





This year's game this year is dedicated in memory of Rick "Uncle Jesse" Brewer.

Henry "Heinie" Emmett "Heinie" Manush was born July 20, 1901, in Tuscumbia.

Over his 17-vear League career Major from 1923-1939, Manush played with Detroit. St. Louis, Washington, Boston, Brooklyn, and Pittsburgh. In his first year with Detroit, he played in 109 games, substituting for Ty Cobb. Manush career batting average of .330 is good for 35th all time in MLB history, right behind Stan Musial. Manush had 110 home runs, 1,183 runs batted in, and 2,524 hits. During four of those years, he compiled 200 hits in four of his Major League seasons. Manush led the American League in triples in 1933, led the league doubles twice (1928 and 1929), led the league in singles for three seasons (1928, 1932, and 1933) and was the American League batting champion in 1926. He also stole 113 bases. His 33 career double plays turned in left field still ranks 25th in major

league history.
Following his playing days, Manush was a minor league manager, a scout for the Boston Braves, and a coach for the Washington Senators.

In 1964, Manush was the first Alabamian to inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame Cooperstown, Following his death in 1971, Manush was elected to the Alabama Hall of Fame in 1972, and to the first class of the Colbert County Sports Hall of Fame in 2000. He is a member of the Michigan and Florida Sports Halls of Fame and is on the Washington Nationals Wall of Fame.

COMPASSION AND REASONABLE BOUNDARIES

Dave,

How do you manage a situation where you feel an employee may be taking advantage of you when it comes to time off? I have one person who seems to have endless things pop up throughout the year, and she's always asking for extra time off. This year, she has already used up her paid time off (PTO), knowing she has fertility treatments scheduled later in the year that would require time off. I've always wanted my business to remain familyoriented and employeefriendly as we grew. But I'm starting to feel my heart harden, too, like she may be taking advantage of me.

Kate.

The fact that you're conflicted about this shows you have a good heart. Team members are individuals,



not units of production. We all have unique hopes and dreams, and you should recognize and respect that. But it sounds like this particular employee also has a habit of making dumb mistakes where her time off is concerned.

I've experienced this kind of behavior from time to time as my company's grown. And as time's gone by, I've started listening to my gut to differentiate actual needs from stupidity. I try to treat other people the way I'd like to be treated, instead of just through the lens of what I want or what's good for Ramsey Solutions.

If a team member is going to make a series of bad choices, I'm going to assume at some point they don't really want to work here. You can be the nicest, sweetest person in the world and still do

dumb things that make you unemployable. But holding someone accountable for their actions doesn't mean you lack compassion.

We've had situations at my company where someone runs through their PTO, then something comes up. We evaluate the situation, and we might extend some grace and give them extra paid time off. Sometimes we might give time off, but it's unpaid. Other times, it might be out of the question to give the time off (or for the person to keep their job at that point). Every situation's different, and we decide things like that on a caseby-case basis.

Now, there's absolutely nothing wrong with this lady's desire to have a family. I think that's a great thing. But she knew these treatments were in her future when she took the other PTO. You're showing great concern and compassion for your employee, Kate, but it's almost like you want her to win more than *she* wants to win.

God forbid, but let's pretend this lady's husband was in a bad car wreck. She's going to need time off to help take care of him. Of

course, she gets extra PTO. No question, that deserves some grace. And if any of your other employees don't understand that or like it, they can hit the road. But that's not the case, is it? This lady had a planned life event, and she messed up her time off situation all by herself.

I think in this situation, you probably let your compassion go a little too far, and now you're having a hard time with the consequences. If it were me, I'd give this lady a little extra PTO for the treatments, but I'd also have a gentle but firm talk with her about managing time off more wisely.

There's absolutely nothing wrong with putting reasonable boundaries on compassion.





## **Medicare Minute** "Medicare Supplements"

Medicare supplements, also known as Medigap policies, are designed to help cover some or all of the deductibles, copays and coinsurance that Original Medicare does not cover. Medigap policies are sold through private insurance companies.

In Alabama these insurance companies can sell you only a "standardized" policy identified by a letter, such as Plan G. The most common supplemental plans in Alabama are Plans A, B, F, G and N. The term "standardized" means that Medicare requires all plans with a particular letter to have the same basic benefits regardless of the company selling it. For example, a Plan G with one company has to have the exact basic benefits as Plan G with every other company selling it.

Two things to keep in mind when shopping for a Medigap policy. First is the premium. Different insurance companies can charge different premiums for the exact same policy. This means you could pay more for your Medigap policy from one company than you would from other companies offering the same basic benefits. It's a good idea to check with someone who can show you the premiums from several companies to be sure you're getting the best premium for you coverage.

The second thing to keep in mind is the type of Medigap policy you are looking at. Some companies offer a Medicare SELECT policy. SELECT policies may require you to use a defined network of providers to receive full coverage, meaning you may not have full coverage from a provider even though the provider accepts Medicare. A standard Medigap policy will allow you to go to any provider that accepts Medicare. If you are not sure about the type of Medigap policy you are looking at, or its premium, you can contact or come by our office for help.

## Change a life: Mentor a child

Become a reading mentor and you can help boost literacy, one child at a time.

Access, socioeconomic level and ability are some of the contributing factors that may lead a child to struggle with reading, but any lag in this essential skill for younger children has far-reaching consequences. Take high school graduation. In 2019, a study was conducted by the Annie E. Casey Foundation and they found that students who were not proficient in reading by the end of third grade were four times more likely to drop out of high school than proficient readers. According to a study by the National Assessment of Educational Progressin 2019, three districts at grade 4 and eleven districts at grade 8 had score declines in reading compared to 2017.

But there's good news and an immediate way to make a positive impact for kids: mentor reading. Studies show that adult involvement improves not only reading skills and enjoyment but also attitudes about school, participation in extracurricular activities, outlook on the future and, in the end, a child's chance of continuing education. Ready to make a difference in your own home and for other children? Try these ideas:

#### Boost a child's ability

Literacy mentors — part coach, part cheerleader — can be found in schools and community organizations across the country. These volunteers' one and only goal? Help children learn to love reading. How they accomplish that varies.

Your next step: Search an online volunteer database, such as Neighborhoodofgood.com®, or contact your local school for connections to childhood community literacy programs.

#### Boost a child's access

You may have heard of the concept of a food desert: an economically challenged area in which residents have little or no access to fresh food. Some literacy experts have begun to use the idea of a book desert to characterize lack of access to reading materials for

Little Free Library is a nonprofit organization that promotes neighborhood book exchanges. More than 90,000 public book exchanges are registered with the organization and branded as Little Free Libraries.

Your next step: Struggling schools may not have a volunteer organization that can fund a book distribution plan — but you may be able to.

#### Boost a school's resources

School libraries continue to be affected by shrinking public school budgets. Studies have shown the benefit of well-funded libraries. Research conducted in dozens of states found a direct link between an increase in library funding and resources and student reading plans

Your next step: Volunteer to organize a book drive to benefit a school in need in your community.
