lamitos Vineyards, San Jose's only vineyard winery located in Almaden Valley, has won several awards at the recent 2024 International Women's Wine Competition.



The motorcyclist, whose name was withheld pending notification of family members, was pronounced dead at the scene just after 4 p.m. on Thursday.

This accident marked the 24th traffic fatality of the year on city streets. At this time last year, San Jose had recorded 26 roadway deaths.

# San Jose officials support retail theft crackdown reform

ast year San Jose City Council unanimously approved creating the Organized Retail Theft Detail, an investigative team within the San Jose Police Department to gather intelligence and track crime statistics and patterns to identify hotspots, catch criminals and reduce the rate of retail crimes. The San Jose Police Department received nearly \$8.5 million from the state to launch a three-year program.

Political consultant Rich Robinson told San José Spotlight he isn't surprised to see big city mayors like Mahan call for Prop. 47 reforms in light of organized retail theft and companies pulling out of some locations.

"Ultimately, crime has gone down in the state of California," Robinson said. "But the cause and effect of the news coverage on thefts with retail shops closing down, and they've got competition coming from Amazon and online retailers – so it's not just Prop. 47 that's causing the problems for these retailers."

A 2022 UC Berkeley Institute of Governmental Studies poll co-sponsored by

the Los Angeles Times found 59% of people surveyed said they supported reforming Prop. 47.

Not all political leaders are on board. Santa Clara County Democratic Party Chair Bill James told San José Spotlight they oppose the proposition, which he said have almost nothing to do with reducing homelessness or drug addiction. Instead, it returns to failed mass incarceration strategies to combat retail theft.

"Law enforcement agencies, including the State Attorney General, already have initiatives in place that have been successful in addressing retail theft, and as the Attorney General has said retail theft

by organized rings and or involving violence is already a serious crime that can and should be charged as a felony," he said.

Regardless of the actual crime statistics, Robinson said he thinks California voters will pass the proposition. Whether the reforms will lead to a decrease in crime and homelessness has yet to be seen, he said, but it will mean more work for the Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office.

"I think the voters are going to pass anything that is going to punish people, especially as they see the quality of life go down," he said.

• Cognitive Assessments: Assessing cognitive function is crucial for determining driving competency. ### **Vision and Hearing Tests**

### Silicon Valley water agency delays decision to fine homeless people

he Valley Water board of directors last week agreed to postpone voting on a policy that poses \$500 fines or up to 30 days in jail for unhoused people residing on agency-owned land.

The directors voiced their desire to hear from other government agencies, nonprofits and unhoused advocates at an Oct. 11 housing summit before making a decision regarding imposing a new policy.

"The status quo is not working. Maybe this ordinance isn't perfect," Director Barbara Keegan said. "But we're spending a lot of money to deal with unhoused issues and it's not benefiting the unhoused or the society at large."

Over the last three years, Valley Water has spent \$8 million cleaning encampments and \$4.8 million relocating encampments along Coyote Creek. In that period, workers also removed nearly 6 million pounds of trash and dehris

There are currently more than 700 people camping along Valley Water property, a number seems to be rising each year. Valley Water owns the land rights to 295 miles of the  $800\,miles$  of waterways in Santa Clara

Homeless advocates urged the board not to go through with the policy until safe places for people are implemented.

By the end of fiscal year 2025, the city believes it can offer 1,200 new shelter options for the unhoused.



# Symphony San Jose announces 2024/25 Season

Classical Masterpieces, contemporary discoveries, light classics, film music, pops, ballet, and education concerts

Symphony San Jose has announced its 2024/2025 season—one filled with an exciting mix of classical masterpieces, contemporary discoveries, light classics, film music, pops, ballet, and education concerts.

The Symphony will present nine productions totaling 27 performances in San Jose's majestic California Theatre for the new season.

"San Jose's connection to symphonic music runs deep," said Executive Artistic Director Robert Massey. "It can be traced back to the 1870s when musicians came together and formed the city's first orchestra. Today, the talented orchestral musicians of Symphony San Jose are key to the city's unique cultural identity, ensuing live, world-renowned music continues to flourish in the South Bay."

