### **CONSTRUCTION UNDERWAY** \$24M Luxury Townhome Community in Elkhart Lake



Construction is currently underway on a \$24 million luxury townhome community in Elkhart Lake. Van Horn Development has acquired a \$24 million housing project on property formerly owned by Sargento Foods in Elkhart Lake.

Whitetail Ridge, a high-end townhome community located off South Lincoln Street, named after the Whitetail deer that inhabit the property, will offer 70 units across 11 buildings. Each building will have between five and ten units. Rental options will include three-bedroom, two-and-a-half bathroom units and two-bedroom, two-and-a-half bathroom units. The townhomes are priced at "market rate," with the three-bedroom apartments ranging from \$2,300 to \$2,700 and the two-bedroom apartments with concierge services listed at \$2,700. Renters are responsible for utilities, but maintenance, trash, landscaping, and snow and ice management are included. The first building is expected to be completed in November, with subsequent buildings being completed at a rate of one per month.

"The project is designed as a rental property because

that is what our investors prefer, and Sheboygan County has demonstrated a need for this type of housing," said Chris Merklein, co-owner of Van Horn Development.

Footings are currently being laid and walls will be erected shortly. The building closest to County 67 is not part of the development. The 11 buildings will be situated behind the current building.

A pre-leasing option is available to reserve your desired townhome. A \$1000 deposit is required, which will be applied to the first month's rent. If you change your mind for any reason, you will receive \$500 back.





## **Engineering His Way to a Culinary Career**



Why would a seasoned engineering technician with 15 years of experience at one of the most popular sausage brands in the U.S. want to move to the foodservice side of the business? Because, he says, he wants to put himself in a position where he can directly impact end users: consumers.

Shawn Engel's change in career path began in 2021 with a job shadow at Johnsonville which exposed him to the culinary side of the company, including crafting menu items for Lambeau Field. Inspired by his experience, Engel set his sights on transitioning his career toward creating memorable experiences for consumers enjoying Johnsonville sausage products.

Engel learned from a culinary team leader that he would need an associate degree in a culinary field to join that team. Making a career change can be difficult. As a husband and a father of two teenage daughters, Engel discussed his interest with his wife, Jennifer. They decided pursuing a culinary arts education would have minimal impact on their home life.

Engel, a Kohler resident, investigated his options and chose Lakeshore Technical College based on location, cost, and American Culinary Federation accreditation. He also discovered Johnsonville's generous tuition reimbursement plan and requirement that he stay employed with the company for one year after completing his degree.

In fall 2022, Engel began taking courses at Lakeshore as a part-time student while maintaining his full-time job at Johnsonville. "My current role is extremely flexible and I'm allowed to leave for class as needed, as long as I get in my 40 hours per week. It can make for long days depending on the class schedule that semester,' says Engel.

Engel has impressed Culinary Arts Instructor and Program Coordinator Amanda Weber. "In my experience, exceptional students stand out due to their remarkable dedication, intelligence, and passion for learning. Shawn imbodies these qualities in his academic work and through his exceptional creativity, critical thinking, and leadership skills. His insatiable curiosity and drive to succeed sets him apart and inspires his peers to strive for excellence," says Weber.

Learning side-by-side in the classroom with students half his age, Engel finds the dynamic interesting. The 46-year-old says he gets excited seeing the younger students begin their careers and start their journeys. "It has opened my mind a little as well, reminding me that we all have a different story and that everyone might approach a situation or task differently."

At home, Engel says his new career path has not impacted his family's life all that much. "In fact, I would say it somewhat improved our lives because of all the wonderful creations I've learned to cook!"

Though completely supportive of Engel's new career path, Johnsonville makes no promises about having a job open for him when he graduates in May 2025. Engel wants to pursue a role involving product validation, recipe creation/verification, and catering internal and external events.

"It's important for Johnsonville to show the public that we are involved with the surrounding community. But one of the coolest things I got/will get to do is work with the culinary team from Lambeau Field in creating menu items for the upcoming football season," says Engel. "This includes the tough task of doing an audit on gameday in which I eat my way through Lambeau Field. You know, to ensure quality!"

In 2023 Johnsonville began sponsoring Summerfest

and the Milwaukee Bucks. It already had sponsorship agreements with the Green Bay Packers and Milwaukee Brewers. The sausage maker doesn't seem to be slowing its pace of Wisconsin sports and entertainment sponsorships, so perhaps it will need to beef up its culinary team by 2025.

Looking ahead, it appears possible many games and concerts may be enjoyed along with some tasty sausage creations developed at the hands of Shawn Engel.







