"The need for basic items among the homeless is overwhelming. Many of us take these necessities for granted. We aim to help as many people as possible by providing

"We have a wonderful young lady [Harika] here who's on the high school level who sees the importance of love, mercy, beauty, and compassion in the community and sees that nobody, no matter what times we're in, should have to fall to a level of ruin and destitution," Drew said. "They're essential things that all people need, and we have."

The homelessness crisis in the Bay Area continues to be a pressing issue, with McKinsey & Company reporting approximately 38,000 individuals experiencing homelessness on any given night, marking a 35 percent increase since 2019. While many organizations focus on providing essential food supplies, Heart & Homes aims to complement these efforts by addressing the dire need for basic hygiene items



# **1 dead in San Jose** hit-and-run crash Wednesday, juvenile in custody

juvenile has been taken into custody in connection to a fatal hit-and-run collision between two vehicles on the early morning of April 5, according to the San Jose Police Department.

The crash occurred in the area of Nieman Boulevard and Elkins Way at around 4:12 a.m., near John J. Montgomery Elementary School.

A white Nissan Frontier pickup truck and a black Chevy Camero car appeared to be involved in the deadly collision. According to police, the Camaro was traveling at a high rate of speed, failed to stop at a stop sign at the intersection of Nieman and



Daniel Maloney Drive and struck the pickup, resulting in the death of one occupant.

SJPD patrol officers later located a juvenile believed to be the driver of the Camaro.

The police investigation is ongoing.

Landscaper San Jose State University Mass Communications professor agreed to allow me to create a short film as a substitute for the original capstone assignments of high-fidelity and low-fidelity frames media apps last year. Having been in Independent cinema and Independent theatre here in San Jose, California since late 1995, this seemed like an ideal and optimal assignment for the course

assignment for the course.

"The Meadowverse: A Commentary" is the title chosen for this first chapter in the series. The Meadowverse. An aggregate and an amalgam of all the parcels and sectors of unmanicured environs and landscapes throughout Santa Clara County and more specifically the valleys within.

My brother, a conservation/organismal biologist, operated the camera for most of the shoot. Roughly seven 2-minute segments comprise the first cut of this short film – highlighting the details and the nuances of those locales within, whose meadowesque appearance lends itself to conjecture and Imagination.

Currently in a certificate program for Horticulture at UCLA Extension, this seems an appropriate condiment and complement to the larger objective of telling a story cinematically and theatrically in the context of western wildernesses. Multiple valleys comprise Santa Clara County. Their essence and their presence imbue the landscapes and the sceneries.

Evergreen Valley, San Jose, California is one such place. Hues and tones of green flush the valley's interior as sunrise and sunset ebb and flow – leaving in their wake a vision of which to partake. Evergreen Valley beckons to each and all who seek serenity and solace in conjunction with an escape from the unyielding demands of Life within this high-stakes high-tech megapolis known as Silicon Valley.

Oak Woodlands pre-date that which we see now, anywhere in the valleys of this county. Evergreen imbues the landscapes and psych escapes of each and all who gaze upon its splendor. Opulent and ubiquitous, Evergreen Valley glows in the waning light of Friday Night as the telescope at Montgomery Observatory (Evergreen Valley College) emerges from its sheath – to circumvent and navigate the evening sky/night sky.






owverse surrounds us. It is a cooperative of botanical and horticultural components beset by artistry and imagination.

"Following a rigorous, nationwide search, the board is confident that Dr. Chaidez is the best choice to lead the District."

Prior to her appointment as chancellor, Chaidez held multiple roles with SJECCD, including interim chancellor, vice chancellor of human resources, and associate vice chancellor of human resources.

"During her tenure as interim chancellor and her years serving our District as vice chancellor and associate vice chancellor of human resources, Dr. Chaidez has proven herself to be a steady leader, a creative problem solver, and a passionate advocate for students," added SJEC-CD Board Vice President Wendy Ho.

H ave you ever stumbled into a conversation where everyone is speaking around this "techie" word – and even after you've broken in, it is difficult to understand the

unfamiliar jargon and acronyms? Well, there's no need to sweat it. Let us teach you the meaning of some commonly used tech words: **AI Copilot** 

An AI copilot is a conversational interface that uses large language models (LLMs) to support users in various tasks and decision-making processes across multiple domains within an enterprise environment. For example, if you type in, "Summarize this memo in two sentences," Copilot will do just that by giving you a concise written summary in the chat interface below your request. Ditto for images when you describe what you want it to draw. You can even ask Copilot to write code in many widely used computer languages, including JavaScript, C, and Python.

AI copilots play a crucial role in enhancing productivity and efficiency by:

• Providing context-aware assistance: AI copilots can proactively respond to user needs based on contextual information, ensuring relevant and timely support during critical decision-making processes.

• Automating mundane tasks: By taking charge of repetitive and time-consuming tasks, AI copilots allow users to focus their efforts on strategic

and creative work, significantly boosting overall productivity.

• Analyzing data: AI copilots can quickly process large amounts of information, identify patterns and trends, and present actionable insights to drive effective decision-making.

• Enabling seamless communication: AI copilots facilitate effective interactions with various stakeholders, including employees, customers, and vendors, streamlining communication processes, and reducing delays or misunderstandings.

• Unifying disparate systems: AI copilots can be the cohesive force connecting multiple platforms, tools, and software applications under one umbrella, ensuring data integrity, accessibility, and compatibility across the enterprise.

AI copilot represents remarkable advances in artificial intelligence. Being able to generate prose, poetry, images, lists, charts, itineraries, recipes, and answers to obscure questions without requiring lots of search term tweaking is a boon. But AI copilot takes longer to produce results than a good old web search, and its facts aren't always correct (though it provides links to sources and corrects itself in response to your feedback). AI copilot itself comes with a warning: "Microsoft Copilot uses AI to respond, so mistakes are possible". As AI copilots continue to evolve with enhanced capabilities and deeper integration into enterprise ecosystems, they hold the potential to redefine the way businesses operate and compete in the coming years. 
