# Journey of passion and leadership as Christensen dances through life

Colleen (Smith) Christensen, 43, has been dancing since she could first walk and talk. She danced with Pat's Dance Studio, Just for Kix, Aitkin All Starz, Luther College Pom Team and more. Then she became a judge and regional coordinator for danceline competitions and was the author of the new scoresheet by which routines are judged.

Christensen was born in Granite Falls but moved to Aitkin as a small infant. "My dad Scott was a cop and the police chief for Aitkin. Growing up I was always the cop's daughter."

Her late mom Joni was a mail carrier and, later, a nurse.

Scott later married Julie Soderquist and she has two kids, Emily Lubben and Eric O'Neil. Sister Brenda, 37, and her family, live in Aitkin and Christensen is spending lots of time with her niece and two nephews. Although Christensen has two dogs, human children are not planned for her. "I'll have 17 teenagers on the dance team."

Aitkin offers her a fresh start and a chance to reconnect with family and friends. "I was able to rent a home near where I grew up. There is plenty to do here if you want to do it. Recently, I went to Ladies' Night Out downtown and went to listen to some live music."

She directs the marketing

for a large insurance company. From home, she manages 75 staff from all over the country who are working on 200 projects.

In her dance journey, she started tap and ballet lessons with Pat's Dance Studio when she was 3. She took baton classes in Aitkin one year and performed in the Riverboat Parade. Then, she joined Just for Kix from grades 3-8, and, in grade 9, was accepted on the Aitkin All Starz.

"At that time, Danceline was considered a Minnesota State High School League activity – it was not a sport," Christensen explained. Therefore, the whole operation was run by the coaches only.

When she was in grade 9 Aitkin won a medal – the only time they placed in her local career. There was only one year with no Smith kid on the All Starz and then Brenda joined in her eighth-grade year. The team ended up having lot of success in the early 2000s.

Not one to sit around, Christensen also played second

doubles in high school, was the softball team manager, ran track where she threw the shotput and also joined Peer Helpers and the National Honor Society -- and she loved playing the saxophone in the band. "I was a band nerd."

She attended Luther in Decora, Iowa, intending on becoming an English teacher. Later, she switched to communications. Starting with a receptionist job at a Yellow Pages company, she has worked in marketing and advertising, landing in her present job.

In an effort to stay involved in dance, when she moved to the Twin Cities she became a judge. She judged danceline competitions and state tournaments, along with updating rules and writing the score card. "I've sat in nearly every high school gym in Minnesota," she said.

The partnership with Just for Kix continues as the program is restarting in Aitkin under the direction of Kristi (Patnode) VanCamp.

Ava Christensen (not relat-

ed) and Hannah Jones were picked as team captions for this season. Summer brings practices as allowed and camps. Justice Ramos is her assistant coach and they are evaluating applications to assign a JV coach. The season starts in the fall and continues around Valentine's Day.

"I'm really excited as to

where the Dance Team can go this year. The girls are very excited and eager. While I'm not a drill sergeant I have high expectations that I communicate to our team. If they want to succeed, I can guide them. It's good to be back. I just couldn't stand to sit on the sidelines and watch someone else be in charge."

# New laws intended to enhance economic development, education

As of July 1, 2024, Minnesota residents will see the implementation of several impactful new laws aimed at bolstering economic growth, education, and environmental stewardship across the state. These measures were enacted during the 2024 legislative session and build upon ongoing efforts to support Minnesota's communities.

### Economic Development

A significant highlight includes a \$23.85 million investment in job training and economic development programs for fiscal year 2025. Spearheaded by Rep. Hodan Hassan and Senate President Bobby Joe Champion, this funding will support initiatives such as innovation grants through Launch Minnesota, capitalization of revolving loan funds for northeast Minnesota startups via the Entrepreneur Fund, and technical assistance for small businesses at the New American Development Center and African Immigrants Community Services.

Additionally, funds are earmarked for violence prevention, biotech innovation, and crucial support for minority-owned enterprises, including the Minnesota Black Chamber of Commerce and WomenVenture.

Rep. Hodan Hassan (DFL-Mpls) and Senate President Bobby Joe Champion (DFL-Mpls) are the sponsors.

- Including in the funding is:
- \$2.5 million for Launch Minnesota for innovation grants to assist eligible Minnesota entrepreneurs or start-up businesses with their operating needs;
  - \$1 million to the Entrepreneur Fund to capitalize its revolving loan funds to address unmet financing needs in northeast Minnesota of for-profit business startups, expansions, and ownership transitions;
  - \$1 million to the New American Development Center to provide small businesses and entrepreneurs with technical assistance, financial education, training, and lending;
  - \$1 million to African Immigrants Community Services for workforce development for new Americans;
  - \$1 million to Change Starts with Community for a violence prevention program;
  - \$1 million to the city of Brooklyn Park to develop a biotech innovation district;
  - \$1 million to the Min-

nesota Black Chamber of Commerce for technical support to Black-owned small businesses;

- \$1 million to WomenVenture for supporting child care providers by providing business training, mentorship, services, and educational materials; and
- \$700,000 for the Shakopee area workforce development scholarship pilot program.

