

Making the Most of the First 30 Days with your New Cat or Kitten

Designate a Feeding Station

Keep the food and water area away from the litter box. Cats don't like them to share the same space. Keep your cat on the same food they are already eating. You can transition over a 10-day period.

It's important to monitor how much your pet is eating, drinking, and using the restroom. If you notice anything out of the ordinary with their stool, or if they aren't urinating regularly, which can be dangerous for cats, contact your vet immediately.

Establish a Safe Zone

Cats need their own space to feel safe. For the first few days or weeks, provide a small room (like the bathroom or laundry room) with food, water, toys, a litter box, and a comfortable place to sleep while they acclimate. Cats like to escape to small spaces, so a carrier or a covered cat bed can work.

Cats can easily slither into small spaces like ductwork, registers and drains. Before you release them into your home, cover up nooks and crannies.

Make sure there is room for you to spend time and bond with your cat, but never force the interaction. Let them come to you.

Set Up the Litter Box

Fill the litter box with 1-2 inches of litter and keep it in their room to give them privacy. Once they transition out of the room, make sure the litter box is in

a private and quiet place.

Institute a Scratch Post

A cat's claws are nails that continually grow. To wear them down and protect your furniture, provide scratching posts, or better yet, a piece of cat furniture that can satisfy their scratching, playing, and climbing instincts.

Encourage Play

Keep them stimulated with a wide variety of toys - from teasers to stuffed mice - to inspire your kitty.

Make the Introduction

Abrupt introductions to other pets may cause your cat to go into survival mode. To avoid this, make sure they are relaxed and in their safe zone first, letting them sniff each other through the door. Share items like clothing, towels, or blankets so they get used to the other pets' scent. Gradually add supervised visits through a pet gate, with lots of treats, and eventually feed them at the same time in close proximity. When ready, supervise them together and encourage play - keeping a barrier close by just in case. Reinforce good behavior.





- On May 6, 1979, more than 65,000 anti-nuclear power demonstrators marched on the U.S. Capitol in protest against more nuclear power plants. Consumer advocate Ralph Nader had described nuclear power as "our country's technological Vietnam.' The group was formed after the accident at the Three Mile Island nuclear plant.
- On May 7, 1934, the Pearl of Lao Tzu, almost 10 inches around and weighing about 14 pounds, was found by a diver in a giant clam in the Palawan Sea. Gemologists did not consider it to be a true pearl, however, as it did not have the iridescence of true pearls.

- On May 9, 2005, the Thorp processing plant in Sellafield, U.K., experienced a leakage of about 20 tons of nuclear material via a cracked pipe. While the leak was contained and didn't impose a risk to the public, the estimated cost to repair the damage was expected to fall heavily on taxpavers.
- On May 10, 1899, singer/actor/dancer Fred Astaire was born in Omaha, NE. Widely considered the most influential dancer in the history of film, his stage and subsequent movie and television careers spanned a total of 76 vears.

• On May 11, 2006, a Chinese website called Baidupedia was launched in China. The American website Wikipedia had been growing in popularity in China until the government banned it in 2005. Baidupedia was set to feature a similar

format of a user-created encyclopedia, though it would be subjected to far heavier self-censorship in order to remain in good standing with the country's government.

• On May 12, 1981, following the death of IRA hunger striker

Bobby Sands on May 5, a second striker, 25-year-old Francis Hughes, died of starvation in Northern Ireland's Maze Prison.

A CONFESSION: I'M NOT **REALLY SMART.** However, I am just barely smart enough that if you teach me something 10 or 12 times, I'll pick it right up. So with 35 years of learning the same things over and over, I've learned a trick or two about computers that seem to impress

some of my clients. Honestly, y'all are too easy to impress. I only LOOK like I know what I'm doing.

SHORTCUT TO SMARTS

you look smart and save lots of time. So let's learn a few, shall we?

First a bit of history: Every PC keyboard has a "CONTROL" key. In the dark ages of computing, this key was used in combination with another key to signal the computer to "control" where the next character will be placed on the display, eject a printed page, erase the screen, ring the terminal bell, or some other operation. It's largely fallen from that kind of use but that's

why it exists in the first place. It is usually abbreviated as CTRL. On a Macintosh computer, the same key is called the COMMAND key and it serves the same function.

To use a keyboard shortcut, you press and hold the CTRL and another key at the same time. For instance, I can use my mouse to highlight this sentence then press CTRL+B to "B"old-face the type.

I can highlight another part of a sentence then press CTRL+U then CTRL+I to both "U"nderline and "I"talicise the text. See how easy that is?

