# **Medicare** Minute "Signing up for Medicare Part 1"

The most common way to qualify for Medicare is when you are turning 65. You will have a specific time period, set by Medicare, to enroll in Part A and Part B Medicare. This is known as the Initial Enrollment Period (IEP).

If you are qualifying for Medicare by turning 65 you will have a 7 month window to enroll in Medicare. This window is based off of the month you turn 65. It starts 3 months prior to the month you turn 65 and extends 3 months past the month you turn 65. For example, if you are turning 65 in September your IEP begins in June and extends all the way through the month of December. If you are eligible, you may not have to pay a premium for Part A, but Part B will have a premium.

For those electing to sign up for Part B after their IEP a late-enrollment penalty may be assessed. This penalty can last as long as you have Part B and there may be a gap in your health coverage. However, one exception to this rule is being employed and having coverage through your company's group health plan. If this applies to you check with your benefit coordinator, Medicare or contact our office.

In most cases, if you are already drawing your Social Security or Railroad Retirement Board benefits you should automatically be signed up for Part A and Part B. If you are not drawing your Social Security or RRB benefits and want to sign up for Medicare you can do so by signing up online at ssa.gov, visit your local Social Security office or give our office a call and we can help direct you.







# **Ground Broken for New Heritage Center off The Natchez Trace**

TUPELO, MS. Chickasaw Nation Governor Bill Anoatubby led groundbreaking ceremonies recently for the construction of the Chickasaw Heritage Center (CHC) located within the tribe's historic Homeland just off the Natchez Trace in Tupelo, MS. "We

gather to what commemorate I consider to be a monumental leap forward in the Chickasaws' ability to preserve and promote our culture and to share it with the world," Anoatubby said. "The future of the Chickasaw Heritage Center will be many things to many people, but for us, as Chickasaws, it is the next step forward in the realization of our vision to be a nation of successful and united people with a strong cultural identity."

162-acre The campus will contain a 10,000-square-foot stateof-the-art exhibit hall, theater, café, art gallery, administrative offices, gift shop, multi-purpose room and playground, well as areas to as



gather collections. The exhibit hall is dedicated to providing an immersive interactive educational experience and will be a state-ofinterpretative the-art highlighting space Chickasaw history and culture from a uniquely Chickasaw perspective. The exhibit will also include an opportunity for visitors to learn about the Chickasaw people Walking today. trails will directly connect the campus to the Natchez Trace Parkway's National Scenic Trail under an agreement with the National Park Service.

Visitors to the CHC can learn about the tribe's history in the Homeland from prehistoric times up to 1837 prior to the tribe's forced Removal to Indian Territory which is located in presentday Oklahoma. Tribal

traditions, experiences, and the enduring spirit of the Chickasaw people will be on full display at the CHC.

A project of the Chickasaw Inkana Foundation, the Chickasaw Heritage Center represents significant, collaborative effort and investment multiple entities. by including the state of Mississippi; Tupelo Convention and Visitors Bureau; city of Tupelo; individual donors, small businesses and regional foundations: and the Chickasaw Nation.

Chickasaw The Center Heritage is expected to enhance cultural heritage tourism spur and economic growth in the area. Upon competition in 2026, the estimated economic impact of the Chickasaw Heritage Center will be \$5.6-\$6 million, with 100,000 visitors or more expected annually. The CHC will be along the Natchez Trace Parkway near Interstate 22, and U.S. Highway 45.



him, he always went by the book and always had the best interest of others at heart. "by That the book" and honest approach may have cost him some professional success at times. However, he didn't


see the need to waver, compromise, or apologize and had no regrets. He always took the high road and kept a positive outlook.

#### YOU HAVEN'T DONE ANYTHING WRONG

Dear Dave,

I'm 32 and debt-free, except for my house. My grandmother passed away a couple of months ago, and her will has caused problems for my family. I was her only relative living in the same town as she got older, so I looked in on her and helped take care of her, because she didn't want to go into a care facility. In her will, she left everything—her house and property, along with about \$300,000-to me. Some of my relatives said they deserve something. Two have even accused me of wanting everything she had and turning my grandmother against them. I don't like what's happening, but I'm not sure what to do. I never asked her for anything. Jeffrev



Dear Jeffrey, I hate it when things get ugly between family members, especially at a time when everyone should be pulling together and supporting each other. I'm

sorry you're going through all this. Let me ask you a question. Did you love your grandmother? It sounds to me like you did. A lot! It takes a special person to step in and help the way you did. I think it's pretty obvious she loved you, too.

When a person dies, they can give their belongings to anyone they choose. It was your grandmother's stuff, so it was her decision. Period. She could've spread it around among you and the rest of your family, but she didn't do that. She had her reasons, and her final wishes were just that—her

final wishes. No one in your family, even you, *deserved* anything from her.

I know this is a hard position for you to be in, Jeffrey. This has probably crossed your mind, so I'll go ahead and say it. Generally speaking, it's possible to transfer part of your inheritance to someone else even if it's not specified in the will or trust. Keep in mind, you might need to seek court approval for such a transfer, depending on the jurisdiction and specific family circumstances.

Or, you can let anyone who has a problem with your grandmother's decision contest the will. Of course, one possible outcome of that is you might have to spend the money she left fighting them in court. The lady left what she left. There's no more. It was her house, her property and her money. The others aren't entitled to what she had just because they're relatives or they want it.

If you go to church, I'd advise you spend some time talking to your pastor about the situation. You've got a lot of folks mad at you right now, and I think you might benefit from a few kind words and an objective point of view. I'd also recommend sitting down with a good financial planner someone with the heart of a teacher—and talk about to best handle your newfound inheritance. Regardless of your decision, it's always best to have a plan and be prepared.

