOLVES!

Minnesota politicians are saying they can't do anything because it is a federal law. However, this was in question by the fact that Marijuana was just legalized by the state even though the Feds still outlaw it.

Of the 16 meetings around the state to date, no DNR individual has been present officialy at a single meeting.

This group is not working to get rid of the wolf, only to manage it.

There was only one person at the C-I meeting that stood up against the delisting of the wolf and he stated that he was a native from the reservation and they do not believe in killing wolves, bear and other animals they consider part of their family. School district grants sexual curriculum opt-out to Muslims

St. Louis Park public schools are allowing several Somali American children to opt-out of sexually based materials being taught in English classes after law firms, True North Legal and First Liberty Institute, sent two letters explaining how the district's previous denial of opt-outs violated the First Amendment and state law. The six families are devout Muslims who immigrated from Somalia

over the past two decades. All asked for notice and the ability to opt out when their elementary school students are taught LGBTQ-affirming books with discussion that promotes these identities. Not only are the elementary schools now granting opt-out requests, but St. Louis Park High School is as well.

"We believe that we have a sacred obligation to teach the

principles of our faith to our children without being undermined by the schools. We are grateful to First Liberty and True North Legal for helping us and to the school for recognizing the importance of our faith," said Fatuma Irshat, one of the mothers.

Another parent, Hodan Has-

san, said, "We came to America because of its rich heritage of protecting religious liberty and the opportunity to raise our children in a place where they have access to success. We were shocked that our children were being taught material that violates our beliefs, but we're grateful that the school has

granted our opt-out requests." "True North Legal exists to protect the religious freedom of Minnesota families," said Renee Carlson, General Counsel of True North Legal. "Ensuring the religious freedom of students and their families is paramount, and infringing upon that right is unacceptable."


