

### History Of Berrien Springs

Berrien Springs, like Berrien County, is named for John M. Berrien. "Springs" was added after mineral springs were discovered in the area.

The village is the site of the earliest European-American settlement in Oronoko Township. It was first known as "Wolf's Prairie" in reference to the 1,000-acre prairie in which it was situated. The site had been a village under the leadership of a Potawatomi chief named Wolf. The first permanent settlers (according to European-American terms), John Pike and his family, did not arrive until 1829.

Francis B. Murdoch was a co-founder of the village and the first lawyer in the county. (His surname was spelled as 'Murdock' in some records.) In 1831 he built a two-story log house, which is the oldest surviving



example of its kind in Michigan. In 1973 this house was moved near Courthouse Square, to be part of that historic complex.

Murdoch was known in the antebellum period for representing enslaved African Americans in freedom suits, in which they tried to gain freedom. Michigan was established as a free territory and later state. It went by the principle of "once free, always free". If slaveholders brought enslaved people to the state, the latter were judged to be free.

The village of Berrien was platted in 1831. The Berrien Springs post office opened with the name "Berrien" on December 4, 1832; this was changed to Berrien Springs on April 18, 1836. Berrien Springs served as the county seat from 1837 until 1894, when St. Joseph was designated as the county seat.

Berrien Springs Courthouse, designed by local architect Gilbert B. Avery, was completed in 1839, making it the oldest courthouse in the state. The Greek Revival-style courthouse emulated the architecture of ancient Greece with its large columns, triangular pediment and white paint. After the county seat was moved in 1894, the building was put to various uses and briefly was vacant. In 1967, efforts to preserve and restore the courthouse were started. Such restoration was completed by 1975.

The restored Courthouse Square also features the Midwest's most complete surviving mid-nineteenth century county government complex. Today a county museum and archives are housed in the square. The courthouse serves as headquarters for the Berrien County Historical Association. Its original buildings are listed on the National Register

of Historic Places. The property is dedicated to the preservation of Berrien County's history and does this through permanent and temporary exhibits, programs, events, and community outreach.

Berrien Springs was once known as the Christmas pickle capital of the world. A festival was established by the Berrien Springs-Eau Claire Chamber of Commerce, the Berrien County Historical Association (BCHA), and the village. They featured parades, games, activities, and a Pickle Prince and Princess contest. The event ran until the mid-2000s. In 2021, the Pickle Festival was revived by the Village, the BCHA, and the Berrien Springs Community Library.

### Watervliet Paper Mill

The flow of the Paw Paw River powered the earliest lumber mills near the site of the Watervliet Paper Mill. With the help of dams, by the late 1830s, local timber was depleted after only a few decades. A brick paper mill was built on the former site of the saw mill and first began operating in 1894, but was closed by 1905.

The Watervliet Paper Company was formed in 1910, primarily by Kalamazoo investors. The paper mill here was considered "one of the best constructed plants ever erected" in Michigan, so it was re-opened with renovations and new state-of-the-art machinery. In 1912, the Watervliet Paper Company (WPC) began making fine glossy or "coated" paper products. A rail spur connected the paper mill to the railroad in town, allowing the WPC to easily bring in pulp sources and ship out its finished products.

WPC quickly gained a reputation for quality and consistency. Paper made in Watervliet was used around the nation as catalog covers, including Sears Roebuck & Co., as well as labels and wrappers in goods such as Wrigley's Gum, Campbell's Soup and Kodak Film. The mill also produced U.S. post-

age stamps and large amounts of playing cards. Hundreds of workers drove the success of WPC by 1960 the payroll included 470 employees. It was not only the area's largest employer, its significant contributions to local taxes helped fund the fire and police services, schools and the hospital in Watervliet. WPC sponsored leisure activities like baseball and bowling teams, musical groups, an employee newsletter, annual parties and social events. The paper mill shaped everyday life for local residents and generations of workers.

Throughout its early history the paper mill was powered by a combination of water wheels and steam engines, and used large amounts of river water for paper making. In 1973 the mill introduced a new water use and recycling system that prevented any further impact on the Paw Paw River. WPC became a part of Hammermill Paper in 1956, then it changed hands again four times after 1974. The paper mill produced its last paper in 1994 and was demolished in 2002, ensuring the total clean-up of hazardous wastes at the site. The historic dam structures remained in place until 2011, when the natural flow of the Paw Paw River was restored.

