As a bilingual social worker and the mental health services coordinator for the Sheffield City Schools district, Jacqueline Campos Johnson serves as a bridge to muchneeded resources for many of her students and their families. Her passionate efforts on behalf of the school system are paramount to the overall health of the district. Through her work, Johnson has made it her mission to connect with the most vulnerable members of her community by providing the support they need. This support includes information on how to continue their education, creating selfcare classes for teachers and students, and even securing funding for

cultural identity and recognize the value of community, family and traditions," Johnson said. "We must also recognize that which does not serve us and acknowledge that trauma-if not faced head-on-is passed on. We must break down stigmas surrounding mental health by being vocal advocates and foster inclusive environments. We owe it to ourselves and future generations to do the work.

Johnson also uses her experience of more than a decade in social work to mentor students from the University of North Alabama that are enrolled in the Social Work program to help foster the next generation of community servants.

In addition, Johnson serves as the board president of the Shoals chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness, regional representative for the School Social Work Association of Alabama and a Girl Scout volunteer.





Hudson Thornton and Malloy "Monk" Thornton, telling them their son was missing in action following the Dec. 7, 1941, attack on Pearl Harbor.

Thornton was among 429 sailors aboard the USS Oklahoma who died in the attack.

"My grandmother never accepted he was dead," his nephew John Belue said. "It was a terrible situation. She went to her grave thinking he was still alive somewhere."

Monday, On Belue was among a gathering of veterans and other community members who in Civitan Cemetery for a mournful but thankful homecoming, as members of the Navy carried an American flag- covered casket bearing Thornton's remains to his awaiting gravesite in the same cemetery with his parents and other family are buried.

While military honors are common at a veteran's funeral, this came complete with the rarity of a full military honors including a 21-gun salute.

"I'm just glad to get him home after all this time," Belue said afterward. "The Navy did a wonderful job. I hope he gets to rest in peace now."

Admiral Jeff Spivey officiated at the graveside service, saying Thornton is among 35 sailors aboard the Oklahoma whose remains have been identified through DNA testing.

In 2015, a U.S. Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency program was created to attempt to identify the remains of fallen soldiers, including those that have been gathered after the attack on the Oklahoma.

Recently, they were able to match Thornton's DNA with Belue's.

During the ceremony, Spivey presented Belue with the flag that had draped Thornton's casket. The admiral said he was impressed by the attendance for the service.

"I want to thank you for all coming today and bringing honor to this sailor, honor to his family and honor to this great nation," Spivey said.

Thornton had been in the Navy for two years and was 21 when he was killed. 

Traffic Stops

I have always emphasized to people in general that arguing with a police officer on the side of the road is the wrong thing to do.

It's always better to be calm, composed, and polite. In the last five years things have really changed in that now you are on camera and being recorded during the entire police encounter.

If you begin moving about the car or making quick motions,

reaching into a glovebox or under your seat, the officer can justify feeling unsafe and ask you out of the car for a "pat down".

You have the right to remain silent and conversation doesn't really help. If they tell you to get out of the car, you should step out of the car. If they feel unsafe and want to pat you down, don't resist, as you will only end up on the ground and then cuffed and stuffed.

I think the real idea here is that you are being recorded and you should verbalize what's going on. By that I mean you should probably say "I am not resisting". This is a casting call and you are on camera. It's fairly common for people to later say, look, I didn't resist but when the officer characterizes your attitude differently that creates a problem. If you are calmly saying out loud I am complying, I am not resisting, the video and the recording look and sound better.

After you are out of the car, police officers will often say something like "you don't mind if I search your car?". This is where you have to speak up. "I do not consent to you searching my car" would be the proper thing to say. If you're silent, court cases have held that that silence can be interpreted as consent.

The takeaway here is to always remember there as a recording of the stop and it's always better to handle these things after the event in court where calmer heads can solve the problem.

