












LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

HERE WAS always a place for them. In Jessica O'Neal's childhood home, their names were all different, but the loving spirit they brought with them was the same. They were children and teenagers with disabilities, abandoned or taken from abusive situations, who needed care and supervision. For the older ones, there were jobs — sometimes — but the jobs ended when the government-subsidized pay to the businesses that employed them ran out, which was often.

"As a teenager, I always thought when I got older, I'd love to have a place where I could hire people with disabilities without worrying about funding [issues]. I had a friend with Down syndrome in high school who had a job at a coffee shop, and I always remember her being so happy that she had a little job. I always thought how fun it would be to bring that special happiness to someone. The world sees them so differently, but I see them as little angels that we're supposed to take care of because I feel like they'll take care of us one day," O'Neal said.

Originally from Albuquerque, New Mexico, O'Neal attended New Mexico State University, and her hotel, restaurant, and tourism management degree led her to Nashville. She met her husband, Chris, while managing a Green Hills restaurant. He worked at a next-door food establishment.

She shared, "It was love at first sight, and we got married and had babies."

They have eight children, one of whom was a still-born baby with Trisomy 18.

"I thought, 'OK, God, maybe I couldn't handle a baby like that.' But then we had a little boy, and he was born on the same month and day we lost his sister. He has Trisomy 21, and he's just a perfect little angel that God gave us," said O'Neal. "Ever since I was little, I remember my mother taking care of kids with autism, Down syndrome — things like that — and I remem-

ber thinking, 'Oh, I'd love to have one of those babies and children because they're such little angels; they're so sweet."

The couple moved from Nashville to her husband's family farm. But no matter how much taking care of her family consumes her days, her heart is always watching for ways to make space for young people with disabilities. She hopes to provide a place where people with disabilities can contribute through responsibilities that give them a sense of pride and ownership and a place where they can spend time like other teenagers doing "everyday teenage things."

What better place for them to work and spend time than a coffee shop? O'Neal connected with young people in our community who could flourish through work and activities in a local coffee shop through conversations with like-minded people advocating for people with disabilities. She crossed paths with the woman who manages suites of businesses within the Flamingo Fiesta on North Thompson Street, remembered by long-time Shelbyville residents as the old Mittwede Shopping Center.

You'll find the Rise Up Cafe there serving specialty coffees, pastries, baked goods, salads, gourmet sandwiches, take-and-bake items, and a variety of offerings. Stopping at the coffee shop refuels your body and your spirit while pouring into the lives of those working there. O'Neal said the cafe's profits help support other nonprofit groups serving persons with disabilities.

"Everybody loves coffee shops, and [people with disabilities] love coffee shops, too. They love Starbucks just as much as everybody else," she said. "This is just a cool place for them to work. Making others happy when they serve them coffee or a sandwich puts a smile on their faces."

It's where O'Neal hopes to see the community and those with disabilities coming together on both sides of the counter. She envisions the space as a meeting place for small groups and a gathering place where friendships blos-

som and no one is separated or excluded based on their differences.

"Everybody's welcome at the coffee shop. And I like the name 'Rise Up' because people have got to understand that you've got to rise up from this world and what people think about others with disabilities," said O'Neal passionately.

The cafe is a place of belonging.

"God is so good. Our community needs this, and I think we'll all be blessed for supporting something like this," she said, adding, "I give all the glory to God. I'm just a small vessel He's using to give young and older people with disabilities a voice."

There will always be a place for them. In O'Neal's life, outreach, and world, there will always be a place for them. **GN**






"If I could touch it, I would say, 'Did a caveman touch this?' I think it was there a thousand years ago, and I wonder who touched it. I would ..." he said, his voice trailing in awe.

We reviewed some of his favorite pieces one at a time, talking through the artistic challenges and why he connects with them. Landscapes are his favorite.

His portfolio pops with timeless treasures like the Golden Gate Bridge, "See Rock City" barns, Big Ben, the Eiffel Tower, and Van Gogh's "Starry Night." His interpretation reflects his vibrant personality.

