





# ESUHSD school board votes to approve parcel tax vote on Nov. 5th ballot and increase teacher salaries

The East Side Union High School District board of directors voted on two major spending items at its June 20th school board meeting.

The board approved a resolution authorizing a Parcel Tax vote that will be included in the November 5, 2024 ballot. (See Item 9.01 of the June 20 school board meeting in written form on the school district website)

Subject to two-thirds approval of the voters, the education parcel tax of \$49 per parcel (except exempt parcels), shall become effective for five years commencing with fiscal year 2025-26 and be collected by the Santa Clara County Tax Collector at the same time as and along with, and shall be subject to the same penalties as general ad valorem taxes collected by said tax collector.

BALLOT MEASURE: "With funds that cannot be taken by the State and spent elsewhere, shall East Side Union High School District's parcel tax to protect career technical education and college preparation programs and maintain competitive wages and benefits for teachers and staff at Andrew Hill, Calero, Evergreen Valley, Foothill, Independence, James Lick, Mt. Pleasant, Oak Grove, Piedmont Hills, Santa Teresa, Silver Creek,

Yerba Buena and W.C. Overfelt High Schools be adopted at \$49 per parcel, raising \$6.4 million annually for five years, with senior exemptions and full public disclosure of all spending?"

Unlike school district bond measures, 75% of the voters must agree and vote for a parcel tax to pass, also people over a certain age (in their 60's who own a home can move to not pay their parcel tax by filing out a form with a school district.

## Teacher and Classified worker pay increase approved

The board approved an increase in teacher salaries (Item 9.03). which included a 2.25% salary schedule increase and a one time, off schedule stipend equal to 1.25% of the unit member's respective salary and any applicable stipends received by the unit member for ESTA, CSEA and the San Jose Federation of Teachers per the terms of those parties' collective bargaining agreements with the District including Classified and Certificated Management Salary Schedules for Unrepresented Employees (Not Including the Superintendent, Associate Superintendents).

# Lillian Fasano of San Jose wins 2024 Calaveras County World Championship Frog Jumping Contest

Fasano nearly breaks previous record when her frog "The Frog Father" jumps 20 ft. 5.5 inches

illian Fasano from San Jose has won the 2024 Calaveras County World Championship Frog Jumping Contest.

Fasano nearly broke the world record when her frog "The Frog Father" jumped 20 feet 5.5 inches. The current world record is held by "Rosie the Ribiter," a frog owned by Lee Giudici, that jumped 21 feet, 5.75 inches in 1986

As one of the founding members of the Gustine Frog Team, Lillian has participated in the frog jumping contest along with her family for more than 60 years. She has done well in the past, coming in 2nd

place and 3rd place, but she has never taken 1st place before.

"I finally got it, first place" said Lillian Fasano, "I told my son Frank, make sure not to give me one of those little frogs, he pulled out a bigger frog for me, and it looked ready, I immediately thought this could be the winner!"

The Fasano family is the most decorated family in frog jumping history. The Gustine Frog Team, started in 1958, has a long line of champions, including Lillian's son Frank Fasano (1979), her husband Gene Fasano (1988), her son Bob Fasano (1998 and 2004), her grandson Justin Fasano (2017) and her great grand-nephew Nolan Moncref (2022). Lillian's sons Bob and Frank

are Leland High School graduates.

"The Frog Jump is a family legacy that has become a big tradition for all of us every year" Lillian said, "I'm so happy to see my children and grandchildren competing every year, I just hope they're not scared that I might break the world record and win the \$20,000 cash prize next year!"

More than 3,000 contestants entered to jump frogs at the 2024 annual contest. The famous Calaveras County Fair & Jumping Frog Jubilee contest takes place the third weekend in May annually at Angels Camp, CA.

Editor's note: There are two wonderful stories written in the late 1800s which highlight humor on a frog jumping contest in a gold mining town in Calaveras County. "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County" was written by Mark Twain in 1865 and Bret Harte authored, "The Outcasts of Poker Flat" in 1869. Today's annual event was inspired by the Twain story, and has been held in Angels Camp Calaveras County California since 1928. Other like events are held in Indiana, Illinois, Ohio, Washington, Maine, Missouri, Louisiana, New York, Wisconsin, and Manitoba, Canada.

knowledge of scientific facts and concepts, others rely on science processes, skills, or applications. The event challenges young minds to approach events with scientific rigor and iterative problem solving, to foster a deeper understanding of theoretical knowledge and practical concepts.

This year's season, October 2023 to April 2024, saw a cohort of 60 students from Chaboya Middle school engage in spirited competition across various mini, satellite, in-person, and virtual tournaments nationwide. Notable events included the Georgia scrimmage, Dodgen-Walton Invitational in Marietta, Georgia, Boyceville Invitational in Boyceville, Wisconsin, Rickards Invitational in Tallahassee, Florida, Rustin Invitational in

West Chester, Pennsylvania, High Desert Invitational in Southern California, Bird Invitational at the University of Southern California, So-Cal, Mira Loma Invitational in Sacramento, California, Kennedy Invitational and Stem Boost in Cupertino, California, Santa Clara Regionals in Milpitas, California, culminating in the Northern California State tournament at California State University, East Bay.





### **Cost of water to increase in Evergreen Valley**

he cost of drinking water will increase \$10-\$11 per month for customers of the San Jose Municipal Water System living in Evergreen Valley, North San Jose, Alviso, and Edenvale. The changes are expected to go into effect on July 1.

City councilmembers voted 8-2 in support of raising rates on drinking water.

The reason for the increase, according to city officials, is due to the rising cost of wholesale water, which it purchases from the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, Santa Clara Valley Water District and South Bay Water Recycling.