The Alabama National Register Review Board will consider the "Old Railroad Bridge" during its April 25 meeting.

The letter states individuals who have opinions on whether the property meets or does not meet National Register requirements are encouraged to write to the Historical Commission.

Barnes said he plans to write a letter of support on behalf of the historic bridge that was not only used as a railroad bridge, but also carried motor vehicle traffic across the Tennessee River between Florence and Sheffield.

"I do believe it's worthy of it," he said, especially with the ongoing preservation efforts that have taken place.

The Old Railroad Bridge Co. has over the past few years installed new deck boards to the bridge as funding becomes available.

Old Railroad Bridge Co. President Tim Wagnon said he also plans to send a letter of support to the Alabama Historical Commission.

"I think it would be beneficial as far as federal and state money and as far as improving things," he said. "I just think it would enhance its reputation as a tourist attraction." Barnes said a National Register designation could enhance the bridge's status in the Tennessee RiverLine program.

"It would bring more tourism to the location," he said.

Anderson. Christy the national register & coordinator easements the Alahama for Commission, Historical said the bridge was documented through the Historic American Engineering Record and at the time it was done, HAER resources had to be eligible for listing in the National Register. It was considered eligible, but that process isn't automatic, so it was not listed at that time. She said that provision was removed in the early

Anderson said if the review board approves the nomination, the Alabama Historical Commission has 90 days to submit the package to the National Park Service for review and approval.

She said the NPS then has 45 days to review and render a decision, which would include listing, returning to correct technical or substantive errors, or determining the resource is not eligible.

Barnes and Wagnon were not sure if being on the National Register of Historic Places would impact future enhancements to the bridge.

Anderson said a National Register listing is an honorary designation so inherently it doesn't come with restrictions.

Sheffield Mayor Steve Stanley said he thinks the old Railroad Bridge Qualifies for inclusion in the national register.

"It would give it official status as a historic structure and help draw attention to it and might help it qualify for grant funds it might not qualify for otherwise," Stanley said. "I don't see how it could hurt anything at all."

Muscle Shoals National Heritage Area Director Carrie Crawford said the MSNHA wrote the nomination, using an old nomination started by the late Sheffield Historian Richard Sheridan as their starting point.

Dear Dave,

Our son will be graduating from high school in May, and then heading off to college in August. He will also be working during the summer to save up money for school. When classes begin, do you think he should continue working a part-time job, or would it be better for him to focus solely on his studies?

Dear Brenda

Dear Brenda,

There's really nothing wrong with either approach, especially during a kid's first semester in college. As a parent, though, I'd urge you not to fall into the trap of thinking his grades will go down if he holds a job while in school. Research actually shows that, on average, kids who work while in college



carry higher grade point averages than those who don't.

The reasons for this differ, depending on who you ask, but I think a lot of it has to do with them having to learn to manage their time—and their lives—more effectively. Lots of kids could pay their way through school, and not have to worry about student loans, if they just used some of the time they spend watching television and on social activities at a job.

We never required our kids to work during the school year, but they were self-starters. And when they came home for the summer, there was no such thing as just lying around the house all day. They had jobs, and they made money. Of course, some of it went toward having a little fun during

their time off. But we made sure they set some aside for the next school year, too.

Long story short, the philosophy of not wanting kids at college to work so they can spend all their time studying is well-meaning, but misguided. For the most part, kids who work while they're in school will make better grades and develop into more mature and well-rounded individuals.



Medicare Minute

"Mail, Calls and Door Knocking 2

Last week we began discussing ways that agents and companies market Medicare plans to people turning 65. We discussed the phone calls you may receive and the possibility of someone showing up unannounced at your door. This week we will look at online marketing and direct mail.

