





WITH A **PURPOSE**

Lawyers tend to tell stories that contain a lesson. A bunch of lawyers talking can be entertaining. After having practiced law for 35 years, I have a few of the stories of my own.

Thirty years ago, I represented a very nice guy who had a child by a previous marriage. During the pregnancy the parties did not get along and shortly after the child service to the residents was born they divorced. After that

the two grandmothers meaning the mothers of the man and wife got together and decided it would be better for their children if they just went their separate ways. These two ladies decided it would be best for their children to get a fresh start. They decided the father would not come around to see the child and the wife would forego the \$50 a week she was due in court ordered child support. The plan worked well and both people remarried happily and had other children except for one small problem, which became a big problem.

About 14 years later, the child of the previous marriage decided she wanted to meet her daddy. And after quickly seeing how well her brothers were treated with 4-wheelers, mini-bikes, and trails to ride, she demanded her own 4-wheeler and her biological father declined. Within a month he had been sued for the child support he hadn't paid, which was about \$27,000 and an additional \$40,000 in interest. He didn't have the money and the court could not help him because the court did not approve the agreement that the parties entered into. Without court approval that agreement wasn't valid. The judge couldn't help, and the judgment was entered. I took that case to federal court and argued that although child support can't be discharged in bankruptcy, the interest should be. I found a few cases throughout the United States to support my position and I mean very few cases.

The federal judge declined to offer any relief and my client, a very nice guy, got hit with a judgment he didn't expect and couldn't pay. The lesson is that if you enter into an agreement about child support it has to be ratified by the court which is more than just mailing a letter to the judge. The court has to enter an order approving the change.

have daughter, Lora, who has done some pretty amazing things. She graduated salutatorian from Mars Hill Bible School, while being the only Black girl in her class. That year, 2005, her team won the Blue Map at the AHSAA State Basketball Tournament and Lora was the MVP. She was also Lauderdale County's Junior Miss 2005. She went on to be an Emory Scholar a scholarship worth \$250,000 to attend Emory University in Atlanta. While there, she became Emory's 3rd All-Time Highest Scorer (missed 2nd Place by 30 points while only averaging 17 minutes per game as their highest scorer.) Okay, stay with me, I'm going somewhere. At the University of Georgia, Lora graduated with her master's degree and a 3.97 GPA, even though she's only a second generation college student in our family.

At age 23, Lora became the Director of Freedom to Grow Unschool, an education alternative program that gave its parents and children a way to grow outside the box. She led FTGU for five years. Lora ceased that program because she had married and had two children and wanted to make more money to support her growing family. But within the last three years Lora jumped back into business to create Joy Village School. This one year endeavor was centered on the thriving of black youth. The program she created was deep, cultural, and academically successful. It was also a tremendous struggle that she managed alone. I want to share some words that she shared last year while in the final months of the battle to keep the school open. These are words of resurrection.

"I just had to tell somebody that God must be real, because yesterday I was so depressed that I didn't want to get out of my own bed. I was awakened by my own grief at 3AM...I was low, low yesterday and...I woke up from what felt like spirit surgery. And I got that, because I asked for it. Something happens when I put my mind on Jesus - something on the inside, actually happens to me, in me...reliably this happens. I have never had an opportunity to test it like this year. Friends...I have never felt so despondent, never felt so paralyzed by anxiety or crippled by depression and defeat...And I have had acutely repeated moments where I wanted to give up and felt like I had no purpose in this world, over this project. But I didn't give up - did you notice? In those times, I went somewhere, in a dark room by myself and danced and called on the name of the Lord until I moved through it and was resurrected from hopelessness. Again and again and again...

Here is what I'm getting to: All those accomplishments in Lora's life pale in comparison to her growing into loving Christ within her spirit. Lora loves the Lord with understanding and belief of His power. She knows that God is real and moving. John 14:23-24. In her baby book all I wrote was, "Live for God." While she was sharing last year, Lora said in tears, "When I speak the name of Jesus I feel alive!" Lora's love for God is her most amazing accomplishment. This is what counts. Blessed!







Medicare Minute "Prescription Drug Extra Help"

Anyone who is on Medicare has the option of signing up for prescription drug coverage. This is also known as Medicare Part D. Some people with limited income and resources may be able to get "Extra Help" with the costs related to their Medicare prescription drug plan. This includes help with monthly premiums, annual deductibles and prescription co-payments.

To qualify for "Extra Help" your annual income must not exceed \$22,836 for an individual or \$30,900 for a married couple living together. Some of the things that count as income are: Social Security benefits, Railroad Retirement benefits, Veterans benefits, pensions or annuities and any wages you are earning from a job or self-employment.

You also must not exceed the resource limit to qualify for "Extra Help". Resources would include: bank accounts (including checking, savings and CDs), stocks, bonds, mutual funds, IRAs or any other investments. Cash and any real estate other than your home also counts. The amount of your resources must not exceed \$17,220 for an individual or \$34,360 for a married couple. The amounts listed for both the income and resource limits are for 2024.

Social Security has estimated that "Extra Help" is worth about \$5,000 per year for those who qualify. We meet with many people each year who qualify for this benefit and don't even know it. To find out if you qualify for "Extra Help" you can call or visit your local Social Security office, apply online at www.socialsecurity.gov or you can call or visit our office and we'll be glad to help. Regardless of the way you choose to apply, you will need your income and resource information available.