### Hickory Creek Phantom Skater

In its wintery heyday, Hickory Creek in Buchanan often welcomed ice skaters when the temperatures dropped low enough. To get their children home on time from a day of skating, parents often warned their children that the Phantom Skater would catch any stragglers.

An enormous figure clad in black tights and a skull cap, the Phantom Skater's blades flashed green sparks and blue flames, according to the recollection of a local. He would leap over bridges while giving out shrieks of eerie, horrifying laughs.

However, only one man has publicly come forward claiming to have encountered the Phantom Skater himself. That was the late Harvey Seasongood, who once operated Harvey Seasongood Farm Supply on Glenlord Road in Lincoln Township.



Seasongood, who died in 1964, said he and other children were once skating along the creek and lost track of time. Then he heard the horrifying scraping of huge blades as the Phantom Skater approached.

When everyone scattered, Seasongood wasn't so lucky. He got stuck in a barbed-wire fence at the top of the ravine. Although the Phantom Skater didn't see Seasongood, the young boy was horrified to find the spectral

skater looked exactly as the legend said. Towering, wearing black, fiery skates and with cloven hooves where his feet should be. He cast no shadow in the moonlight.

The legend of the Phantom Skater still makes its way around the rumor mill these days, although there haven't been more reported sightings. The kids must be getting home on time after a day of winter fun.

### DRIVE-IN THEATERS

On June 6, 1933, eager motorists park their automobiles on the grounds of Camden Drive-In, the first-ever drive-in movie theater, located on Admiral Wilson Boulevard in Pennsauken, New Jersey.

Park-In Theaters—the term "drive-in" came to be widely used only later—was the brainchild of Richard Hollingshead, a movie fan and a sales manager at his father's com-

pany, Whiz Auto Products, in Camden. Reportedly



He experimented in the driveway of his own house with different projection and sound techniques, mounting a 1928 Kodak projector on the hood of his car, pinning a screen to some trees, and placing a radio behind the screen for sound. He also tested ways to guard against rain and other inclement weather, and devised the ideal spacing arrangement for a number of cars so that all would have a view of the screen.

The young entrepreneur received a patent for the concept in May of 1933 and opened Park-In Theaters, Inc. less than a month later, with an initial investment of \$30,000. Advertising it as entertainment for the whole family, Hollingshead charged 25 cents per car and 25 cents per person, with no group paying more than one dollar. The idea caught on, and after Hollingshead's patent was overturned in 1949, drive-in theaters began popping up all over the country. One of the largest was the All-Weather Drive-In of Copiague, New York, which featured parking space for 2,500 cars, a kid's playground and a

full service restaurant, all on a 28-acre lot.

Drive-in theaters showed mostly B-movies—that is, not Hollywood's finest fare—but some theaters featured the same movies that played in regular theaters. The initially poor sound quality—Hollingshead had mounted three speakers manufactured by RCA Victor near the screen—improved, and later technology made it possible for each car's to play the movie's soundtrack through its FM radio. The popularity of the drive-in spiked after World War II and reached its heyday in the late 1950s to mid-60s, with some 5,000 theaters across the country. Drive-ins became an icon of American culture, and a typical weekend destination not just for parents and children

but also for teenage couples seeking some privacy. Since then, however, the rising price of real estate, especially in suburban areas, combined with the growing numbers of walkin theaters and the rise of video rentals to curb the growth of the drive-in industry. Today, fewer than 500 drive-in theaters survive in the United States.

#### KAYAKING

There is no better way to explore not only Lake Michigan's coast, but interior waterways around our region than by kayaking Southwest Michigan! From the big lake and rivers winding by breweries to creeks and inland waters. there is much to see while paddling. Take in the nature around you and those rippling surface reflections. Here are some of the best places to kayak:

conditions before paddling; wear a properly fitting life jacket; and if you are a beginner, stay close to the shoreline.

### **GALIEN RIVER MARSH TRAIL**

Approximately a six-mile stretch on the river that starts at Glassman Park in New Buffalo Township and ends at the City of New Buffalo's boat launch. This is an easy river to paddle upstream and downstream. The best viewing of wildlife is in the early morning and evening.



