Florian Chmielewski of Sturgeon Lake died Tuesday, April 23 at age 97.

A one of a kind name for a one-of-a-kind man, who was known for his accordion polka band in northeastern Minnesota, and a duo career serving in the Minnesota Senate.

I met Florian and interacted with him when I was with the press in Aitkin and he was

a state senator. His grin — I remember it. Some folks have a smile. Florian had a grin.

We crossed paths at different events in the area and he told me some stories. "I didn't get to be a musician by accident," he noted. "I practice all the time. I have an accordion in every room of my house except the bathroom because my wife won't let me. I pick it up and play it all the time."

His official biography says on to attend the University he was one of 15 children born on a family farm near Sturgeon Lake in 1927. My late uncle, Peanuts Holmberg, was also a polka dancing fool born in the same decade in Lawler, MN. He and Florian probably celebrated many a Saturday night playing and dancing at polka fests all over Minnesota.

Florian had the Chmielewski Funtime Television Show for 35 years. It was broadcast locally as well as syndicated all over the United States and Canada. A local music show akin to Lawrence Welk it featured couples dancing to polka music,

He also started an International Polka Festival which ran for 40 years and won many grammy awards and was inducted into various halls of fame and awarded honorary music degrees,

He was also a state senator for 26 years, and that part of his resume shows the serious and studious nature of Florian. He served as Minnesota Senate president for a time, and seriously tried to get a higher education: He graduated from Willow River High School, with honors, in the 1940s. But he went

of Minnesota, School of Agriculture; for three years; did a business course at Fort Benning, Georgia, where he also graduated with honors and attended LaSalle Law Extension University Law School for two years. But the draws of his family business and legislative career might have kept him from getting a degree completed - except honorary ones.

He continued to perform, even at his 97th birthday in February. Daughter Patty carries on the family business.

When I moved from covering Scott and

Carver counties to Aitkin County, I wrote a column about names. I told how I learned to spell these German names, like Klingelhofer, in Carver County, but in Aitkin County, I had to learn Finnish names such as Paakarinen and Hyytinen. And, I added, I also learned how to spell Chmielewski. I heard that Florian grinned when he read it.

Moms who live in Minnesota are invited to join a free virtual fishing challenge Saturday, May 11, through Sunday, May 12, during Take a Mom Fishing Weekend, when all Minnesota moms can fish without purchasing a fishing license.

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is partnering with the Student Angler Organization and Women Anglers of Minnesota to host the challenge.

To participate in the Mother's Day weekend fishing challenge, moms simply need to join the Facebook group called "Minnesota Moms Fishing Challenge 2024" and post one photo of each fish they catch.

All participants who sub-

mit one or more fish photos will have their name entered in a random drawing for prizes provided by the Student Angler Organization and their partners, including gift cards for SCHEELS and Lund. Additionally, participants are invited to tune in for a pre-challenge virtual Fishing 101 class, hosted by Women Anglers of Minnesota in the challenge Facebook group (facebook.com/ groups/967975514717550) on May 7.

Challenge details are available on the Minnesota DNR website (mndnr.gov/takemomfishing). All fish species and sizes are welcome in the challenge. Participants can snap a photo and let their fish go or keep it if it's in season.

"This year's event follows the successful inaugural Minnesota Moms Fishing Challenge in 2023. Last year, more than 2,400 moms joined the challenge," said Cara Hanson, DNR marketing coordinator. "This year, we hope even more people will join in the fun!"

The Minnesota State Legislature established Take a Mom Fishing Weekend in 1988 to coincide with Mother's Day. This year, the weekend also coincides with the fishing opener — seasons begin Saturday, May 11, for walleye, northern pike, bass, and trout in lakes. To celebrate the fishing season, the Minnesota Governor's Fishing Opener event is taking place May 10-12 in Lake City.

Fishing season dates and regulations are available on the Minnesota DNR fishing webpage (mndnr.gov/fishing). Find out how and where to fish, learn about fishing equipment, read about ways to catch different kinds of fish, and get acquainted with fishing ethics and being stewards of Minnesota's natural resources, on the Minnesota DNR learn to fish webpage (mndnr.gov/gofishing).

Mandy Erickson, DNR fisheries expert said this year, the DNR enhanced the program in a few ways, most notably by adding 18 species in the catch-and-release category beyond the four current species that were previously recognized.

In a webinar on Wednesday, May 8, you may join DNR staff as they go live while shore fishing to talk about the upcoming fishing opener and Take a Mom Fishing Weekend on May 11-12. The webinar will focus on the upcoming fishing season, DNR fishing updates, favorite lures, and how to be more successful fishing. People might also hear about a great fishing spot or two.





CWC Land Services property review

Crow Wing County Land Services will begin the state mandated "quintile" process of physically viewing 20 percent of the parcels within the County for property valuations effective in 2025. State statute requires each county to review properties annually to verify the accuracy and completeness of assessment records used to determine property taxes. This year, property assessors will view approximately 8,000 parcels county-wide.

Property Assessor Supervisor Sandra Brueland noted "Property owners will see assessors verifying information about their property including, size, quality, homestead status, and conditions of improvements. Assessors will also be able to answer property owners' questions about the

property tax process. This may be the only contact a property owner has with the County, and we are committed to providing excellent customer service during this review process. Assessors will always display their County identification badges, will wear a Crow Wing County high visibility vest, and vehicles will display County markers. Business cards will be left with customers if no one is home during the visit, and some customers may receive a follow up letter requesting an interior review if necessary."

Brueland added, "We are committed to fairly and accurately valuing property for tax purposes. Annual physical reviews of property is an essential tool in maintaining accurate, uniform, and con-

sistent property valuations."
Information from the 2024
physical review will be reflected in the 2025 property tax assessment. Property valuations are primarily determined by analyzing sales information on similar properties throughout the County. Official notice of the 2025 assessment will be mailed to property owners by

the end of March next year.

Crow Wing County Land Services Department is committed to providing excellent customer service and responding to all inquiries in an efficient, courteous, and professional manner. on short notice for short periods of time.

Setting aside the month of May to thank those who are involved in the foster care system is important. Foster parents, family members, volunteers and mentors are essential to our community well-being and keeping our kids safe and cared for. Recognizing all involved is a wonderful way to celebrate the importance of all those who make a meaningful difference in the lives of young people in Crow Wing County.