"Sometimes I need a little help, but they don't do it for me," he said. "Like this clock [on Big Ben]; this clock was very hard." WESTON JOHNSON





It took shading to create dimension, he explained.

His parents and local art teachers support his interest in painting, and Martin Rabbit's ongoing instruction at Bad Rabbit Art Studio in Bell Buckle expands Weston's skills. He paints with Rabbit weekly.

"She's really encouraged his painting, and I think he enjoys it," said his mom, Krystle.

Weston agreed. "I feel good [when I'm painting], and I'm very proud of my art."

Some weeks, he knows what he wants to paint when he arrives at the studio. But there are times he is undecided.

"Sometimes I know in my mind what I want to do. Sometimes it takes longer," Weston said.

One of his favorite paintings is one he knew he wanted to do.

"This was my idea. I saw a Bob Ross picture, and I thought I could do it," he said, holding up a tranquil landscape with an evergreen-flanked stream winding down from snow-capped mountains.

And he was right. There's no mistaking the trademark peace felt by the teachings of Bob Ross. Happy trees, soft clouds, and a trickling stream invite you to slow down.

Weston doesn't just paint images; he wants to experience them. Referring to his Bob Ross landscape, he said, "I want to see this place. I don't know where it is, but I want to see it. I'm thinking it's gonna be in Utah."

He visited Rock City, but other sites he's painted are still on his list to see. Big Ben, the Eiffel Tower, the Golden Gate Bridge, and Stonehenge aren't just landmarks to take in visually. He wants to experience them with all his senses.

"With Big Ben, I would ask someone who has seen it, 'Have you ever touched it before? Is it very dusty?' he expressed thoughtfully.

For all the ways he experiences the art that brings him joy, it's also a tool for touching others' lives. People in Colorado, Florida, Texas, and Michigan have bought his art. Last year, he sold prints of his art at the Bell Buckle Craft Fair, raising \$500 for the Shelbyville Community Soup Kitchen.

Robert Martin, manager of the soup kitchen, said he knew Weston was a special young man the first time he met him. "He always shined, and when I found out about his donation to the soup kitchen, it just confirmed my first impression of him," said Martin.

Weston's parents hope to help him raise money for a good cause every year.

His dad, Adam, said, "We want to push Weston to continue to be creative. We want him to continue to give back to the community by selling his art, and that's something that's really important. He wants to do that because it makes him feel good to give back."

Weston has some advice for those who think we can't paint or are afraid to try.

"There's nothing to worry about. It's just all about fun. If you get something on your shoes or your clothes, it doesn't matter about that. It matters what you paint."

Weston's advice is as much about infusing creativity into your lifestyle as it is about painting. While he may be too young to understand the depth of his wisdom, his parents are not.

"It's exciting watching Weston be creative. A creative mind is going to help as he goes through life. It's amazing to see," Adam said. "He goes [into the studio], and we don't know what he's going to paint, and then, all of a sudden, he comes out with it. And you're like, 'What just happened?"

Krystle agrees. "It's exciting when we pick him up each week just to find out what he's painted and why he chose it. We were completely surprised when he painted Gordon Ramsay. My favorite is his ostrich in motorcycle goggles. The creativity that went into it just makes me smile."

His art does that; it brings a smile, spreads joy, and helps make life better all the way around.

Weston's artistic journey is just beginning, but the foundation is already strong. It's a journey filled with exploration, challenges, and moments of pure joy. It's a testament to the power of curiosity, the importance of support, and the magic that happens when a child is encouraged to dream in color. With each sunrise, a new canvas awaits, and with each stroke, Weston continues to paint his own unique masterpiece. **GN**

chocolate ice cream studded with brownie bits, blended to creamy perfection and topped with a generous dollop of whipped cream, it was a decadent delight that left me craving more.