Masterworks of the Classical Canon. Strauss' Death and Transfiguration, and Pärt's Cantus in Memory of Benjamin Britten. Japanese conductor Tatsuya Shimono returns for The Planets—An HD Odyssey featuring the popular Holst work, Mozart's Symphony No. 41, and Montgomery's Starburst. The season closes with España—a musical trip through Spain led by Jose Luis Gomez and featuring Frank's Escaramuza, Rodrigo's Concierto de Aranjuez performed by guitarist Rafael Aguirre, Ravel's Rapsodie Espagnole, and Rimsky-Korsakov's Capriccio Espagnole.

**Symphonic Spectaculars.** New this year are three concerts consisting of a mix of familiar favorites, light classics,

pops, and film music. Halloween Spooktacular features haunting harmonies with music including J.S. Bach's Toccata & Fugue, Saint-Saëns Danse Macabre, Mussorgsky's Night on Bald Mountain, Bernard Hermann's Psycho Suite, and John Williams' Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban. Holiday Spectacular celebrates "The Most Wonderful Time of the Year" with the Symphony, Symphony San Jose Chorale, Cantabile Youth Singers, and New Ballet performing holiday classics, carols, audience sing-alongs, and the ever-popular 12 Days of Silicon Valley.

Hollywood Spectacular celebrates films and film composers who took home the coveted Oscar for Best Score, including Korngold's The Adventures of Robin Hood, Mancini's Breakfast at Tiffany's, Jarre's Lawrence of Arabia, and Williams' Schindler's List. 

### **TECH JARGON OF THE WEEK:**

### Retrieval Augmented Generation (RAG)

Have you ever stumbled into a conversation where everyone is speaking around this "techie" word – and even



after you've broken in, it is difficult to understand the unfamiliar jargon and acronyms? Well, there's no need to sweat it. Let me teach you the meaning of some commonly used tech words:

#### Retrieval Augmented Generation (RAG)

Retrieval Augmented Generation, or RAG, is popular these days because it introduces some serious capabilities to LLMs like OpenAI's GPT-4 - and that's the ability to use and leverage their own data.

Why do we need RAG? There's so much noise in the AI space and about RAG. Vendors are trying to overcomplicate it. They're trying to inject their tools, their ecosystems, their vision. the essence of RAG involves adding your own data (via a retrieval tool) to the prompt that you pass into a large language model. As a result, you get an output. That gives you several

benefits:

- You can include facts in the prompt to help the LLM avoid hallucinations
- You can (manually) refer to sources of truth when responding to a user query, helping to double check any potential issues.
- You can leverage data that the LLM might not have been trained on.

With Retrieval Augmented Generation, the system allows the LLM to function in the context of data external to its original dataset used for pre-training. The system works as follows:

- Ingest flow: Data is split into sentences or other chunks of data. Each chunk or sentence is then encoded into a vector embedding and stored in a vector store.
- Query flow: When a query is issued, the query is first encoded into its own vector embedding, and those are compared to the data in the vector store. The most relevant sentences or facts from the vector store are retrieved. Those facts (or sentences) are then provided to a summarizer LLM so that it can respond to the query with this context (set of facts) in mind and provide an accurate response to the query, based on the data.

# Supervisor may leave for job in New Mexico

Bernalillo County board votes to hire Cindy Chavez as next county manager

anta Clara County Supervisor Cindy Chavez could be leaving the Bay Area for a new job leading Bernalillo County in New Mexico after serving decades in public service.

The Bernalillo County Board of Commissioners voted last week 3-2 to hire Chavez as the next county manager. Bernalillo County, which includes the city of Albuquerque, is the most populated county in New Mexico with more than 672,000 residents.

Chavez, who terms out at the end of the year, still would have to accept the offer and

pass a background check.

In 1998, she was elected to the San Jose City Council, and she was reelected in 2002. Several years after her failed 2006 mayoral bid in San Jose, she became the head of the South Bay Labor Council, and later the exec-

utive director of labor think tank Working Partnerships USA. She won a special election for the District 2 seat on the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors, where she has represented parts of downtown and East San Jose. In 2022, she made another run for the San Jose mayor's office, but ultimately lost to current Mayor Matt Mahan.
