On Wednesday, June 12, 2024, north-central Minnesota experienced a tumultuous evening as severe thunderstorms unleashed a series of tornadoes, causing widespread damage across Crow Wing, Aitkin, and Carlton Counties. The U.S. National Weather Service in Duluth conducted surveys to assess the impact of the storms, confirming four tornadoes spawned by two distinct su-

percell systems. The first supercell storm, which developed around 3:45 p.m. near Wabun in northwest Minnesota, was particularly potent, covering a staggering distance of approximately 230 miles before dissipating near Wascott in southeast Douglas County, Wisconsin. This supercell produced multiple tornadoes, including a significant EF-2 tornado that struck areas near

Whitefish Lake, Clamshell Lake, and west of Crosslake in Crow Wing County between 6:18 and 6:23 p.m. With estimated peak winds of 120 mph and a path length of 3.2 miles, this tornado left a path of destruction characterized by extensive damage to homes, forests, and infrastructure. features Kim Gordon's oil and batik 'Between Earth and Sky'

Kim Gordon expresses her connection and passion for the natural world through oil and batik paintings. "Between Earth and Sky," the new show at Ripple River Gallery, features Gordon's work, through July 14.

"Painting is the most natural and direct way to for me to express ideas about the world in which I live and my place in it," Gordon said. "I have a constant fascination with the way the world looks, with the way light defines and erodes form, and with the compelling tension that exists between the quiet of the landscape and the palpable vitality that flows

through it. My choice of medium contributes to the communication of my ideas how it looks when applied to a surface is as important to me as the image it forms. I think of the painted stroke as a visual language."

Gordon, who lives and works in Minneapolis, often works with landscape because it encourages a connection to the world. "By spending time in an environment, I am able to steep myself in it, bringing back to my studio specific color harmonies, a sense of light and movement through the landscape, and a greater understanding about that

place. Translating that into paint, I can best reveal both an inner experience and a sense of place."

During an oil painting residency, Gordon was first introduced to the ancient and process-oriented technique of batik. "My passion is the natural world and my

years of plein air oil painting have provided a foundation for my work in batik." Batik uses a fluid pigment or dye and a "resist" — hot wax to slowly build designs. The pigment is applied in layers, from lightest to darkest, and the hot wax is selectively applied to areas the artist wishes to remain that color or value. The wax "resists" subsequent layers of pigment. By layering pigment and wax, one gradually can increase color and value range, and in this way a complex image can be created. Gordon will also teach two classes in batik at the gallery on July 13 and 14.

Ripple River Gallery is is located five miles south of Deerwood on Highway 6, then 3 miles east of Ruttger's Bay Lake Lodge on County Road 14 to Partridge Avenue; or south of Aitkin on Highway 169 to Bennettville, then 3.2 miles west on County Road 11 to Partridge Avenue.



Emergency responders air-


dic Trauma Unit at St. Cloud Hospital, where he underwent surgery later that evening as medical professionals were compelled to perform a partial amputation.

Weather Service in Duluth Storm survey, extensive damage to private residences and forest was found along Old Whiskey Road and Ruttger

over 50 percent of the roof deck uplifted and removed. Homeowners also reported a nearly hourlong storm surge of 1 to 2 feet from Upper Whitefish Lake

Following closely behind, another

EF-2 tornado emerged from the same supercell, touching down from Wolford to Rabbit Lake, Cedar Lake,

100 yards, highlighting the intensity of the storm.

A third tornado, rated EF-0, briefly formed near Glen in Aitkin County from 7:25 to 7:29 p.m. While minimal damage was reported due to its rural location, the appearance of yet another tornado underscored the severity and unpredictability of the weather event.

Meanwhile, a separate supercell generated a weak EF-0 tornado near Wright in Carlton County from 6:42 to 6:54 p.m., causing minor tree damage along its 7.8mile path.

Everywhere we go it is delay, delay

By ANN SCHWARTZ Well people, I did it. During

the latest cleanout of my car I packed away my snow brush and scraper.

Now, we native Minnesotans know there has been snow every month of the year. We have fought blizzards as late as May and as early as October.

While the winter season, sometimes, seems to last forever, it at last gives way to the second Minnesota season – road construction. We give you this lowdown and summary as you plan your travels.

(Note that this is just construction on state highways. Check your county, township or city website or contact the engineering department to find out about more local projects).

· In the Little Falls and Randall areas, Hwy. 10 is seeing struction zone driving offered by MnDOT: Slow down and drive with

caution

Drivers traveling too fast and not paying attention are the main causes of work zone crashes. Follow these safe driving tips:

Obey posted speed limits. The fine for speeding in a work zone is \$300.