FROM FARM TO FORK TO FAMILY FUN

Crossing Creeks
Farm delivers

The birdsong and blue sky seem to defy the concrete and office buildings surrounding you, but the stress inside pulls you back into reality. Notification dings from your phone and laptop tap your shoulder, demanding attention. Your work week may last a few days longer, but the date on your calendar confirms the reservation for your three-day weekend escape to an unplugged life.

You can't wait! You stare at the photos online throughout the day, imagining the glass no longer separating you from spring's celebrations. The screened front of your Adirondack cabin invites stargazing and gentle breezes. Crickets and hoot owls lull you to sleep, and the mockingbird awakes you — not your cell phone alarm. Breakfast over

the fire pit and showers in the open bathhouse prepare you for the day. A tour of the property is first on your agenda, followed by a family hike at a nearby state park. Finish the day gathered around the fire pit again under the glow of solar-powered string lights. With the stars in view, your cabin welcomes you for another peaceful night's sleep.

It's not a spring fever-induced delusion. It's a reality when you visit Crossing Creeks Farm in Shelbyville, a local agribusiness featuring regenerative farming, RV and open-air camping, and sales of grass-fed meats, eggs, and locally sourced products. Its on-site commercial kitchen offers take-and-bakes, dairy, beverages, desserts, bone broths, and other organic, nutrient-rich foods.

Good-for-you food, farm living, and hospitality permeate the atmosphere at Crossing Creeks, a 125-acre farm purchased in 2012 by Shane and Elizabeth Stuart alongside Elizabeth's parents, Reid and Susan Farmer. What started as an idea for a generational farm soon grew into a passion for nutrient-dense beef and a desire to feed their family the best possible food. From there, they expanded to sharing their food with the community.

Elizabeth said, "My parents are the true inspiration behind Crossing Creeks Farm. Through their own health journey, they connected the quality of food they consumed to the quality of their health. And so to better feed them, ourselves, and our community, we stepped into farming over 15 years ago."

They knew how they farmed would influence the quality of the foods they produced.

"We practice regenerative farming with intensive rotational grazing, which puts our focus on healing the soil first," Elizabeth said. "This results in healthier animals, which in turn produces nutrient-dense meats and eggs for our community."

Their farm kitchen and store connects farmers and artisans committed to improved lifestyles. It offers these sellers a

storefront for their goods, strengthening our community through collaboration.

"We currently work with Belle Fleur Farms for their organically grown produce and Red Hill Farm for their organic jams and sourdough bread, both of which are located right here in Bedford County," Elizabeth said. "These partnerships support our local customers as well as traveling guests for a convenient one-stop shop for all things local. During their visit, guests and customers can enjoy freshly made treats from our onsite commercial kitchen and a latte,

smoothie, muffin, or brownie from our kitchen window."

The farm's convenient location to Bedford County's historical sites and events and its location near the Tennessee Whiskey Trail makes for the perfect place to stay overnight. There are RV and camper pads with hookups and charming open-air Adirondack cabins with everything you need. New things are developing this year as well.

Elizabeth said, "We are currently working on remodeling a 1970s block garage into a stunning Airbnb for guests to stay year-round, with plans to open in the spring of 2024. In the summer of 2023, we had the opportunity to create an educational nonprofit, The Bridge at Crossing Creeks, here on the farm in order to create workshops and classes for our community to gain hands-on learning experiences for farming and homesteading. With continued support from our community, we hope to expand our educational offerings in 2024."

Through these and other offerings, like their horseback riding program, the family connects with guests on a deeper level as they spend more time on the regenerative farm.

"Our greatest joy of hosting is when a guest or their child encounters farming for the first time, like watching a chicken peck the ground or lay an egg or watching a calf take its first steps," Elizabeth enthused.

An unplugged adventure awaits you at Crossing Creeks Farm. Visit for a day, overnight, or longer, immersing yourself in the beauty of nature and the healthier options for nourishing your mind, body, and soul. Put a visit on your calendar. Lean back, breathe deep, and smile. Everyone around you may still be stressed and think you've finally lost it, but you know better. Blame it on spring fever! **GN**
