Many of my recent columns mentioned baseball players, many obscure, and frankly, not very good. Kind of like some of our nation's Presidents.

Kidding! I'm just jealous. I've never received one single vote for the Presidency, even though my primary campaign promise would stir the souls of all humanity: Changing that "ball 4" call made on September 2, 1972, by umpire Bruce Froemming that cost Cubs pitcher Milt Pappas a perfect game!

At any rate, to mark Independence Day, here's a column that's chiefly executive.

My No. 4 son, now 27, still has a knack -developed back in 4th grade – for rattling off at lightning speed, and in order, the name of every President of the United States. 

How important do you feel identity theft protection is today? Should my husband and I buy it just for ourselves, or should we cover the kids, too? Lastly, where does identity theft protection fall in your Baby Steps plan? Lanie

Unless you've gone completely off the grid, and have been there for a long, long time, there's a good chance someone out there has a few of your numbers. Unfortunately, that's all part of living in today's world. Between consumer carelessness and data breaches-which have become an all-too-common occurrence these days-almost everyone has experienced, or will experience, some sort of identity theft during their lifetime.

So, yes. I recommend everyone have identity theft protection. I don't really consider it part of the Baby Steps, because in my mind it's like car insurance or life insurance, in that it's something virtually everyone needs. And things like that should just be part of your regular monthly budget.

I own a small rental house, and for the

most part my tenants have been conscientious people over the years. Recently, I learned my current tenant is subleasing the property for the short term as a vacation site. This kind of thing is prohibited in the rental agreement. He has always taken very good care of the place, so should I confront him about this. or just ignore it until it becomes a real problem? Karl

Dear Karl,

This may sound hardnosed, but it's already a problem. He's in obvious violation of the lease agreement. If it were me, I'd have a face-to-face talk with this guy today. I'd let him know how much I appreciate that he's been a good, respectful tenant in the past, but the subleasing has to stop.

An agreement is an agreement. I have several rental properties myself, and I always try to be gentle and nice, but really clear about things. You may not have experienced any problems up until now, but what happens next time? If you don't know and trust who's in the house, you could end up with holes in the walls, ruined carpets and worse. On top of all that, what if they don't have the money to fix things when they leave? It'll be on you, because you lost control of your property.

Again, be decent when you talk to this guy. It sounds like you two have a good history. But remind him he's in violation of the lease agreement. And gently let him know if anything like this happens again, you'll begin the eviction process.





glad I received this opportunity and am so grateful for the experiences I made".

The trip has grown over the years from the very first trip in 2013, where the Rotary partnered with Whirlpool Corporation and provided water filtration for each home in the Bateys and building latrines. After studies and a better water system installed in the area, we switched our focus to building homes and education. Many of the residents live in very poor conditions with metal walls and roofs.

Prior to Covid in 2019, the Interact Clubs of SJ and Our Lady vowed to raise \$20,000 to send every child in Batey 106 to school in the city. Prior to that there were just tutors once a week for the young ones. The Whirlpool Golf Charity Outing matched Interact funds dollar for dollar which put the group ahead of schedule and able to fund the kids going to school or at least have devices for learning during the Covid months and after including uniforms, bus transportation, and school supplies

Interact Club Advisor for SJPS and trip coordinator, Cindy Igoe said "these special people in Batey 106 hold a special place in our hearts and we just want to see to it that they flourish and have opportunities to better their lives".