### LAKE MICHIGAN WATER TRAIL

New Buffalo to South Haven: 50 miles of coastline that offers some of the most amazing scenery - magnificent dunes, lighthouses, wilderness, beach towns where you can shop and catch a bite to eat and stunning sunsets. Popular places to launch are New Buffalo Beach, Warren Dunes State Park in Sawyer, Weko Beach in Bridgman, Lions Park/Silver Beach/Tiscornia Beach in St. Joseph, Jean Klock Park in Benton Harbor and Deerlick Creek Park in South Haven. The waves can change quickly from mirror-smooth to dangerously wild. Always check the weather and wind

#### SISTER LAKES AREA

Dowagiac & Edwardsburg: The calm inland waters in the Sister Lakes area are ideal. for stand-up paddle boarding. You can paddle from sunrise to sunset on Magician Lake, Dewey Lake, Indian Lake, Pipestone Lake, Cable Lake, Big Crooked Lake, Little Crooked Lake and Round Lake. But one of our favorite paddles is starting at the Christiana Creek Paddling Launch near Edwardsburg and then doing one, two or all three of the interconnected lakes - Juno Lake, Christiana Lake and Painter Lake.

### Where to Launch Your Kayak

We have several kayak launches throughout Southwest Michigan. Some of them are a little more established than others, while a few are simply right off the sand of our beaches. Here are a few popular spots:

#### **Carronde Park Access:**

This St. Joseph River launch site is on Riverbend Dr, Benton Harbor. **Galien River Access:** Red Arrow Highway, East of New Buffalo Paw Paw River Riverside Access:

On Coloma Road, this launch is handicap accessible with a mechanism to help slide into the kayak and lower into and out of the water!

St. Joseph River Access: Niles Boat Ramp - Niles





#### HIKING

Our paved trails, boardwalks and well-worn paths take you along our Lake Michigan shores, into the woods and across our wideopen farmland. Many are ADA accessible so everyone can enjoy the outdoors. The region's longest trail is the 34-mile Kal-Haven Trail State Park between South Haven and Kalamazoo. Sarett Nature Center and the Galien River County Park have walkways over the treetops. Your reward for hiking the dune trails in Warren Dunes, Grand Mere and Van Buren State Parks is seeing the jaw-dropping views of Lake Michigan.

### **Warren Woods State Park**

Elm Valley Rd, Three Oaks Wrapping along the Galien River, this state park is in Three Oaks. It offers 311 acres of nature preserve that is just seven minutes away from Warren Dunes State Park.

### **Warren Dunes State Park**

12032 Red Arrow Hwy, Sawyer Warren Dunes State Park provides 1,952 acres of recreational opportunities along Lake Michigan. The rugged dune formation rises 260 feet above the

lake, offering spectacular views and is excellent for hang gliding. The park is home to 3 miles of shoreline and 6 miles of hiking trails and is open year-round.

**Grand Mere State Park** 

7337 Thornton Dr. Stevensville Grand Mere State Park is characterized by magnificent sand dunes, deep blowouts and half a mile of Lake Michigan shoreline, accessible by the park's two trails. Two inland lakes lie behind the dunes in the undeveloped natural area. Royalton Township Nature Trail

Bacon School Rd, St. Joseph

This year-round, wheelchair-accessible trail off Bacon School Road surrounds you with beauty for three-quarters of a mile. Wind your way through wooded ravines, by a pond, across wetlands, into an open prairie and down to the river during daylight hours. In the warmer months, bring a picnic and enjoy the fragrant tapestry of wildflowers.



## The Underground Railroad - Vandiala Hub


The Underground Railroad (UGRR) existed from 1830-1861, the start of the Civil War, and was neither underground nor a railroad. Rather it was a series of houses, barns, cellars and other hiding places that were stops for fugitive slaves on their journey north to freedom in Canada.

Rail transportation was becoming popular in the early 1800's and the UGRR adopted the terms. The routes that freedom seekers followed north were called lines. The places where they hid were called stations. Those who provided food and shelter at the station were called stationmasters, and those who carried freedom seekers to the next station. were called conductors. Canada outlawed slavery in 1833 and became a beacon for freedom seekers everywhere. Escape from the deep south slave states was almost impossible. Most freedom seekers journeyed north on hundreds of lines from the border slave states of Kentucky, Virginia, North Carolina and Tennessee through the free states of Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York

and Michigan, crossing into Canada at

various sites. It is said that between 50,000 and 100,000 freedom seekers escaped bondage by 1861, many on the UGRR.