### **Enriching Students Through Food**

Last fall, Lakeland Associate Professor of Writing Jodie Mortag taught an experiential learning Honors Seminar class titled Food: Hunters, Gatherers, and Phone Tappers.

Mortag's goal, as a mother of two young children of her own, was to help students to become more aware of the food they consume and explore the cultures and foods around them that they would otherwise never encounter or indulge in on their own.

To remain true to the experiential learning values of the Honors Program, Mortag engaged her students in thoughtprovoking and engaging experiences within the Sheboygan County area. To teach her students the communal properties of food, Mortag looked to the community. The regular field trips did not disappoint in their lessons.

"Food brings communities together, and I witnessed this first-hand," Mortag said. "A student peeling and chopping his first clove of garlic to add to a class-made chili at Nourish Farms, another student in awe as he peered into the milking parlor at Saxon Homestead, students hiking single file in the thick snow covered woods outside of Kiel examining deer rubs, and an entire class 'wowing' at the stat from the director of Fresh Meals on Wheels regarding their impact on the community beyond providing meals: 'We decrease feelings of loneliness and depression by 85%."

Each trip as a class enabled the students to delve deeper into their own relationship with food. After reading student reflections the first week of class, Mortag recognized that some students had a strained relationship with food. Her goal was to show each of her students how food can be a more intimate experience when it is a labor of love instead of a simple trip to the store.

"Not only were we learning about food," Mortag said, "we were re-working our relationship with it: 'hunting' turned to 'harvesting,' 'fat' turned to 'fit,' 'diet' turned to 'do not.""

Mortag challenged her students to guide their own learning and explore topics in food that interested them. In the end, they created their own learning experience. As a class, they decided how to tackle their student-led service learning project: the garden at Lakeland. After learning the in's and out's of gardening and harvesting throughout the course of the semester, the students came together to rejuvenate Lakeland's garden, located to the west of the Younger Family Campus Center. The project involved manual labor to revitalize the garden, collaboration with Lakeland dining services and the LU grounds crew and creating a Garden Club to maintain the garden.

Student Montana Zdroik enjoyed the way the class engaged students with the broader community.

"The class taught me that there are so many different impacts that food has on a community," Zdroik said. "From the relationships it creates between community members to the quality of how food is grown and distributed."

The honors class provided students with long-lasting lessons that not only shaped their relationships with food, but also their community. As they worked together, they became a family of food enthusiasts, thinking in terms of hunters and gatherers.


Student Sarah Stege advised students to jump at the chance to get involved in a future offering of Mortag's class.

"This class is no melt-in-your mouth wafer or Jello," Stege said. "It requires you to chew the material and think about its texture. You will ruminate on food and its history, how it got to your mouth and the people who grew, raised or hunted it."

### **LTC Receives National Bellwether Award**

### Hiring, onboarding, and retention efforts earn recognition.


According to Carlsen, after acknowledging its recruitment and onboarding practices needed improvement in 2020, the college's leadership team took steps to analyze and





ahead as the Planning Commission only meets monthly. Permits must be obtained prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

#### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Sheboygan County has established three periodic collection sites for disposing of hazardous wastes. The majority of the program is funded with County tax dollars, so be prepared to show proof of residency. When those funds are depleted, the sites will be closed until funds are again available. The fees are: \$20 – Vehicles with hazardous waste only, \$40 – Vehicles with household size electronics only (6 items or less), and \$40 – Vehicles with both hazardous waste and household size electronics (6 items or less). The first date is set for April 6th at the Highway Department on County J and Highway 67 from 8 am until 11 am. 

Susan Apps-Bodily will share stories and recipes from the warm-hearted Apps family Old Farm Country Cookbook at Wade House Visitor Center on Saturday, April 20 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Susan will share the memories that footnote the family recipes plucked straight from matriarch Eleanor Apps's well-worn, Depression Era recipe box. From canned chicken and fresh peas in milk sauce to ring bologna and wild blueberry cobbler, this realistic study of food and farm life from the 1930s-50s guides us through a time when food was local, farming was

a family affair, and homemade ice cream tasted better than anything you could buy at the store. After her presentation, guests will

be treated to samples of the recipes made in the kitchens of the

Wade House stagecoach inn.

The Wisconsin Historical Society Press cookbook features many of the Depression Era and Midwestern comfort food recipes often "forgotten" in traditional cookbooks. Seasoned with personal stories, menus, and family photos, Old Farm Country Cookbook recalls a time when electricity had not yet found its way to the farm kitchen and almost every ingredient was "locally sourced." 
