



### **City of Crosby Mayor update**

As Mayor of Crosby, I have recently attended several meetings with fellow government entities in order to provide a better understanding of the needs of our city. In February I attended the Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation District Board meeting. I discussed with them the flooding issues at our city park. Since then, they have been in touch with our city engineer and things are progressing nicely towards finding possible solutions, along with possible grants.

Also in February, the City Administrator and I met with Pete Stauber regarding the needs of the city that he may be able to provide us at the Federal level. We discussed road repairs for streets without underlying utilities and how our schools are underfunded. He stated they are working on education funding currently.

He also forwarded us a grant application and we have sent that request in and hope to hear this year, if our project was accepted

for street repair grant funding. In March I attended the "Day on the Hill" event sponsored by the League of Minnesota Cities. I was able to talk directly with Rep. Michael Howard - a member of the Tax Committee. I handed him. documentation of how the State's formula for Homestead Exclusion is hurting our residents.

In Crow Wing County alone over \$80,000,000 of Homestead Exclusion has been lost since 2019 due to rising home values. This is drastically hurting our residents that live in low to moderately priced homes. Myself - and five fellow Mayors - emphasized to Rep. Howard how the State of Minnesota needs to fix this problem. He took note and said he would bring it up at the Tax Committee.

Also at that March meeting I presented a road repair bonding request to Rep. Ben Davis and we are now officially on the request list! Attending the "Day on the Hill" event at the Capital was of great benefit to our city.

I was joined by Mayor Taylor of Deerwood and we both voiced the same requests - fix the Property Tax, give us money for road repair and help with the school funding shortfalls.

Property Tax statements are coming out this week, and if your property value has risen a lot, this can only be fixed at the state level. Too many lower valued homes are paying a higher portion of the taxes due to the State formula and they need to adjust it for inflation. They can fix it this year - call your Representatives! În 2020, the City Council began researching much needed street repairs. In March of 2021, our Engineer completed the grant/ bond request for PFA Funding for several projects including 1st St SW, 1st and 2nd Streets SE and the alleys south of Main Street. The first of many public hearings was held and the request was submitted and we were approved for more than \$9,000,000 of the PFA funding. The first phase of this project is the 1st St SW and 4th St NW project. We received funding from the PFA for over \$2,000,000 at 2.185% for 20 years. The balance of costs of around \$1,000,000 will be paid from current reserves and ARPA funds leftover from Covid.

On Monday, March 26, 2024, the Council will be voting on

whether to improve storm sewer items south of Main Street as part of the Alley/PFA project. This will provide better storm water drainage out of the areato the park and will work with the bigger plan to provide better storm drainage for the park itself. Once we get final engineered drawings the project will go out for bid. The PFA funding will be reviewedand it will be determined how much of these costs are a low interest loan and how much will be a grant.

Due to the debt we currently have for the Water Plant and the 1st Street SW project, we are hopefulthat a large portion of the Alley Project will be a grant instead of a loan. Some construction on the southern alleymay start this year if all goes well. This is a complicated project due to the electric/gas/ cable utilities beingin the same narrow alley space as the water and sanitary sewer and storm sewer. Most likely this is a 2 year project to complete.

The last PFA phase will be 1st St S and 2nd St S - east of City Hall. Engineering is working on the preliminaries.

Public Hearings will begin once the engineering is ready, most likely in 2025. Other projects we are looking into that are not part of this PFA funding are the 1st St N replacement and the 2nd St S replacement along the City Park. This is all part of the 5 year Capital Improvement Plan that the Finance Committee requested in 2021.

More information will be provided and many more public hearings will be held as information becomes available.

### Ice ridge shoreline damage

Crow Wing County Land Services is reminding property owners affected by ice ridges this winter the options for repairing shoreline damage. Given the lack of snow and above average temperatures this winter, many lakeshore landscapes around the county have been affected by severe ice ridge damage this spring. Before repairing shoreline damage, property owners should consult the Land Services Department or their city/town zoning office for a review of applicable rules.