The most important time saving shortcuts are for COPY, CUT and PASTE. Highlight a bit of text or a picture in a document or website and press the CTRL+C to copy the object into computer memory. You can then paste that text into another document by pressing CTRL+V. Why "V" for "paste" Turns out that V stands for "vipectus" which is a latin word for "paste." It might also stem from V's resemblance to a down arrow. Similarly, CTRL+X looks like scissors and "cuts" (removes) instead of copying highlighted objects or text from a document.

are "CTRL+A" to select "A"ll of the objects on a page. Once you select all, you can "C"opy document then CTRL+V to paste the contents into another document.

If you somehow mangle vour document in the process. CTRL+Z is your saviour. CTRL+Z translates to "undo." You can press CTRL+Z multiple times to backtrack lots of

Impressive huh? Well, not really. But now that you know some tricks, you can at least look impressive.





Property damage to your car or truck will be an annoyance and likely a problem. We can help with the property damage, and we do that at no charge. What we are really doing is helping you avoid mistakes that cost you money.

The way property damage claims are handled varies widely. There are differences between insurance carriers, and every accident is different. Some accident reports take longer to get than others. If you don't have other

transportation, the lack of a vehicle is a real problem. Some mistakes are avoidable. The insurance companies know the rules and tend to follow them.

The old Kelly Bluebook values are gone because the internet provides a public market value for vehicles. Your vehicle's value is about what other vehicles like yours sell for. Research Auto Trader or CarFax.com to see what cars like yours are selling for. Of course, low mileage is worth more, and high mileage is worth less. "Sentimental value" (it was my grandfather's truck) does not exist.

Don't rent an expensive car if you don't have to. You will probably spend more than your auto insurance is willing to reimburse you. I advise people to use their own motor vehicle insurance and pay the deductible. The insurance companies will work it out and, if possible, refund your deductible.

If your automobile is deemed a total loss, it's crucial to start shopping for a replacement vehicle immediately. Once the insurance company makes its total loss offer, it does not have to pay storage fees. Do not allow the vehicle to sit in a wrecker yard. The daily charges add up quickly. It is a mistake not to move the car to your property while a dispute is ongoing. I once resolved a case where the dispute took 400 days at \$40 a day before they came in to see me.

You will need to know where the title is and the loan payoff amount. You will also need the lender's name and address.

passed by the state review board, it will go to the National Park Service,' said Clayton Davis, a historic preservationist with the Muscle Shoals National Heritage Area. 'Specifically, it goes to the Keeper of the National Register, who has final say on approval and listing on the register."

Once it is nominated, Anderson said the National Park Service will have 45 days to review and render a decision.

Davis said the same nomination reviewed by the Historical Commission will be sent to the National Park Service with a few updates and clarifications.

Davis said he does not have confirmation the been nomination has forwarded to the Park Service. If it hasn't already been sent, he anticipates it will be sent soon. Davis said the Memphis & Charleston Railroad Bridge is being nominated under National Register Criterion A and Criterion C.

He explained Criterion refers to properties that are associated with

events that have made a significant historical contribution. Criterion refers to properties have distinct characteristics of a certain type, period, or method of construction, or that have high artistic value, are the work of a master, or are a distinguishable entity.

More specifically, Davis said Areas of Significance were transportation for Criterion A and engineering for Criterion

C. "We argued the bridge was locally significant for its connections to railroad and transportation history in the Shoals," Davis said. "Further, we argued that it was similarly significant for its uncommon doubledeck design and its construction method, a tower on wheels on the upper deck that replaced spans from above.'

Davis said the nomination paperwork required background thorough documentation of bridge's history and usage.

It also called for a defined Period of Significance, or the time range in which the property was significant under selected criterion.

documentation

Davis purposes. said they listed the bridge's Period of Significance as 1893-1939, which covers the construction of the still-standing bridge and ends when O'Neal Bridge opened.

Sheffield Mayor Steve Stanley said he was surprised the old railroad bridge was not on the National Register Historic Places. He said the non-profit Old Railroad Bridge Company was formed to acquire

the bridge from Norfolk Southern Railway and save it from demolition.

Old Railroad "The Bridge Co. acquired the bridge and some adjacent property about same time the city of Sheffield bought the right of way leading to the bridge and built Ashe Boulevard and a walking trail."

Ashe Boulevard leads to parking lot that serves the bridge.

Telemarketers are trained to get as much information out of you as they can, including your personal and Medicare information. They are also trained to talk fast and never take "no" for an answer. They may be offering walkers, wheelchairs, back braces, or Medicare Advantage Plans.

Here are some tips to help you avoid being scammed. First is never, never, NEVER give your Medicare or Social Security number out over the phone. If someone calls representing your insurance company, and they ask for your Medicare number, do not give it to them. If they are truly your insurance company, they will already have it.

The second thing to avoid is allowing anyone, except your doctor or other provider, to review your medical records or services. Third, never join a Medicare Advantage plan or Prescription Drug plan over the phone without checking with Medicare first. The commercials you see on television are designed to entice you to call an 800 number. Once you make that call the odds are you will be enrolled in a Medicare plan whether you wanted it or not.

