





It's been a month of recognition for the years of service as a mentor to young local chapter of Big Brothers Big Sisters.



Henschel's Indian Museum & Trout Farm


Our May Chamber Member Spotlight is Henschel's Indian Museum and Trout Farm. Located at N8661 Holstein Road in Elkhart Lake, the Henschel Site is a wonderful place to get outside and enjoy some family fun! When you arrive at the Henschel Site, you will be greeted with smiles and welcoming arms. The museum is full of both artifacts found on the Henschel site and the



surrounding area, as well as collections on loan.

The ancient springs that feed the trout ponds no doubt was a source of fresh water for the indigenous peoples of the area. Since the first Henschel homesteader settled in Sheboygan County in 1849, the family's land has yielded evidence of 10,000 years of human occupation.

Today the Henschel collection is one of the most complete in Wisconsin. These items - chipped stone tools, projectile points, ground stone tools, bone tools, copper implements, and pottery - trace the lives and times of the original culture inhabiting the area. # **Top Lakeland Teacher**

Evan Chancellor named top Lakeland teacher for 2024

Lakeland University Assistant Professor of Music and Director of Bands Evan Chancellor, D.M.A., is the 2024 winner of the annual Underkofler Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching Award.

Chancellor is Lakeland's 33rd winner of the Underkofler, which recognizes outstanding performance in undergraduate teaching.

A member of Lakeland's faculty since 2017, Chancellor is known for being a student-focused instructor who helps his students develop a passion for music in his classroom and with performers through his conducting.

In nominating Chancellor, students noted he was encouraging, takes on additional responsibilities, demonstrates instrumentation by playing alongside them and delivers lessons that are clear and well thought out. Recently, Lakeland's choir director abruptly left the institution. Chancellor seamlessly filled the role on an interim basis, and he created a space for students to share their opinions about the situation.

In addition to his work in the classroom, Chancellor founded LU's Muskie Pride Marching Band, he directs the campus musical and he organizes Lakeland's summer music camp. Outside of Lakeland, Chancellor serves as the music director of the Fond du Lac Symphonic Band and is active as a guest conductor and clinician.



As a horn player, he has appeared with the Sheboygan Symphony, Milwaukee Philharmonic and other groups in Eastern Wisconsin.

In nominating Chancellor for the Underkofler Award, students offered these thoughts:

"Music comes easy to some, and hard for others. And it can be hard to join an already established group. With this in mind. Dr. C is so exceptional because he is fully able to welcome and integrate people in the group and help them grow in such a natural way that it is barely noticeable. Not every teacher can create an environment like that."

"He is a great teacher who cares a lot about his students and wants everyone that passes through his classes to succeed in life.

"Teaching doesn't just mean helping in an educational sense. Dr. C stops what he is doing the second any student needs something to help them."

"I switched to Music Education because

Dr. C was able to help me make a smooth transition. I knew I had to sacrifice maybe being here another year to finish classes, but we put together a four-year plan and he made class scheduling seem like a breeze. I never have had a bad experience talking with Dr. C. He truly is a great human being.



"The environment he creates in class is so positive, welcoming and productive, and I have always looked forward to every class with him."

Before coming to Lakeland, Chancellor was assistant professor of music and director of bands at Oklahoma Baptist University. He also taught at East Central University and Oral Roberts University.

He is a founding member of the Frontier Brass Band and the Oklahoma Haydn Festival and performed regularly with the Oklahoma City Philharmonic, Tulsa Symphony, Enid Symphony and the Symphony of Northwest Arkansas. Chancellor is a member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi, the Wisconsin Bandmasters Association, the Collegiate Band Directors National Association and NAfME.

Chancellor has a bachelor of music, music education from the University of North Texas, a master of music, horn performance from Oklahoma City University and a doctor of musical arts from the University of Oklahoma.

The Underkofler Award is presented through the Alliant Energy Foundation and the Wisconsin Foundation for Independent Colleges, Inc. The Underkofler Endowment Fund was created in honor of past Wisconsin Power & Light president and chairman James R. Underkofler to recognize his 48 years of service to the utility industry.





# **Record-Breaking Support**

In 2023, more than 800 individuals received a record-breaking 98,168 home-delivered meals from Fresh Meals On Wheels of Sheboygan County (FMOW). While most people were over the age of 75, there were also people in their 20s and 30s who needed assistance for a short period of time as they were recovering from illness or injury. Regardless of the reason, FMOW delivers.

"As the temperatures rise outside, older adults and homebound individuals may have a harder time getting around because of the impact heat has on their bodies," explained Amy Stader, FMOW client coordinator. "These deliveries help make sure people are okay in their homes, it gives them and their loved one's peace of mind knowing that we are here to help if something is askew.

Stader said that several times in the last few months volunteers were able to notify they FMOW team so that assistance could be rendered for a few Sheboygan County residents. "This meant that help was made available and most were able to return home and continue receiving meals," Stader said.

She is passionate about her calling to help those who are widowed and homebound and who just need a little help with good nutrition to be more comfortable at home.

FMOW works with qualified volunteers to deliver meals Monday through Friday to individuals residing in all corners of Sheboygan County. A nonprofit organization, FMOW has no age or income restrictions and can help people as they recover from short-term or long-term illnesses or injuries, or even if someone needs to cook a few less times a week.

