



How to Find Affordable **Internet Services?**

Dear Savvy Senior,

I was recently notified that the Affordable Connectivity Program, which subsidizes my monthly internet bill, is about to end. What are my options for finding affordable home internet services now? I'm 71 years old and live primarily on my Social Security benefits. Barely Getting By

Dear Barely,

It's unfortunate, but without additional funding from Congress, the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is winding down and will end in mid-May.

For those that aren't familiar with this program, the ACP is a government benefit that has provided millions of financially eligible households with a discount of up to \$30 per month toward their home internet service, or up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands.

The ACP was initially born out of a pandemic-era program called the Emergency Broadband Benefit in 2021 and replaced six months later by the longer-term ACP when Congress devoted \$14.2 billion to the program as part of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.

More than 23 million households are currently enrolled in the ACP which has significantly helped close the digital divide, as affordability has been the primary barrier that has kept most ACP beneficiaries from getting home internet services. But funds are almost out, and a sharply divided Congress has chosen not to continue funding the program, unless they change their mind in the 11th hour.

What to Do Now?

A good first step in securing affordable home internet services is to contact your current provider to find out if they offer any other discounts or low-cost services that fit your budget.

If not, you should shop around. The nonprofit organization EveryoneOn has a National Offer Locator Tool that can help you find low-income discounted internet services from providers in your area. Just go to EveryoneOn.org/find-offers, type in your ZIP code and answer a few questions regarding your household financial situation so the internet services you're eligible for can be located.

Some cities and states across the country are also offering their own local versions of the ACP to help low-income households pay their internet. The best way to look for these services is by going to Google and searching for "(location) internet resources."

Check Lifeline Benefit

If you haven't already done so, you also need to find out if you're eligible for the Lifeline program. Unlike the ACP, Lifeline is a permanently funded federal assistance program that provides a \$9.25 monthly subsidy that can help pay your home internet, phone or bundled services (up to \$34.25 if you live on Tribal lands). Only one benefit is available per household.

To qualify, your annual household income must be at or below 135 percent of the federal poverty guidelines, which is \$19,683 for one person or \$26,622 for two. Or, if you're receiving certain types of government benefits such as Medicaid, SNAP, SSI, public housing assistance, veterans' pension or survivors pension benefit, or live on federally recognized Tribal lands.

You can apply for Lifeline online at LifelineSupport.org, via mail or through your internet or phone provider. Or, if you need assistance call their support line at 800-234-9473.

Other Options

If you find that you aren't eligible for any of the lower-income services, you may still be able to save on your internet by shopping and comparing. The best way to do this is at websites like InMyArea. com, which provides a list of internet providers in your area, along with pricing and download speeds. Most providers offer plans under \$50 monthly, and you can often find additional discounts for things like bundling with a cellphone plan or signing an annual contract.

Another way to save some money is to buy your own equipment. Most internet service providers charge around \$15 per month to rent a modem and router from them. But you can buy your own for as little as \$100, which will pay for itself within the first year.

country. As sad as she was for her mother's passing, she realized that her very vibrant and outgoing mother would not have done well in COVID isolation.

Price "turned the corner" on her grief when she began to volunteer. She wanted nothing more than to give back as a way of celebrating her mother's life. In November 2023, former chair, Cheril Cleveland, signed her up for the Walk. Price teaches health science and her team rallied to raise \$1700 for Walk. This year their goal is a bit higher.

One of the most difficult parts of her mother's journey with Alzheimer's was the lack of communication in the health systems regarding resources. She says the health care system nurses and doctors in 2014 didn't really know about Alzheimer's Association resources like the 24/7 Helpline and care and support resources like they do now. Back then, she says, her family needed help navigating

the health system. Today Price's family team proudly walks for her mother in celebration of her life. She wants those who live with Alzheimer's or dementia to realize they are "not defined by infirmities" but rather they are loved

Instead, I sent John a link to an IP-address logging website assuming that John would be dumb enough to click on the link. He did so, which immediately revealed his rough location somewhere in Pakistan.

That's quite a few miles from **Muscle Shoals!**

Unfortunately, Pakistani John stopped communicating with me after he clicked the link so I didn't discover exactly how John would run away with my money, but I'm certain of his ill intentions. I've heard stories of these people acting as brokers where they send someone out to do a really bad job of cleaning your ducts and then ask for payment. I've seen this exact same routine with "car detailing' instead of duct cleaning.

So, what should you do if your air quality feels a bit off? Here's the shocker: most homes don't need professional duct cleaning regularly. Try changing your air filters more often, and

open windows for fresh air. If you insist that your ducts need cleaning, there are reputable local companies that will do the job.







say they deliberate for a few days, and a mere 5% say they take more than a week, highlighting that the online shopping environment largely promotes and benefits from instant purchasing breaks or brief downtimes, offering a key window for businesses to capture their attention with timely promotions.