Anti-slavery abolitionists of all races and religions participated in the Underground Railroad.



Quakers were the first to declare slavery a 'sin against man and God' freeing their slaves in the late 1?00's. Many moved to free states to escape slavery and freedom seekers followed them.

There was a large settlement of Quakers in Wayne County Indiana, many of whom moved into Cass County Michigan around 1830, settling in Penn, Porter and Calvin Townships, known then as Young's Prairie. Some of them became part of the Ouaker Line of the UGRR. Freedom Seekers crossed the Ohio River at Cincinnati, were taken by conductors to stations along a route to Wayne County, IN up to Bristol IN to Vandalia, Ml. Another route was called the Illinois Line. Freedom Seekers crossed the Ohio or Missouri Rivers, and traveled north through Illinois to Chicago to Niles, Michigan and into Vandalia. Well known UGRR stations and stationmasters in the area were the homes of Stephen Boque, William Jones, Ishmael Lee and the Carriage House of James E. Bonine. Conductors Zachariah Shugart and

African American Henry Shepard took freedom seekers to the next station, the home of Dr. Nathan Thomas in Schoolcraft.




From there they continued their journey to Battle Creek, then stops about 20 miles apart until they reached Detroit, where they crossed the Detroit River into Canada.

Many free black families began arriving in Cass County in the mid-1800's, purchasing land and creating thriving farms. They founded Chain Lake Baptist Church and Mt. Zion AME, formed anti-slavery societies and played an important role in the UGRR. It is said that over 1500 freedom seekers came through Vandalia on the Underground Railroad. Slave catchers weren't far behind.

# 10 Great Lakes Fun Facts You May Not Know

Thousands of years ago, receding glaciers formed the Great Lakes and created Michigan's iconic peninsulas. Here are ten fun facts you may not know about these incredible natural treasures.

### 1. Lake Superior is the largest freshwater lake in the world by surface area

Spanning nearly 32,000 square miles, Lake Superior is not only the largest freshwater lake in the world (by surface area) but



it is also one of the largest lakes in the world, second only to the Caspian Sea. In fact, if you were to add up all the water in Lake Michigan, Lake Huron, Lake Ontario, and four of Lake Erie it would total the volume of Lake Superior.

### 2. Lake Michigan's shore is home to the largest freshwater sand dunes in the world.

Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore, as well as many other protected dunes along the western coast of Michigan, make up the world's largest collection of freshwater sand dunes. The tallest dune at Sleeping Bear stands about 450 feet above the shore of Lake Michigan.

### 3. The Great Lakes are the largest freshwater system in the world.

The five Great Lakes - Superior, Huron, Michigan, Erie and Ontario - span a total surface area of 94,600 square miles and are all connected by a variety of lakes and rivers, making them the largest freshwater system in the world.

### 4. More than 20% of all the world's freshwater is in the Great Lakes.

It is estimated that there are nearly 24,000 cubic miles of surface freshwater on earth. The Great Lakes hold over 5,400 cubic miles of water -- therefore accounting for more than 20% of the world's surface freshwater.



## 5. Lake Superior contains half of the water in all the Great Lakes.

As mentioned before, the Great Lakes hold over 5,400 cubic miles of water. Of this amount, Lake Superior holds 2,900 cubic miles, or 3 quadrillion gallons -- accounting for more than 50% of the water. The rest is distributed among the other four lakes, with Lake Michigan holding the second most, Huron third, Ontario fourth, and Erie holding the least. To raise the water level of Lake Superior by one inch, you would need to pour more than 500 billion additional gallons into it!

# 6. Lake Michigan is the only Great Lake that is entirely within U.S. territory

The Great Lakes touch 8 states – but Michigan is the only state that touches four lakes, with borders on Superior, Michigan, Huron and Erie. While two Canadian provinces also touch the Great Lakes, Lake Michigan is the only Great Lake that doesn't touch Canada.

7. The Empire State Building would sink beneath the surface of Lake Superior.

Lake Superior's deepest point is 1,330 feet – for comparison, the Empire State building is 1,250 feet tall from ground to roof. If you built the Empire State Building on the deepest point of Lake Superior, the only thing peeking above the waves would be the antenna.

8. The Great Lakes Region is the primary water source for more than 40 million people.

It accounts for more than 90% of the surface freshwater in the United States. The freshwater system is also an important shipping route, tourist attraction and energy source.

