
# **National Register!**

were sponsored by 10 local companies. The FAME Advanced Manufacturing Technician (AMT) program at NWSCC is a

pathway to a challenging and well-paying career as a multi-skilled technician. Students will attend classes two full days (16-20 hours) per week while working three full days a week (24+ contract hours) with a sponsoring

company. "With the help of our industry partners, the FAME program is making a tremendous impact on the lives of our students," said **John** 

McIntosh, Dean of Workforce Development, Institutional Effectiveness & Advancement. "This is truly a local workforce led program and our students along with the community are reaping the benefits."

The NWSCC FAME program currently has 43 students in the program.

Each student participated in an interview process and was matched with a sponsoring company to begin the preemployment process with each of the respective companies. The 2024-2025 FAME class are currently working with their sponsoring companies and will begin fall semester classes on August 15.



### presented to the review board and the "Keeper of the National Register," who has the final say on approval and listings on the register.

The nomination process, however, began around 2015 when the late Richard C. Sheridan, a local historian and former TVA chemist, submitted a National Register documentation form to the Alabama Historical Commission, according to the MSNHA.

The Alabama Historical Commission commented on and made suggestions for revising the nomination draft and asked the MSNHA to get involved in the process for extra support.

The document remained dormant for some time and Sheridan died May 8, 2023.

Broyles said the Old Railroad Bridge Board's major fundraiser is July 4. Shoals residents are invited to come and enjoy the Independence Day fireworks from the bridge. The cost is \$3 per person, she said.








was bigger than life, yet the 20-time All-Star was a slight 5' 10" and 175 pounds by most accounts. That helped him running the bases and covering center field, but it didn't mean he lacked strength. Mays led Major League Baseball in home runs three times between 1955 and 1965 and led the National League another vear.

Mays is flatly regarded as one of the greatest all-around players in baseball history. He hit, hit for power, could fly around the bases, and made incredible plays in center field. Those plays earned him a dozen Gold Glove Awards, all in succession from 1957-68. All of those were won after Mays made one of the most famous defensive plays in MLB history. Simply called "The Catch," Mays' over-the-shoulder snag in deep center field at the cavernous Polo Grounds in Game 1 of the 1954 World Series also included a whirlwind throw back to the infield that prevented a run from scoring. Many of us have seen that highlight.

According to mlb.com however, Mays' most famous catch probably wasn't his best. He made an incredible catch as he ran into his right fielder, Bobby Bonds, at the top of the right-center field fence in San Francisco's old Candlestick Park. Mays was knocked virtually unconscious on the play but managed to hold on to the ball. Bonds had to reach into Mays' glove and show the umpire that it was caught.

Mays also made two different bare-handed catches on fly balls while running hard to his right when he knew he would not be able to reach across

his body far enough with his left (glove) hand. Video link: https://www. mlb.com/news/mostgold-glove-awards-alltime-each-position

Those plays, and the fact that Mays owns the most Gold Glove Awards of any center fielder in MLB history. can get overshadowed by so many of his other

statistics. He was the 1951 NL Rookie of the Year, a two-time National League MVP, and an All-Star in 20 of his 22 MLB seasons.

During one season, 1955, he led the Majors in home runs (51), triples (13), and total bases (382). He also led MLB in steals three times in his Hall of Fame career. Mays is the only player in MLB history with at least 3,000 hits, a .300 average, 300 home runs and 300 stolen bases. He exceeded some of those plateaus rather easily, finishing

with 3,283 hits, 660 homers, and 338 stolen bases. His lifetime batting average was .302, he scored 2068 runs, and had 1909 runs batted in (RBI's).

Mays may have been among the most popular, athletic. and players, outgoing but he was far from the only notable talent there. Joining Mays in San Francisco during the late 60's and early 70's were additional four future MLB Hall of

Famers, Bobby Bonds, Juan Marichal, Willie McCovey, and Gaylord Perry

Baby boomers have enjoyed watching many outstanding baseball players through the years. However, for my money Mays tops them all. We didn't realize it at the time, but Willie Mays was what we needed in "America's Pastime" just when we needed it.

**Medicare** Minute "Frequently Asked Questions"

We began in the Medicare business in 2010. Since that time we have been asked some interesting and unique questions about Medicare. However, the majority of the questions we are asked we get on a regular basis. Over the next few weeks we are going to discuss some of our most frequently asked questions.

Do I have to sign up for Medicare Part B when I turn 65 if I'm still employed? This is one of the questions we get asked the most. In most cases the answer to this is no". When you turn 65, if you are still working and on your employer's health insurance plan you probably will not need Medicare Part B. I say probably because most employer plans do not file on Medicare if you have a claim. Because you have to pay a premium for Part B, Medicare does not require a person to sign up for Part B as long as you are on your employer's plan. Also, because the rules can be different for companies with less than 20 employees, the safest thing to do is check with the benefits coordinator at your place of employment for guidance or give us a call at our office.

I am on Medicare and Social Security Disability. I'm turning 65 soon. What are my options? Once you reach the age of 65 you have many more options than before. As you know if you go on Medicare and you are under the age of 65 your options for health plans are limited. When you turn 65 you will have another open enrollment period to sign up for any plan you wish to get. In other words, just because you are already on Medicare does not prohibit you from having all the options a person not on Medicare and turning 65 would have.



**DOG LAW: OLD AND NEW** 

Dogs are domesticated animals, and the law regarding them dates back thousands of years and is embodied in Leviticus. The ideas in Leviticus regarding the responsibility of ownership from thousands of years ago continue to be reflected in our law today, but with some modifications (Alabama Code § 3-6A-1).

The law divides animals into domesticated animals and wild animals. People who choose to keep wild animals such as lions, tigers, and bears (oh no) do so at their own peril. The idea here is that

they are strictly liable for injuries if the wild animal gets out of whatever enclosure it's in. Even if we were in a cage, inside a bank, fence, and a prison, the precautions are deemed inadequate, as a matter of law, if it hurts someone.


Not so with domesticated animals like dogs. The law does not rule dogs as dangerous until proven otherwise. People will say, "Every dog gets one bite," and to a large degree, that's true. Once an owner of a dog knows that the dog has bitten another person without provocation, they are responsible for the injuries that dog causes. Some dogs in some states do not get one bite because the lawmakers in those states will publish a list of dogs deemed to have a propensity to bite because of the type of dog breed.

In 2018, our legislature passed a law called Emily's Law named after a young lady killed by a pack of dogs in her yard. Emily's Law is, in many ways, a game changer, but it only works if you know how it works. It defines a dangerous dog, regardless of its breed, that has bitten, attacked, or caused physical injury, serious bodily injury, or death to a person without justification. When a person claims that a dog is dangerous, they have to make a sworn statement (there's a proper form that one has to follow here) to a city magistrate or sheriff that sets forth the name of the dog owner, the location of where the dog is kept, and why they think the dog is dangerous. The city magistrate or sheriff will then deliver that statement to the animal control officer, who shall complete a "dangerous dog investigation."

If the investigation leads the animal control officer to believe that the allegation is true, all kinds of things begin to happen that will take that dog out of general circulation. This doesn't necessarily mean that the dog's owner would have to have it euthanized; there are provisions for the owner to choose to keep the dog, but only in a kennel that meets state certifications.