The survey also reveals that younger consumers, particularly those ages 18 to 24 and 25 to 34, are the most prone to impulse purchases.

Torah portion Emor, found in Leviticus, 21:1-24:23 is part of the holiness code, a group of laws authorized by rabbis and priests. Scholars believe that the priests, influenced perhaps, by the teachings of the prophet Isaiah, wrote the laws contained in Leviticus, 17-26, as a response to laws created earlier priests in by Leviticus 1–16.


The laws in the holiness code-like the laws in the rest of Leviticus, seek to mold the Israelites into a holy people and to safeguard the ritual purity that is necessary for contact with the divine G-d. Leviticus, depicts G-d as the creator of a harmonious, good, and orderly universe. To keep the world with proper balance, beings human must take care not to breach boundaries whether these are boundaries of body, time, space, or spirituality. A person's body, the sanctuary. the community and are all components of G-d's sacred world and violations within any of these spheres have a negative impact overall.

Boundaries of space separate the sacred from the near sacred as well as life from death. Leviticus commands rituals, including sacrifices to cancel, or ameliorate the damage that results from boundary violations. The priests are in charge of the performance of sacred rights connected with the sanctuary and must maintain strict standards of purity to avoid profaning the sanctuary or the sacred objects it contains.





greater level of urgency or significance attached to them. Some may have been more altruistic in nature than others. However, losing a leg or a family losing a beloved member while representing the U.S. in battle is a huge loss, regardless. We can't choose in what era we were born or what set of officials declared war.

I was too young to take part in Vietnam and past the optimal age for the Gulf War. My father served in Korea for two years, my grandfather in World War I for 14 months. He earned two purple hearts as a US soldier only a few years after coming through Ellis Island from Italy. My wife can trace her lineage to a family member serving in the Revolutionary War.

For many families, the Memorial aspect of the holiday really hits home. Whether almost 250 years ago, or as recent as 250 days ago, families have suffered through almost unbearable anguish of getting the news they always dreaded.

Some enthusiastically risked their lives to preserve the American ideal. Others were called to duty and patriotically left the security of U.S. soil to fight.

Would either group in years-past be as enthusiastic to fight for the future of our country if they could see what has transpired over the years? How unappreciative many are? What some think that freedom represents? What some think (and are taught) the U.S. now represents?

Īt's a fair question that would probably produce some disheartening answers.

A few Memorial facts from major wars from 1775 forward are listed here followed by casualty totals that deserve our respect and admiration.

The Civil War has by far the largest number

of American military fatalities in history. In fact, the death toll on both sides from that war is comparable to that of all other major wars combined.

For more than a century, the generally accepted Civil War death toll of around 620,000 may be an underestimation, a figure which was first proposed by Union historians William F. Fox and Thomas L. Livermore in the late 1800's through enlistment figures, battle reports, and census data. In 2011, historian J. David Hacker conducted further investigations and claimed that the likely number was 750,000 between and 850,000).

Historians agree that both sides were poor slaes keeping detand throughout at records the the Confederacy's of records were lost bv the war's end. Many Confederate widows also did not register their husband's death with the authorities, as they would have then been ineligible for benefits.



2023 Water Quality Report - CHISHOLM HEIGHTS WATER AUTHORITY

The Board of Directors of Chisholm Heights Water along with the City of Florence Water Department monitors for contaminants in your drinking water. This report is designed to inform you about the quality of water and services we deliver to you every day. Our goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. We purchase our water from the City of Florence and redistribute in our area; Florence Water Department's water source is Wilson Lake and Cypress Creek. This provides an abundant supply of quality water for all customers.

We are pleased to report that our drinking water is safe and met or surpassed all federal and state requirements during 2023.

If you have any questions about this report or concerning the quality of your water you can contact our office number 256-718-0301, or one of the board members, Jimmy Risner 256-764-5222, Trent Butler 256-766-3549 or Steve Watkins 256-764-8670. If you have problems or concerns you can attend our scheduled meetings. Please call the office to be placed on the agenda for the meeting.

The Board of Directors of Chisholm Heights Water along with the Florence Water Department monitors for contaminants in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws. The following tables shows the results of the monitoring by Florence Water from the period January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023. It is important to remember that the presence of some contaminants

does not necessarily pose a health risk. The Florence Water Department utilizes coagulation, flocculation, sedimentation, and filtration in their process. Also, chlorine is used for disinfection, fluoride for dental protection and lime for ph treatment.