Multiple diets and meal preferences are available including heat healthy, controlled carb, renal, gluten free, bland and lactose intolerant. All diets may be served cut up, ground or pureed for those with chewing or swallowing issues. There is also the option to eliminate fish, pork and/or eggs. All meal choices are made fresh with local ingredients

as frequently as possible.

Meal recipients get the dignity of selecting their hot meal daily and can choose the best option that works for them including a hot meal only, hot and cold meal, or frozen meals. Individuals can receive as few as three meals per week, or as many as 14 meals a week — and that number can be adjusted at any time. Various meal patterns are available, with a minimum of three meals per week. Financial assistance may be available. SNAP payments are also accepted.



With Fresh Meals On Wheels you are not just getting a meal, you're getting community support," Stader said. "Volunteers are stopping by, saying hello and making connections. They account for every person they serve every day. There are also caring callers who can check in by phone multiple times a week if requested."

Gift certificates are available – great for Mother's and Father's Day. Anyone interested in learning more about meal delivery or volunteering in the garden, kitchen or with meal delivery should call 920-451-7011 or email FreshFood@FreshMealsOnWheels. org. 



# Women Finding Success in Tech

Though mechanical design and engineering teams at the fabrication engineering is a field historically dominated by men, anyone who is naturally curious about things, detailoriented, and good at solving problems has the potential to succeed. Jill Brotz, a May 2024 Lakeshore Technical College graduate of the college's Mechanical Design & Engineering Technology program, is doing her part to increase diversity in the field.

"I strongly encourage females to enter this field!" says Brotz, who is employed as a mechanical design engineer. "Females are definitely underrepresented in Mechanical Design Engineering."

Brotz, a Sheboygan resident, says she didn't grow up with much interest in mechanical things and struggled with confidence when she first entered the program in spring 2022.

"I was comparing myself to men who grew up with it. But I've learned that there are so many other skills that go into being successful as a design engineer, such as a high attention to detail, a curious mind, and a problem-solving mentality. Learning the ins and outs of mechanical design comes with time, through school and job training," Brotz says.

Brotz became interested in mechanical design and engineering after observing company she previously worked at. She wanted to move forward in her career, and the design engineers were very helpful in advising her on the proper steps to take. Some of the design engineers she worked with at the time were Lakeshore graduates who recommended the Mechanical Design & Engineering Technology program to her.

"Jill is proof of how successful females can be in a field traditionally filled with men. I welcome more females to join me and Jill in this field," says Lakeshore Adjunct Instructor Kelly Ryba.


Brotz started as an intern at UNISIG before getting offered her current fulltime position a few months later. The Menomonee Falls company engineers and manufactures drilling machines and systems for use worldwide.

Brotz brought design work experience from her previous job and believes she was ultimately hired due to her experience with the design software, the impending completion of her associate degree, and her previous experience as a hands-on fabricator. Brotz says UNISIG also appreciated her having Lean Six Sigma Blackbelt certification, which she earned at Lakeshore.

While Brotz was still a Lakeshore student,

UNISIG tasked her with redesigning a particular mechanism.

"I was able to improve on the design by making it more cost-effective and easier to manufacture. I also worked closely with our electrical and automation teams to improve the design for their needs. It turned into a more complex project than what was initially planned, but the result was very positive," says Brotz. In addition,

Brotz says she will be able to apply the improvements to similar products.

During a tour of UNISIG in April, Ryba had the opportunity to see the machine Brotz redesigned and learn more about how valuable Brotz had become to the company.

"Not only was the company impressive in their engineering, manufacturing, and machine building, but for me it was so great to see how Jill has applied the skills she learned at Lakeshore to the significant work she does at UNISIG as a mechanical design engineer," says Ryba.

Ryba also says she learned from UNISIG representatives that Brotz was instrumental in the company bringing its fabrication department in-house, work which had previously been fully outsourced.

"Jill is a terrific example of the top caliber Mechanical Design & Engineering Technology program students Lakeshore is training to satisfy needs in the manufacturing industry," says Ryba.

In spring 2024, Brotz was one of only four females enrolled in the program at Lakeshore.


# Open for 2024 Season

#### **CALL NOW FOR WATER LINE INSPECTIONS**

The DNR is requiring all water systems to identify the piping of all private water laterals in the Village. Please call 920-876-2231 to schedule a time for Public Works to inspect your line.

#### **BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED**

If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Properties zoned commercial have their building permits reviewed and approved or denied by the Planning Commission. Please plan ahead as the Planning Commission only meets monthly. Permits must be issued prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

#### **BEACH PASS INFORMATION**

The Village is reminding people that the Village beach is for residents of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Joint School District only, per Village Ordinance. The Village Police and Village employees will be monitoring beach use more frequently. The prices of the passes is \$10 for residents and \$50 for school district residents, which are good for an even and odd year (this is the first year of the beach pass). These passes are available as of May 1st. The price of replacement passes is \$25 for Village residents and \$50 for school district residents.

Rental properties are to have their guests use Fireman's Park. Fireman's Park is the public access to the lake that should be used for guests. Some of the other regulations include, but not limited to:

- No person shall allow a dog to be on any public beaches owned or leased by the Village.
- No person shall use or possess beverages containing alcohol on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.
- No person shall ignite nor maintain fires of any kind on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

#### **NO FLUSHING OF SANITARY WIPES**

Please remember do not flush sanitary wipes, sanitizing wipes or any other wipes into our sewer system. Even though they say they are flushable, these wipes are not tolerable for our sewer system and sewer treatment plant.


