having authored over 45 articles and six books, including his notable work "SCOTUS and COVID; How the Media Reacted to the Livestreaming of Supreme Court Oral Arguments" in 2023.

Johnson's research and insights have garnered widespread attention, with coverage by esteemed publications such as The Economist, The Guardian, New York Times, Washington Post, and Wall Street Journal, as well as media outlets like NPR, CSpan, Slate, USA Today, ABC, CNN, MPR, and WCCO. In recognition of his contributions to academia, Johnson received the American Political Science Association's Distinguished Teaching Award in 2018.




