
#### THIS IS WAY OUT OF LINE


Under its new rule, President Biden's Department of Education has abandoned accepted ideas of sex and gender single-handedly interpret Title IX as protecting students from discrimination based on "gender identity." Schools must now allow students to participate in any 'activity consistent with their gender identity," as asserted by the students themselves, or risk facing a discrimination lawsuit.

This will open up schools to lawsuits if they forbid biological boys from using girls' restrooms or locker rooms. The same will be true for schools that ban biological boys from the girls' health or physical education classes.

Put differently, Title IX will no longer protect women based on their immutable physical characteristics. Instead, activists can weaponize Title IX to force schools to prioritize the comfortable education of the boy with gender dysphoria above the academic and emotional well-being of the dozens of girls who would rather not share a locker room or learn about puberty alongside biological boys.

President Biden's new rule defeats the purpose of Title IX. By interpreting Title IX to be about protecting "gender identity" instead of physical gender, President Biden will place countless women and girls in uncomfortable—or even unsafe—learning environments.

The Biden administration is unperturbed. It dismissed the concerns of parents who



don't want their daughters to share a bathroom with a biological man by denying that the "mere presence of a transgender person in a single-sex space compromises anyone's legitimate privacy interest."

Put down the bong.

It may be President Biden's belief that little girls do not have a legitimate privacy interest in only sharing restrooms with other women and girls, but common sense and most Americans disagree.

Biden

The

administration's Title IX rule will also require language restrictions on any teacher who wishes to use grammatically correct pronouns, as mandated by the federal government. Under the new rule, any teacher who refers to a little boy as "he" instead of "they" in a way that the federal government finds objectively offensive will trigger a lawsuit for discrimination. Grammar teachers might as well cancel the lesson on pronouns now.

I have empathy for the

small percentage of young people who suffer from gender dysphoria. Those students deserve to receive a quality education, too. We cannot, however, prioritize the comfort of a small set of gender dysphoric students over the safety, education and opportunities of all women and girls.

Title IX has protected women and girls for more than 50 years. President Biden ought to hide his head in a bag if he allows his administration to destroy decades of progress for women by turning Title IX into a weapon that his party can use to tear apart schools that don't support these anti-women gender policies.





#### My Time

Hey y'all, last week I turned 65! I had to deal with it for a minute, and then I got over myself. 65 years is a lot of years and I have loved all of them. I do feel like I've lived a long time, but I also feel new to this moment.

65 means that I have been on the planet long enough remember when there were only three channels on the TV. I remember when we got our first television because we could finally afford it. It was a black and white TV. not on the outside, but in the fact that we could only see the shows in black and white. I remember when we got our first color TV. a console that took up a good bit of floor space in the primary spot in our small living room. The TV

programming signed off at 11PM with the playing of the national anthem. And just prior to that, the statement was made by the announcer, "It's 11 o'clock, do you know where your children are?" My mama could always answer, "Yes," to that question – we were all at home.

I could walk to the corner store by

myself when I was 6, 7 and 8 years old, because there was no stranger danger.

And yes, I can remember the party line, having operators and having one phone for the entire hall of girls to use in college. I put quarters in public phone booths. I remember having a phone cord long enough to walk from our kitchen wall phone out to the back porch, so that I could have some privacy. We also had a green rotary desk phone that matched our green naugahyde couch and chairs. I don't remember talking on the phone of our house for long hours, but I do remember talking with my friends in the swing on our front porch for hours. The first time I heard about a cell phone was on a news report that showed people in Sweden walking the streets talking on their phones. I remember thinking, "That will never happen here."

I remember the race riot at our high school in 1968, and I remember that first step on the moon. Walter Cronkite spoke of the Vietnam War, and I watched soldiers carry death bags while I was eating supper. It was the first time that I actually got to see something tragic happening in the world on TV. After that, it never stopped.

I'm old enough to remember Fortran cards in college. I substitute taught for the technology teacher shortly after computers came to the schools. I knew nothing except to tell the children to wait for the turning hourglass to stop before they did the next task...umm...the rest is history.

Yes, I'm old enough to remember a few changes, but that doesn't seem what 65 is about for me. 65 seems to be a time when I trust myself and my knowledge, and those who don't agree are not a bother. 65 seems to be a time when I have just enough money to buy what I want, but I know health is wealth. 65 is a time when I love my husband dearly and he loves me fully in





#### **HOW MANY CASES GO TO COURT?**

All divorce cases go to court because there's no commonlaw divorce. If a divorce is not ratified by the court, it is not valid. A judge has to sign the final decree confirming and ratifying the agreement of the parties.

All worker's compensation cases go to court. These cases have to be explained to the injured worker about the

rights they have and the rights they are giving up. Judges frequently will not approve worker's compensation agreements where the injured worker is not represented by an attorney. Some judges take half an hour to go over the settlement, others take less than five minutes. Some settlements are complicated, and others are straightforward. Very few worker's compensation cases are actually tried even though all are filed simply because eventually they will need court approval and if you don't file it, they will start changing adjusters on you and it will be delay after delay.