"Given this winter's conditions or lack of, we are expecting that many property owners will be affected by annual ice ridges this year" stated Chris Pence, Environmental Services Manager.

The Crow Wing County Land Use Ordinance allows an annual ice ridge to be re-graded back to its original elevation without a permit when the work is done in the same year the ice ridge occurred. Annual ice ridges are defined as a linear mound of lakebed

materials pushed up onto the lakeshore by the action of ice within a calendar

It is important to remember that the soil from the annual ice ridge cannot be pushed back into the lake and must be graded back away from the lake. Erosion and sediment control measures such as a silt fence must be implemented before any work is started on the project.

Land Services encourages landowners to implement near shore buffers with native vegetation to help reduce annual ice ridges. The deep roots hold the soil in place and helps shorelines be less susceptible to ice action on lakes. The Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation District can be a technical resource for landowners interested in planting and establishing natural buffers. Visit https:// www.cwswcd.org/.

Any dirt moving activities on a historic ice ridge requires a shoreland alteration permit. Historic ice ridges are a linear mound of lakebed materials pushed up onto the lakeshore by the action of ice over a period of two or more years upon which well-established trees, shrubs or grasses are growing.

Additionally, the Minnesota DNR and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers may need to be consulted if restoration work extends below the ordinary high-water level (OHWL) of the lake.

### DNR seeks input on muskie plan

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is asking people to share their thoughts on how the DNR manages muskellunge as part of an update to the state's muskie long-range

For the plan update, the Minnesota DNR hopes to hear from anglers who fish for muskies, other anglers, lake-user groups, partners in tribal nations, and anyone interested in muskies. People can share input in an online scoping survey on the Minnesota DNR muskie webpage (mndnr.gov/muskie). A webinar about the update process is planned for fall 2024, and in the winter of 2024-2025 the public will be able to review and provide input on a draft plan.

Muskies are a large, popular predator fish native to Minnesota. The Minnesota DNR manages muskies by stocking them into waters, setting harvest and season regulations, population monitoring and research, and outreach and education about muskies.

As part of the plan update, the Minnesota DNR is considering ways to enhance muskie stocking in lakes that already have muskies, how to ensure that hatcheries can produce enough quality-sized muskies to meet stocking needs in these lakes, and options for improving public education surrounding muskie biology, ecology, and management. Muskie background

Minnesota has 102 waters managed for muskies, comprising 2% of the state's fishable lakes and rivers and 21% of the total surface area that is fishable. Muskies have been introduced in 48 lakes and are maintained in these lakes through stocking. The state record muskie for catch-and-release length is 58 1/4 inches, caught on Mille Lacs Lake in 2022.

Recent Minnesota DNR research on muskie diets show that, on a population level, pike and bass consume much more food than muskies in the lakes where they are present. The research found that muskies consumed a wide range of prey, but the primary makeup of muskie diets are yellow perch, white sucker, bullheads, invertebrates and northern pike. Cisco can also be important in those lakes where their populations are abundant. Walleye are not an important component of

attract bears.

While most of the female bears with cubs and yearlings are still near their denning areas, the mild winter has caused some full-grown

bears to emerge from dens early to look around or find a quick, high-calorie snack.

"Bird feeders can become bear feeders," said Andrew Tri, DNR bear project leader. "Birdseed and grains are very attractive to bears looking for a quick, high-calorie meal. Prevention is key. Once a bear finds a food source, it will likely return."

As bears emerge from hibernation, their metabolism gradually ramps up as they transition from nibbling on plants to more substantial meals. Food and food odors attract bears, and they can pick up a scent from over a mile away.

Home and cabin owners can prevent bear conflicts now by using the BearWise checklist (files.dnr.state. mn.us/wildlife/bear/bearwise/mn-bearwise-at-homechecklist.pdf) and following these BearWise basics: (bearwise.org/six-bearfeeders when bears are active. Secure food, garbage and recycling Never feed or approach a bear. Never leave pet food outdoors. Clean and store grills and smokers. Alert neighbors to bear activity.