In the meantime, don't beat yourself up over this, son. You haven't done anything wrong. God bless you.


According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), motorcyclists are approximately 28 times more likely than passenger car occupants to die in a motor vehicle crash per vehicle mile traveled. The reasons for this disparity

are numerous, including the lack of protective barriers and the inherent instability of motorcycles compared to fourwheeled vehicles.

While the thrill of riding a motorcycle is undeniable, it is imperative to know the risks. By understanding the common causes of motorcycle accidents and adhering to recommended safety practices, riders can enjoy their journeys while reducing the likelihood of accidents. Safety gear, visibility, defensive riding, proper training, and motorcycle maintenance are all critical components of a safe riding experience. As motorcycling continues to grow in popularity, spreading awareness about these safety measures becomes increasingly important in fostering a culture of safety and responsibility among riders.

The rules of the road apply to all drivers, and we frequently handle motorcycle accidents. Distracted driving is always a danger. #### **How Extreme Heat Affects** Seniors: Tips to Stay Safe

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

*I* work for a county health department and every summer we're seeing more and more seniors get sick and even die from heatrelated illiness. Can you write an awarness piece on the affects extreme heat has on older adults, and what they can do to guard against this summertime risk. Thanks for helping keep seniors safe! Health Advocate

#### Dear Advocate,

Happy to oblige! Most people don't realize that each year, extreme summertime heat kills more people in the U.S. than hurricanes, floods and tornadoes combined. While extreme heat can be deadly for anyone, older adults are uniquely vulnerable because of three key factors: biological changes that occur with age; higher rates of age-related diseases; and greater use of medications that can alter the body's response to heat.

Here's how to gauge the risk for a heat-related illness for you or an older loved one and how to stay safe.

#### **How Heat Affects Seniors**

The human body has two main mechanisms to cool itself: sweating and increasing blood flow to the skin. In older adults, both of those processes are compromised. Seniors sweat less and they have poor circulation compared with younger people.

Chronic health conditions that are more common in old age, most notably cardiovascular disease and diabetes, can also exacerbate these issues. A diseased heart isn't able to pump as much blood, further reducing blood flow to the skin. And if the nerves become affected in people with diabetes, the body might not receive the message that it needs to start sweating.

As people age, they also stop feeling as thirsty and so they tend to drink less. In hot conditions, that can cause them to become dehydrated faster.

In addition, some older adults, particularly if they have some form of dementia or cognitive decline, may not perceive temperature changes as well. As a result, they won't respond appropriately to heat, both biologically (through sweating) and behaviorally (by moving to someplace cool).

Finally, certain medications many seniors take like diuretics and other high blood pressure drugs can affect people's hydration, blood flow and even the sweat response, so be sure to ask your doctor about any medications you're taking.

#### How to Stay Safe

On hot days, older adults and people with serious health conditions should limit outdoor activities like walking and gardening to the cooler mornings and evenings, take frequent breaks and drink plenty of water even if you aren't thirsty. Listen to your body. If the activity starts to feel harder than normal, that's a signal to stop and find a place to cool down.

Signs of dehydration or heat exhaustion include dizziness, lightheadedness, headache, flushed face, a racing heart or feeling lethargic. Low energy is especially important to watch out for in people with cognitive impairment, who may not realize how hot they are or be able to express it.

If heat exhaustion worsens to a heatstroke, it becomes a lifethreatening emergency.

While older adults face unique challenges when it comes to heat, the ways to cool down are the same for any age. If you or a loved one start to experience any of the above symptoms, the best thing you can do is to go somewhere that has airconditioning. If AC isn't available in the home, check if there's a local cooling center.

In the absence of air-conditioning, water is extremely helpful in reducing the risk for heat-related injury. Rubbing an ice cube or cold compress over your skin, spraying yourself with cool water or taking a cool shower or bath can also help.



On December 6, 2023, the Board reversed its decision, now certifying that Mr. McDonald holds an Alabama certificate in administration and supervision, according to the Board's own requirements pursuant to Sections 16-9-2 and 16-9-4, Code of Alabama 1975.

Upon receiving the certification from the State Board of Education, Colbert County Probate Judge Daniel Rosser consulted with me as Colbert County the Democratic Party Chair. Judge Rosser proposed that rather than sue the Probate Court to get Mr. McDonald's name on the March primary ballot, where he would face no Democratic opponent, the Party could nominate him for the vacancy on the November general ballot election in accordance with Section 17-13-23, Code of Alabama 1975.Ι consulted Alabama the with Democratic Partv's legal representation agreeing before to Judge Rosser's accept recommendation.

On March 11, 2024, as agreedwithJudgeRosser,Colbert County the submitted Democrats Certification of the Democratic Candidates, nominating Mr. McDonald as general election candidate for the vacant Superintendent position.

At some point, Judge Rosser consulted State Attorney General Steve Marshall on the matter. On June 12, 2024, Judge Rosser forwarded AG Marshall's opinion to me and others that stated since the Democratic Party did not nominate Mr. McDonald or any other candidate for the Superintendent position, there was no vacancy now to be filled.

Mr. McDonald's name could not appear on the November ballot, no matter what Judge Rosser had previously stated in the agreement with the Colbert County Democratic Party.

iniustice An to democracy has occurred in the Shoals. Colbert County citizens have been denied the right to have Mr. Lymos McDonald – a qualified, certified candidate on the ballot. Lymos McDonald 's mission is to provide Colbert County students and their families the option of having him represent them. He will therefore continue his campaign as a write-in candidate for Superintendent of the Colbert County Board of Education.