· Drive undistracted. Avoid using phones, mobile devices, adjusting the radio - even eating – while in work zones. Move over. Give workers room to safely complete their work.

·Know before you go. Get real-time information about traffic and road conditions at 511mn.org or download the free 511mn app at Google Play or the App Store.

·Be patient. Expect delays, especially during peak travel times.

·Avoid making unnecessary lane changes.

·Never enter a road blocked with barriers or cones.

·Expect work zones to constantly change. Day to day you could experience lane shifts, closures, narrower lanes, moving workers and vehicles.

It is the American way and there is no need to stop now. Make up some bologna and cheese sandwiches, potato salad and a cooler of lemonade. Pack the kids, grandkids, dogs, toys and all the travel paraphernalia in the vehicle and hit the road for summer adventures. Keep cool, stay alert and don't let the construction zone waits drive up your blood pressure.

Road (referred to by locals as "Tip Top Point") and across Bertha and Clamshell Lake towards the far eastern reach of Whitefish Golf Club's holes. Damage path was the widest near Old Whiskey and Ruttger Road, around 700 yards across, with tree damage even identified on the island to the north of Old Whiskey Road. Over 80 percent of trees were uprooted or snapped near the base, and numerous homes showed minor to major roof damage. The worst of the roof damage was several homes and Hammal Lake from 6:45 to 7:05 p.m. This tornado, with estimated peak winds of

115 mph and a path length of 13.1 miles, caused significant tree damage and structural impacts. Residents reported scenes of devastation, including a







In a claim to bolster workforce readiness and address disparities across Minnesota, Governor Tim Walz unveiled a significant investment totaling over \$12 million aimed at enhancing job skills training, internships, and job placement opportunities. The funding, allocated under the Targeted Populations Workforce Competitive Grant Program, is set to benefit approximately 2,100 Minnesotans, particularly those from historically underserved communities.

Governor Walz, in a press release on Tuesday, emphasized the crucial role these grants play in reducing barriers to employment. "For underserved communities, finding employment can be especially challenging," he stated. "These grants are designed to bridge that gap by providing essential training and support, ensuring all Minnesotans have equitable access to meaningful careers."

Lieutenant Governor Flanagan echoed these sentiments, highlighting the ongoing disparities faced by marginalized communities. "Race, gender, and zip code should never hinder someone's ability to find work," she affirmed. "These grants are a critical step towards economic equity, offering tailored support to those who need it most."

The initiative, funded through a \$50 million appropriation from the 2023 legislative session, targets populations traditionally overlooked in the job market. According to DEED Commissioner Matt Varilek, the selected organizations bring invaluable experience in reaching these communities. "This diverse group of grantees is well-equipped to provide the technical and work-readiness skills essential for securing in-demand jobs," Varilek noted. "Their efforts will not only benefit individual job seekers but also strengthen Minnesota's workforce as a whole."

Among the organizations receiving grants is Native Sun, a Native-led nonprofit dedicated to promoting energy efficiency and renewable energy. Robert Blake, Executive Director of Native Sun, expressed enthusiasm about their role in preparing underserved communities for careers in clean energy. "This funding will help us introduce new opportunities in solar manufacturing and other green economy sectors," Blake remarked. "It's about empowering communities to thrive in sustainable industries."

The broader scope of DEED's workforce development strategy includes investments totaling more than \$216 million through 2025. This includes funds from initiatives like Drive for 5, focusing on training for sectors such as education and manufacturing, and Clean Economy Equitable Workforce grants, aimed at high-demand fields like construction and clean energy.

Marc Majors, DEED's Deputy Commissioner for Workforce Development, underscored the transformative impact of these investments. "By prioritizing workforce training and job readiness, we are not only meeting current labor market demands but also paving the way for a more inclusive economy," Majors stated. "These targeted efforts will help Minnesota businesses access the skilled workforce they need to thrive."

The Targeted Populations grants are part of a concerted effort to expand opportunities across diverse communities. Organizations like the Latino Chamber of Commerce and the Somali American Social Service Association are set to receive substantial funding to support their respective workforce development initiatives.

Looking ahead, additional grant opportunities are being made available to further enhance workforce capacity and foster diversity within Minnesota's small business sector. Community-based organizations are encouraged to apply for capacity-building grants, while small businesses can access funding for diversity and inclusion training.

As Minnesota continues to navigate a competitive labor market, Governor Walz remains optimistic about the impact of these investments. "This isn't just about filling jobs; it's about empowering individuals and strengthening our economy from the ground up," he concluded. "Together, we can build a Minnesota where opportunity is accessible to all."


