The April mystery photo depicts the driveway through the original Siebken's Resort, looking north from Lake Street to Elm Street.


The left rear building originally housed an opera house on the second floor. At one time it became the Forrest Tucker Theater for Harand Camp, and after that it was used for the sale of antiques. The bar and sandwich shop on street level has remained as such through the years.

The building on the left is the residence,

lobby, and dining room where Herman and Laura Siebken established the resort's reputation for good food served in an old-world atmosphere. Like the owners, many guests were of German heritage. Some were survivors of the holocaust.

Before being replaced by condos, the building on the right offered rooms for the guests. Its patio and large lawn presented a perfect background for summer weddings.

As shown in the picture, the rise in the sidewalk remains as it leads to the front of the resort.



In their reading curriculum, the third Assessment, and had their baggage grade students in Mrs. Stecker and Mrs. Porath's classes have been learning about the history of immigration, the experiences immigrants had while coming to America, the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island, and the immigration process that took place over 130 years ago. This hands-on experience will help the students with a future task in which they will write a letter from an immigrant's experience at Ellis Island.







manage a high volume of jobs.



If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be issued prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

BEACH PASS INFORMATION


The Village is reminding people that the Village beach is for residents of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Joint School District only, per Village Ordinance. The police will be monitoring beach use more frequently. The prices of the passes is \$10 for residents and \$50 for school district residents, which are good for an even and odd year (this is the first year of the beach pass). These passes will be available by May 1st. The price of replacement passes is \$25 for Village residents and \$50 for school district residents. Rental properties are to have their guests use Fireman's Park. This is the public access to the lake that should be used for guests. Some of the other regulations include:

 No person shall allow a dog to be on any public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

- No person shall use or possess beverages containing alcohol on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.
- No person shall ignite nor maintain fires of any kind on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

NO MOW MAY

No Mow May was first popularized in the United Kingdom but is now gaining traction across North America. The goal of No Mow May is to pause mowing during the month of May, allowing flowers to bloom in your lawn to help early season pollinators. Late winter and early spring is a time when floral resources are often limited.



The Village is asking those who wish to participate in No Mow May to register with the Village by emailing us at clerk@ elkhartlakewi.gov. We will provide you a sign we would like placed in your yard. The Village's ordinance on grass height is still in effect and if your grass is taller than 9" it will need to be mowed during the month. We also ask that if you choose to participate that you mow your lawn on June 1st or 2nd.

MEMORIAL DAY EVENT MAY 25TH

The annual Memorial Day Tribute Program will begin at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 25th at Memorial Park, which is located on the corner of Highway 67 and Chicago Street. Immediately following the program, the Lions Club will be sponsoring a brat fry, with proceeds to be used for maintenance of the Veteran's Memorial.

DOG LICENSES

Please stop in at the Village Hall to license your dog by March 31st. You need to provide a proof of rabies vaccination and pay the fee (\$7.00 per spayed or neutered dog and \$14.00 per dog if not spayed or neutered). A late

charge will be assessed to all dogs not licensed by March 31st.

NOISE ORDINANCE REVISIONS

The Village Board revised the noise ordinance. They have put in place limits on outdoor live music on Mondays and Tuesdays besides holidays or special permits. They also reduced the time allowed for outdoor live music on Sundays to 3 to 8 pm. This is to keep with the tradition of having quiet Sundays on the lake.

VILLAGE ORDINANCE-8.32 ANIMAL FECES

Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!!