Direct mail - This is the most common way companies market their plans. When you are within 6 months of turning 65 a company will purchase a mailing list with your name and address on it. Most companies will start sending mail 6 months prior to the month you turn 65. This is because you are eligible to purchase a Medicare supplement any time during that 6 month period. In most cases direct mail is designed to initiate a response on your part. That response is to call a toll free number. You may be calling to get information but usually are connected to a sales person. If you do respond to direct mail, our advice is to never give the agent on the line your social security number until you are ready to buy. This should protect you against unknowingly signing up for a plan.

Online marketing - Occasionally we will have someone stop by our office that has gone online to research Medicare plans. Most online marketing companies will ask you to provide your phone number and/or email address to get pricing information. Once you enter this information you will immediately begin getting phone calls. This is because when you hit "send" that information goes out to 10 or more agents who have bought that lead. All the agents will begin reaching out to you within minutes.

Phone calls, direct mail, door knocking and online marketing are perfectly legal and compliant under Medicare guidelines for some plans but not others. If you have any questions concerning any of these you can contact our office for more information.





How to Tap Underutilized **Burial Benefits for Veterans**

Dear Savvy Senior,

What types of funeral benefits are available to old veterans? My 83-year-old father, who has Alzheimer's disease, served during the Vietnam War in the 1960s.

Planning Ahead

Dear Planning,

Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) National Cemetery Administration actually offers a variety of underutilized burial benefits to veterans as well as their spouses and dependents.

Most U.S. veterans (both combat and non-combat) who didn't receive a dishonorable discharge are eligible for burial benefits. To verify your dad's discharge, you'll need a copy of his DD Form 214 "Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty." If you don't have it, you can request online at Archives.gov/veterans.

Here's a rundown of some of the different benefits that are available to veterans that die a nonservice related death.

Military Cemetery Benefits

If your dad's eligible and would like to be buried in one of the 155 national or 119 state, territory or tribal-operated cemeteries (see *VA.gov/find-locations*), the VA provides a number of benefits at no cost to the family, including: a gravesite; opening and closing of the grave and perpetual gravesite care; a government headstone or marker; a United States burial flag that can be used to drape the casket or accompany the urn; and a Presidential Memorial Certificate.

If your dad is cremated, his remains will be buried or inurned in the same manner as casketed remains.

But be aware that funeral or cremation arrangements and costs are not taken care of by the VA. They are the responsibility of the veteran's family, but some veteran's survivors may be eligible for burial allowances.

The VA also offers a memorial web page called the Veterans Legacy Memorial for any veteran buried in a national, state, territorial or tribal cemetery. This allows families to post pictures and stories of their loved one online as a way to remember and honor their service.

If you're interested in this option, the VA has a pre-need burial eligibility determination program to help you plan ahead before your dad passes. See VA.gov/burials-memorials/pre-needeligibility or call the National Cemetery Scheduling Office at 800-535-1117.

Private Cemetery Benefits

The VA also provides benefits to veterans buried in private cemeteries. If your dad chooses this option, the VA benefits include a free government headstone or grave marker, or a medallion that can be affixed to an existing privately purchased headstone or marker; a burial flag; and a Presidential Memorial Certificate.

Funeral or cremation arrangements and costs are again the responsibility of the family, and there are no benefits offered to spouses and dependents that are buried in private cemeteries.

Military Funeral Honors

Another popular benefit available to all eligible veterans buried in either a national or private cemetery is a military funeral honors ceremony. This includes an honor guard detail of at least two uniformed military persons, folding and presenting the U.S. burial flag to the veterans survivors, and the playing of Taps.

The funeral provider you choose will be able to assist you with all VA burial requests. Depending on what you want, certain forms may need to be completed which are always better to be

For a complete rundown of burial and memorial benefits, eligibility details and required forms visit Cem.va.gov.

Burial Allowances

In addition to the burial benefits, some veteran's survivors may also qualify for a \$948 burial allowance and \$948 for a plot to those who choose to be buried in a private cemetery. And \$231 for a headstone or grave marker allowance. To find out if your dad is eligible or to apply, see VA.gov/burials-memorials/veteransburial-allowance.