The law also appropriates General Fund money to support programs through Explore Minnesota Tourism: \$2 million to the 2026 Special Olympics USA Games to provide food and housing to athletes; \$1.25 million to the Minneapolis Downtown Council for infrastructure and associated costs for the Taste of Minnesota; \$825,000 for Explore Minnesota Film; and \$400,000 to Ka Joog for Somali community and cultural festivals and events.

### Education

Education funding receives a \$43 million boost, primarily directed towards improving student literacy through the READ Act. This initiative, championed by Rep. Cheryl Youakim and Sen. Mary Kunesch, aims to ensure every child reads at or above grade level from kindergarten onward. The law also enhances equalization aid and establishes a state school librarian position to strengthen academic standards and support media literacy.

### Elections and Deep Fakes

In the realm of elections, legislation effective July 1, 2024, addresses school board vacancies and tackles the issue of deep fake technology, safeguarding electoral integrity.

A candidate will forfeit the nomination or office if they are found guilty of using deep fake technology to influence an election.

The law also amends the time frame in which a person can commit the offense of using a deep fake to influence an election to include 90 days before a political party nominating convention, or after the absentee voting period has begun prior to a presidential primary, state primary, local primary, special primary, or special election. The provision does not apply to a cable television system or broadcaster who disseminates a deep fake produced by a candidate if the dissemination is required by federal law.

Rep. Mike Freiberg (DFL-Golden Valley) and Sen. Jim Carlson (DFL-Eagan) sponsor the elections law.

### Employment

In addition, restrictive employment covenants are now prohibited under new labor policies, offering greater employment flexibility to Minnesota workers.

### Environment

Environmental efforts receive a substantial \$79.64 million from lottery proceeds to preserve and enhance Minnesota's natural resources. This includes funding for land acquisition, environmental education, and research into innovative conservation methods.

Funding in the law includes:

- \$20.3 million for land acquisition and recreation projects, including more than \$5 million to develop state trails and \$4.7 million for local parks, trails and natural areas;
- \$15 million for 28 foundational information and data projects, including money to update field guides, track movement of white-tailed deer and prepare geologic atlases;
- \$11.3 million for 22 environmental education projects such as \$410,000 to support a naturalist and intern at a nature center in Austin and \$459,000 to create a mobile earth science education lab in northwest Minnesota;
- \$10.9 million for 16 projects exploring methods to protect land, water and habit. They include studying how microbes can degrade microplastics, and whether an advanced LiDAR system can save birds from wind turbines;
- \$8.3 million to address invasive species with most going to the University of Minnesota Invasive Terrestrial Plants and Pests Center;
- \$6.9 million directed toward water resources research projects such as state flood and drought modeling and nutrient recovery from wastewater treatment plants research;
- \$4.83 million for five projects addressing air quality, climate change and renewable energy, such as one to develop and test low-cost biofilters; and
- \$2.1 million for administrative costs, with \$1.1 million going to the emerging issues account and \$750,000 for the LCCMR administrative

budget.

### Other Key Changes

Health and human services will see a significant reorganization, consolidating responsibilities under the newly formed Department of Children, Youth, and Families, effective July 1, 2024. This restructuring aims to streamline services ranging from child care to juvenile justice.

### Transportation

Effective July 1, 2024, a new law mandates plain language standards for driver's license exams, ensuring clarity and accessibility for all applicants. Additionally, a retail delivery fee will support transportation infrastructure improvements across the state, benefiting metropolitan counties, small cities, and town roads.

## Stamps increase July 14

In a recent development affecting millions of Americans, the U.S. Postal Service has formally notified the Postal Regulatory Commission of forthcoming changes to its mailing services pricing. Scheduled to come into effect this Sunday, July 14, these adjustments include several notable shifts in postage rates.

Chief among the updates is a five-cent rise in the cost of a First-Class Mail Forever stamp, elevating its price from 68 cents to 73 cents. This increase reflects ongoing efforts by the Postal Service to maintain operational efficiency and service quality amidst evolving economic conditions.

## Tragic accident claims life of Red Wing man

A Fourth of July celebration turned tragic for a group of friends in Fleming Township when a tree climbing accident claimed the life of 27-year-old Henry M. Cannon. The incident occurred at a private residence on the shores of Gun Lake, where Cannon was enjoying the holiday festivities with companions.

According to reports from the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office, Cannon was climbing a large White Pine tree when a roughly 2-inch diameter branch gave way, causing him to fall approximately twenty-five feet to the ground. He suffered severe internal injuries and was rendered unconscious by the impact.

Emergency services, including the McGregor Fire Department, Palisade First Responders, and North Ambulance, rushed to the scene in response to the distress

call. Cannon was quickly transported by ambulance to Riverwood Hospital, where medical personnel made efforts to save his life. Despite their best efforts, Cannon was pronounced deceased shortly

after arrival.

Following protocol, Cannon's body was transferred to the Ramsey County Medical Examiner's Office for further examination, including toxicology tests to determine

if any substances may have contributed to the accident.

The Aitkin County Sheriff's Office conducted a thorough investigation into the circumstances surrounding the tragic incident.