Dear Dave.



you're playing with fire if you take him up on the offer. I assume your father-in-law is doing pretty well financially, since he can afford to make this offer. But the downside is just too risky. If I were him, I might offer to pay off the mortgage as a gift to my daughter and son-in-law. But a loan? No way. There are no strings attached to a *gift* that comes from the heart.

Don't get me wrong, Seth. I'm not bad-mouthing your father-in-law. What he's making is a very generous offer, and it's an incredibly nice thing to do. But in my mind, a very important consideration is being left out of the equation, and it's a spiritual issue. The borrower is always slave to the lender. Always. And sadly enough, nowhere is that more true than within a family.

Accepting this offer could bring instant discomfort into the relationship for you and your wife. This money situation is likely to hang over things like a dark cloud. Thanksgiving, Christmas and other special occasions will feel different—and kind of weird—when you're suddenly celebrating with your mortgage lender instead of just good, old dad.

Even if you come from a reasonable, stable family, and it sounds to me like your inlaws are very good-hearted folks, this debt will always be in the back of your mind. But if you're involved with a dysfunctional or controlling family, that tension is going to be right there-constantly. I'd thank your father-in-

law for his generosity and for the offer. But in my mind, it's just not worth the risk. - Dave



Lightning pickup trucks. Mercedes and BMW no longer plan to go allelectric by 2030.

EVs are more expensive, take a long time to recharge, and battery range in lose cold weather-especially when car heating is used. The bestselling vehicle in America is the F-150 pickup truck, and the electric version costs \$17,000 more than the gasoline model and does not have the towing or lugging capability of the gas-powered version.

This rule will put small businesses and farmers need gasolinewho powered pickup trucks out of business. They can't do their jobs with electric vehicles, because recharging saps valuable time from a day. Consider who landscapers go from house to house improving people's yards. No charging stations are nearby, and they can't take two-hour breaks to find a charging station to recharge.

disproportionate The effect on small businesses agriculture and will result in higher prices for services and food, and upward pressures on inflation. People already follow food prices closely and complain that food costs more.

The rule will cause electricity outages because the grid, even by 2032, is unlikely to be set up for 10 million electric vehicles (70% of today's new car sales) to charge, a number that would grow over time.

Electricity outages mean that people won't be able to charge their EVs, and that other services

and appliances that rely on electricity won't be reliable either. That means scheduling homework and cooking around when the power comes on.

A companion powerplant rule from the EPA, not yet released in final form, would make electricity more expensive. The proposed rule would require the closure by 2040 of all power plants that did not sequester 90% of carbon emissions. In an act of stunning dishonesty, EPA does not mention its proposed power-plant rule in its final emissions standards rule.

EPA justifies its regulation on the grounds that America will have cleaner air. But EVs are not emissions free, and they impose costs on the environment that gasoline-powered cars do not share. Electrifying the U.S. vehicle fleet would have practically no effect on global temperatures by 2100, even as it raises inflation and lowers gross domestic product.

Electricity for batterypowered vehicles comes from coal and natural gas, rather than renewables. Solar, wind, and nuclear power are generally fully used for other purposes, and additional sources of energy to meet electricity demand come from fossil fuels and hydropower. Until emissions-free fuels are common enough to have a net environmental benefit, battery-powered vehicles will not reduce emissions.

Producing batteries causes emissions. Batteries are produced in China, using energy from coal-fired power plants. Producing batteries for electric vehicles uses carbon, and the longer the range of the battery, the more carbon is used. In addition, transporting

batteries from China to the United States generates emissions.

Mining battery ingredients causes environmental damage. EV batteries weigh about 1,000 pounds and can reach 2,000 pounds. About 100,000 pounds of ore are needed to get the lithium, cobalt, nickel, graphite, and copper to make the batteries function. To get the 100,000 pounds of ore, it's necessary to move 500,000 pounds of earth.

When the battery is worn out, it must be disposed of. Some materials such as plastics, copper, aluminum, nickel, and cobalt are worth recycling. The remainder is disposed of in landfills, using a method to ensure that the lithium-ion batteries do not catch fire.



Budgeting for retirement

Farmers Benefit by Accepting

Editor:

Local farmers markets, direct-market farmers, and farm stands that are not registered to accept benefits or vouchers from customers might be leaving money on the table.

Three of these benefits are the Supplemental

Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), and the Seniors Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP). Many community members are eligible for and have these benefits and might wish to shop at farm stands or farmers markets this season. But if vendors are not registered, those sales won't happen. Farm businesses, farmers markets, and shoppers all miss out.

Producers who sell at farmers markets or through farm stands, and farmers market managers who wish to increase their sales through accepting these benefits, must register separately with each program.

A resource available to farmers and markets who wish to register to accept SNAP benefits is the MarketLink program, established by the National Association

of Farmers Market

Nutrition Programs. MarketLink works nationally and provides support for completing SNAP paperwork at no cost.

State departments of agriculture manage WIC and SFMNP registration, and registration processes vary by state.

Finally, several states offer additional funding called "Double Up Food Bucks" to support directmarket farmers and farmers markets. These are funds offered at point of sale to double the value of SNAP benefits. This increases the number of local foods people can purchase, benefiting both them and the vendor. Interested farmers and markets should contact their state Department of Agriculture to learn more.