The most important thing to remember is Medicare will never call you unless you have called Medicare and left a message. Also, Medicare will never visit you at your home. If you suspect someone has contacted you without your consent call 1-800-Medicare.



Dear Dave.

My husband and I are following your plan, and we're on Baby Step 2. We just learned that the person who has done our taxes for the last three years made mistakes on all our returns. They were really nice and did our taxes for free, but now we owe back taxes *in the amount of \$18,000.* Since we're still paying off debt, the only savings we have is the \$1,000 in our beginner emergency fund. Should we take out a personal loan to take care of this, or set up payments with the IRS? Laura


Dear Laura,

Take out a personal loan. Period.

Let this sink in for a minute. How often does Dave Ramsey tell people borrow money? Almost never. Why am I doing it now, in this situation? Because the IRS is the worst creditor on the planet. They have almost unlimited power, which they use and abuse, and they have ridiculously high penalties and interest rates. With a personal loan from a local bank or credit union, you'll at least have more input and flexibility in deciding the terms of the agreement.

Now, I don't know about you, but if the person doing my taxes screwed things up to the tune of \$18,000, I'd find someone else in a heartbeat. I understand vou want to work with someone nice, and free is usually a great price. But in this case, free was not so free after all.

Just go to your local bank or credit union, explain the situation and see what you can work out. I always recommend small



banks or credit unions over any of the mega banks. Places like Bank of America and Fifth on Third just have no soul or empathy whatsoever. the And customer service at a credit union or small bank is a hundred times better than what you'll find at a big bank. Sure, they're still bankers, but there's a human element in there. You're not just a number to them like you are to the mega banks.

I hate debt, Laura, and I'm sorry you guys are in

this situation. But 100% of the time, I'd rather have personal loan debt than IRS debt. In my mind, it's the lesser of two evils.



Ways to Make Gardening Easier as You Age

What gardening tips can you offer to older seniors? I love to putter around and work in the garden, but my back and knees have caused me to curtail my gardening activities, which I miss

Older Gardner

Dear Older.

There's no doubt that gardening can be hard on an aging body. Joints stiffen up, kneeling for prolonged periods hurts, and bending and reaching can strain muscles. But that doesn't mean you have to give up your hobby. You just need to garden differently, add some special tools and know your limits. Here are some tips that may help you.

Limber Up

With gardening, good form is very important as well as not overdoing any one activity. A common problem is that gardeners often kneel or squat, putting extra pressure on their knees. Then, to spare their knees, they might stand and bend over for long stretches to weed, dig and plant, straining their back and spine.

To help protect your body, you need to warm up before beginning. Start by stretching, focusing on the legs and lower back. And keep changing positions and activities. Don't spend hours weeding a flowerbed. After 15 minutes of weeding, you should stand up, stretch, and switch to another activity like pruning the bushes or just take a break.

It's also important that you recognize your physical limitations and don't try to do too much all at once. And, when lifting heavier objects, remember to use your legs to preserve your back. You can do this by keeping the item close to your body and squatting to keep your back as vertical as possible.

Get Better Tools

The right gardening equipment can help too. Kneeling pads can protect knees, and garden seats or stools are both back and knee savers. Lightweight garden carts can make hauling bags of mulch, dirt, plants or other heavy objects much easier. And long-handled gardening and weeding tools can help ease the strain on the back by keeping you in a standing upright position versus bent over.

There are also ergonomic gardening and pruning tools with fatter handles and other design features that can make lawn and garden activities a little easier. Fiskars and Felco make a number of specialty tools that you can buy online or at local retail stores that sell lawn and garden supplies. Also check out Gardeners.com and RadiusGarden.com, two online stores that sell specialized gardening tools and equipment that are very helpful to older gardeners.

Make Watering Easier

The chore of carrying water or handling a heavy, awkward hose can also be difficult for older gardeners. Some helpful options include lightweight fabric or expandable hoses instead of heavy rubber hoses; soaker or drip hoses that can be snaked throughout the garden; thin coil hoses that can be used on the patio or small areas; a hose caddy and reel for easier hose transport around the yard; and a self-winding hose chest that puts the hose up automatically. There are also a variety of ergonomic watering wands that are lightweight, easy to grip, and reach those hard to-get-to plants.

To find these types of watering aids check with your local lawn and garden supplies stores or visit Gardeners.com.

Bring the Garden to You

If your backyard garden has become too much to handle, you should consider elevated garden beds or container gardening – using big pots, window boxes, hanging baskets, barrels or tub planters. This is a much easier way to garden because it eliminates much of the bend and strain of gardening but still provides the pleasure of making things grow.