As far as other personal injury cases, out of every 200 cases probably 150 of those cases will settle without having to file a lawsuit. The other 50 are filed in court and those are cases where insurance companies change the way that they settle cases, or the adjuster believes there's some defense (often because the person gives a recorded statement to the adjuster). 48 of those cases will settle during negotiation and/or mediation. The other two will be tried before a judge or a jury.

Because the limits of district court have been raised to \$20,000 some cases are more appropriate to be heard in district court. These cases are heard by a judge and not a jury and a lot more expeditiously because you don't have to bring 100 people to the courthouse for jury selection. Most car wreck cases that I try are tried before a jury over two or three days. I have tried four personal injury jury trials in three weeks as my own personal record. I was tired.

#### **Medicare Minute**

#### "Medicare vs Employer Coverage"

We meet weekly with individuals who are currently working but becoming eligible for Medicare. Their dilemma is often whether to stay on their employer coverage past the age of 65 or go on Medicare.

Here are a few things to think about. For those of you who are married you will want to know how it will affect your spouse if you leave employer coverage. If your spouse is not old enough for Medicare it may affect your decision differently than someone whose spouse is also Medicare eligible. If your spouse is also Medicare eligible you will want to know what your exact premium will be for you and your spouse together and separately. If that cost is high you may benefit by looking at a Medicare plan outside the company.

One important factor is the prescription drugs, if any, that you are taking. Often employer coverage will cover expensive prescription drugs better than Medicare. Also, employer coverage does not have the "donut hole" or coverage gap that Medicare drug plans have.

How Medicare works and how it coordinates with other Medicare plans can be very confusing. Some companies require their employees to go through a third-party call center to obtain their Medicare health plan. The biggest disadvantage with going through a call center outside of the area is you lose the ability to have a local agent explain your coverage face-toface and that can go to the insurance company on your behalf if you have a problem.

In most cases it's best to stay on your employer sponsored plan. I would never encourage anyone to leave their employer coverage but the decision to do so is an individual one. What's best for your former coworker may not be what's best for you. Feel free to contact our office anytime if we can be of assistance.





#### **Dreading a Colonoscopy?** There Are Alternatives

Dear Savvy Senior,

Are there any easier alternatives to a colonoscopy to screen for colon cancer? I just turned 60 and my wife keeps nagging me to get tested, but I hate the idea of drinking that laxative solution and being sedated for the procedure.

Squeamish Steven

Dear Steven.

While a colonoscopy remains the most accurate screening test for detecting colon cancer (94 percent accurate), there are other easier – although less accurate – tests available. But be aware that if the result of one of these tests are positive, you'll still need to undergo a colonoscopy. Here's what you should

Screening Guidelines
Colorectal cancer, which develops slowly over several years without causing symptoms especially in the early stages, is the second largest cancer killer in the U.S., claiming more than 50,000 Americans each year.

Colorectal cancer screening guidelines from the U.S. preventive Services Taskforce and the American Cancer Society call for most adults to get screened starting at age 45 and continuing through age 75. Earlier screenings, however, are recommended to people who have an increased risk due to family history of colorectal cancer or polyps, or a personal history of inflammatory bowel disease, Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis.

But despite these guidelines, and the fact that colonoscopies save an estimated 20,000 U.S. lives each year, around 40 percent of eligible people don't get screened.

Why? Because most people, like yourself, dread the laxative prep and sedation, not to mention the procedure itself.

But a colonoscopy is not your only option for screening for colon cancer. There are currently several types of FDA approved stool tests that you can take in the privacy of your own home that requires no laxative-taking/bowel-cleansing preparation. The two most accurate that you should ask your doctor about are the:

Fecal immunochemical test (FIT): This test looks for hidden blood in your stool, which suggests polyps or even cancer. Your doctor will give you a FIT test kit to use at home. You take a small sample of stool and mail it to a lab to be analyzed. You don't need to do any prep. The cost of this annual test is covered by private insurance and Medicare. FIT has an almost 80 percent accuracy rate for detecting colon cancer, but it detects only about 28 percent of advanced polyps that might turn into cancer.

Stool DNA test (Cologuard): This screening kit looks for hidden blood as well as altered DNA in your stool. Your doctor will order the test, and you will receive the collection kit in the mail. You do the test at home every three years and send your stool samples to Cologuard via UPS. No special prep or change to your diet or medication schedule is required. Cologuard, which is covered by most private insurers and Medicare, detects 92 percent of colon cancers but only 42 percent of large precancerous polyps. It also may provide a false-positive, indicating that you might have cancer when you don't.

#### New Blood Test

There's also a new experimental colon cancer blood test you should ask your doctor about called the "Shield blood test." This new test, developed by Guardant Health, detects more than 80 percent of colon cancers early when they're most treatable.

Guardant is currently seeking FDA approval to market the test but it's available now as a "lab-based test" (which does not require FDA approval) but it's currently not covered by most private insurers or Medicare. Your doctor will need to request this test, which costs \$895, at *BloodBasedScreening.com*.