## 9. Michigan has the most freshwater coastline of any U.S. state.

Michigan also ranks in the top 10 for shorelines in the U.S. Who needs the ocean when you can go boating, surfing, paddle boarding and swimming in the fresh waters of the Great Lakes?

## 10. Lake Michigan has a 'Bermuda Triangle' of its own.

There's an area of Lake Michigan where many unexplained occurrences have left people bewildered that has been dubbed the Michigan Triangle – similar to the Bermuda Triangle. Occurrences have included unexplained ship disappearances and missing planes. North of the triangle near Traverse City, a strange, Stonehenge-like rock formation rests below the lake's surface. Glen: Downtown St. Joseph is home to a new breakfast spot that is garnering rave reviews. The Copper Pot Breakfast Café opened its doors in November by Robert and Tawn Montgomery, who also own the adjacent 221Main Restaurant and Cocktail House at the corner of Main and Pleasant Streets.

"We've heard for years that there were not enough breakfast restaurants in the downtown area," Tawn stated. "We already own the space and were not utilizing it during the morning hours, so the idea was birthed."

One of the unique features of The Copper Pot is their coffee/espresso bar which

also has alcohol options. As I sipped on an **Espresso Martini**, I was taken with its smoothness. Robert explained that the smoothness and rich flavors come as a result of cold brewing Forté Coffee espresso beans, resulting in a drink that is less acidic and bitter compared to traditional hot espresso. "We top the expresso martini with three espresso beans," Robert said. "Tradition says they symbolize health, wealth and happiness."

I also noticed the cocktail menu read **MIMOSA FUR-THE-TABLE** - a carafe of OJ, a bottle of prosecco and miniature frozen OJ

paws at the bottom of each glass. "With a passion for pets, we've made the decision to contribute \$5 to the Humane Society of Southwest Michigan for every Mimosa FurThe-Table ordered." Tawn explained.

If you are an Eggs Benedict fan, The Copper Pot has eight "Benny's" to choose. We sampled the **Eggs Florentine** which had rustic, country toast as the base instead of a traditional English muffin. Piled high was sauteed spinach, avocado, sun-dried tomato, and poached eggs, bathed in a delightful hollandaise sauce. Like 221 Main Restaurant, **Chef Chris Hooley** makes everything from scratch, including this exquisitely balanced hollanda-



ise. The slightly sweet undertone and tangy acidity of the sundried tomatoes made this dish "pop."

We watched as pancakes, French toast and waffles paraded from the kitchen to other tables, and all looked visually appealing. We split the **Copper Pot Waffle**, which was golden brown, crowned with lemon confit and served with house-made amaretto syrup. The delicate aroma of freshly cooked batter tantalized the senses, inviting anticipation with each bite. The waffle held a decadent, buttery taste complemented by subtle notes of vanilla, almond, and, of course, lemon. These flavors complemented the sub-

tle sweetness of the cake but didn't overpower. You can add little bites of the lemon confit to boost the intensity. I could do another review on the house-made amaretto syrup. Shelly is not much of a drinker, but she adored this syrup, which unquestionably elevates the waffle experience with its wow-factor. This is a 21+ dish.

Since adding **The Breakfast BLT** to the menu, it has quickly become a fan favorite. The massive sandwich consists of jumbo slices of rustic bread enveloping two eggs, thick bacon, roasted tomato, arugula, and horseradish mayo. Initially uncertain about horseradish mayo on a breakfast sandwich, I found it to be pleasantly subtle yet undeniably superb. The bacon was on point...thick, meaty, salt and smoke balanced, and cooked



to crispy perfection. Roasting the tomato and utilizing the peppery taste of arugula were brilliant culinary choices. This champion is served with The Copper Pot's soon-tobe-famous Morning Potatoes. The cubed redskins were tender yet slightly firm in texture, with a golden-brown exterior that offers a satisfying crunch. Each bite revealed a velvety interior, infused with savory flavors from the seasoning. When asked about the blend of seasoning, Robert shared, "It's the same seasoning blend we utilize at 221 Main for our fries. People love our fries, so we decided to try it on our potatoes with the same positive response." I pressed in for the secret blend of seasoning, but Robert jokingly said if he told me, he'd have to kill me.

The Copper Pot is "killing it" in downtown St. Joseph with elevated breakfast.

Shelly: When I come back to The Copper Pot, I want to try the Coconut French Toast.