In the testing that Chisholm Heights Water are required to do each month, total coliform bacteria, we did not have any violations. CHW was late sending in one of our monthly operation reports during 2023. Disinfection By-Product Monitoring (DBP) done every 3 months, with no problems. Lead/Cooper testing was done in 2021. In 2014 Florence Water added the MIEX system as a simple

solution for meeting U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) disinfection by-product (DBP) removal by employing a continuous ion exchange process. The process removes dissolved organic carbon (DOC) allowing for improved drinking water quality and regulatory compliance.

Included are tables of the testing from Florence Water. What do these tables mean? Our water is tested to assure that it is safe and healthy. The Table of Primary Contaminants provides an a health risk to humans. The **Table of Secondary Contaminants** is contaminants that generally pose no health risk, but are monitored for reasons of aesthetics. In the **Table of Detected** Contaminants, the column marked Amount Detected shows the highest test results during the year. Sources of contaminant level how where this substance usually originates. Columns headed MCL and MCLG refer to:

Maximum Contaminant Level or MCL: The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal or MCLG: The level of a contaminant in drinking water below, which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

Action Level (AL) - The concentration of a contaminant, which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements, which a water system must follow.

Treatment Technique (TT) - A required process intended to duce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

UNREGULATED CONTAMINANTS

The Florence Water Department nor Chisholm Heights Water tested for, nor was it required to test, for Radon during 2023. However, there are other unregulated contaminants that were tested for in 2023.

Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are synthetic chemical compounds found throughout our environment. PFAS are found in water, air, and soil. PFAS are used in many consumer and industrial products because they have the unique ability to repel oil, water, and grease. The City of Florence tested for PFAS in 2023 at Cypress Creek and Wilson Lake Water Treatment Plants. Cypress Creek WTP had a 0.0021 ppb result for PFAS. Wilson Lake WTP had a 0.036 ppb result for PFAS.

ASBESTOS and DIOXIN

Based on a study conducted by ADEM with the approval of the EPA, a statewide waiver for the monitoring of asbestos and dioxin was issued. Thus, monitoring for these contaminants is

SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENTS

Florence Water Department has performed source water assessments for the Wilson Lake Treatment Plant and the Cypress Creek Treatment Plant. CRYTOSPORIDIUM & GIARDIA

Cryptosporidium and Giardia are microscopic organisms found in surface water throughout the U.S. Although filtration

removes Cryptosporidium and Giardia the most commonly used filtration methods cannot guarantee 100 percent removal. their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Ingestion causes an abdominal infection. Symptoms of the infection include nausea, diarrhea, and abdominal cramps Most healthy individuals can overcome the disease within a few weeks. However, immuno-compromised individuals, infants, small children and the elderly are at greater risk of developing life-threatening illness. We encourage immuno-compromised individuals to consult their doctor regarding appropriate precautions to take to avoid infections. Cryptosporidium and Giardia must be ingested to cause disease, and it may be spread through means other than drinking water. Florence Water currently monitors for Cryptosporidium and Giardia and is removed and/or treated by effective filtration and disinfection processes.

<u>LEAD</u>

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Chisholm Heights Water is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but can not control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for eral hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at http://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead. LEAD AND COPPER RULE MONITORING

Lead and copper Rule (LCR) was developed to protect public health by minimizing lead and copper levels in drinking water. The LCR established an action level of 0.015 mg/l for lead and 1.3 mg/l for copper based on the 90th percentile level of tap water samples collected. Lead and copper asampled on a mandated three-year testing cycle with sampling conducted at customer's tap. Our 90th percentile for lead was 0.005 mg/L. Our 90th percentile for copper was 0.102 mg/L.

The idea is that the first time a workers compensation doctor confirms a total disability may be the last time they are on the approved list.

If you are injured on the job, do not go to your own doctor or use your own insurance. If you tell the doctor it was an on-the-job injury, they won't see you, and your insurance will not pay for the visit.

If you go to your own doctor and tell them the injury was not on the job but it actually was, two things can happen: first, workers comp won't pay for it, and second, neither will Blue Cross Blue Shield. You will be the financially responsible party. Any misrepresentation will be brought to the court's attention, which never helps your case.

You have the right in Alabama to a panel of four physicians (Ala. Code § 25-5-77 (a)) to choose from. Let us get involved in that choice!

If surgery is recommended, you can request a second surgical opinion from another panel of four doctors.

Good decisions are crucial when a person is hurt while working, and their pay is reduced to 66% (Ala. Code § 25-5-1(6)). Your outcome is important. Lawyers representing people injured on the job are limited to charging 15% plus costs. Of course, there is no limit on how much the employer can spend on lawyers.



Medicare Minute *"Medicare Supplements"*

If you are considering a Medicare Supplement, or Medigap policy, for the first time there are some important facts you should know. To begin with you have to be enrolled in Medicare Part A and Part B to sign up for a Medigap plan. If you choose to sign up for a Medigap plan, you then will pay the private insurance company a premium in addition to your Part B premium that you pay Medicare. Occasionally we will speak with someone who thinks the Part B premium paid to Medicare covers the cost of their Medigap plan. This is not the case. The Part B premium paid to Medicare covers the benefits, discussed in earlier articles, that Medicare allows you under Part B.

Another fact to keep in mind is a Medigap policy will only cover one person. This is also true of Medicare Advantage and prescription drug plans. If you spouse wants a Medicare plan of any type they will have to sign up themselves. However, some Medigap companies will give you a premium discount if you are married or live with someone over the age of 60. This can be a huge savings for you.

Medigap policies do not cover most prescription drugs. If you want prescription drug coverage you will need to purchase a stand-alone prescription drug plan from a private insurance company. Medigap policies are designed to supplement, or fill in the gaps of, Original Medicare. When a claim is filed with Medicare, Medicare will pay first and the Medigap policy will pay its part depending on the type of plan you have chosen. Therefore, because Original Medicare does not cover most prescription drugs, your Medigap policy will not have that coverage either.



Dr. Mustafa Ahmed Thinks Forward in Heart Treatment for Women

BIRMINGHAM-Darian Tymes was an active and independent 80-yearold who suffered with shortness of breath and fatigue. The Millbrook, Alabama resident stated, "If I walked from here to the other side of the room, I'd get tired. I'd get out of breath." Tymes was experiencing symptoms of severe aortic stenosis (AS), the most common type of heart valve disease. To explore treatment options, she was referred to Dr. Mustafa Ahmed, interventional an cardiologist treats heart valve and structural heart disease at UAB Medicine.

previously Tymes had open-chest, surgical aortic valve replacement. She did not want to another through go open-heart surgerv. Thankfully, Dr. Ahmed provided a minimally invasive option for Tymes called transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR). Tymes was lucky to get the care that she needed, but for

female patients, that's not affect women is limited. Historically, women underrepresented are trials, in clinical which can contribute to misdiagnosis and underdiagnosis of heart conditions, as well as poorer health outcomes. of two commonly used

aortic stenosis (AS). Amazingly, this clinical trial enrolled 87% women, providing female-specific data for the first time ever on the treatment of AS, which affects millions of people in the U.S. With AS, the aortic valve leaflets cannot fully open or close like they should. Over time, the area becomes stiff and reduces the ability for the valve to fully open and close, resulting in the heart working harder to push blood through the aortic valve to your body.

TAVR systems to treat

The one-year results of the SMall Annuli Randomized To Evolut or SAPIEN (SMART) Trial showed the Evolut transcatheter heart valve performs better in patients with a small aortic annulus, who are primarily women.

the "Data from show SMART Trial mechanical that characteristics of these heart valves make a difference in outcomes and shows us that it's important to select the right TAVR device for patients," said Nina Goodheart, senior vice president and president, structural heart &

aortic, which is part of the Cardiovascular Portfolio at Medtronic. "We are committed to developing evidence in the cardiovascular space to reflect the racial, ethnic and gender diversity of the patients who use our technologies particularly, those racial ethnic and populations that are underrepresented clinical research despite having a disproportionate burden for diseases." certain

The study published or was on the heels of President Joe Biden's recent executive order highlighting a shortfall in women's healthcare, women's under representation in cardiovascular clinical trials and the need for personalized treatment options as women have smaller annuli (heart valves) than men. There cannot be a one size fits all approach, particularly when it comes to TAVR procedures.

Ahmed explained the benefits of the TAVR procedure to Tymes. "There is no long recovery period," he stated. "We expect people to have the procedure. Go

home. And, get on with their lives very quickly." The Medtronic Evolut TAVR was used by Dr. Ahmed given its optimized blood flow, its safety, and its ability to be positioned very accurately.

"The Evolut system allowed us to do a complex valve-in-valve procedure for Mrs. Tymes with the most minimal of fuss in a very controlled environment. Ahmed added.

Tymes no longer experiences symptoms and has a restored quality-of-life. "I can walk. I can dance. I can cook, drive, basically do anything I want to do," she stated.

Medtronic is sparking change in leading healthcare initiatives by bringing physicians and local leaders together in working groups – across communities – to treat more aortic stenosis patients.

"It will take all of us – industry leaders, cardiologists, patients, healthcare providers and legislators - to do their part to address this urgent health equity issue," said Nina Goodheart.
